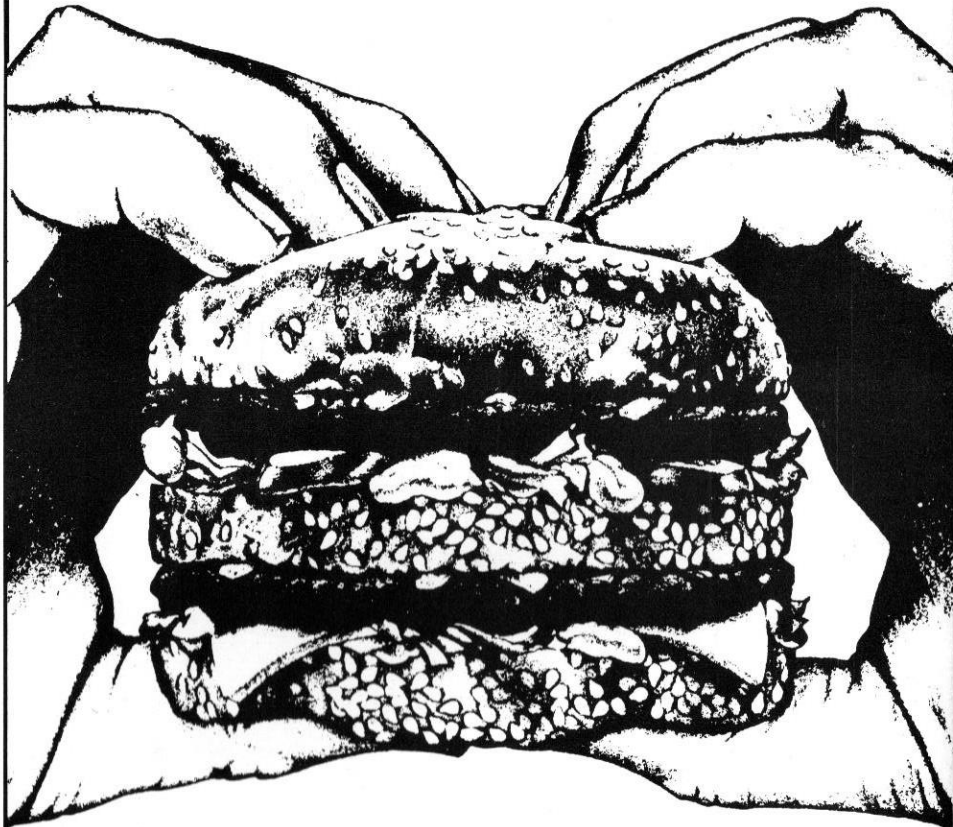

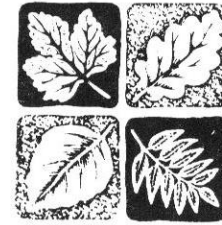

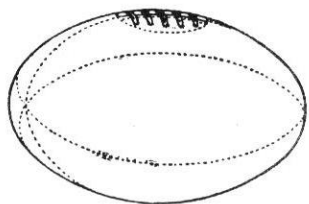

Lancashire Cup Competition — 1st Round

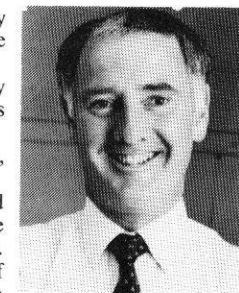
BARROW v OLDHAM

TODAY WE GIVE A WARM WELCOME to Oldham who many supporters recall we triumphed over for our first ever trophy success the Lancashire Cup 12 - 2 in 1954/55 season.

Oldham are bidding to climb back into the First Division under Tony Barrow but lost a vital game at Halifax last week before 8,000 plus spectators.

The last time we met Oldham at Craven Park was on 13th December, 1987 and Barrow won 18 - 14 before a crowd of 22,244.

After last weeks game I spoke to Leeds International Garry Schofield and he tells me that Chris Johns will be a great asset to the team when he arrives, Schofield says that Johns has had a great season Down Under. Although we went down 32 - 10 Schofield said that there was plenty of effort from the Barrow players only pace being the difference between the two sides.

At the time of going to press it is not known where the game will be played as safety measures have closed down the Owlerton Stadium.

Tickets will be available shortly for the Daily Mirror Road Show in aid of Steve Tickle's benefit which will be staged at the United Club on Wednesday October 25th.

SANDRA'S PAGE

Today's article takes a look at one of Barrow's most popular players - Eddie "Smiler" Szymala.

