In the past few seasons matches between Oldham and Featherstone Rovers have been close, exciting and entertaining, but never so much as last year when we played three matches, the total points difference for the matches was only 5; one match drawn and one win by either side. You cannot get anything much closer than that. Both sides won thousands of new friends for that fantastic battle at Old Trafford, which was supposed to be the curtain-raiser for the first division final, but I am afraid that match came a poor second to "our" match.

Regarding overseas players the two clubs seem to have much the same idea. We had talks with Ashley Gilbert and believed that he was our player for the season but Ashley changed his mind and decided to join the men from Oldham.

MICK BURKE (full back). Won almost every honour in the game with Widnes and joined Oldham in a £40,000 deal in January last year. The only player to have won both the Lance Todd Trophy for the outstanding display at Wembley and the Harry Sunderland Trophy for winning the man-of-the-match award in a championship final.

KEVIN MEADOWS (wing) experienced wingman who has seen service with St. Helens and Warrington. Joined Oldham with team-mate Steve Peters, at the start of last season and was an ever-present in Oldham's Second Division championship-winning side. Also scored the vital try that gave Oldham the Second Division premiership trophy in that thrilling final against Featherstone at Old Trafford.

RICHARD IRVINE (wing) snapped up by Oldham from amateur rugby in Huddersfield. Richard won both Yorkshire and Great Britain amateur honours in youth football and Oldham expect big things of him as he gains in experience.

DES FOY (centre) one of five Oldham players who toured Down Under in 1984 and the younger brother of former Wigan player, Martin Foy. Des won stacks of honours in schoolboy rugby and signed for Widnes before transferring to Oldham in a deal that took Brian Hogan back to Naughton Park. Pacy and penetrative, he played in the first Test against Australia in Sydney on the '84 tour.

CHARLIE McALISTER (centre) hit the headlines last season when he turned pro for Oldham after having a 'secret' trial. His name leaked out, the RU banned him, and the former All Blacks trialist took the pro ticket. A big favourite with the Oldham fans, Charlie has spent the summer playing for Newcastle Knights in the Sydney League.

CHRIS O'SULLIVAN (stand off) an Aussie from Canberrs Raiders, Chris will fill the Oldham stand-off job this season. One of the most experienced half-backs in the Sydney league. MIKE FORD (scrum-half) Spent several good seasons at Central Park and played in that magnificent Wembley final against Hull alongside Brett Kenny. Moved on to Leigh, finally joined Oldham early this year and toured down-under this summer with Britain.

ANDY RUANE (hooker) a new signing from Rochdale, Andy made his name with home-

town Widnes. Joined Rochdale for £15,000 at the start of last season. Transferred to Oldham recently for £8,000 plus utility back Chris Myler.

HUGH WATTELL (prop) what an impact Hugh made on the GB tour! Got his big chance in the third Test at Sydney Sports Ground and had a blinder in Britain's shock victory. A £15,000 buy from the old Blackpool Borough club in January last year. Hugh is currently on the list at £90,000.

PAUL ROUND (second row) joined Oldham at the start of last season. Tribunal fixed a £60,000 fee. Fast and long-striding, Paul is a player of great potential, as he displayed recently by scoring 6 tries as Oldham reached the final of the Central Park sevens.

COLIN HAWKYARD (second-row) a real stalwart of the Oldham pack, Colin a workhorse from Huddersfield. Due to enjoy a benefit next year he has given terrific service over the years after joining Oldham from junior rugby in the Huddersfield area.

ASHLEY GILBERT (second-row) another Aussie from Canberra Ashley will be travelling with O'Sullivan and his arrival will depend upon how the Raiders fare in the Sydney play-off. A player with a good try-scoring record Gilbert was in fact the leading forward try scorer in the Sydney League a fortnight ago.

LEO CASEY (prop or second-row) local lad who won the BARLA youth player of the year award some years ago. A hard worker and sound tackler. Leo will be out to break into the senior pack this term.

Four Leeds tries in the last 16 minutes shattered Featherstone Rovers hopes of an upset on the opening day of the new Stones Bitter championship campaign at Post Office Road yesterday.

Newly-promoted Featherstone fully deserved their 18-12 lead going into the closing stages but could not match Leeds' pace and devastating finishing power. Great Britain Test centre Garry Schofield gave an inspiring performance at stand-off scoring one try and producing the final pass to all but one of the five other Leeds tries.

In a classic stand-off duel Graham Steadman also stood out for Featherstone to take their man of the match award. Although Steadman was not as involved as much as Schofield he scored a brilliant solo try.

