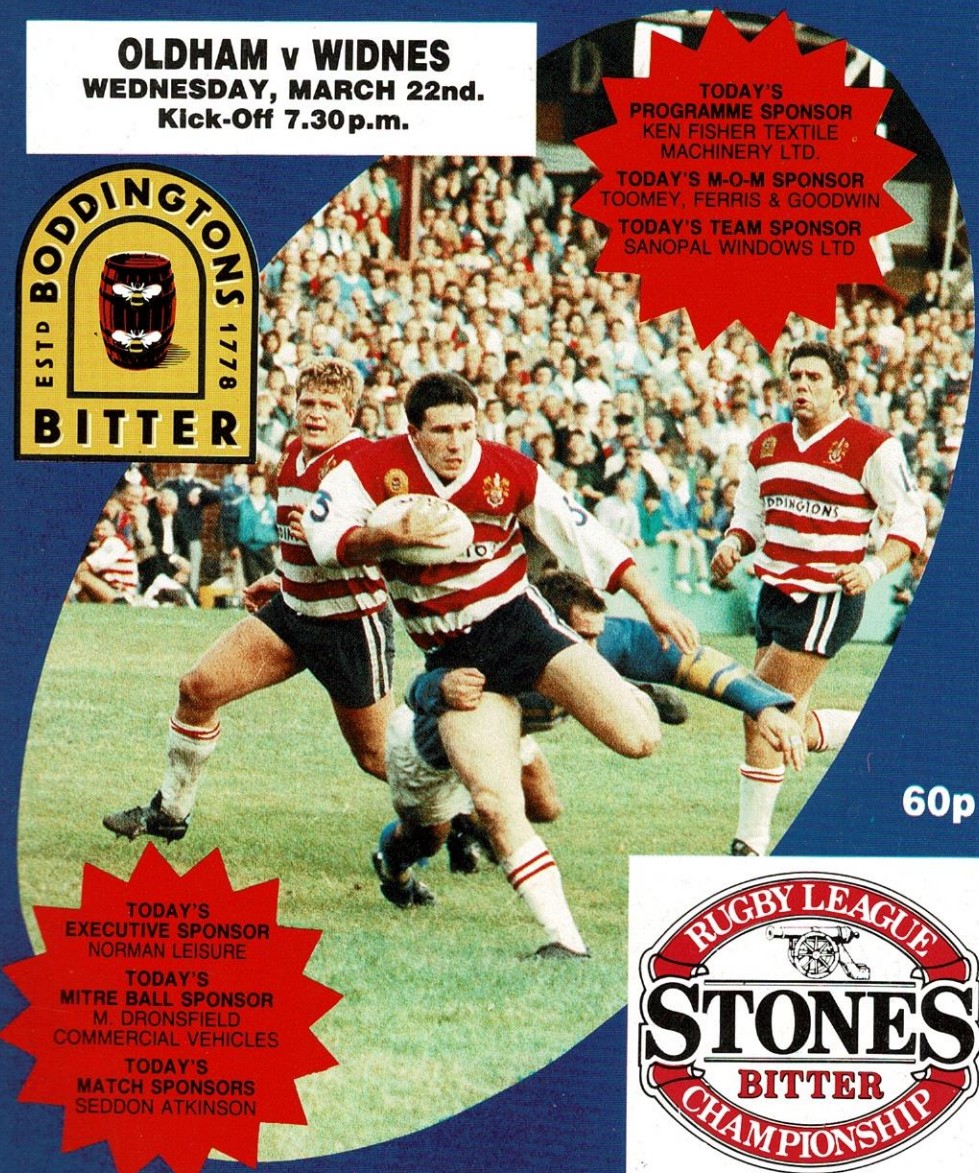
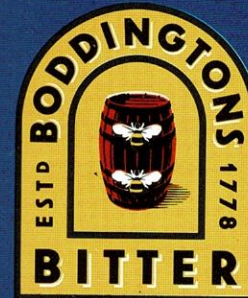

ON THE BARROW BEAT

(A regular feature with Oldham coach Tony Barrow)



ONE of the big talking points concerning tonight's match will be the appearance, or non-appearance, of Jonathan Davies in the Widnes line-up.