Eddie signed for Barrow R.L.F.C. in the 1973/74 season from Barrow Island A.R.L.F.C. and immediately made a big impression on the professional scene. Throughout the 12 years that Eddie played for Barrow, he represented Great Britain U24's (twice), both against France in 1976, England against France in 1979 and full Great Britain caps (twice) again against France in 1981. On a lighter note, he also came 3rd in the Cumbria R.L. Superstars in 1983. Eddie gained a Division Two Championship medal in 1983/84, and a John Player Trophy runners-up medal in 1980/81. He was also awarded Barrow's Young Player of the Year award early in his career.



Many opposing players feared Eddie on the field because of his aggressive style of play - this sometimes gained him a 'bad boy' image. This image often rebounded against him, causing him to come into conflict with many a referee. (it's rumoured that Eddie and Fred Lindop were not blood brothers!). He was in fact sent off 14 times in his career. In contrast to this, Eddie was one of the most respected players in the game, and was a real character both on and off the pitch (sadly something which is all too frequent with the modern game).

During his time at Barrow, Eddie's score sheet read as follows:-

- 1983 - Cumbria's Strongest Man
- 1985 - Open Cumbria
- 1987 - Under 90Kg. (U.K.)
- 1988 - West Coast

Maintaining this standard means he has to spend several nights of the week training at the Furness Health Studio.

Another sport that Eddie has just been introduced to is roller skating, which he says helps to improve his physique and build up his strength and stamina.

Eddie still nurses a deep interest in the game and hopes one day to be able to return to the game in some role. I'm sure all the supporters will look forward to this!

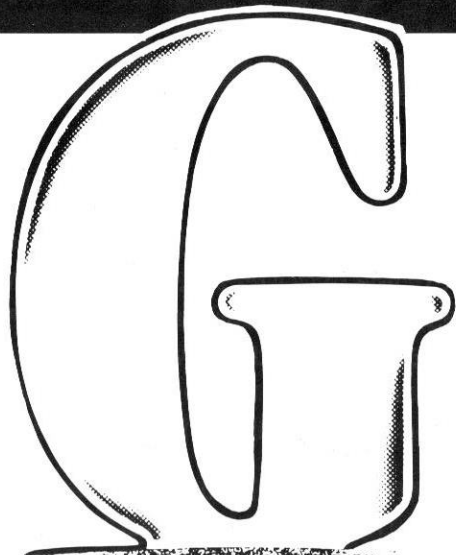

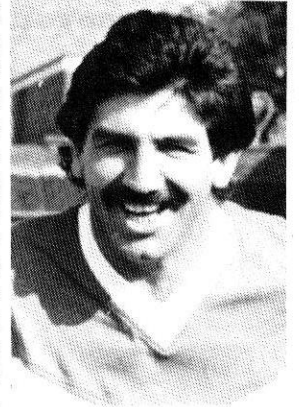

The Oldham players will want to prove that even though we are in the First Division they are better than us, conversely the same will apply to the Barrow team today. Oldham were unlucky in the First Division last season, they did manage to beat a few teams but not quite enough to stay up. Kenny had played with the reserve team the day before so he's had a very busy time last weekend. The most disappointing thing for us was having Leeds pinned back in their own half for twenty minutes and then letting them off the hook to score two long range trys and then the same happened in the second half. To give credit to our players though, they did stick at the task and were rewarded in the second half late on by two trys. I was very pleased with the fitness level of our players, its very hard to play football against a team that is a stone heavier man for man and about 5 inches taller. So we must plug along sticking to the same pattern and make the passes stick. A bit of super glue would come in handy today. We could do with making things a bit harder for Oldham today, given the same opportunities as last week we can go ahead with it, we are not that far off a win and today can be the day.

