OUR VISITORS

Today we welcome Oldham for a real relegation zone battle, Oldham are in 11th position, and have already defeated us comprehensively at The Watersheddings, so today's encounter is vital to both clubs as each tries to claw its way from the bottom of the table.

In the summer of '87 Oldham had been relegated, before an almost completely new regime was set up. Only one previous Director remained, and a completely new coaching team was former Hunslet and Oldham goalkicking winger **Eric Fitzsimmons**, assisted by **lain MacCorquodale** and Aussie forward **Mal Graham**, formerly with Hunslet and Bradford, though the latter elected to stay in his native Newcastle this season despite his 16 tries for Oldham last term.

The revitalised Oldham side won the Second Division Championship, losing only four of 28 matches to finish three points clear of second placed Featherstone. They then made it the double by winning the Premiership Final last May in a thrilling 28 - 26 defeat of Featherstone, after leading 22 - 0 at one stage, then trailing 26 - 22 as the "Colliers" staged an incredible recovery, before Kevin Meadows clinched it with a late converted try.

Oldham strengthened the side, signing former Widnes and Rochdale Hornets hooker **Andy Ruane** and Leigh centre **John Henderson**. They also imported a trio of Australians, Canberra's highly rated duo of **Ashley Gilbert** and **Chris O'Sullivan**, along with Parramatta's utility man **Paul Taylor** for his second spell at Watersheddings. Regrettably Taylor suffered a serious injury and has had to return to Sydney early. The club also agreed to an early season exchange deal with £90,000 rated Great Britain tourist prop **Hugh Waddell** joining Leeds and prop **John Fairbank** valued at £50,000 and a cash adjustment moving in the opposite direction.

Then in mid November Oldham sacked **Eric Fitzsimmons** and **lain MacCorquodale** and within a few days appointed **Tony Barrow**, who had sensationally quit as Warrington coach the previous evening. He immediately went searching for new players, coming up with full back **Duncan Platt** a member of Widnes 1988 Championship winning squad, and Castleford Under 24 international centre **Gary Hyde**.

Mick Burke: Full Back: Former Great Britain and Widnes full-back, touring Down Under with the 1984 Lions and totalling 15 caps at full test level. Has five Lancashire caps and five at Under 24 international level. Broke the Widnes goals (140) and points (316) records in his debut 1978-79 season and, after struggling following his January 1987 move to Oldham, returned to his best attacking form last term, recording 7 tries in 30 appearances. One of only four players to have won both the Lance Todd Trophy and the Harry Sunderland Award.

Duncan Platt: Full Back: Signed recently from Widnes for £35,000. Kicked two goals and on his debut to insure a 12 - 0 win at Halifax to end a six-match spell without a victory. Played 16 games and scored 80 points as Widnes won their First Division title last season, and also played in the Premiership Final. Brother of international forward Andy of Wigan.

Richard Irving: Wing: Signed for Oldham in August 1987 from Moldgreen ARLFC and impressed coach Eric Fitzsimons with his strong-running displays, scoring tries against Keighley and Rochdale. This term he scored on the opening day visit to Wigan.

Paul Lord: Wing or off half: A Wakefield boy and younger brother of Gary Lord, the Leeds and former Castleford utility back, he is a strong finisher with lots of pace.



John Henderson: Centre: Recently signed from the Leigh Club, this prolific try-scorer should add firepower to the Oldham back division. A try scorer against Castleford, St. Helens, Warrington and Halifax. Was sorely missed by Leigh for much of last season. Scored 31 tries in 1985-86 and another 27 in 1986-87 for Leigh and gained selection for Lancashire, scoring a try in a 22-22 draw with Papua New Guinea in 1987. Guested for Sydney Wests in 1985.

Mark Lord: Centre: An Oldham boy and a member of the 1983 B.A.R.L.A. Tour. He later Signed for Leeds after Maurice Bamford, then the Headingley club's coach spotted him playing a star role in an Amateur final in Oldham. He has now joined Oldham on a month's trial loan period.

Gary Hyde: Centre: Another of Tony Barrow's recent signings from Castleford. Gained two Under 24 international caps in 1980 and 1982 and also appeared for Yorkshire in 1985, scoring a try against Lancashire. Scored 8 tries in 22 appearances for Castleford last season and is also a recognised goalkicker.

Des Foy: Centre: Joined Widnes straight from schools international football, before returning to hometown Oldham. Very pacy centre/stand-off touring Down Under on the 1984 Lions tour and appearing in the No. 6 shirt in the First Test. Scored 16 tries in 38 appearances last season, including two in the Premiership Final defeat of Featherstone, when he was named Man of the Match, and a hat-trick against Rochdale. Agreed to join Newcastle Knights in Sydney for 1989, and may be missing this afternoon.

