BACK TRACK

If today's game is to be Hornet's last game on the Athletic Grounds, then it is most appropriate that our opponents should be our friends and rivals from Watersheddings.

Oldham Rugby League Club has figured prominently in Hornet's history and many memorable games have taken part between the two sides. The following are a few memories from the past:-

"The first time Hornets and Oldham met on the Athletic Grounds was on 27th October 1894, 15,000 people saw Hornets triumph by two tries to nil both scored by Chapman. On the 24th March 1911, Hornets met Oldham in a third round Challenge Cup replay, Hornets winning 4-3 after an 8-8 draw at Watersheddings. In the first League Match after the war on the 18th January 1919, Hornets went to Watersheddings and defeated Oldham 8-2 with tries from Heaton and Bowers."

On the 12th April 1924, 41,831 people saw Wigan and Oldham fight out a magnificent Challenge Cup Final on the Athletic Grounds with Wigan running out winners 21-4. Prior to that on the 22nd March 1922, a record crowd for Hornets on the Athletic Grounds of 26,664 saw Hornets defeat Oldham 5-2 in a Challenge Cup Tie with a try by Joe Corsi.

During the thirties many more memorable encounters took place and after the war intervened, the forties and fifties saw many outstanding games between Hornets and Oldham. The Law Cup Games (previously the Infirmary Cup) were pre-season matches which saw battles as strong and dedicated as any Challenge Cup Tie. On the 8th August 1953, 8,413 saw the Law Cup game which Hornets won 31-19. On October 16th 1954, 19,654 saw Oldham justify their position as League leaders with an 18-4 defeat of Hornets. Jackson, Pitchford, Barrow and Davies scored the Oldham tries.

The sixties and seventies again produced many fine games, but without the passion and atmosphere of the pre and early post war era. A match many present fans will remember was on 27th December 1971, at Watersheddings, when Hornets put up a magnificent performance winning 8-2 with tries from Delooze and Brelsford, for over a half the game Hornets played with 11 men, Hodgkinson and Clarke having been sent off.

So Oldham return to the Athletic Grounds possibly for the last time. Whatever happens with regard to the Ground it is most important that Rochdale Hornets Rugby League Club survives. In March 1901 the club held a fund-raising event at the Town Hall, the following extract from the handbook of that date is as appropriate today as it was then.

"The Hornets Football Club has numerous claims upon your sympathy and support. It is one of the oldest in the county, it has earned the reputation of which all its past and present members may be proud, although unfortunately its lustre has been somewhat dimmed of late years. It has encouraged and fostered local football, it has sent forth players who have done noble service on the football field in upholding the honour of Lancashire and England. It has provided unnumbered hours of enjoyment for thousands of the inhabitants of this busy industrial centre. No institution in the district has proved more attractive."

Let's hope Hornets survive!

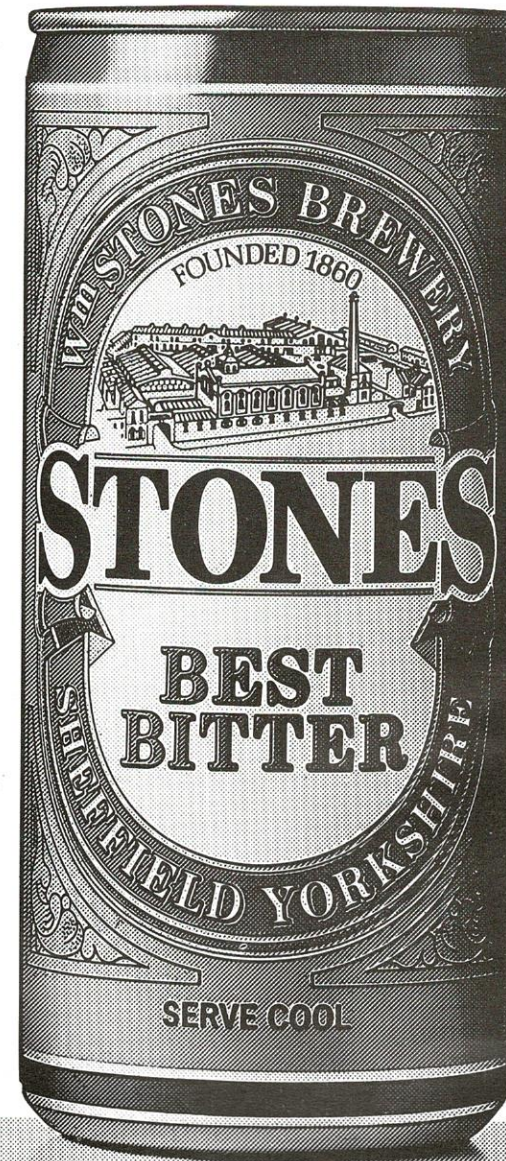

SCORELESS SEMI-FINALS

The 0-0 draw between Halifax and Hull at Headingley on Saturday was the fifth scoreless semi-final in Rugby League Challenge Cup's 91 year history. The others were 1903 Salford v Oldham, 1923 Barrow v Leeds, 1937 Keighley v Wakefield and 1968 Huddersfield v Wakefield T.

