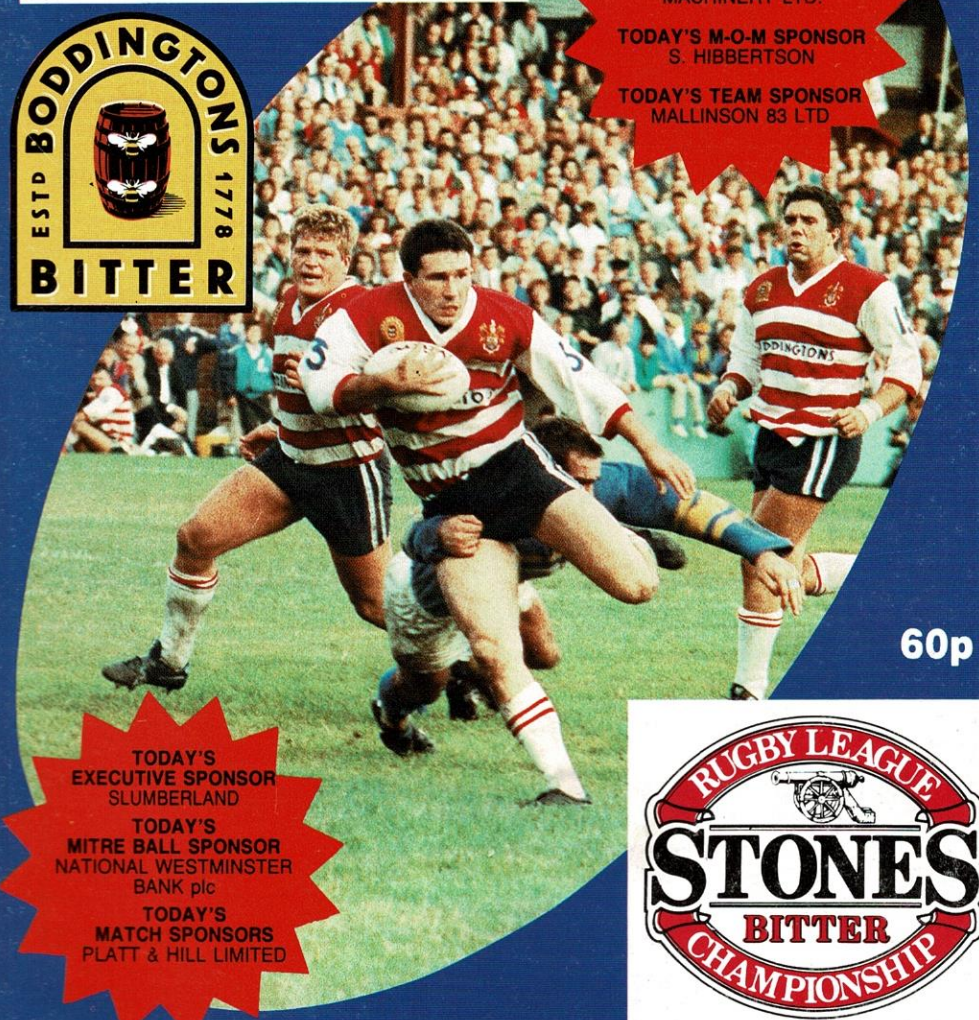
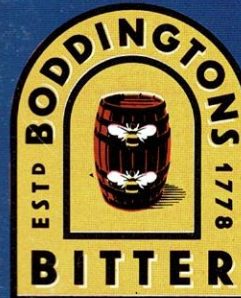

## ON THE BARROW BEAT

(A regular feature with Oldham coach Tony Barrow)



NO praise of mine can be too high for the way the Oldham players got stuck into the task of taking on Wigan last Saturday in the third round of the Silk Cut Challenge Cup.

We made special plans beforehand and the lads stuck to them like glue to give Wigan the biggest fright they are ever likely to get in this year's competition.

In front of the television cameras the Oldham players did everyone proud and, although we lost, I walked off the pitch and up the tunnel with my head held high.

It was a very emotional moment for me because I knew the players had given everything they possibly could in the cause of Oldham Rugby at a very important time for the club's future.

Those lads were ready to die to put Oldham into the semi-final of the cup and although we had injury problems of gigantic proportions the players never once lost their faith and their self-belief.

