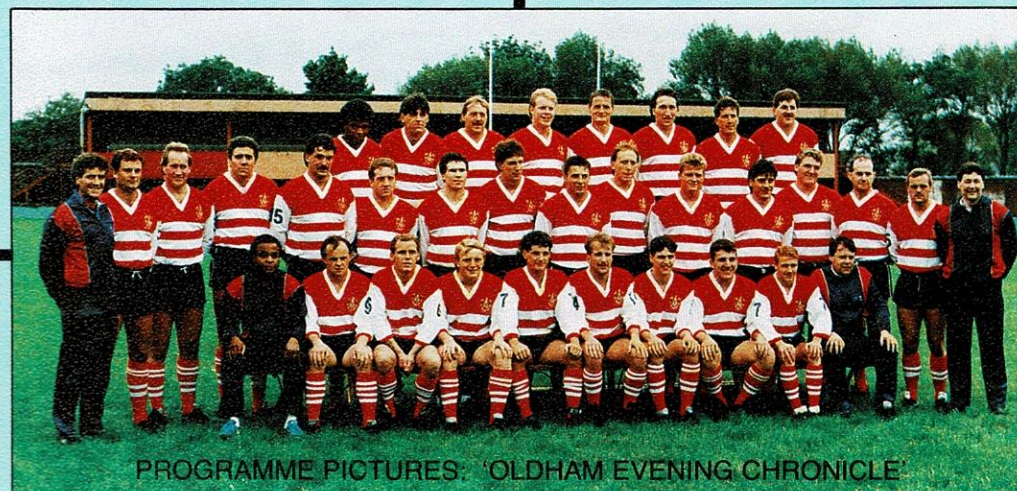

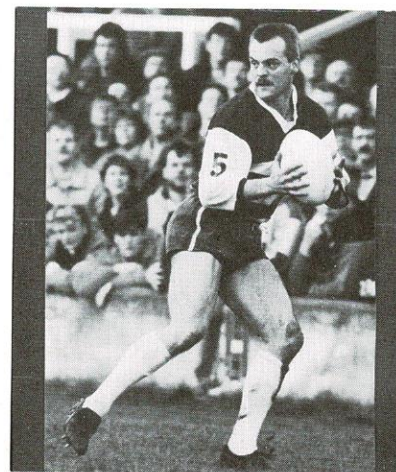

FOLLOW THE 'A' TEAM

A combination of injuries, first-team promotions and a fixture pile-up has severely dented our hopes of climbing out of the second division of the Alliance in recent weeks.

Our magnificent run of success came to an end when we were beaten 8-6 at home by leaders Blackpool. The Seasiders fielded a very strong side, dominated the first-half, and led 8-0 at the interval. In the absence of coach Iain MacCorquodale, the reserves looked a little lost, but they rallied in the second half and could easily have won had they taken their chances.

Oldham set up a thrilling finish when Steve Patterson and Geoff Munro sent centre Steve Robinson over for a try goaled by Martin Hall, but it came too late to prevent defeat.

In the next match against Workington at home, we scored ten tries in a 52-14 victory. Town had grey-haired Jackie Newell, their former half-back star, as sub and his son, John, at scrum-half.

Steve Robinson (3), Paul Round (2), Trevor Croston, Ian Bates, Richard Irving, and two trialists grabbed the tries, with Martin Hall kicking six goals.

Minus Ian Sherratt, Leo Casey, Keith Atkinson, Morrison and Marsden, the side bore little resemblance to the team that was pressing for promotion. The three new injury victims were Paddy Kirwan (broken foot), Tom Foley (elbow) and Martin Hall (facial stitches), and the injury to Paddy was a particularly sad one as he had only recently returned to action after being out for several months with a broken leg.

THE BOSS TALKING

A personal view by Oldham coach Eric Fitzsimons).

Congratulations to all the Oldham supporters. Your contribution this season in both league and cup games has been first class. The players were delighted with the reception at Wakefield. I was with Keith Atkinson the day after the game and he told me the atmosphere was more charged than anything he had ever experienced before.

What a shock his back injury! Keith has played well since regaining his senior place and he has shown a different maturity in his all-round game. We all wish him a speedy recovery. We are looking realistically at next season and if its any consolation to Atky I think he has earned a contract offer and that's the recommendation I will be putting to the board.

Looking back over the season, I suppose we can rightly say that we have achieved the aims we put to the players last July - promotion and championship. Our upset at Doncaster was the first reminder to us all that nothing could be taken for granted and that, as 7/4 favourites, we were there to be knocked down.

Barrow showed us how easy it is to be carried away and lose sight of our main aim. That game was Barrow's Wembley and it is interesting to note that they - and many others who have geared up to play Oldham - have steadily deteriorated since.

Wakefield was a real sickener for everyone at the club and that defeat lifted a team that, at the time was very ordinary, to become genuine championship contenders. Wakefield that is. At Featherstone we did everything but get the vital score and the lesson learned was that in the higher levels you don't get chances all that often and when they come along they have to be taken. The defeat the following week could possibly be attributed to a lack of confidence after applying all the pressure, but failing to score the week before.

The wisdom of two fixtures in close succession has to be questioned, but it's the same for both teams and the Yorkshire lads were mentally tougher on the day.

I talk about the upsets because they are very important milestones in our learning process. Winning sometimes hides problems and papers over the cracks. All the same, winning is a good habit and generally speaking that's been the pattern this season. The players deserve recognition for their efforts.

The league programme lasts for 28 games. We are the best because we have been the most consistent over the FULL season. The division has been the toughest ever and more so for Oldham than any other team because of that 'favourites' tag. Wigan have suffered similarly in the First Division.

Today we start our cup campaign again. Two matches away from a big day out at Old Trafford, there is every incentive to perform well today. Oldham folk are already buying their tickets for the final. I'm not sure that Keighley will agree with our fans. Certainly, the message which should be on all our minds as we approach this important game today is "You're only as good as your last performance."

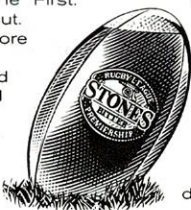