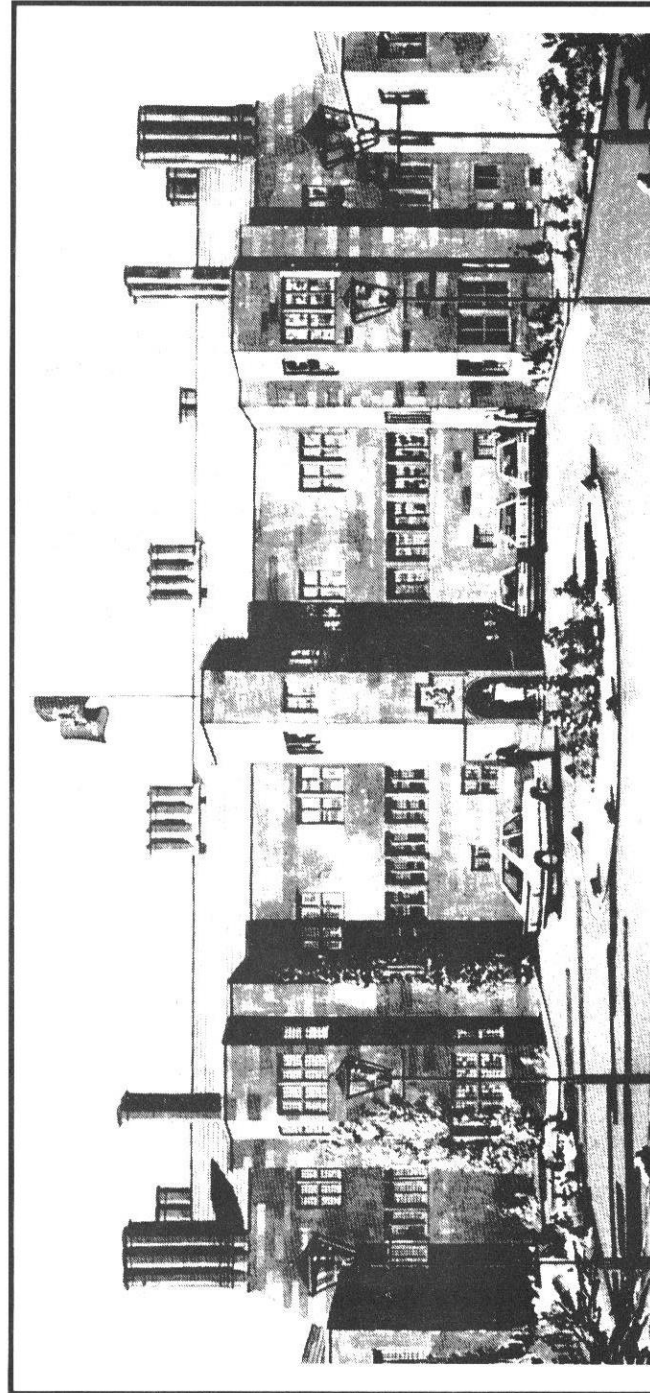


Parallell's can be drawn between the situation then and the state of play today with plenty of people, Barrow Fans included, predicting a swift return to the Second Division football. Well I know one good way to make sure that the club goes straight back down, that is to turn up to the game and shout and moan at the players rather than get behind them and encourage them to do their best. Everyone knows that Barrow will not win the league but with encouragement the players can win the 12 vital games necessary to ensure First Division football next season. When you take a look at our side today just look and see how many players are products of the local amateur league. This has to be the way forward. It is alright to shout that Barrow should be signing such and such a player but it would be irresponsible to put the club into more debt by signing top quality players who would have to travel to Barrow and could not therefore be a proper part of the squad system. Players like Steve Tickle and Stuart Williams have proved good value for money "travellers", Steve in particular has been a top class player and an ambassador for the club. Steve is respected amongst all league referees for his fair play and his consistency. There can not be many more players as unlucky as Steve in missing out on an International place at the height of his powers.

The prohibitive cost of signing ready made players from other clubs means that the production of local talent must be the priority for Barrow. We also live in a small community that is effectively cut off from the rest of the country. This means that we are not a very attractive proposition from a national sponsors point of view until we achieve lasting success. There are only a limited number of businesses in the local community that are willing to sponsor. As commercial manager it is my job to convince these people that their hard earned money is best spent with Barrow Rugby League Club. The lack of facilities has made it hard for people to justify spending too much on sponsorship and I am eternally grateful for the help of sponsors who have been willing to sign up for this season. Having said this, with the prospective new stadium and the private boxes built-in, I expect to be able to raise more money next season. There is increased competition for sponsors money but while you, the people of Barrow continue to make the rugby league clob the best supported sport in the whole of South Cumbria, then we are off to a head start in front of all the others. We could of course attempt to improve this, especially this year in the top flight by introducing new people to the sport from the area. If every supporter could bring a friend with them for one game then we would have doubled the attendance, it really is as simple as that. If you want to see Barrow compete with the big boys, then there are many ways in which you can help. Firstly and most simply, you can attend every game at home and shout the lads on. The next step is to bring a friend along to shout the team on along with yourself and next you can make your friend bring all the family along with them. If you work at a large company that employs a lot of people that like yourself attend the Rugby, then you and your friends might suggest to your employer that your company sponsors the Rugby League team. For example any employer that would like to buy 100 season tickets or more for the workforce as a bonus, could get these at a special discount rate from the club. The only thing I would add is that the club wishes for the sponsor to get value for money and would not wish to put any undue pressure on the company.

I would like to finish by congratulating the team on gaining promotion last season and by thanking the supporters that have attended the games last season and have come to the two games so far this season. I hope you all continue to enjoy your Rugby League this season and that Barrow get the results they need to remain in the First Division of the greatest game of all.