A lot of words have been written — and a lot of opinions expressed — about the Welshman's move to League in a blaze of publicity, followed by a somewhat modest entry into the professional code so far as first-team football is concerned.

A lot of people, of course, assumed wrongly that because Jonathan was a big star for Wales and British Lions in the Union game, and because he commanded a large and lucrative contract to turn pro, he would automatically cruise into the Widnes first team and start to take the opposition apart with his speed and flair.

Those of us who are in the game, of course, did not think like that at all. Doug Laughton, the Widnes coach, didn't and I have no doubt that Jonathan himself was well aware that he would have to settle in and earn his place in the side.

Let me say at the outset that Jonathan is a class player. I have no doubt that he will be very successful in Rugby League when he has had time to adapt. I saw him play in 'A' team rugby for Widnes shortly after he arrived and he was certainly one of the fastest players I have ever seen on a rugby field in nearly 30 years in the game.

All players, though, must serve their apprenticeship and must earn their place in a team. When that team is Widnes, it becomes all the harder to achieve.

Dougie is lucky to be in a position where he can afford to ask Davies to be patient. He is, nevertheless, doing things the right way, in my opinion, and I am sure that, in the long run, Jonathan will benefit, as will Widnes, from the decision to introduce him gradually into the whole new world of Rugby

League football at the highest level.

Dougie is a shrewd coach and a good judge. You can gamble he will have good reasons for tackling the Jonathan Davies issue in the way he has and judging by the way Widnes took Castleford and Leeds apart on their way to the cup semi-final showdown with St. Helens, I don't think anyone can argue with him.

He has successfully handled the transition from Union to League of men like Martin Offiah and Alan Tait and there is absolutely no reason to suggest that he might not be on the right lines with Jonathan.

Whether you are a young lad reared on League or a star from the other code, you have to serve your apprenticeship. It's the same in a trade or in any walk of life you can care to name. Once that learning process is complete, the player is all the better for it and he, more than anyone, will appreciate everybody's patience.

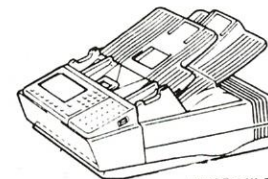

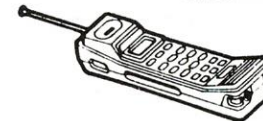

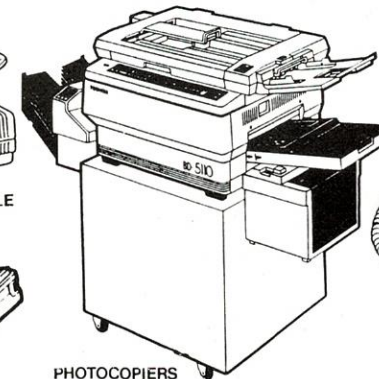

OLDHAM'S FUTURE

A message to all from director Greg Pache



It is not very often that I speak publicly, or in the programme, but I wish to bring to the attention of supporters the importance of our share issue which has now been extended until March 31.

As you are probably aware, we have been a members' club since 1876 and we have never been able to compete at top level consistently. Even the little success we have had was more than 30 years ago or as far back as the 1920s.

Being a members club has always hindered progress and limited financial support. For the first time, we can now convert to a limited company but when this was set in motion by the previous committee only £15,000 was raised by members. As it was for a closed company we could never have gained enough funds to keep Oldham Rugby afloat.

The alternative, therefore, was to look at other ideas to create a strong financial basis for success, hence the creation of the **PUBLIC LIMITED COMPANY**.

This gives an opportunity for everyone, not just members, to become a share holder of the club. i.e. companies, individuals, institutions, amateur club etc, both in the Oldham area and throughout Great Britain.

Putting figures into perspective, the market we are now entitled to pursue is enormous. As an example, our average home support totals about 4,000 and if each one of those 4,000 contributes, say, £100, we would be nearly half way to our target. That in itself would guarantee the survival of the club. Make no bones about it. If you want to continue to see rugby played in Oldham **BUY SHARES**.