Keith Atkinson: Wing: A product of Oldham Colts football, signing professional forms for the club in August 1984. Scored a total of 148 points in last season's Second Division Championship campaign, from 6 tries and 62 goals. A versatile back with pace and ability, but has suffered his share of ill luck down the years.

Charlie McAlister: Wing: A sensational capture from Bradford & Bingley RUFC in February 1988, scoring 9 tries and 15 goals in 18 appearances. Had a summer spell in Australia with the Newcastle Knights, improving his defensive abilities. Kicked four goals in last season's Premiership Final. Can play centre, wing or stand-off. New Zealander with great strength and pace. Recently returned from injury.

Kevin Meadows: Wing: One of the First Division's most underrated wingers, having previously played for St. Helens and Warrington. Scored 16 tries in 38 appearances last season. In nis second spell at Oldham where he once scored 5 tries in a Frist Division match against Salford in 1984. Very fast and elusive.

Steve Robinson: Wing: Local signing from Saddleworth Rangers amateur club, who has won Yorkshire amateur honours.

Chris O'Sullivan: Comes to Watersheddings with a big reputation as stand-off for the Canberra Raiders club in Sydney. Gained representative honours for Country in Place of Origin football and is a great controller of play - a fine organiser, kicker and midfield general. Try scorer in the Lancashire Cup rout of Workington, he scored Canberra's only try in the 1987 Grand Final v Manly. Recently made skipper of Oldham.

Mike Ford: Scrum half: Local lad who went on the '83 B.A.R.L.A. Tour, but subsequently signed for Wigan. He played for them at Wembley against Hull alongside the famed Brett Kenny, and eventually moved on to Leigh from where Oldham signed him in a £65,000 deal a year ago.

lan Bates: Scrum half: Nephew of former Dewsbury and Great Britain half-back Alan Bates. Impressed in Alliance football to get his chance in first team football, but Oldham will nurse him along steadily. Signed from Gate Inn ARLFC in September 1987.

lan Sherratt: Prop: Former Bradford Northern prop joining Oldham in April 1987, as part of a deal which took Great Britain forward David Hobbs to Odsal. Has enjoyed two successful spells in Australian country football. Scored two tries in 12 appearances for Oldham last season and has been drafted into the side following the transfer of tour man Hugh Waddell to Leeds.

Neil Clawson: Prop: Son of much-travelled former Rovers and Great Britain prop forward Terry, Neil is another front-rower with lots of ability. Joined Oldham from Featherstone in May 1986 and scored 2 tries in 26 appearances last season.

Andy Ruane: Hooker: Former Widnes and Rochdale hooker, signed for Oldham by Eric Fitzsimons, his former coach of the Hornets. A great worker in the loose, with goalkicking skills, he scored 12 tries, 15 goals and 2 drop goals for Hornets last season. Has already made his presence felt at Watersheddings, claiming the No. 9 jersey and kicking his first goals against Workington Town in the Lancashire Cup tie.

lan Sanderson: Hooker: Signed from Fireways ARLFC in September 1983, this is another promising hooker, who scored 4 tries in 27 appearances last season. Voted one of the best up and coming players in the country a few seasons ago.

Leo Casey: Prop: Recruited from St. Annes ARLFC in April 1985, this hard grafting forward scored 3 tries in 8 appearances for the club last season. Was a try scorer at Featherstone in September.

John Fairbank: Prop: Former BARLA international forward signed by Leeds last November from Elland ARLFC. One of five League-playing brothers and son of former Leeds and Huddersfield forward Jack. Played 19 games in his debut season for Leeds, but was surprisingly allowed to leave Headingley in August, in the exchange deal which took test prop Hugh Waddell to Leeds. Strong, forceful 21 year old whose best is yet to come.

Paul Round: Second row: Signed for £65,000 from St. Helens in August 1987, instantly repaying Oldham with 16 tries in 26 appearances and gaining inclusion in the Lancashire teams which opposed Yorkshire (scoring a try) and Papua New Guinea in 1987, Originally a back-row forward who has played on the wing and at full-back this season.

Ashley Gilbert: Second row: Arrived with Colleague Chris O'Sullivan from the Canberra Club and with a reputation as a hard-working forward. Sought by a host of English clubs, he opted to join the Roughyeds. Scored tries against Workington and Castleford.

Colin Hawkyard: Second row: Unsung workhorse of the Roughyeds pack, a frequent scorer and a tireless defensive player. 3tries in 27 appearances last term. Played for Oldham in the 1986 Lancashire Cup Final against Wigan. Had a 3-match loan spell at Huddersfield in 1981-82.

Keith Newton: Second row: Most recent of Oldham's captures, being signed only a couple of weeks ago from Widnes. Made 55 senior appearances for the Chemics. It is expected that the Tribunal will fix the fee.

