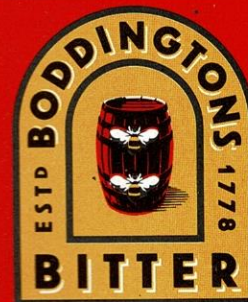
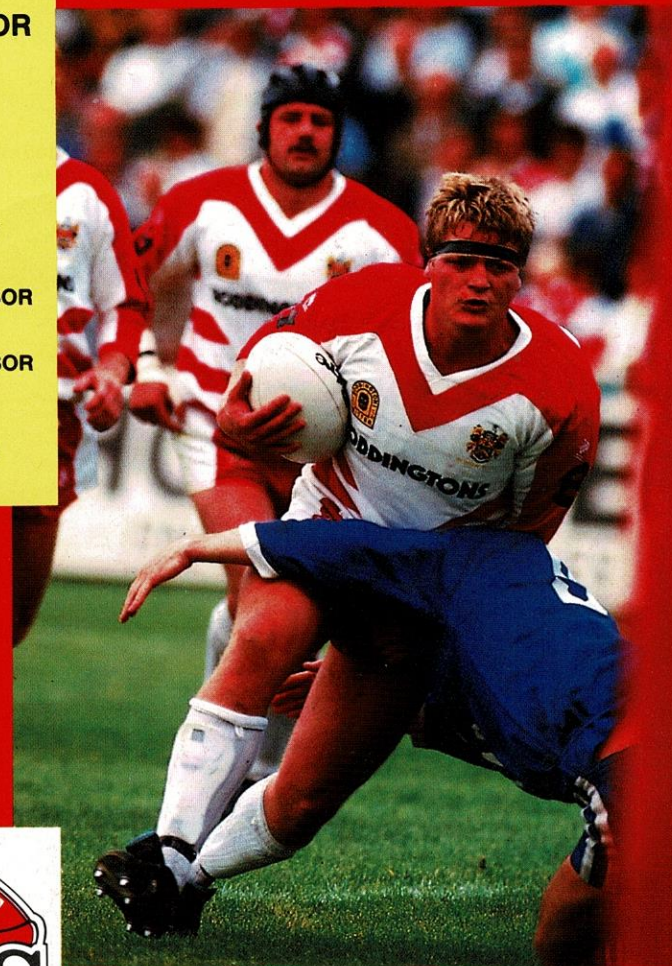

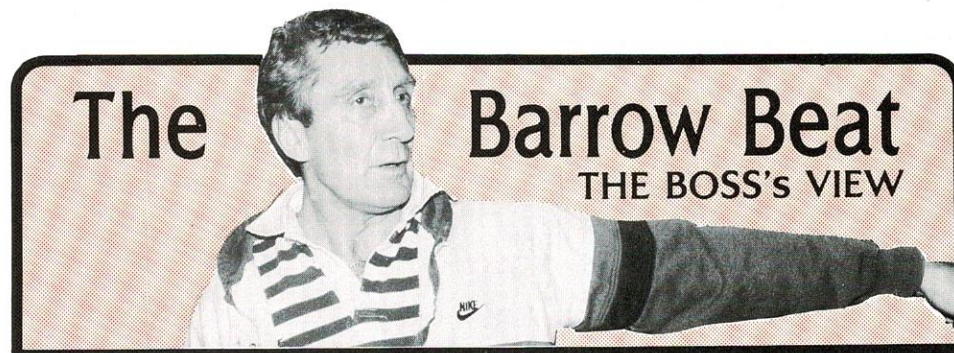

THE BOSS'S VIEW



NOTHING can hide our disappointment at losing the Grünhalle Lancashire Cup final to Warrington at Knowsley Road on Saturday, but wasn't it a marvellous fightback from our boys after they had gone behind 12-0?

I was proud of them all . . . and that's what I told them afterwards.

In the past 12 months we have come a long way together and if we can reach the Lancashire Cup final in that time, beating St. Helens and Wigan on the way and coming so close to inflicting the first defeat of the season on Warrington.

I have to ask myself: what can we do in two years?

We all felt we were unlucky to have a try disallowed when Richard Irving kicked the ball on midway through the first half and if we had been awarded a try at that stage, under the posts as well, the whole course of the game might have changed.

It was another blow to lose Duncan Platt. He was carried off with ankle ligament damage and well though Richard Russell did as his replacement — and I thought he did very well — we missed Platt's long, loping runs through the Warrington defence which he had cut to ribbons several times before he was hurt.

I also thought our half-backs, Mike Ford and Brett Clark, did particularly well. Ford had an outstanding game and showed what a good player he is.

I am sure we will all benefit from the experience of having played in the Lancashire Cup final and the lessons we learned will probably stand us in good stead when the Regal Trophy starts in the next week or two.

In the meantime, we have to concentrate on the Second Division and we could not have a tougher match, so soon after our final, than to meet our arch rivals Halifax in tonight's encounter at Watersheddings.

The match should have been played last Sunday but it was postponed because we were in the final of the Lancashire competition and Halifax faced a Yorkshire Cup semi-final replay with Bradford.

In that respect both teams go into tonight's game level pegging and we will be out to avenge our early-season defeat at Thrum Hall.

My thanks, too, to all those fans who made the trip to St. Helens and gave us a resounding reception. Your support is truly appreciated and you can rest assured that we will leave no stone unturned in our efforts to produce some silverware.

Welcome to Halifax

HALIFAX come to Watersheddings tonight as the only unbeaten side in the Second Division — and a team Oldham will be anxious to beat after their 22-12 defeat at Thrum Hall on September 10.

Since then, the Yorkshiremen have been further strengthened by the arrival of Australian centre **Brian Hetherington**, a former Illawarra star who has made a big impression in his early games at Thrum Hall.

