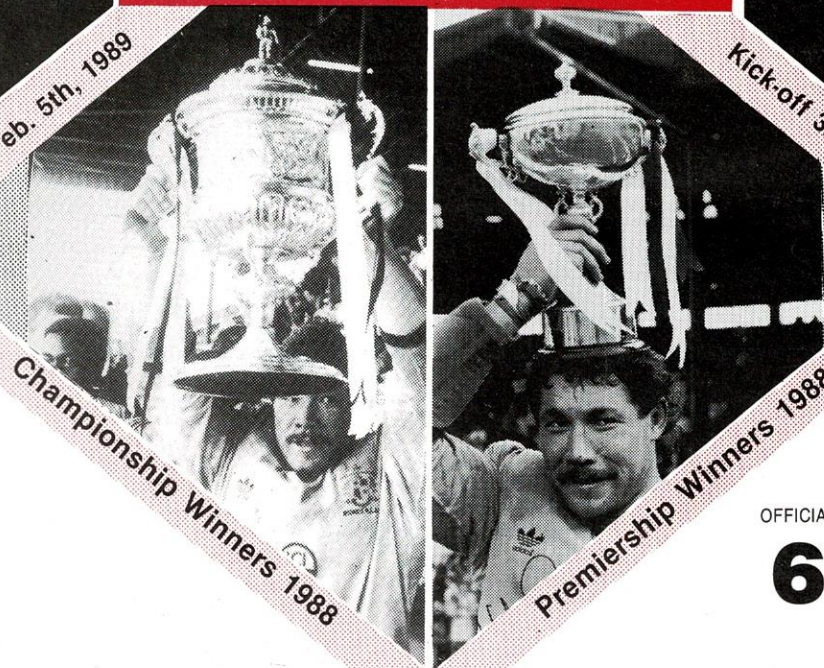

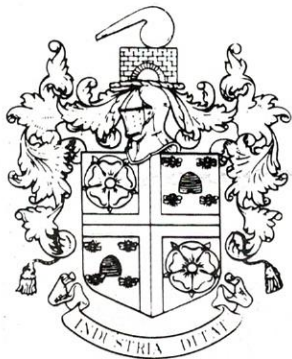

## Our Guests Today

WE welcome the players, officials and supporters of Oldham to Naughton Park this afternoon. Both sides will be putting thoughts of cup glory to one side as they chase important league points. Oldham's need, in terms of survival, are most pressing for after today's game they have only eight league fixtures in which to try and haul themselves to safety. Six of these are at Watersheddings against Castleford, Featherstone, Hull, Wakefield, Widnes and Wigan, while they have still to travel to play Bradford and St Helens. So Oldham's destiny lies very much in their own hands.

Oldham found themselves in the Second Division last season after a disastrous final run in to the 1986-87 campaign. Having looked like achieving a comfortable mid table position Oldham lost their closing six league games and were relegated in fourth from bottom spot after a combination of unlikely results from other teams. Oldham set about regaining their First Division place and came up in style as champions and also achieved a noteworthy Second Division Premiership Final victory over Featherstone in an exciting and dramatic match. The club received some fine support both home and away from spectators who remained steadfastly loyal despite the disappointment of relegation and hopes were high that Oldham would make a real impact this season.

Oldham were expected to be the promoted side most likely to avoid the 'yo yo' syndrome of a quick return to the Second Division, but things have not worked out that way. After just one win in their opening 10 league games Oldham were facing an almighty

struggle to stay in the First Division. New coach Tony Barrow inspired his charges to exciting wins at Halifax and at home to Warrington and Salford but defeats in each of their last three league games have once again raised anxieties.

Having made the ambitious step of launching a public limited company, the last thing Oldham want is relegation. Efforts have been made in recent weeks to strengthen the playing staff but time is often needed to gel things together and time is one thing not on Oldham's side.

The First Division is so competitive that a couple of league defeats can have an enormous bearing on league placings. Oldham will be regretting agonisingly close defeats at home to Leeds, St Helens and Halifax and away at Featherstone, Castleford Warrington and Hull. Seven games, all lost, in which the losing margin was by six points or less and what a difference 14 points would make to Oldham's position.

Oldham have a good record on this ground in recent seasons and will come here fired up and giving everything. Any complacency will be punished and a close and exciting game is in prospect. Enjoy the game!