It is no use saying: 'It'll be reet. Somebody else can put it in. I'm giving nowt. They'll only waste it. The club'll still be ere!'

WRONG. Think again. Be patient. Success takes time. You may say £100 is a lot of money. I'm saying, 'Yes, it is.' However, spread shares around the family and relatives. Ask your bosses to help. Think of every conceivable way in which you could introduce a shareholder. Mention it at your pub or club. I'm sure that, with effort, each supporter could raise £100 at least.

Don't forget also the Business Expansion Scheme. Contributions over £500 entitle the individual to tax relief, effectively reducing net cost for shares by 25 or 40 per cent.

We know supporters are not satisfied with results. Neither are we. We not only need money to reduce our deficit, but to be in a position to compete for the better class of players.

We have not become directors for the benefit of ourselves. On the contrary, we are here for the benefit of Oldham RLFC, a club which everyone should be proud of and which should be among the elite of the game.

Help us to save Oldham. Help us to make the club great. **BUY SHARES, and now is the time to do it.**

Don't delay because the offer has to close on March 31.

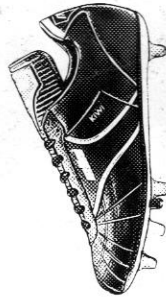

STUDENT RUGBY LEAGUE WORLD CUP, 1989

THE greatest occasion in Student Rugby League history is due to take place during the first two weeks in August this year when the SRL World Cup will be held in this country. This event has been approved by the International Board and is receiving the full support of the RFL and BARLA.

Entries have been accepted from Australia, New Zealand, France, England, Wales and Scotland. Holland are almost certain to be competing and at this stage it is possible that teams from Papua New Guinea, USA and Ireland will be taking part. The whole event promises to be the largest single gathering of international RL teams in the history of the game and is a great boost for the ever-increasing popularity of RL in the student population in this country and other parts of the world.

All the teams will be based at the University in the City of York and the matches will be played at top professional and amateur club grounds throughout the North of England. The Grand Final is scheduled for Saturday, August 12, at Central Park, Wigan, the home of the best-supported and most famous Rugby League club.

The cost of staging the event is estimated at £87,000 and while the official RL bodies have promised their support, the bulk of this money has to be raised by the SRL through the efforts of their executive committee. Bev Risman has been appointed by the RFL to co-ordinate the event and to organise the massive fund-raising initiative.

The value of student RL to RL in general is now being recognised at both playing and administrative levels and there is great sympathy and support for the student game throughout RL circles. It is in everyone's interest therefore to try to ensure that this event is a major success and the SRL are looking for financial support from all true followers of RL.

HERE COME THE CHEMICS

THE big question on the lips of most RL fans tonight is — will Jonathan Davis be in the Widnes side?

The Chemics captured world-wide headlines with their signing of the former Welsh and British Lions fly-half star in January to follow his fellow Union men Martin Offiah and Alan Tait into the League scene.

Davis (pictured) played his first full game of League against Oldham at Naughton Park on February 5 and local fans will be hoping he is on view tonight.

Star-spangled Widnes will probably choose from the following squad, plus Davies, of course . . .

of his career. After appearing in three major Finals for Warrington, he left the game for a spell before returning with Widnes. His pace brought him 44 tries for the Wires and he scored 11 in the title win last season for Widnes.

ANDY CURRIER: Drafted into the Great Britain tour party as a replacement for Garry Schofield, scoring 3 tries and 5 goals in 5 appearances without adding a full Test to his two 1984 appearances for the Under-21s. Very fast and a useful goalkicker, as he showed in the Charity Shield match, scoring 11 tries last season and 4 goals in the Premiership Final. Has played wing, but is a much more impressive centre these days.

DARREN WRIGHT: The first of four Widnes Tour replacements to be flown out to Australia to deputise for Shaun Edwards, appearing in 8 tour matches without scoring. In the same mould as Currier — fast, incisive, confident. He scored 2 tries in the Premiership defeat of Saints and totalled 12 last season. Signed in March, 1985, and made his Under-21 International debut against France in January, 1987. Approaching his 100th first-team appearance.