At 6-4 to Wigan for most of the second half it was anybody's match and had we scored at that stage — and we went close on numerous occasions — there is no doubt in my mind that we would now have been preparing for a semi-final.

After all our problems and anxieties in the week leading up to the tie fate dealt us two more cruel blows during the match.

Paul Round, who had a pre-match injection had to be pulled off at half time. To make matters worse Gary Hyde, who was playing with a knee heavily supported, took a blow

to the upper body in the early stages and had to retire at the interval with a rib cartilage injury.

I seem to have been bedevilled by injuries throughout all my coaching career, but for the players, from me, a personal thank-you and a very big hand to all you did last Saturday. The club, the spectators and the town must have been proud of you all.

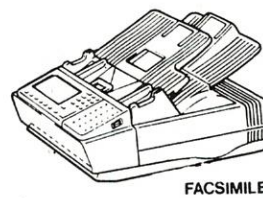
All that, of course, is now water under the bridge and it is important that we build on that cup performance to pick up vital points in the battle to scramble away from the relegation zone.

Today's match against Featherstone is a crucial one and we will be looking for a repeat of our form against Wigan to avenge our early season setback at Post Office Road.

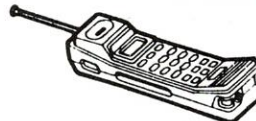

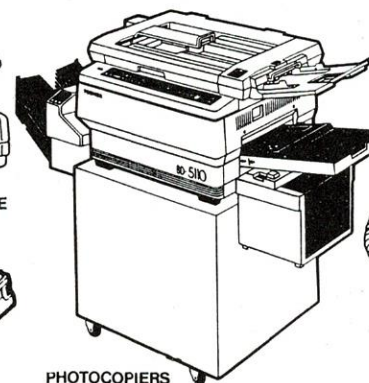

## OLDHAM'S FUTURE

A message to all from director Greg Pache



IT is not very often that I speak publicly, or in the programme, but I wish to bring to the attention of supporters the importance of our share issue which has now been extended for several weeks.

As you are probably aware, we have been a members' club since 1876 and we have never been able to compete at top level consistently. Even the little success we have had was more than 30 years ago or as far back as the 1920s.

Being a members club has always hindered progress and limited financial support. For the first time, we can now convert to a limited company but when this was set in motion by the previous committee only £15,000 was raised by members. As it was for a closed company we could never have gained enough funds to keep Oldham Rugby afloat.

The alternative, therefore, was to look at other ideas to create a strong financial basis for success, hence the creation of the **PUBLIC LIMITED COMPANY**.

This gives an opportunity for everyone, not just members, to become a share holder of the club. i.e. companies, individuals, institutions, amateur club etc, both in the Oldham area and throughout Great Britain.

Putting figures into perspective, the market we are now entitled to pursue is enormous. As an example, our average home support totals about 4,000 and if each one of those 4,000 contributes, say, £100, we would be nearly half way to our target. That in itself would guarantee the survival of the club. Make no bones about it. If you want to continue to see rugby played in Oldham **BUY SHARES**.

It is no use saying: 'It'll be reet. Somebody else can put it in. I'm giving nowt. They'll only waste it. The club'll still be ere.'

**WRONG.** Think again. Be patient. Success takes time. You may say £100 is a lot of money. I'm saying, 'Yes, it is'. However, spread shares around the family and relatives. Ask your bosses to help. Think of every conceivable way in which you could introduce a shareholder. Mention it at your pub or club. I'm sure that, with effort, each supporter could raise £100 at least.

Don't forget also the Business Expansion Scheme. Contributions over £500 entitle the individual to tax relief, effectively reducing net cost for shares by 25 or 40 per cent.

We know supporters are not satisfied with results. Neither are we. We not only need money to reduce our deficit, but to be in a position to compete for the better class of players.

We have not become directors for the benefit of ourselves. On the contrary, we are here for the benefit of Oldham RLFC, a club which everyone should be proud of and which should be among the elite of the game.

Help us to save Oldham. Help us to make the club great. **BUY SHARES, and now is the time to do it.**

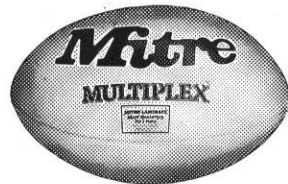

## TRAVELEADS TOP FAN 1989

TRAVELEADS Top Fan, 1989 — Rugby League's official supporter of the year — will witness the historic transatlantic meeting between Warrington and Wigan in Milwaukee in June as part of a £4,000 prize.

