



My thanks, too, to all those fans who made the trip to St. Helens and gave us a resounding reception. Your support is truly appreciated and you can rest assured that we will leave no stone unturned in our efforts to produce some silverware.

Spotlight on ... LEO CASEY

BUSTLING Leo Casey, Oldham's all-action prop forward, has been in outstanding form this season — and to prove it he is the season's first winner of the Evening Chronicle OB Man of the Month award.

Leo, who follows in the footsteps of previous winners John Cogger, Chris O'Sullivan, Andy Ruane and Mick Ford, received an inscribed medal, a £100 cheque and case of Boddies bitter from Boddingtons representative Matthew Smith, as a reward for his industrious efforts throughout September.

Few could argue with the choice as the Northern Ireland-born 24-year-old, who is married to wife Helen with a seven-month baby boy, Leo Junior, has been one of Oldham's most improved players.

Leo, who has lived in Oldham since he was three, earned this tribute from Evening Chronicle Rugby League journalist Roger Halstead, who commented: "Leo has shrugged off neck and thigh injuries to make a massive impact on Oldham's early-season performances. His form has been particularly impressive in the two Lancashire Cup wins at Barrow and St. Helens."

That neck injury, a trapped nerve which has plagued him for 12 months, hasn't stopped him becoming an essential member of the Oldham team four years after joining the club from St. Anne's Amateur RLFC.

Initially, Leo, who made his First Division debut in a 42-12 Lancashire Cup defeat against Leigh, found it difficult to win a regular first-team place but sheer hard work and determination have proved to be decisive.

He earned a regular first-team spot at the start of last season and hasn't looked back since.

After 45 first-team games and a dozen tries, he's one of the game's most improved and ambitious players. Speaking before last Saturday's Cup Final, he said: "I want to win



a major trophy with Oldham and hopefully tour with the Great Britain international squad."

Rugby has its downside, too, as Leo discovered before the Premiership Final victory against Featherstone. "I dislocated my shoulder a couple of days before the final and my wedding. Fortunately I wasn't wearing a sling for the marriage ceremony but I couldn't carry Helen across the threshold after!"

A major inspiration throughout his career has been Steve Deacon, a coach at St. Anne's, who has helped him throughout his amateur and professional career. Steve encouraged Leo to go to Australia where he played 14 First Grade games with Sydney County Club, Marellan. The season down under proved to be a great experience and helped bring Leo's game on leaps and bounds. Less helpful was a short spell on the wing for the Oldham 'A' team.

"I couldn't get in the reserves after an injury so to get back in the team I played on the wing for four or five weeks. The experiment was not too successful and I was glad to return to the forwards"

And the forwards is where Leo intends to stay as his powerful, all-action performances further enhance his growing reputation. That GB place might not be too far away!