Saturday's match contrasted with this season's first semi-final when Wigan's 34-4 defeat of Salford was the highest semi-final score in the Wembley era which began in 1929 and just missed the all time record of Huddersfield's 35-2 defeat of Wakefield Trinity in 1913.

The highest scoring draw in a semi-final was Hull KR v Leeds in 1986.

There have been 19 drawn semi-finals altogether with only one producing two replays — Hull KR v Oldham in 1964.

SEMI-FINAL CROWDS

Both the Challenge Cup Semi-Final attendances topped 20,000 for the first time since 1969. This year's aggregate of 41,320 was also the biggest since the 42,074 in 1969. Then 21,497 saw Castleford beat Wakefield T 16-10 at Headingley and there were 20,600 at Wigan for Salford's 15-8 victory over Warrington.

This year's attendances were 20,783 for Wigan v Salford at Bolton and 20,537 for Halifax V Hull at Headingley.

In 1969 the total receipts were £16,215 compared with £177,902 this season.

MARTIN OFFIAH

Martin Offiah equalled the Wigan record of 34 tries in a season with his touch-down in the 39-6 win at Castleford last Wednesday (23 March). The record was set by stand-off Frank Myler in 1959-60 when he totalled 34 tries in 38 matches.

Offiah equalled the record in his 28th match. The winger has also scored a try each for Great Britain and the Rugby League Chairman's XIII to head to try scoring list with 36.

FEATHERSTONE ROVERS RECORD

Featherstone Rover's unbeaten League run ended at a club record equalling 16 matches when they lost 23-18 at Carlisle on Sunday. Carlisle were also the previous last team to beat them in Division Two winning 29-22 on 25 October.

Featherstone's unbeaten run including 2 tries equals the sequence in their Division Two title winning campaign of 1979-80 when they drew one match.

WINNING RUN

Wakefield Trinity's winning run ended at 7 matches when they lost 12-10 at Bramley on Sunday. It also ended Wakefield T's Division Two winning run of 10 matches.

The longest winning run now belongs to St Helens who have won 5 in succession. Their last defeat was 22-18 at Salford in the third round of the Silk Cut Challenge Cup.

The Saints have won 12 successive Stones Bitter Championship matches with their last League defeat being 25-16 at Hull KR on 6 December.

LOSING RUN

Hunslet have the longest losing run of 7 matches, made up of 6 Stones Bitter Championship matches and 1 Silk Cut Challenge Cup Tie. Their last victory was 23-4 away at Leigh Miners Welfare — a Silk Cut Challenge Cup Preliminary Tie on 15 January.

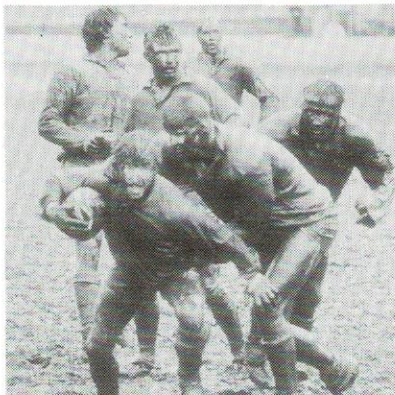

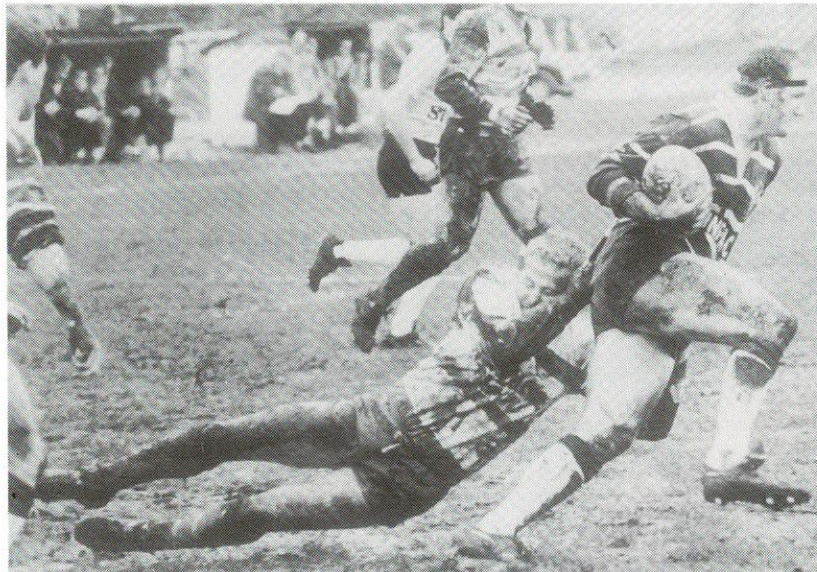