The fifth winner of the Traveleads Top-Fan title, and guest, will attend the first-ever all British encounter in America before rounding off the 10-day holiday with a stay in Orlando featuring a visit to Disney World.

Rugby League public affairs executive David Howes said: "The Traveleads Top Fan award is unique in British sport, designed to acknowledge and reward our loyal and knowledgeable supporters, the fastest growing sector of the country's sporting public."

Traveleads chairman David Easthope said: "We know from our most recent experience as official travel agents for last summer's Great Britain tour Down Under, and this year's American venture, that Rugby League fans are dedicated to the 13-a-side code. This inaugural United States trip is a Rugby League follower's dream holiday and we urge all fans to enter or put forward a candidate."

Nomination forms are now available from the Public Relations Department, The Rugby Football League, 180 Chapeltown Road, Leeds LS7 4HT.

Five nominees will be interviewed by the Traveleads Top Fan panel of judges, headed by BBC Television Rugby League commentator Ray French, the winner being announced on Thursday, 30th March.

## 1989 GREENALLS MAN OF STEEL AWARDS

GREAT Britain scrum half Andy Gregory and Leigh's new under-21 cap Tim Street, born and bred in Oldham, are the respective Division One and Division Two leaders in the half-way stage voting in the 1989 Greenalls Man of Steel awards.

Record prizes totalling £8,000 will be presented at the 13th annual Greenalls Man of Steel award ceremony at Salford RLFC on Thursday 11th May, 1989.

The First and Second Division player-of-the-year awards are determined in a twin ballot by players in each division in January and April, with a player's first choice being awarded five points, second placed three points and third placed one point.

In the First Division poll Wigan half back Andy Gregory — voted Greenalls First Division player-of-the-year in 1987 — leads Widnes skipper, Kiwi Kurt Sorensen, and Naughton Park team mate, full back Alan Tait, the former Scottish RU international.

Other leading contenders for the prestigious players' title are Featherstone Rovers' goal kicking stand-off Graham Steadman and Warrington skipper and Great Britain back-row man Mike Gregory.

In the Second Division poll Hilton park prop-forward Street, recruited this season from Wigan for £18,000, is ahead of Sheffield Eagles captain Darryl Powell and Whitehaven's Kiwi import, Dave Watson.

Chasing the pack are Batley's Paul Gearey, York's Dean Williams and Leigh full back Chris Johnson.

The prize for the Player of the Year titles is a new record £750 plus a £200 silver memento, also awarded to the 1989 Greenhalls Coach, Young Player and Referee of the year.

The 1989 Greenalls man of Steel — the personality judged to have made the most impact on the season — will receive a new record prize of £2,000 plus a £250 silver champagne goblet.

## NEW LOOK ABOUT THE ROVERS

THERE is something of a new look about a Featherstone Rovers side that comes to Watersheddings today looking set to occupy a comfortable mid-table place in the Stones Bitter championship at the end of the season.

As we know to our cost from a couple of years ago, nothing can be certain so far as relegation is concerned, but Rovers do look safe at this stage, having won eight of their 17 games prior to the midweek clash with Wigan which came too late for inclusion here.

In contrast, the Oldham club is badly in need of victory today to follow up the success over Hull in the last home league game and pull away from the relegation scramble.

What, then, will Oldham be up against? Well, there are one or two comparatively 'unknown' names in the Featherstone line-up these days and one or two familiar faces missing, notably that of goalkicking centre Steve Quinn, who retired from the game recently after an illustrious career at Post Office Road.

His place in the centre goes to 17-year-old Paul Newlove, who has already represented Great Britain at under-21 level — on the wing — and is regarded as one of the most exciting back division prospects in Rugby League at the present time.

Paul is the son of former Rovers stalwart John Newlove so it can be said that he has Featherstone in his blood.

In the third-round Challenge Cup tie at St. Helens last Sunday, Newlove formed an all-local back division with Ian Smales, Alan Banks and Danny Beach — a young winger who has worked his way up from the Travellers' amateur side, via the 'A' team, to senior recognition.

Full back Chris Bibb needs no introduction, of course — one of the fastest and most reliable full backs in the game — while much of the Featherstone scheming comes from former Great Britain scrum-half Deryck Fox and much of the scoring from his pacy stand-off partner Graham Steadman.