MARTIN OFFIAH: Marvellous opportunist whose 44 tries made him the top try-scorer in the game last season. His 42 for Widnes were a club record and his 15 consecutive scoring appearances were just two short of Eric Harris's all-time record. From the Rosslyn Park RUFC, Offiah gained Lancashire and Great Britain selection in his debut-season, and then scored 19 tries in 11 tour appearances, including two in three Tests against Australia. Electrifying pace, great hands and an uncanny ability to beat defenders on the outside make Offiah one of the game's genuine danger men. Voted Man of Steel last season.

BARRY DOWD: The unsung member of the Champions' squad, this goalkicking utility back joined the club from nearby Halton Hornets, having played for Widnes Schools in the 1975 Under-11s Wembley curtain-raiser. Can operate at centre, full-back or stand-off and rarely puts in a below-par display. Has some 70 appearances for the club behind him and kicked 21 goals last season.

TONY MYLER: One of the game's most brilliant — but unluckiest — individuals, being dogged by knee injury problems since 1984, when he made an ill-advised tour Down Under, immediately after a cartilage

ALAN TAIT: The club's latest acquisition, from the Scottish Rugby Union Club Kelso, from where George Fairbairn emerged in 1974. Holds 8 Scottish caps, four from the 1987 World Cup series and another four from last season's home internationals. Settled in admirably at Naughton Park, claiming a Premiership medal as a substitute in May and helping the Chemics win the Charity Shield on the Isle of Man in August. Looks to be another surefire winner for Widnes and already being tipped for international honours.

RICK THACKRAY: Signed from Warrington in January, 1987, having gained Under-24 international honours in 1980, at the outset

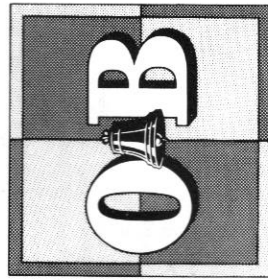
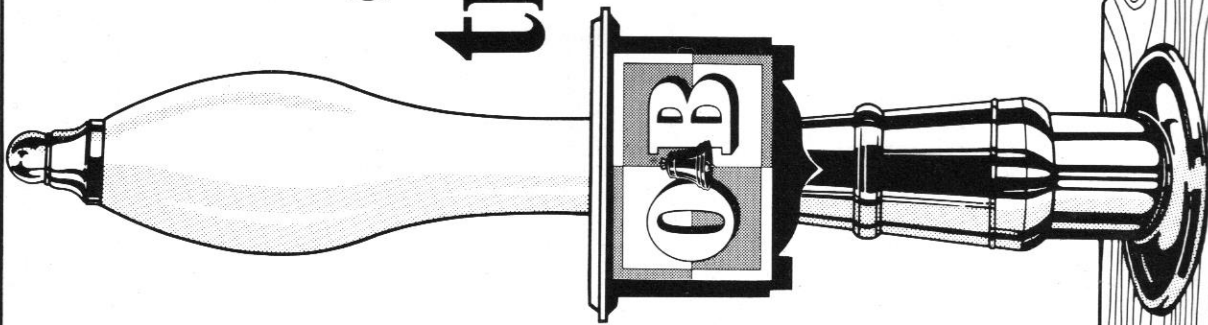

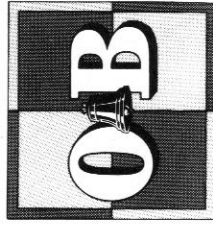

A VERY significant event took place at Watersheddings a week last Saturday when our young 'A' team clinched promotion to the first division of the Stalom Lager Alliance with an 18-6 win against a strong and experienced Barrow side. We had some experience in the pack, notably from Terry Flanagan and Neil Clawson, but the most encouraging aspect of the day was the fact that so many of our players were teenagers or only 20 years of age.

The evergreen Rod Reddy, Barrow coach and former Aussie Test star, held his side together for the first half and, in fact, the Cumbrians led 6-4 until early in the second half when Richard Irving, also aged 21, broke from near half way to score a spectacular solo try. Martyn added a brilliant goal from off the touch line and soon afterwards finished off a great move by taking Entwistle's return, inside pass to dive over. It was all over then and Tony Morrison, who had scored Oldham's first try off a Flanagan pass, again obliged from Terry to score try No. 4 midway through the second half.

