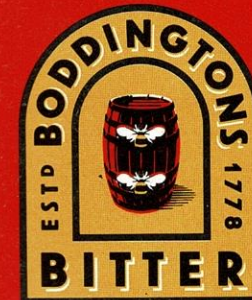
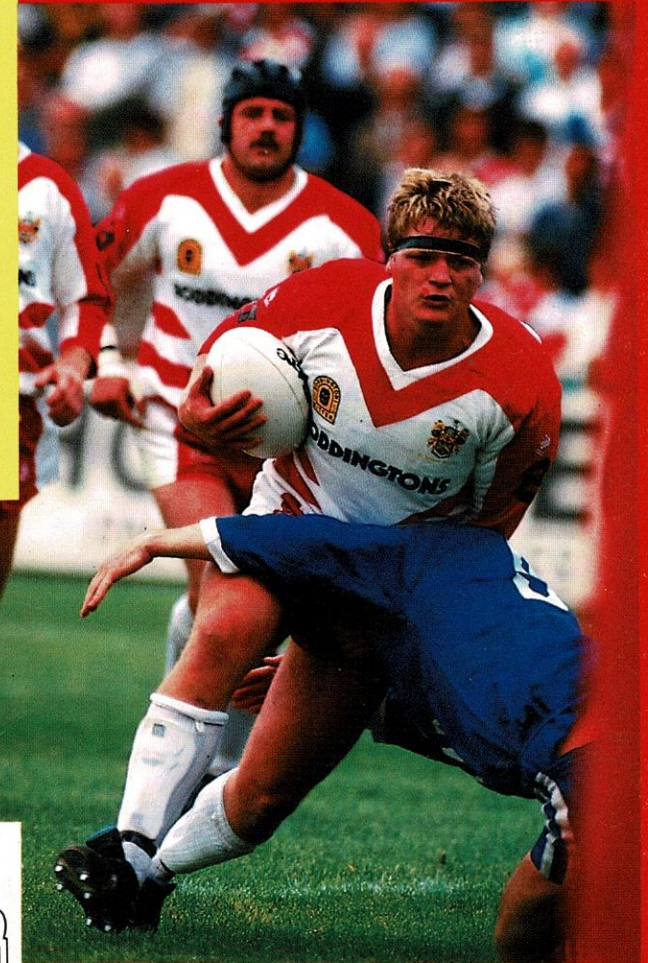

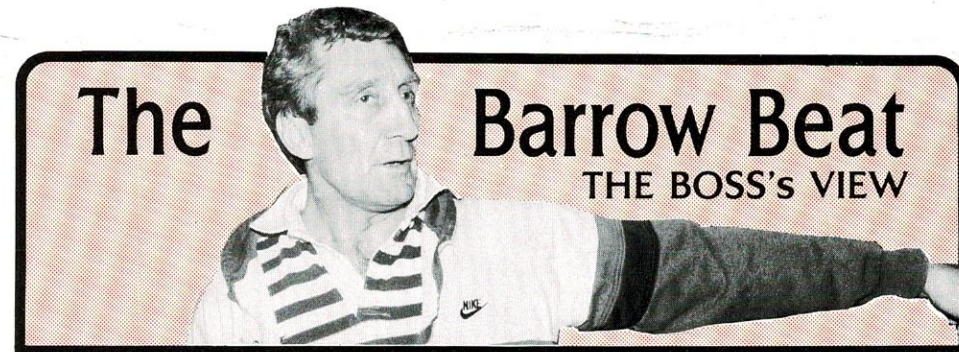

WE'RE PUTTING OUR SHIRTS ON OLDHAM



BRITAIN still stands supreme in the world of Rugby League when it comes to ball skills. In recent years the Aussies may have had the edge in fitness and strength — although we are rapidly catching up in that direction, too — but there is nothing to compare with good, old fashioned British ball play.

Years ago we sent out many of our finest players to Sydney and the reason they were in such big demand was that the Australians realised they had to learn and learn fast. And that's exactly what they did. They learnt fast from men like Brian Lockwood, Mal Reilly, Tommy Bishop and a score of other players who proved in those days that British is best.

I think the emergence of Australia as the world power she is today had its origins in those days and it is interesting to note that overseas players still see Britain as the place to learn the skills.

You will be staggered to discover that I have on my files no fewer than 78 names of New Zealanders who want to come to England this season — and that 15 of them are from one club! All the leading clubs are being asked to take one Kiwi or another and I think it is just as well that we have a maximum number from the quota otherwise some clubs may be tempted to overload with the men from Down Under.

English clubs, of course, seem to be changing direction somewhat now and much more emphasis is being placed on looking around other parts of the British Isles to sign Union men on long-term contracts rather than Aussies or Kiwis who

might have to return home just when the English season is preparing for its climax.

I said when Chris O'Sullivan had to leave us last February that I wouldn't sign another

Aussie on a short-term contract and I am happy to report that Brett Clark, who joined us last week, will be here until the end of the season and maybe for another year if things work out well.

Rovers showed the other way to go when they went to South Wales and returned with scrum-half David Bishop. He is one of several Welshmen who have made the trek north during the last 18 months with Widnes to the forefront thanks to the headline-hogging signings of Jonathan Davies, Paul Moriarty and John Devereux.

Without question, Bishop is a top-class player — big, strong, with good hands and an eye for the opening. He will doubtless be a key figure in today's game which should be an important one for both clubs when it comes to collecting the Second Division silverware at the end of the season.

Having lost to Halifax it is all the more important that we take the points off Rovers today. A great game is in prospect and I am sure you will get behind the players right from the start.