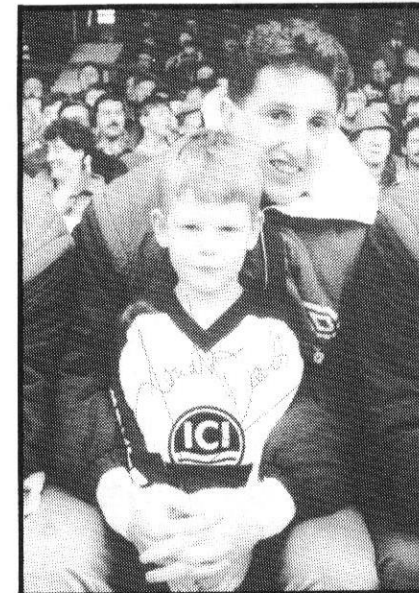

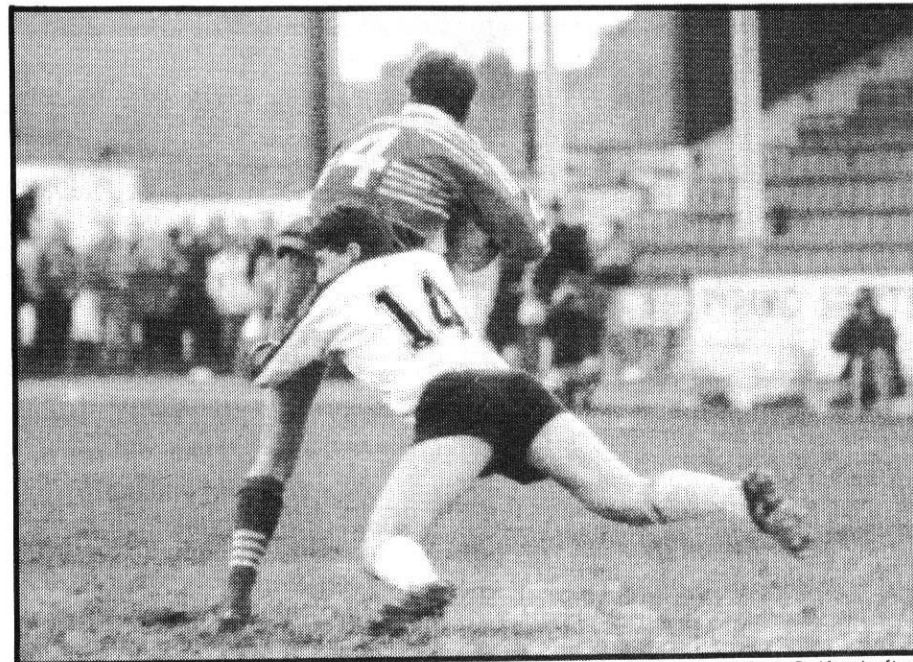

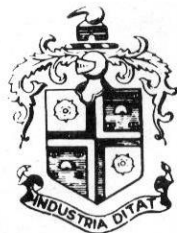

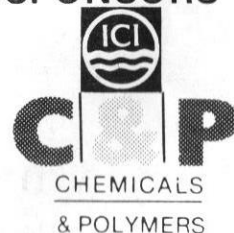
Last Sunday we played Salford again, this time in the Challenge Cup and at the Willows. Everyone predicted a completely different game and they were right. Salford tackled much better

## What was happening . . .

### One Year Ago — February 7, 1988

Martin Offiah scored a hat-trick in Widnes' 26-4 home win over Bradford Northern. There were tries too for Paul Hulme and John Myler and the latter added three goals. Oldham bounced back after two defeats with a hard earned 16-8 win at Workington. Clawson, Round and Foy scored the visitors tries.

### Two Years Ago — February 8, 1987

A meagre crowd of 3,101 saw Widnes edge home 13-12 against Salford at Naughton Park. Darren Wright and Mike O'Neill scored the Chemics tries and John Myler kicked two goals and a decisive drop goal. Oldham had no game and were still basking in the glory of a dramatic midweek cup win over Wigan. Paddy Kirwan's late match winning try earned Oldham a second round home tie with St Helens. The crowd at Watersheddings was 11,906 as Oldham beat Wigan 10-8.

### Three Years Ago — February 2, 1986

Widnes crashed 6-22 at Salford after a fine run of five successive wins. Darren Wright scored Widnes' only try. Oldham were engaged in a tight struggle at Wilderspool and had only two Mick Parrish goals to show for all their efforts as they went down 4-8.