Blackman excelled on defence in the first half, using his speed to turn and catch opponents on the break, and in the second half he was twice unlucky not to score after exciting breaks up the touch line.

Martyn, at the hub of things with No. 6 on his back, looked a class prospect, while Foley came on as substitute to produce one of his best displays of the season.

We are determined to continue the youth policy now and we know we will have the full backing of the club and its supporters in so doing. But it costs a lot of money when run in tandem with ready-made strengthening for more immediate needs — another reason why we need every penny we can get from the share issue.

"It is hoped that extending the closing date will result in substantial extra subscription from potential investors among supporters and the business community who may have previously hesitated."

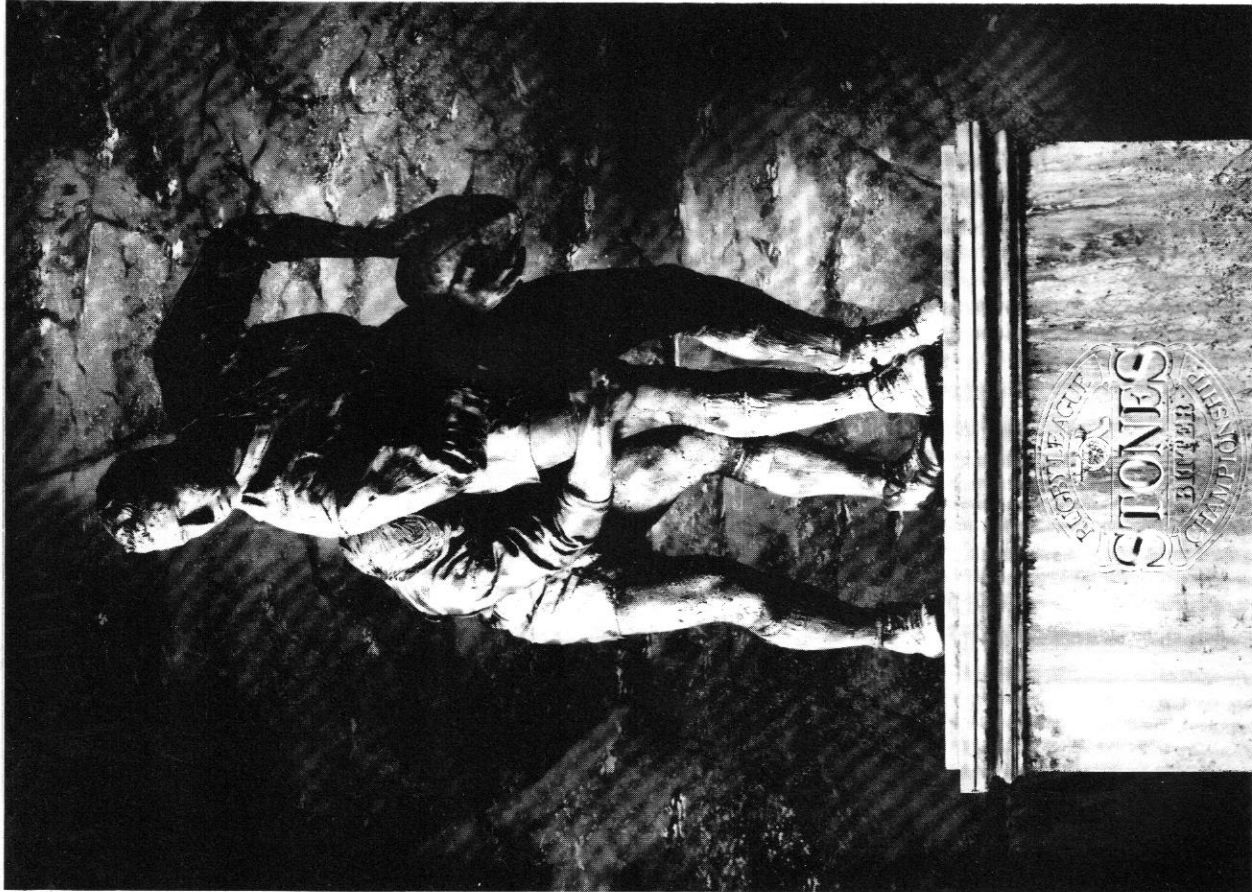

operation. Took the Harry Sunderland Award for a breath-taking performance in Widnes's 1983 Premiership Final defeat of Hull at Headingley. Made a Test debut in 1983 and has 14 Great Britain caps, a figure which might have been doubled but for injuries. A powerful runner, and a sound, resourceful defender, who stayed in Sydney for Balmain in 1986. Has not played in a major Final for Widnes since the 1983 Lancashire Cup Final defeat at the hands of Barrow.

DAVID HULME: Finally got the recognition he deserved after doing a magnificent job in the stand-off position in four Tests on tour. Appeared in 13 of the 18 games on tour and proved a model tourist. Showed his potential as a young 17-year-old scrum-half understudy to Andy Gregory at Naughton Park and developed to gain Under-21 and Lancashire honours. Last May took the Harry Sunderland Award for an outstanding display in the Premiership Final. Scored 19 tries in 1986-87 and produced a 16-try return last season. Joined Widnes from Halton Hornets in August, 1980. Outstanding all-round footballer, whose consistency matches his brilliance. Approaching his 100th try for Widnes.

KURT SORENSEN: Outstanding New Zealand Test forward. Originally a back-row forward, making his Test debut in 1975, still going strong, appearing in the World Cup Final in Auckland. Captain/coach of the Chemics, arriving in England after spells with Cronulla and Easts, in Sydney, and a guest spell with Wigan as a teenager in 1976-77. Powerhouse forward, who leads by example and scored 6 tries in 2 appearances last season, including one in the Premiership Final defeat of St. Helens.

