



The Roughyeds traditionally give us a hard game but also like to play fast open rugby which the fans appreciate.





The only player to have won both the Lance Todd Trophy for the outstanding display at Wembley and the Harry Sunderland Trophy for winning the man of the match award in a championship final

KEVIN MEADOWS (Wing): Experienced wingman who has seen service with St. Helens and Warrington. Joined Oldham, with team mate Steve Peters, at the start of last season and was an ever-present in Oldham's Second Division championship-winning side. Also scored the vital try that gave Oldham the Second Division premiership trophy in that thrilling final against Featherstone at Old Trafford.

NEW RUGBY LEAGUE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

In the biggest constitutional move in the history of the game, a new six-man Board of Directors has been appointed to manage the Rugby Football League affairs. Replacing the previous nine-man Management Committee, the Board is responsible for the day-to-day affairs and policy planning of the 13-a-side code, with the Rugby League Council now meeting once every two months.

Each Director has been allocated specific responsibilities with David Oxley, formerly the Secretary-General of the League, assuming the new title of Chief Executive with voting powers for the first time. Mr.Ashby, who has just completed his year's service as Chairman of the Rugby Football League, has been appointed Chairman of the Board for three years.
