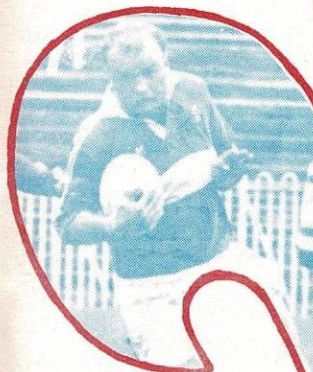

Club Notes -

For this, our last League programme of the Season we start our notes by welcoming Players, Officials, and Supporters from Oldham. The welcome and warm response given to us in January after our win was a credit, not only to the folk from Oldham, but also to our game in general. We trust that all Trinity fans will respond in similar manner today — whatever the result. For our part, David and the players know that only a solid victory today will keep alive the hopes of the Championship. Should we fail this afternoon, we will be congratulating our opponents on winning the title.

A vital part of the game these days is the increasing support from the Commercial World being sought and offered to Rugby League. It is only right that we mention the 'prize' of £10,000 which is available to either of today's teams for that title and the debt owed by the game to Stones for their fine support over this past and we trust, future seasons. We regularly see their guests joining us at Belle Vue and despite the 'problems presented by the Safety Act in respect of ticket arrangements, they are always assured of a welcome here as representatives of the main League Sponsors. Similarly, today we welcome Bruce Harding from T.S.A. and Tony Davidson from Sparkomatic, together with their guests. Their sponsorship of this game and their support of Trinity is most welcome and they can be sure that in line with the thoughts expressed at the recent Press Launch of our new contract with SML, they will be amply looked after and every attempt made to maximise their support of Trinity, in other words, good old-fashioned value-for-money.

Congratulations to Mark Conway for 'making it' on to the top ten try-scorers list in the game following his two against York last week-end. He and Nigel Bell are in the running to take some silverware from us — Supporters Club included — as our men of the Season and both are deserving of whatever comes their way. Well done Kevin Harcombe for passing the 200 points mark this season in the first York game and with two goals (or one try) today he will make the 300 points mark in just forty games.

The 'Ruggerline' competition was won by Andrew Hobbs from Ossett. He was correct with nine out of the ten voices identified, but we shall have to interview Paul Mallinder before too long, as his name was included in practically every other entry and as yet he hasn't said a word . . .

Finally, we should place on record the assessment of the past season's main achievement as it ought to be seen. We all like to aim for everything that is to be won. When we fall short, there is a tendency to undervalue that which has been gained. At the end of last season we were relegated in some dis-array and with a side which hardly looked able to compete in the Second Division.

David Topliss' appointment was made in the knowledge that money was not only scarce, it was almost non-existent. David's astute dealings with Leeds gave him not only four for two but sufficient cash on top of the players to eventually buy Andy Kelly. Those four Leeds players have played 117 matches between them and have scored fifty-seven tries. With Mark Conway's goals they have been responsible for forty per cent of the points this year and with Kevin Harcombe's tally of just over thirty per cent, their contribution to the points list is immense. More importantly however, is the fact that from little hope at the start of the season, the team has challenged at the top of the table all term and was assured of promotion after the win against York last Friday. We are all aware of the need to strengthen for next season in the First Division, but recent injuries have highlighted the present lack of depth — thus making the squad's achievements all the more creditable in a season when the Second Division has been harder than many a previous year. It is easy to allow the recent set-backs against Bramley and York to cloud the picture, but let us acknowledge what has been achieved and congratulate the coaches and the players on their efforts. Similar support in the face of the strong Oldham following this afternoon could just make that bit of difference which they need. Whatever the result, we shall be back here in two week's time when the Top Eight Play-Offs commence — see you then.

During the week we were sorry to learn of the death of Harry Skidmore. Harry's association with Trinity goes back to the sixties when, as a Police Constable, he was regularly on duty at Belle Vue. Since retirement he has been one of our stalwarts on the gates for not only First Team, but Colts, and A Team matches alike. Our thoughts are with Audrey his wife and her loss, and we at Belle Vue will miss such a reliable servant and supporter.
