



do well as, indeed, I think Gary Hyde will surpass expectations in his new role of loose-


I don't expect miracles overnight from Gary, but I think he is tailor-made for the loose-forward berth and I have a hunch he will make a lot of people sit up and take note.

OLDHAM'S FUTURE A message to all from director Greg Pache

IT is not very often that I speak publicly, or in the programme, but I wish to bring to the attention of supporters the importance of our share issue which was launched on Thursday and remains open until February 27th.

As you are probably aware, we have been a members' club since 1876 and we have never been able to compete at top level consistently. Even the little success we have had was more than 30 years ago or as far back as the 1920s.

Being a members club has always hindered progress and limited financial support. For the first time, we can now convert to a limited company but when this was set in motion by the previous committee only £15,000 was raised by members. As it was for a closed company we could never have gained enough funds to keep Oldham Rugby afloat.

The alternative, therefore, was to look at other ideas to create a strong financial basis for success, hence the creation of the **PUBLIC LIMITED COMPANY.**

This gives an opportunity for everyone, not just members, to become a share holder of the club. i.e. companies, individuals, institutions, amateur club etc, both in the Oldham area and throughout Great Britain.

Putting figures into perspective, the market we are now entitled to pursue is enormous. As an example, our average home support totals about 4,000 and if each one of those 4,000 contributes, say, £100, we would be nearly half way to our target. That in itself would guarantee the survival of the club. Make no bones about it. If you want

to continue to see rugby played in Oldham BUY SHARES.

It is no use saying: 'It'll be reet. Somebody else can put it in. I'm giving nowt. They'll only waste it. The club'll still be ere'.

WRONG. Think again. Be patient. Success takes time. You may say £100 is a lot of money. I'm saying, 'Yes, it is.' However, spread shares around the family and relatives. Ask your bosses to help. Think of every conceivable way in which you could introduce a shareholder. Mention it at your pub or club. I'm sure that, with effort, each supporter could raise £100 at least.

Don't forget also the Business Expansion Scheme. Contributions over £500 entitle the individual to tax relief, effectively reducing net cost for shares by 25 or 40 per cent.

We know suppporters are not satisfied with results. Neither are we. We not only need money to reduce our deficit, but to be in a position to compete for the better class of players.

We have not become directors for the benefit of ourselves. On the contrary, we are here for the benefit of Oldham RLFC, a club which everyone should be proud of and which should be among the elite of the game.

Help us to save Oldham. Help us to make the club great. **BUY SHARES**, and now is the time to do it.

A LOOK AT NORTHERN

KEITH MUMBY: Full back 5'9", 13st 8lbs. One of the game's most consistent and loyal players, who has been at Odsal for 15 seasons since joining them as a 16 year old, yet is still widely regarded as one of the best full backs in England. Club records include most matches in a career, most goals and most points scored. Honours include England, Great Britain under 24's and Tours in 1974 and 1979. Club Player of the Year on seven occasions.

STEVE McGOWAN: Centre. 6'3", 13st. Signed from Leeds Colts. Has had great games in previous seasons, but was out many months with a bad leg injury. Standing at 6'3" he is reminiscent to Eric Ashton in his style.

ERROL JOHNSON: Centre. Signed in mid September from Leeds R.L.F.C. after failing to agree terms with them. An Under 21 international, very strong runner and hard defensive player. Subsequently Leeds valued him at £60,000 and it seems likely that the R.L. Tribunal will have to decide the fee.

GARY MERCER: Centre. 6'1", 13st 12lbs. Virtually unknown in this country until he joined Northern a year ago, when he quickly became noticed, nevertheless he had been prominent on the wing for New Zealand scoring a try when they had defeated Australia in July 1987. Was included in the Kiwis World Cup Final team.

ROGER SIMPSON: Wing. 5'6", 11st. From Mold Green A.R.L., he can also play centre or off half. A former Colts International, he joined Northern on his 17th birthday.

RICHARD FRANCIS: Wing. 5'10", 12st. Signed from Parkside Juniors as a 17 year old. A Great Britain Colts International, and former schoolboy sprint champion, he is the fastest player on Northern's books.

GARY SIDEBOTTOM: Wing. Another youngster from Northern's Junior side. Can play equally at centre or wing. He is a hard strong runner and sound tackler, and was an English Schools representative.

RUSSELL STEWART: Off half. 5'61/2", 12st 12lbs. A junior Kiwi who played for Northern District versus Great Britain during our 1984 Tour. Has also played scrum half and loose forward in his native New Zealand, he returned to action last weekend after spending the summer back home.

PAUL HARKIN: Scrum half. 28. 5′5½″. 11st 3lbs. Joined Northern as a 17 year old from Wakefield Colts and transferred to Rovers in 1978. Earned international honours, appeared in eleven major finals for Rovers and often proved the man for the big occasion, with Man of the Match Awards in the 1984/5 and 1985/6 John Player Finals. Nevertheless he asked for a transfer and after being on the list for a couple of years he rejoined Northern, for the largest fee Rovers have received for a player. Paul continues to be a shrewd organiser and dictator of play.

ANDY ROBINSON: Scrum half. 22. A former Northern ball boy who has graduated through the Colts and 'A' team to become a very valuable member of the first team squad. Was captain of the side for a time five seasons ago when only 19. Lost his place when Terry Holmes and later Harkin was signed, but is hoping to fight his way back to recognition.

HEATH GODFREY: Scrum half. 22. A player who always gives 100 per cent whenever he receives a first team chance as deputy to Harkin. Has also stood in at off half.

BRIAN NOBLE: Hooker. 27. 5'8". 13st 6lbs. Joined Northern straight from school, and graduated through the sides until he won a first team place. In 1984 he was the youngest ever captain of a Great Britain side to tour Australasia, and although he has 11 international caps, eight as captain, for the past four seasons he has been passed over for international selection. An ever present in the side last season, he is currently in his Benefit Year.

KELVIN SKERRETT: Prop. 22. 6', 16st. Nephew of former Hull F.C. and Great Britain forward Trevor Skerrett, he originally joined Hunslet, later moving to Bradford in August 1987, where he has been a first team regular ever since.

DAVID HOBBS: Second row or Prop. 6'1". 15st 7lbs. Joined home town Featherstone where he gained International honours and a Cup winners' medal, Lance Todd Trophy winner in 1983. Had a couple of years at Oldham prior to joining Northern two seasons ago. This strong running forward is also a very useful goalkicker, and was in the League's top ten last season with 83 successes. This season he is already 9 goals clear at the top of the goal kicking chart.

KARL FAIRBANK: Second row. 6'. 15st. B.A.R.L.A's player of the year in 1986. Signed from Elland Amateur Rugby League at the end of 1985/86 season. At 23 years old, he had an outstanding Tour with the Great Britian Amateur side in Australia, and last season went on tour after ending the season as the Club's top try scorer, but did not win a Test place. One of five brothers

he is the son of former Leeds star Jack Fairbank.

HARRY PINNER: Loose forward. Former St. Helens and Widnes star, an ex Great Britian captain and a player of vast experience at all levels of the game. Signed during the summer it was considered his distributive skills would bring the best out of Northern's running forwards. Unfortunately he was stretchered off during last week's game with a suspected severe knee ligament injury.