PHIL MCKENZIE: Qualities for British citizenship in two years' time, and should be then challenging to claim the Great Britain Test jersey. Arrived from the Illawarra district of Australia to play for Rochdale Hornets in 1985-86. Outstanding form there brought 19 tries in 32 appearances and Widnes won the race for his signature. Proving a man in the Keith Elwell mould, possessing all of his try-getting, ball-

winning qualities. His 11 tries in 1986-87 included a brilliant Cup semi-final effort against Halifax at Headingley. Scored another 12 last term, including one in the Premiership Final. Man of the Match in this year's Charity Shield match on the Isle of Man.

MIKE O'NEILL: Substitute in Widnes's 1979 Wembley defeat of Wakefield Trinity, and currently in his benefit season with the Chemics. A 1984 Lions tourist, having gained his only three caps in 1982-83. Mike holds three Under-24 international caps. Has also appeared 7 times for Lancashire and in 9 major Finals for the club he joined from school. Can play front or second row. Almost 350 appearances for the club and is a model of consistency.

RICHARD EYRES: Another Widnesian to join the British party mid-way through the Lions tour during the summer, making just 3 appearances. Toured New Zealand with the Young Lions squad and joined Widnes in 1984 from Widnes Tigers.

DEREK PYKE: Former Leigh skipper who joined Widnes in a part-exchange deal which took Harry Pinner to Hilton Park. Skilful front-row man.

JOE GRIMA: Another eve-of-Cup signing, arriving at Widnes from Swinton. This New Zealander helped to win the Second Division Premiership at Old Trafford in 1987, scoring 5 tries in 18 appearances in their promotion-winning season.

PAUL HULME: Outstanding young utility player, was produced by Halton Hornets. Joined the Lions tourists as a replacement last summer and appeared in the unaccustomed role of hooker in Great Britain's Third Test victory. Made his Lancashire debut against Yorkshire at Headingley.

EMOSI KOLOTO: Age 23, 16 stone 5 pounds, Tongan-born. A Wellington RU and New Zealand junior Kiwi and unlucky to miss out on full NZ All-Blacks tour to Australia last summer. Signed after lengthy negotiation and already his a big with Widnes fans after an impressive debut.