Fox and Steadman are one of the most dangerous half-back pairings in the game, operating behind a set of forwards that coach Peter Fox has drilled into a workmanlike set and always take a lot of holding.

Last week's pack line-up was thus: Jeff Grayson, Trevor Clark, Glen Bell, Carl Harrison, Chris Burton, Peter Smith, with Paul Hughes the forward sub.

Grayson — 40 next month and a grandfather — is the oldest player in the game. When he left Leeds last summer, he was wanted here at Oldham but in the end he chose to renew his old comradeship with Peter Fox and he has played a major part in Featherstone's bid to establish themselves this season in the higher division.

Says Jeff: "We lost a lot of games early in the season because it took time for us to adjust to the First Division. We were scoring 20 points and losing because we still had a Second Division attitude. We are looking a better side now and the signing of Chris Burton has stiffened the pack."

Much the same, of course, could be said of Oldham and a real First Division battle is in prospect so long as both clubs are not affected too much by their respective mid-week battles against St. Helens and Wigan.

It seems strange to see overseas imports in the Rovers pack, but there are two Kiwis in hooker Trevor Clark and prop Glen Bell, while the recently-signed Chris Burton gives the Colliers forward formation a vastly-different look to that of previous clashes with Oldham, in the past few seasons.

Outside the pack, Oldham will have to watch scrum-half Fox closely, while there is plenty of pace, as supplied by Bibb, Steadman and young Newlove, to test the best of defences.

Steadman has often been a thorn in Oldham's side in the past and he now has an ally in teenager Newlove, who was capped for Great Britain under-21s in his first season and, in his first 18 matches in the senior side, scored 13 tries.

**Alison Walker**, 10 today, of 2 Low Farm, Great Preston, Nr. Leeds, is the Featherstone mascot for today's match. **Happy birthday Alison.**

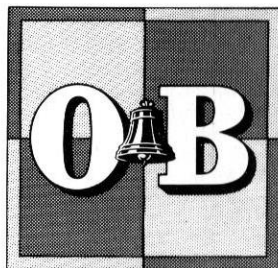
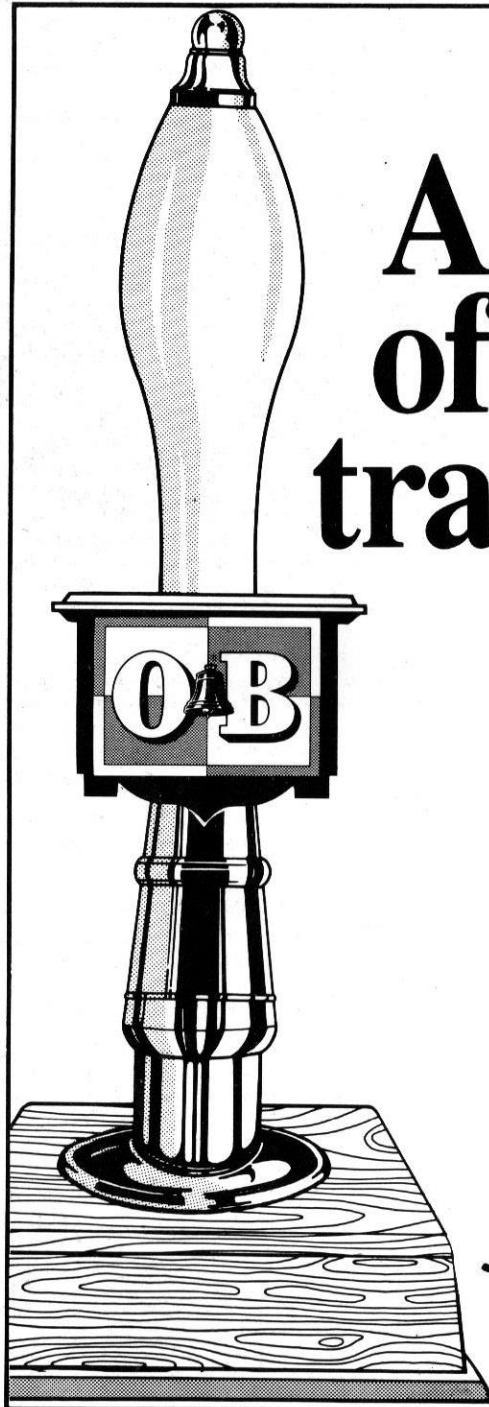

## WATERSHEDDINGS SURVEY

THE fans have responded superbly in the past three weeks to our share issue appeal and the directors wish to take this opportunity to thank everyone who has contributed to a total which passed the £100,000 minimum in time for us to extend the selling deadline for another few weeks.

