Today will no doubt see them shout for Oldham so perhaps we may not get as many letters as usual this time! Septembers clash at Watersheddings was a cracker when Borough emerged unlucky losers. Lets hope today brings a change in fortunes.

## Rugby League Review



GOODBYE TO 1987

If anyone had told me at the beginning of last year that Blackpool Borough would be leaving Blackpool and playing in Wigan under another name I would have said they were losing their marbles, and would have taken bets on it not happening. We were in financial difficulties but that was nothing new for the Borough. Over my many years with the club it had never been anything else, but we struggled on, season after season hoping a miracle would happen and that we would start getting gates that would help us to pay our way. However the killer blow came when the Town Council at their first meeting of the year. changed their minds about paying for the work required on the ground to meet the new Safety regulations. This was followed quickly by the Ground Safety officers giving us the ultimatum that unless certain w work was carried out by a certain date in January, the ground would be closed to professional Rugby League. This was the knockout blow to the punch drunk directors and so the last game was played at Borough Park on January 4th against Whitehaven. What a start to the year. The remaining games were played at Bloomfield Road and that was another loss making exercise and it is history now what happened at the end of the season and why we are here today under a new name. But with a lot of hope for the future. I was talking to the Batley Secretary. Les Hardy who has been with that club many years at our 'A' team game played at Borough Park. He said, he was flabbergasted, a typical Yorkshire expression, at the closure of our ground, one which he considers the best 'non-soccer' R.L. ground in the 2nd Division. He said. "Wait until you see our ground", which of course we did last Sunday. What a sorry sight, the main stand demolished, not a seat in sight, I stood on the re-terraced popular side, which has been well done, by men under instruction by the Manpower Services Commission, the Batlev club only having to pay for the material, even so, there was not a crush barrier in sight, and yet at Borough Park, where crush barriers already exist, we were told they were not adequate. One wonders if the Safety Officers have different standards in different areas. I feel that if the Safety Officers are going to adopt a hard line with R.L. clubs then there could be a few less clubs coming up to the starting line for the 1988/89 season unless they get some financial assistance from their Town Councils. Some have, some haven't, their local sports grounds should not be made a political issue, they should be proud to bring these long established clubs upto date with grants.

HALFWAY STAGE ....

Here we are today at the halfway stage of our league programme and we can look back at the first half with some satisfaction for we have surprised everybody with the good displays we have put up especially

when the team has had to be re-built. We only had 18 players at the end of last season. The re-building programme has been costly especially with the new 'Players Contracts' coming into force this season. You can't win them all, but the majority of our signings have been a success, a mixture of experienced players and some young and promising ones straight from Junior Football. Some of the latter are already established in the 1st team and there is great credit due to our coaches, scouts and the football committee, particularly Mike Nicholas who seemed to have his finger on the pulse of junior football and it was a stroke of genius to get the signature of Bob Eccles, an expensive signing, and yes. I will hold my hand up, I was one who doubted the wisdom of this move. Bob has been a piller of strength to the team and despite all the rumours that he was prone to injury, he has not missed a match and he has gained the confidence of the players around him. We have been unlucky with injuries, particularly with our expensive Australian import. Gary French also another expensive signing, from Warrington Tony Hodson who has had to have a cartilege operation, he looked a real live wire in his early games. He is now making a comeback via the 'A' team. The latter has also been a success story. In their first season they have done well. being 3rd in the Alliance league at the moment. Of course we are not complacent enough to think everything in the garden is lovely, the coaches know where the team needs strengthening, but it is all a question of L.S.D. Our Commercial Manager and his staff are working hard to bring in the cash so badly needed. We also require an average gate of 2,000. They are slowly improving as the good Wigan people realise we have not got a team of mugs, and despite uncalled for opposition from across the town, we believe there is room for two R.L. clubs without treading on anyones toes. At the time of writing we are only 4 points behind the League leaders and we have already played eight of our away games. We have nine home games and of the six away we should get maximum points from at least four Mansfield Marksmen, Dewsbury, Fulham, and Carlisle. A glance at the league table shows that there is going to be a real struggle for the top three places but what a cockeved system when all the clubs don't play each other and yet every week some clubs have blank fixtures. I know it is the big boys who are dictating the compilation of the two divisions at the moment and in my opinion it is not for the good of the game. I would prefer to see 16 teams in the first division and 18 in the 2nd with four up and four down with every club playing each other in its own division. At the moment there is too big a gap with the standard of play between the two divisions. I believe that the more movement there is between the two divisions, the more chance there is of raising the standard.



It is not unusual at this stage in the winter calendar to appraise what has gone before and look forward to what might be.

It is a matter of fact that from the ashes of the old Blackpool Borough set-up arose a different and entirely new structure which rightly or wrongly took over the title of Springfield Borough. A title which in the due process of time will have to change again.

Springfield Borough has achieved minor miracles in what is effectively a new team in the league. Springfield Park is a fine venue which can only get better. The team ably led by Bob Eccles, has made an impact both on and off the field and with team spirit riding high and injuries at a minimum who knows what the position might be at the end of April.

A policy of attracting local talent has proved its worth with five of the youngsters drafted into the team being recommended for Under 21 International honours. A string of victories against top opposition, with Oldham being taken all the way earlier in the season underlines the wisdom of this policy which has got to continue. Our ventures into the overseas market has rebounded in that Gary French, imported from Brisbane at some considerable cost received a nasty injury in an off-the-ball incident and will not play again this season.

The calculated risk of running a second team in the Alliance League starting from scratch has paid handsome dividends. Not only has it enabled first team players to play out injuries or re-gain lost form, it has been a wonderful vehicle to try out new players. 