Terry Flanagan: Loose forward or hooker: Long serving forward currently enjoying a benefit season at Watersheddings. Has played for Great Britain on four occasions and toured Down Under in 1984. 5 Under 24 caps, plus three Lancashire caps gained in 1980-82, Good ball distributor and a real 100% trier. One of only three survivors from the 1986 Lancashire Cup Final team.



DEEP IN RELEGATION TROUBLE

It would be foolish to pretend other than that recent results have left us deep in trouble. After our first away league win of the season at Wakefield, we were optimistic that we might be poised to achieve more success. Unhappily this so far has not proved to be the case, although the close proximity of half the clubs in the division means that if we could string two or three wins together we might pull ourselves out of the relegation zone.

We started with a visit to Wheldon Road. Although this is a ground we often do well on, we were under no delusions for "classy Cas" were undefeated league leaders. Hull F.C. coach Brian Smith was able to take the opportunity to watch that game, and lay his plans accordingly from what he saw, for the "Airlie Birds" were our first visitors of 1989. Barring Challenge Cupties, this was the last "local derby" to be played on Craven Park. Regrettably we were not able to sign off from Holderness Road with a win over the old enemy, and this defeat came as a real blow.

Again first points to Rovers, when Dave Harrison caught the Hull defence napping, to dodge his way over under the woodwork. Unfortunately the easiest of goal kicks was missed, and the visitors responded quickly with a couple of opportunist tries, both converted, to leave us in real trouble. It was right on halftime when one of our frequent raids brought success with a six pointer, the only try of the afternoon resulting from a combined passing move and scored by our leading try scorer **Chris Close** whose all action display earned him the man-of-the-match award.

It left us only two points in arrears at the break, and early in the second half a penalty goal saw scores level, but any hopes that we could now seize the advantage just trailed away. A drop goal and a controversial penalty edged the visitors in front, and despite an abundance of possession - we won the scrums three to one - and surging inside the visitor's 25 for long periods, we failed to register any further points.

The margin of our defeat, therefore, was narrow, but the two league points lost were very expensive.

The game marked a very satisfactory debut for recent signing **Jim Irvine** at left centre, who might have earned greater rewards than a penalty when he kicked ahead and looked likely to gain the touch before being "taken out".

The visit to Warrington followed, and it is difficult to be constructive about our performance here. Warrington were only just above us in the first division table and had lost their previous five games. "On paper" therefore an even game could have been on the cards with a real chance to improve our position.

Instead the two clubs looked divisions apart. Our defence was paper thin and the home side were able to run through with ease. Eleven tries tells its own sad story. At threequarter time Warrington eased up, but the 18 points we added to our score, were no more than consolation to add a little more respectability.

He took charge of 48 finals and internationals, including games in Australia, New Zealand and France, and was named Referee of the Year on a record four occasions in the 12 year history of the award.



SUPPORTERS' CLUB NOTES

Although our efforts to sign some leading players from First Division clubs and some top names from Rugby Union were not successful, we are pleased to report the signings of two young players from Second Division sides who we consider have plenty of potential for the future. In each case the fee was £25,000.

First signing on 29th December was that of Carlisle prop forward **Colin Armstrong**. Signed from Broughton Red Rose amateurs in the summer of 1984, he developed into a forward in the traditional Cumbrian mould and has been a member of the County squad. At present he lives in Workington and his transfer formalities were completed in Penrith, but he is moving to Humberside shortly. In the meantime he is the game's longest distance commuter. 24 years of age, he is 6ft. 3ins. and 16 stone.

We signed the second new player, with the transfer late on New Year's Eve of Hunslet centre **Jim Irvine**. A Leeds born player who turned professional from Bisons Sports early in 1986-87, he is a former Great Britain Colts International and has shown his versatility by playing on the wing and in both half back positions for Hunslet. He is 22, 5ft. 11 ins. and 13 stone.

Then on 7th January, when we learned that Featherstone were prepared to let him go, we moved quickly to sign **Paul Lyman**. He was valued at £90,000, before a player exchange deal meant we were to pay £55,000. A schoolboy international, he joined Featherstone in May 1982 from Travellers Saint Juniors. As a 17 year old he was a substitute in Featherstone's Wembley Cup winning side. In season 1985-86 he went on to earn Great Britain Under 21 honours, and played for the Yorkshire side which defeated New Zealand at Odsal. He was also in the Great Britain squad for the first two Tests against the 1986 Australians without getting a game. He is 23, 6ft. and 15st. 7lbs.

The deal with Featherstone saw **Chris Burton** move to Post Office Road. We thank Chris for his wholehearted displays for Rovers, and wish him success with the "Colliers". Signed in February 1981, in addition togaining Test match honours, including the '87 Tour, he has made 208 appearances for Rovers, plus a further 25 substitute appearances, scoring 24 tries (85 points).

(Played 17th December, 1988)