In the space of a fortnight, after our second-round Challenge Cup win at Sheffield, we took more than £75,000 to top the minimum required to launch the PLC and, in the end, there was no need for Harvey Ashworth, the chairman, to make up any deficiency, as he had promised to about 500 fans at a public crisis meeting in the Civic Centre.

That meeting, in the Queen Elizabeth Hall, encouraged us enormously, because there was a good turn-up of interested spectators and Eddie Hemmings and his BBC-2 camera team also came along to give us a good feature on the following Friday evening's 'Sportsround' programme which compensated somewhat for the disappointing presentation of our share issue a fortnight earlier.

Once we had put the fans firmly in the picture about the very real threat of closure if the PLC plans had to be aborted we felt the townspeople were in a supportive mood and so it proved as the money began to come in.

We took more than £6,000 on the night at the Civic Centre and more was received at the club and at the stockbrokers, Bell Houldsworth Fairmount, as the total rose towards the £100,000 target.

As the money came in there were several interesting tit-bits to report, such as the £100 subscription from local amateur club British Aerospace, who took the opportunity of urging other amateur clubs in the town to do the same.

The Higginshaw club, through an editorial in its match programme, also urged the public to back the town's professional Rugby League body — further evidence of the growing relationship between Watersheddings and the local amateurs.

It was reported in the Oldham Chronicle that a group of fans at Torman's fabrication works in Booth Hill Lane, Oldham, had a whip-round to raise £140 for shares and one of them, Paul Saxon, said: "We've lost too many local institutions already. Oldham Rugby must not die. A lot of money will be raised if other workers in the town do the same."

At the public meeting, former official Keith Broadbent said his 85-year-old aunt — a pensioner — had bought 25 shares to help the club and suggested this was the spirit that was needed to help the club out of its plight.

There was a lovely little touch from Hathershaw School where kids bought 50 shares with proceeds from their tuck shop. The profits from this source always go to sporting projects of one kind or another and teachers Tom Hill and Nigel Marland felt the £50 subscription would be a thank-you for what the

club has provided for local children, directly and indirectly, over the years.

Radio Cavell donated £25 and our former wing star Ike Southward travelled all the way from Cumbria to watch the Wigan match and buy 50 shares for old time's sake.

Another star of the past, former Wigan and Great Britain full back Martin Ryan, promised to buy 100 shares.

In our last programme, of course, we reported that a Rochdale lady had sent us £100 in memory of her late husband — an Oldham fan for most of his life — after hearing the appeal on GMR.

All these are touching little stories which show that the spirit is certainly right and that Oldham Rugby will live on — thanks to the public's generosity and the backing of the directors, sponsors and fans.

We want to thank you all, at the same time pointing out that we still have a long way to go and a lot of ground to cover over the next few weeks before the subscription list finally closes.

We have on offer a total of 750,000 £1 shares, so we have plenty of selling to do yet and we aim to get around the town's businesses and firms to complete a vigorous marketing job in the time available.

If you, as an individual, can help, please do so. Several fund-raising ideas have emerged over the past few weeks from interested supporters and you can, of course, buy shares as a syndicate — a method already taken up by a lot of people.