I'd also like to take this opportunity of officially welcoming Brett Clark to Watersheddings. He is an experienced half-back who served St. Helens well in the 1986-87 season and I am sure he will be a valuable capture as the season unfolds.

Revitalised Rovers

Rovers have been hitting the headlines on and off the field since last season, not least since the sale of Craven Park and the recent move into a brand-new, purpose-built £3.5m stadium.

It was opened last Sunday for the visit of Trafford and such was the interest generated that police demanded it was an all-ticket match.

Indeed, Rovers' staggering £120,000 season ticket sales are a club record besides which Hull's pale into insignificance.

Why all the interest? The move to the new ground has helped but the Rovers' fans have been inspired by an impressive start and a team-building programme that has taken several top-class players to East Hull.

Among newcomers are Aussie pair **Greg Austin** and **Bryan Neibling** and New Zealander **Tony Botica**, a big man from the Mount Albert club who is making a big impression in the second row.

Austin will be remembered as the former Rochdale Hornets and Salford player. He has signed a one-year contract with a 12 month option and is adding pace and punch into the middle of the Rovers back-line.

Neibling is a vastly experienced Test star of 15 Kangaroos appearances as well as 11 appearances for Queensland in the State of Origin Series. After arriving in Hull he could not get into the side against Trafford although he was expected to make his debut last Wednesday night in the second round of the Yorkshire Cup against Castleford.

In addition to the new boys, there are many well-known league personalities in the Rovers line-up, starting with veteran full-back **George Fairburn**.

Former Test winger **Garry Clarke** is almost certain to have scored a century of tries for Rovers by the time today's game comes around. He was only 17 when he made his debut in 1982 and his most prolific season was his second when he touched down 24 times.

Tony Sullivan, son of the late Clive Sullivan, may be on the other wing with **Austin** and **Mike Fletcher** in the centre and **Wayne Parker** and **David Bishop** at half-back. Bishop, the former Welsh RU international, has made a terrific start to the campaign and will need to be closely marked in today's encounter.

The pack will feature Cumbrian **Colin Armstrong**, the former Carlisle player at prop, **Colin Rudd** at hooker and either **Neibling** or **Zook Ema** on the blind-side of the front-row.

Behind them will be **Paul Lyman**, a £90,000 signing from Featherstone last season, **Botica**, and that Rovers stalwart, **Mike Smith**, who is now appearing at loose forward after spending most of his career at outside half.

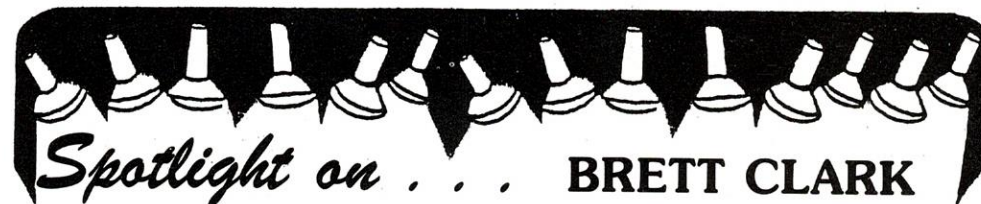

Brett Clark, Oldham's latest signing, will feel quite at home in the Watersheddings dressing room — even though he's travelled over 12,000 miles to help the club back into the First Division at the first attempt.

Indeed, training with the squad for the first time last week was more like an old boys reunion rather than the introduction of the club's latest Down Under import.

The reason why is because the 27-year-old Aussie has already teamed up with half a dozen members of the Oldham squad at two of his previous clubs, Sydney's Western Suburbs and St. Helens. Clark played with John Cogger and John Henderson in Australia and alongside John Fieldhouse, Shaun Allen and Paul Round at Knowsley Road.

"I already know several of the players here so it'll make it a lot easier settling in at Oldham. Already I feel quite at home," says the fast-moving Australian whose pace will add extra speed to the Oldham back-line, whether he plays half-back or scrum-half.

The nippy Aussie, who first started playing top class Rugby League for Western Suburbs at the turn of the decade, further strengthens Oldham's first team squad and his arrival makes competition for shirts No. 6 and 7 extremely fierce.

Many Oldham fans will already recognise the stocky Aussie. That's because Brett, who has signed for Oldham for the rest of the season with an option of another year, is no stranger to Rugby League in England.

He first made his name during Alex Murphy's first season as Knowsley Road boss when St. Helens went to Wembley and finished runners-up to Wigan in the First Division.



During that season Brett played 36 times, scoring 19 tries in the process, taking on Oldham three times and winning on each occasion, including an infamous 24-14 cup victory on the road to Wembley's twin towers for a memorable final against Halifax.

That thrilling final has provided Clark with the high and low point of his career to date. "Getting to Wembley with St. Helens was a great moment to treasure, especially as I flew in from Australia for the match. Losing the game by a single point wasn't so pleasant!"

Brett, who signed for Oldham despite competition from other clubs, relishes the coming months having completed a two-year stint with Sydney St. George. "It's a new challenge and I'm looking forward to it. I enjoyed my time with St. Helens and I am sure I will be happy with Oldham."

His ambition now with Oldham is simple: "I want to keep on winning and playing well for as long as possible. Obviously, I'd like to help Oldham into the First Division and pick up a few cups at the same time.

For the next 12 months at least Stalybridge is going to be the home for the friendly Aussie and his wife Donna and two-year-old son, Andrew, as he sets out to emulate the success he had last time he played in the UK. However, this time Oldham will benefit rather than be on the receiving end of his considerable talents.