### Four Years Ago — February 3, 1985

Widnes slumped to their fourth successive defeat, 6-24 at home to Leeds. The following Saturday though they bounced back in fine style to win 14-4 at Headingley in a first round Challenge Cup tie. Oldham went down 10-22 at home to Hull, despite tries by Green Vigo and Wally Jones.

### Five Years Ago — February 5, 1984

Widnes emerged victorious from a hard fought Challenge Cup prelim tie at Carlisle with John Basnett scoring two of their four tries in a 20-12 win. Oldham went down 8-20 at Hull, their sixth defeat in their last seven league games. Gary Bishop scored Oldham's only try.

### 10 Years Ago — February 4, 1979

Dave Moran scored two tries in Widnes' 25-9 home win over Featherstone Rovers. Doug Laughton was also on the scoresheet and Mick Burke kicked five goals. Oldham were still waiting to play their first fixture of the year. It was February 28th, when they played host to Ace Amateurs in the cup, before they took the field in 1979 due to the harsh winter weather.

### 20 Years Ago — February 1, 1969

There were two tries each for McDonnell and Nicholls in Widnes' 31-5 win at Doncaster. Whitfield added five goals. Oldham were leading 5-2 in a league game at Leigh when the match was abandoned due to torrential rain which flooded the playing area. As only 22 minutes had been played the match was replayed in March and this time Oldham lost 5-12.

### 50 Years Ago — February 4, 1939

Widnes began their Challenge Cup campaign with a 10-5 first round home win over Dewsbury. Shannon and Topping scored Widnes' tries and the latter tagged on two goals. Oldham were also in cup action, and tries by Rhydderch and Turner helped them to a 10-3 home win over Castleford. Oldham went out in the next round, losing at Bradford Northern. Widnes' Wembley dreams also ended in Yorkshire with a defeat at Leeds.

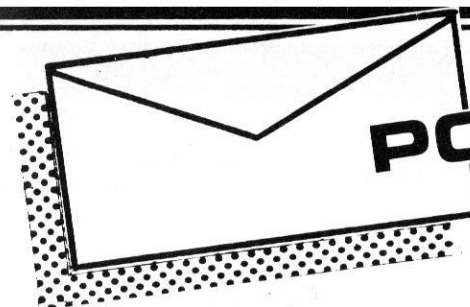

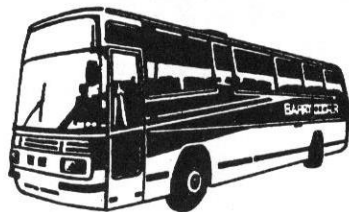

was at its best against a determined side who put the pressure on from the first whistle, but their handling mistakes became their downfall in the end while Widnes snapped up the chances that came their way.

Martin Offiah (who extended his try tally to 34), Alan Tait and Andy Currier will be missing from the home line-up this afternoon as they will be on duty in France against the French.

We extend a warm Naughton Park welcome to Tony Barrow and his Oldham team and look forward to an enjoyable game.

Jonathan Davies continues to make progress, drawing another great crowd for his second 'A' team outing. He obliged with five goals and a try, his first touchdown for Widnes. Davies also added the extra interest to the Salford tie at the Willows. He must be the best thing that has happened for the game in this country since last summers great third test victory over the 'Roos in Sydney.

This last week I have had two telephone calls from Baskingstoke and Birmingham inquiring about his progress and requesting photographs of him.

It was sad to hear of the death of former Widnes player Terence (Terry) Gallagher. 'Golly' as he was known to his many friends and football pals, who played for the club during the 1951/52 period, first playing for St Patrick's School before joining the junior and amateur leagues, then signing for the senior club. He made his senior debut at Craven Park against Barrow in the first round second leg of the RL Cup, a promising loose-forward in his day. 'Golly' also played in the centre, turning out against Liverpool City and Warrington.

The sad passing of Martin Cain, a great Widnes fan and supporter of the amateur game in the town came as a great shock to many local fans also, and to former Widnes Wembley hero of the 1930's, Peter Topping, we send best wishes for a quick recovery and hope he will soon be out of hospital.

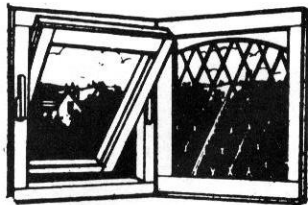
