



WELL, here we are, once again, at the start of a brand-new Rugby League season. Supporters of all teams will be full of hopes and aspirations. For some, perhaps, their dreams and ambitions will be realised, while for others it will be disappointment.

As the season unfolds before us, the answers to these questions will slowly emerge.

Can Widnes retain the RL championship for a record-breaking third year in succession?

Will Wigan go back to Wembley and return triumphant once again? Perhaps more importantly, how will they cope with the loss of an outstanding coach like Graham Lowe?

Of the teams across the Pennines, Malcolm Reilly's Leeds have flattered to deceive in recent seasons. They are still able to splash out on big-money signings but, as yet, are striving for consistency.

Still in Yorkshire, with Halifax, comes a clear indication of how quickly times can change. Two Wembley appearances and a championship season are now history as they return to division two and have to battle it out with fancied Oldham and Hull KR in the race to return to the top flight.

Of the three teams who went up last season, many people would have expected Oldham to retain first division status, but despite a tremendous effort they, too, must lift themselves as they prepare for a swift return to division one rugby.

Encouragingly for Roughyed supporters, a clear pattern is starting to

emerge from Watersheddings with their signing of quality, young players, blended with experience and players of proven ability.

Good, also, to see better times ahead for our neighbours, Rochdale Hornets. They have money to spend and have struck a deal to share headquarters with the soccer club. Fans of both Rugby clubs will have the added bonus of at least two local derbies which will add spice to any fixture list.

Well, now it's time to enter the dangerous world of predictions. For the major honours it's hard to remove Widnes from the list, whilst Wigan, with quite a number of their players having played all year round, plus a settling-in period for new coach John Monie, might not be quite as successful as in recent years, but without doubt they will be there or thereabouts.

Castleford and Hull could both be more than also-rans this season. For outsiders, Bradford Northern might raise a few eyebrows.

Oldham, Halifax and Hull KR are obvious candidates for division two honours, but Hornets will be out to throw a spanner in the works.

Finally, I will leave you with some of the quotes of the year from last season: "Despite what the Aussies say about their supremacy, the best players in British RL are British players."

"I often think all the things that made a good cowboy in John Wayne make a good rugby player: heroism, honesty, strength, confidence and selfsufficiency."

Enjoy your rugby.

CUMBERLAND CUP TONIC FOR TOWN

WORKINGTON Town come to Watersheddings today on the opening day of a brandnew Rugby League season in the knowledge that they have already beaten Barrow and Carlisle to lift the Cumberland Cup.

First Division Barrow were beaten 28-14 at Derwent Park and then new-look Carlisle, with Harry Pinner at loose-forward, were knocked over 8-4 in a tough derby clash on the same ground.

As Carlisle had already beaten Whitehaven at the Recreation Ground, Workington can take great comfort from their feat in retaining the county cup.

They won it last year, too, and then had a poor season in the Second Division, finishing fourth off the bottom with only nine wins from 28 games.

"We hope it's not a bad omen to win the county cup again," says long-serving club stalwart John Bell, "but we are sure it's not. The big difference this year is that our homegrown lads have all matured together and we are a much stronger team than a year ago."

This time last year Town were looking to "outsiders" like Ray Tabern and David Ward, both in the twilight of their careers, to do big things for them.

Now the team is entirely homespun — most of the players coming from local Rugby Union clubs or from such well-established amateur League nurseries as Ellenborough, Clifton or Egremont.

Recently appointed club captain — and responding by showing some brilliant early-

season form — is loose-forward Gary Nixon, a former prop who has shed some weight and is now excelling at No. 13.

Nixon has had about six seasons at Derwent Park, but even that is not as long as prop Colin Falcon, who is now in his benefit year and still serving the club admirably.

Town will be fielding a strong and mobile pack with two young second-rowers in teenager Keith Lamb and Peter Riley and a promising prop in 24-year-old Paul Vannet, who has been transfer-listed at £25,000 after a breakdown in contract talks.

Vannet, who is seeking a club in Lancashire or Yorkshire, is expected to be watched by several scouts from other clubs today. Town regard the fee as a snip, Paul having picked up a lot of experience during the summer with Sydney club Cronulla, where he played in the first-grade side on occasions.

Gary Smith, son of a former Town player, will be at stand-off, and choice of his scrumhalf partner will rest between Glen Burgess and John Newell, son of Jackie, the former Town and Great Britain star.

A young back division features Paul Penrice and Keith Tubman on the wings and Neil Rooney and Mark Mawson in the centre, while at full back is a player whom Derwent Park officials rate very highly, namely the £80,000-listed David Lowden, a nephew of the renowned Frank Foster, a prop who made his name with Workington and later became a firm favourite of the Watersheddings crowd.



STONES BITTER AWARDS

RUGBY League's premier Man of Steel Award scheme is to be sponsored by Stones Bitter in a new three-year £50,000 deal.

The Man of Steel title was launched in 1977 and is awarded to the personality judged to have made the most impact on the season, the 1990 award being doubled by Stones Bitter to £4,000. Stones Bitter will also be backing the Top Scorers Awards of £25 a try for the leading try-scorer and £5 a goal for the top goal-scorer.

The Stones Bitter Team of the Month and Year Awards have been increased to £500 for the Stones Bitter Championship Team of the Month and £350 for the Second Division Team of the Month, plus £1,500 for the adjudged Team of the Year, a total prize structure of £8.300.

campaign.

"Rugby League reached new invigorating heights last season marked by a 25% increase in attendances in the streamlined Stones Bitter Championship, the League title not being decided until the last match of the season, and a record-breaking gate of 40,000-plus for the Stones Bitter Premiership double-header at Old Trafford."

Paul Hughes, Marketing Director of Bass North, said: "We are convinced that the increased prize money further lifts the prestige of the Stones Bitter Championship and Premiership and consolidates the happy partnership that exists between Bass and the Rugby League.

"We believe the marketing programme we have developed with the Rugby League has contributed to the growth in popularity of the game and the increased crowd attendances, and we look forward to the future with