Pontefract & Castleford Express – 1/9/88 Featherstone sunk by four-try blast Featherstone 18 Leeds 32

Feathersteone's hopes of a winning start on their return to the 1st Div. were shattered by a late Leeds scoring burst. It looked as though Rovers were heading for victory when they led 18-12 with only 16 minutes remaining but it all went disastrously wrong after

that. Four tries in a 13-minute spell saw Leeds run away with things in the closing stages, leaving Rovers to ponder on how they managed to lose a match they could — and should — have won. There was little doubt Featherstone were the better side for much of the game. They buckled down in defence and showed plenty of enterprise in attack. PETER HUTTON INTERVIEWS...

ERIC FITZSIMMONS

Eric Fitzsimmons has had a baptism of fire as a first division coach. Oldham lost 40–18 in the first game at Wigan and then had to come up against Leeds, again losing, if only by a close margin.

Fitzsimmons could be forgiven if he was shell shocked after such a start, but he's an intelligent and articulate coach and was quick to point to his side's problems in a Radio Aire interview this week. "We're making too many mistakes, the game is a lot quicker in the first division, particularly under these new rules. The first division means not only greater speed and power, but also greater speed of thought".

"Against Wigan we lost 40—18, but we won the second half 18—6 so we were learning quickly in half a game. Against Leeds we created a lot more than Leeds, but we spoiled a lot more as well. In the second half we were giving the ball away every other possession, which just means you find yourself tackling all the time".

Fitzsimmons was well known as a player, particularly for his prodigious goalkicking but now, as a coach, he finds himself under a lot more pressure. "It's a very different week. As a coach you're working hard every day of the week, trying to get the best out of your players. Then on match day you're powerless, you just have to hope".

"We're coming along the right lines, the arrival of the overseas players will be very important for us, as it will be for all the clubs in what I'd call the survival area. Leeds didn't look that much different to us and we'll catch up pretty quick. We've just got to get a toe hold in the first division.

"Only 1 in 5 sides promoted in the last decade have stayed up, but there are some success stories, look at the way Wigan have developed since being promoted. We know it will be a long and difficult battle.

Oldham are putting their faith in a new share issue but Fitzsimmons is very aware of the support he's had from the Oldham crowd. "Our crowd has treated us very well, which puts the onus on us to play entertaining rugby. Entertainment is not necessarily the order of the day. Our message is to take a little more care with the ball, don't do anything too risky".

Despite Featherstone's magnificent win at Hull Kingston Rovers Fitzsimmons' Oldham will prove a strong test today, and provide a good pointer to how both newly promoted sides will fare in the first division.



Statom Lager Alliance Report

OLDHAM R.L.F.C. - SEASONS 1955-59

During the middle and late fifties, Oldham was one of the teams that dominated Rugby League. Few teams can boast of a record like Oldhams. Championship winners 1956-7, League leaders 1957-58, beaten Finalists 1954-55, Lancashire League winners 1956-57 and 1957-58. Lancashire Cup winners 1956-57, 1957-58, 1958-59 and beaten Finalists 1954-55. During this period of greatness they had such fine players as Bernard Ganley, Ken Jackson, Sid Little, Terry O'Grady, Frank Pitchford, Ike Southward, Derek Turner and Charlie Winslade, all Internationals just to name a few.

From 1956-57 season to 1958-59 they dominated the Lancashire Cup winning it three years running. In 1956-57 season they beat St. Helens by 10 pts to 3, in 1957-58 season they beat Wigan by 13 pts to 8 and in 1958-59 they beat St. Helens by 12 pts to 2.

Their best ever season was in 1956-57 after winning the Lancashire Cup and winning the Lancashire League, they went on to win the Championship beating Leeds in the semi-final by 22 pts. to 12 and beating Hull in a thrilling final at Bradford by the slender margin of 15 pts to 14. In that great Season of 1956-57 they played 38 League matches winning 33, losing just 5. Most app. were as follows: - Etty 36, Jackson 36, Keith 36, Winslade 36, Cracknell 35, Ayres 33, Ganley 33, Little 33, Pitchford 33, Turner 33, Davies 29, Stirrup 27 (who was also Captain) Vines 25. Top Try Scorers were Etty with 34, Ayres 24, Cracknell 23, Pitchford 15 and Turner 14. Goals were kicked by Ganley with 161.


The Season after 1957-58 they finished as League Leaders. Being only one of a few teams to remain unbeaten at home in the League (played 19 won 19), but in the Championship Semi Finals they were beaten at home to a very strong Hull side by 20 pts. to 8.

In Season 1958-59 they once again finished in the top four only this time loosing in the Championship Semi-Finals to the eventual winners St. Helens by 42 pts to 4.

Only one honour that Oldham have not achieved is playing in a Challenge Cup Final at Wembley. Although they have won the Cup on three occasions in 1899, 1925 and 1927, they have never played at Wembley. But who know's this may be the year - let us hope it is the Rovers they meet in the Final. But one thing is for sure - Oldham in the 1950's were a great time with some great players.

P.S. Just for the record - Oldham also got to the Championship Final in Season 1954-55 only to lose by 7 pts to 3 by Warrington. OLDHAM WHAT A TEAM.






