





## HERE COME HULL

HULL come to Watersheddings today as the form team of the First Division, having won nine consecutive league matches to soar from bottom place last October to a position among the top-four elite.

It is generally recognised that a major influence on this remarkable echievement has been Australian coach Brian Smith, a 34-year-old from Sydney, who came to England at the start of the current season and, after a shaky start, has started to hit the headlines.

Smith was a half-back with South Sydney until a severe knee injury ended his playing career and he turned to coaching, first with the South Sydney under-23 side and then the club's Reserve grade team, taking both to the premiership finals.

It was during his spell with the under-23s that he first came into contact with a young unknown by the name of Craig Coleman — a player who was to play a significant part, some years later, in Hull's surge up the First Division table.

Moving on from South Sydney, Smith spent four seasons with the Illawarra club before taking a year off and then flying across the world to join Hull thanks to the 'pull' of the club's honorary secretary Mike Stanley.

He had met Smith when Brian was in England as coach of the James Cook High School team some years earlier and he felt he was the man to restore good fortunes at the Boulevard.

Smith moved in initially on a one-year contract but he has since signed a new deal covering the next two seasons — an offer put to him during a remarkable spell of success since Hull found themselves at the foot of the First Division after a 32-20 defeat at Bradford in early October.

Since then, Hull's only defeat was in the first round of the Silk Cut Challenge Cup when Castleford triumphed at the Boulevard.

In the league, the Airlie Birds have enjoyed nine successive triumphs, including wins at St. Helens, that started the glory run, Leeds, and Wigan where the 35-20 victory was a record high for Hull at Central Park in 94 years.

The sequence also included an 11-8 win over Oldham at the Boulevard just before

Christmas, so we will be anxious today to avenge a defeat that saw Hull score the only try to be conceded by Oldham in a three-match spell.

Since that game, Hull have lost the services of Aussie prop David Boyle of South Sydney, who has had to return home to have a knee operation, so the No. 10 jersey today could well be filled by Steve Crooks in a hard-working pack that does the spade work for half-backs Coleman and Welshman Gary Pearce to do the damage with their accurate field kicking.

Young hooker Lee Jackson, robbed of an under-21 Great Britain appearance by injury, is expected to return to the side today, to be propped by Andy Dannatt and Crooks.

Tim Wilby and Jon Sharp form the second-row with Gary Divorty at loose-forward — not a pack of big-name players, but certainly a hard-working set of forwards whose tackling has been exemplary during the run of success.

Scrum-half Coleman is sharp and incisive on the break and both he and stand-off Pearce kick accurately for touch or for position, always trying to ensure that the game is played in their opponents half of the field.

Pearce is also one of the most accurate goalkickers in the game — a man with a long and reliable kick whose drop goals have also played a significant part in the big revival.

Giving a player like Pearce the scope to field kick and drop goals is a classic case

of playing to one's strengths.

The pack and the halves certainly contain most of Hull's strengths but that is not to say that the back division can be overlooked because it boasts incisive runners in former Salford full back Paul Fletcher and evergreen Kiwi Dane O'Hara on the left-wing — a former Test man who will soon qualify for a benefit on the completion of 300 club or representative games while on Hull's books, nearly 30 of them for Auckland or for the full New Zealand international team.

Aussie David Moon and Brian Blacker, bought from Barrow for £25,000 recently, will fill the centre spots with local lad Adrian Bullock probably filling the right-wing both





### **WATERSHEDDINGS SURVEY**

THERE remains eight days until the subscription list for the share issue closes and there may be many fans who are still undecided about whether to buy a future in the club.

On the playing side, we have re-launched the youth policy and Tony Barrow, with the board's backing, is determined to see it through in the long-term so that we have a


steady supply of young players available every year.

THE Annual General Meeting of the Lifeline Society was held in the social club last Tuesday. These notes had to be presented to the printer before then, but we were able to report that the Society had donated more than £72,000 to Oldham RLFC in the year ended September 30, 1988 — a massive increase on the previous year when less than £22,000 was handed over.

This was a remarkable improvement and a tribute to all our terriffic supporters and Lifeline members, any of whom were due to attend last Tuesday's get-together which not only took the form of an annual meeting but also doubled up as an annual social get-together, including buffet and entertainment.

during the term of the agreement with them that ends at the completion of this season.

will put up a trophy and £200 in cash for Oldham's top try scorer of the season. There will also be a replica trophy for the player to keep.

You can check on page 25 of this programme who is currently in the lead in the club's tryscoring list and who looks to have a chance of challenging for the Trophy before the season is out.

Our thanks to John for putting up this new prize and also thanks to our chief club sponsors, Boddington's, who are organising through this programme, a player-of-the-year and fan-of-the-year competition as well as a player of the month scheme, to be run in conjunction with the Oldham Evening Chronicle.

Boddington's, who sell OB, are also to push our Lifeline and Cashline schemes through their many outlets in the town and surrounding areas and they are keen to involve **YOU**, the supporter, in their League activities, so make a point of buying a programme at home games for the rest of this season to see what Boddington's have to offer


