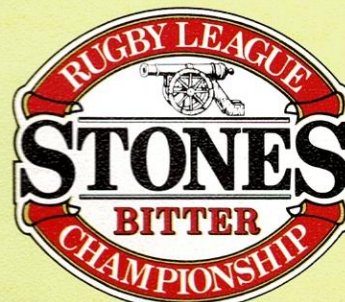

STATISTICS AND ALL THAT

Oldham statistician Steve Rigby puts the case for those tell-tale "stats")

A positive attitude and the clinical application of talent are the hallmarks of quality players and successful teams. We often hear the word 'talent' used to describe many players but without the correct attitude and application on and off the field that talent is worthless.

One of the positive aspects of the club this season has been the close monitoring of players' performances, both during the game and during mid-week training. When a player trains well, or has an outstanding game, he sets himself a standard that he then has to live up to. To fall below acceptable standards set by himself, a player must cause his coach to place question marks about the player's commitment or fitness.

The competition for places is often highlighted by the coaching staff and it is interesting to see how many 'A' team players study with interest the statistics on first-team performances. This gives them goals to aim for as well as a possible insight into players whose lack of form may give an opportunity to press for a place in the senior side.

Another positive development has been the emphasis on self-discipline, a quality that all today's great players possess in abundance. With the aid of statistics and video recordings, today's players can assess their own performance and note how they acted or re-acted in a match situation.

To simply believe that statistics revolve around a simple tackle count is naive. They are far more complex and detailed.

It was interesting to observe that after all three matches in which one of the Great Britain selectors watched Hugh Waddell, prior to his call-up for the Tests against France, Hugh's match statistics were of great interest to the Great Britain 'scout'.

Hughie's "stats" certainly are impressive when you look at the yardage he makes during a game. Hopefully, similarly impressive statistics by other members of the Oldham team will not only help them in their individual careers but will help the team climb from the Second Division into the First and become once more a member of Rugby League's elite.

THE BOSS TALKING...

(A personal view by Oldham coach Eric Fitzsimons)

THERE was an unusual mixture of emotions in the Oldham dressing room at Post Office Road last Sunday after the 8-8 draw - a subdued silence with a few handshakes to Featherstone players; little said on the way in; then a few faltering words from one or two, particularly Tony Morrison and Martin Hall, who were trying hard to get some normality into the atmosphere by kind words of praise and encouragement.



There followed the customary requests for injury reports from me for doctor and physiotherapist and then suddenly the whole room was singing out at the top of their voices, "Hail, hail, the boys are here".

It was as if everyone was waiting for the right show of emotion - afraid of looking happy, in case it was mistaken for apathy. Safer in sadness where there was no blame to be dealt out.

What was the right mood? How are you expected to feel? We knew we had them on toast, and so did Featherstone. Peter Fox is a man I have a great respect for. He said we were the better team and deserved to win and I don't disagree with him. It was a game of "if only's and I don't intend to start the ball rolling here. All I will say is that the players' reaction after the game was good. It showed the right balance of caution and a reason to be optimistic.

Featherstone may have picked up a little bit this week when they read of the injuries to Mick, Hugh, Gaz and Colin, but I can assure you it would take wild horses to stop them playing in this one. I have no doubt as I write this on Monday that they will be running out in six days time.

Featherstone still carry their unbeaten record. They are a fine side, they will make it a fine game and the team that wants to win most on the day will triumph. The message is clear - we make no team changes, we make minor adjustments to our tactics, and most important we aim to turn the breaks into points.

Fox, Bell and Steadman were key players last weekend and they can expect far more attention than they got last week. We missed 25 tackles last week and that is poor by our standards. We don't intend repeating it this week. The Oldham players know what is expected of them.

A big thanks once more to our travelling supporters who swelled the Featherstone crowd to 3,500 on the day. Great stuff. Keep shouting. We all appreciate it!

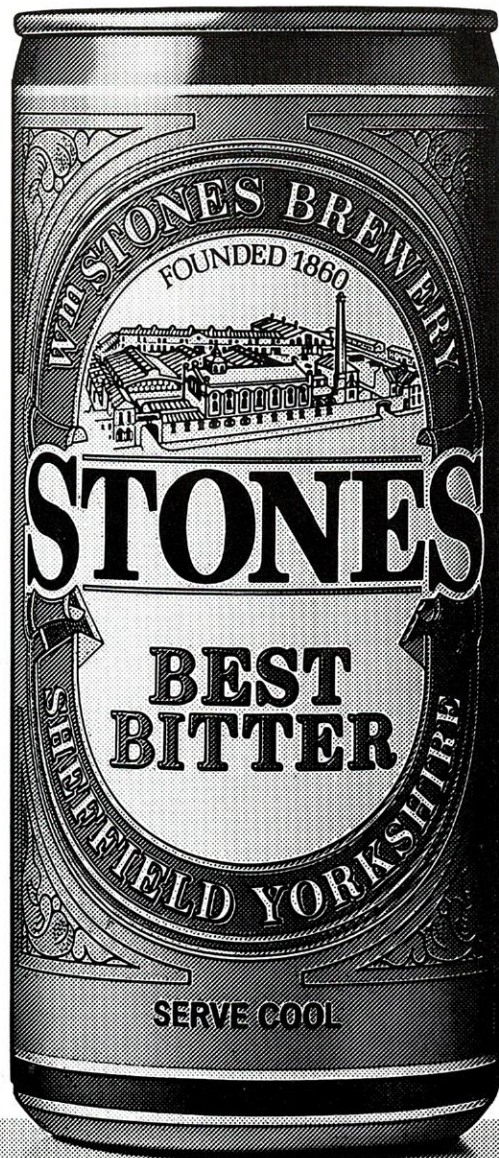

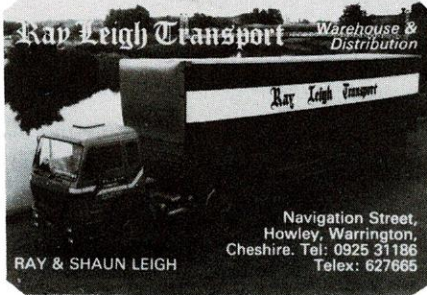

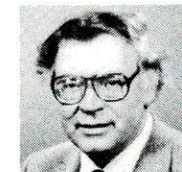

Rugby League at its best gripped Rovers' biggest crowd of the season, produced a match that was full of drama and incident from beginning to end, supplied top-class football and dreadnought tackling, created a cup-tie atmosphere, and fashioned a draw on points with the title rivals still looking for the knock-out punch when battle resumes in six days time.

The draw was the right and proper result, in my view, and the winner was Rugby League thanks to the guts, courage, skill, discipline and sportsmanship of the 26 men who, as we thought they would, turned this crucial match into a First Division classic in everything but the name.

As Wakefield creep into the top spot on points difference and no doubt relish the thoughts of another draw in the return match, Sunday's Oldham-Featherstone showdown assumes even greater importance.

It will be no place for the faint-hearted, believe me!