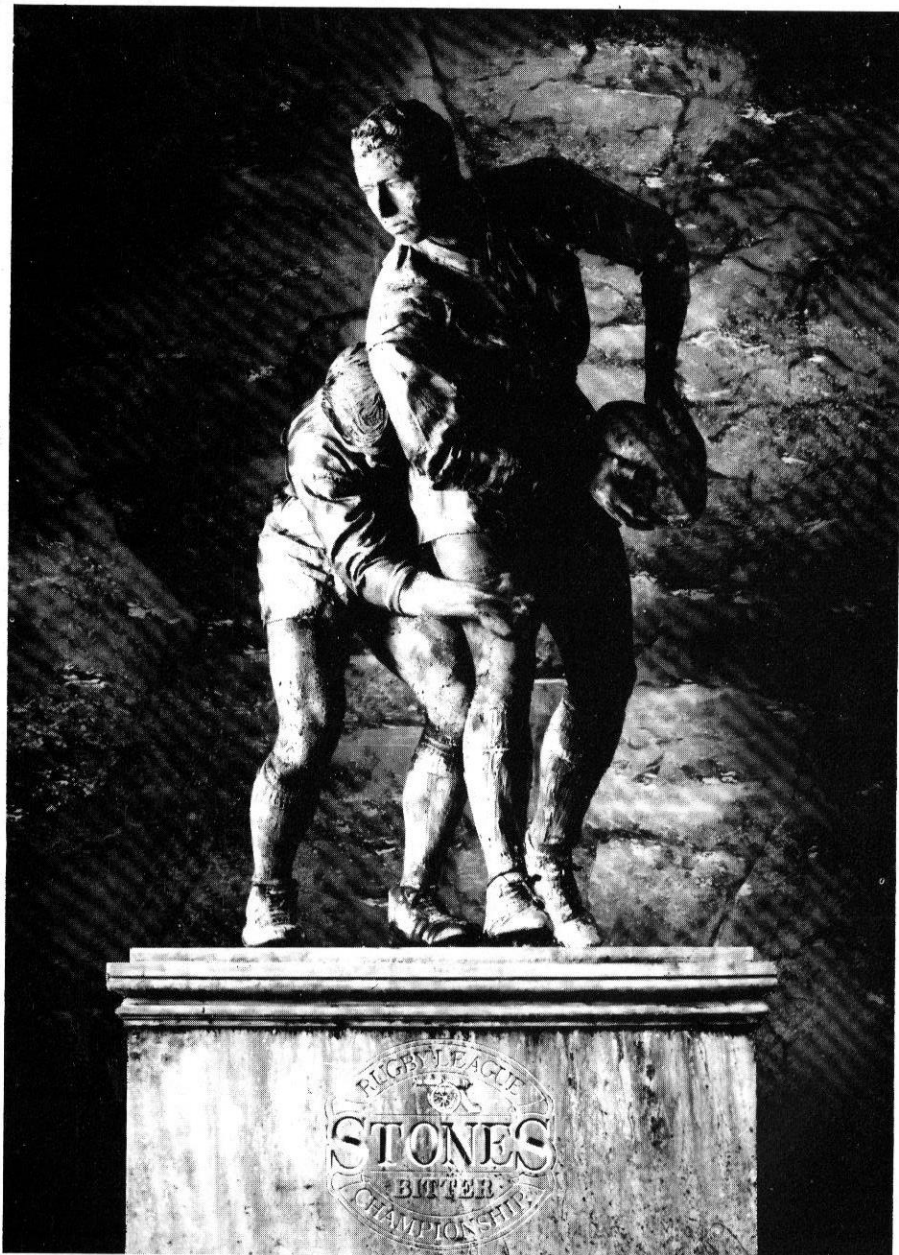
The more shares we can sell before the list closes at the end of March or the beginning of April the better chance we will have of fulfilling our plans for the team, the ground and the club in general.

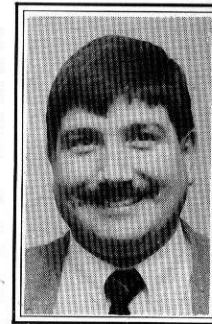

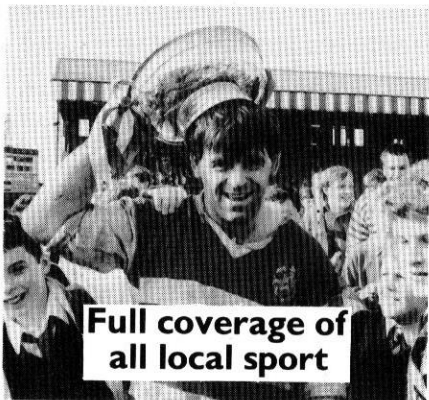

## MATCH REPORTS

### OLDHAM 4, WIGAN 12

IF it is truly possible to earn friends in defeat then Oldham certainly did just that in the third round of the Silk Cut Challenge Cup-tie against Wigan last Saturday. Wigan came here with a team of 11 internationals, 15 games without defeat, and 17 consecutive cup-tie victories.