He is one of four Australians in the side which is led by captain-coach **John Dorahy**, the former Hull KR player known as 'Joe Cool' for what used to be his laid-back approach to goalkicking.

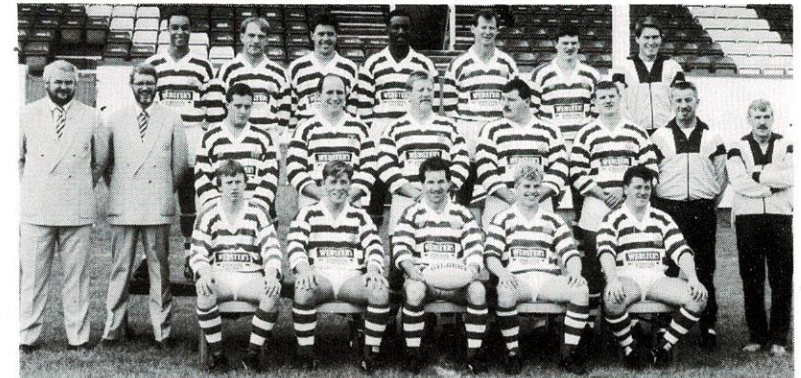
The others are prop **Lindsay Johnston** from South Sydney and long-serving centre **Tony Anderson**, who has been resident in the UK for five years now and, as such, is excluded from the club's overseas quota.

Anderson is fast and inventive and forms a pacy right-flank with former Keighley flier **Colin Atkinson**, who played a leading role for England in the recent Student Rugby League World Cup.

Halifax possess a big, strong pack — as they have done traditionally down the years — but they may have to take the field tonight without Dick Fairbank (John's brother), who received a five-match ban for an alleged offence in a recent game at Nottingham.

Fairbank appealed against the decision at a hearing last Friday and the selection of the Halifax pack for tonight's game will probably hinge on that outcome.

Another big man is prop **Brendan Hill**, who was used as substitute when Oldham played at Thrum Hall last month as he had only just arrived back from a summer stint in Australia.

Spotlight on . . . LEO CASEY

BUSTLING Leo Casey, Oldham's all-action prop forward, has been in outstanding form this season — and to prove it he is the season's first winner of the Evening Chronicle OB Man of the Month award.

Leo, who follows in the footsteps of previous winners John Cogger, Chris O'Sullivan, Andy Ruane and Mick Ford, received an inscribed medal, a £100 cheque and case of Boddies bitter from Boddingtons representative Matthew Smith, as a reward for his industrious efforts throughout September.

Few could argue with the choice as the Northern Ireland-born 24-year-old, who is married to wife Helen with a seven-month baby boy, Leo Junior, has been one of Oldham's most improved players.

Leo, who has lived in Oldham since he was three, earned this tribute from Evening Chronicle Rugby League journalist Roger Halstead, who commented: "Leo has shrugged off neck and thigh injuries to make a massive impact on Oldham's early-season performances. His form has been particularly impressive in the two Lancashire Cup wins at Barrow and St. Helens."

That neck injury, a trapped nerve which has plagued him for 12 months, hasn't stopped him becoming an essential member of the Oldham team four years after joining the club from St. Anne's Amateur RLFC.

Initially, Leo, who made his First Division debut in a 42-12 Lancashire Cup defeat against Leigh, found it difficult to win a regular first-team place but sheer hard work and determination have proved to be decisive.

He earned a regular first-team spot at the start of last season and hasn't looked back since.

After 45 first-team games and a dozen tries, he's one of the game's most improved and ambitious players. Speaking before last Saturday's Cup Final, he said: "I want to win



a major trophy with Oldham and hopefully tour with the Great Britain international squad."

Rugby has its downside, too, as Leo discovered before the Premiership Final victory against Featherstone. "I dislocated my shoulder a couple of days before the final and my wedding. Fortunately I wasn't wearing a sling for the marriage ceremony but I couldn't carry Helen across the threshold after!"

A major inspiration throughout his career has been Steve Deacon, a coach at St. Anne's, who has helped him throughout his amateur and professional career. Steve encouraged Leo to go to Australia where he played 14 First Grade games with Sydney County Club, Marellan. The season down under proved to be a great experience and helped bring Leo's game on leaps and bounds. Less helpful was a short spell on the wing for the Oldham 'A' team.

"I couldn't get in the reserves after an injury so to get back in the team I played on the wing for four or five weeks. The experiment was not too successful and I was glad to return to the forwards."

And the forwards is where Leo intends to stay as his powerful, all-action performances further enhance his growing reputation. That GB place might not be too far away!

Terrace Talk

"I COULD not hear a thing; I missed the sound of the hooter at the end, and if that's the support you can get when you are supposedly not a top team, then when you return to the top flight the support is going to be absolutely magnificent here at Watersheddings." This was Robin Whitfield speaking after that epic cup-tie defeat of Wigan.

Tony Barrow reflects on the cup run and obviously one of his best moments came at St. Helens. But whatever the outcome it's been a fabulous effort and particularly gratifying to have knocked out three 1st Division clubs on the way.

Well, tonight it's a return to league action. Another mighty effort will be needed to see off the challenge of Halifax, and also an opportunity to gain some revenge for that defeat at Thrum Hall in September. Who said Second Division rugby was easy!

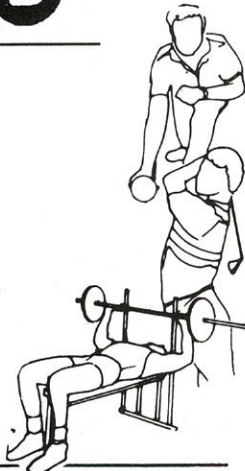

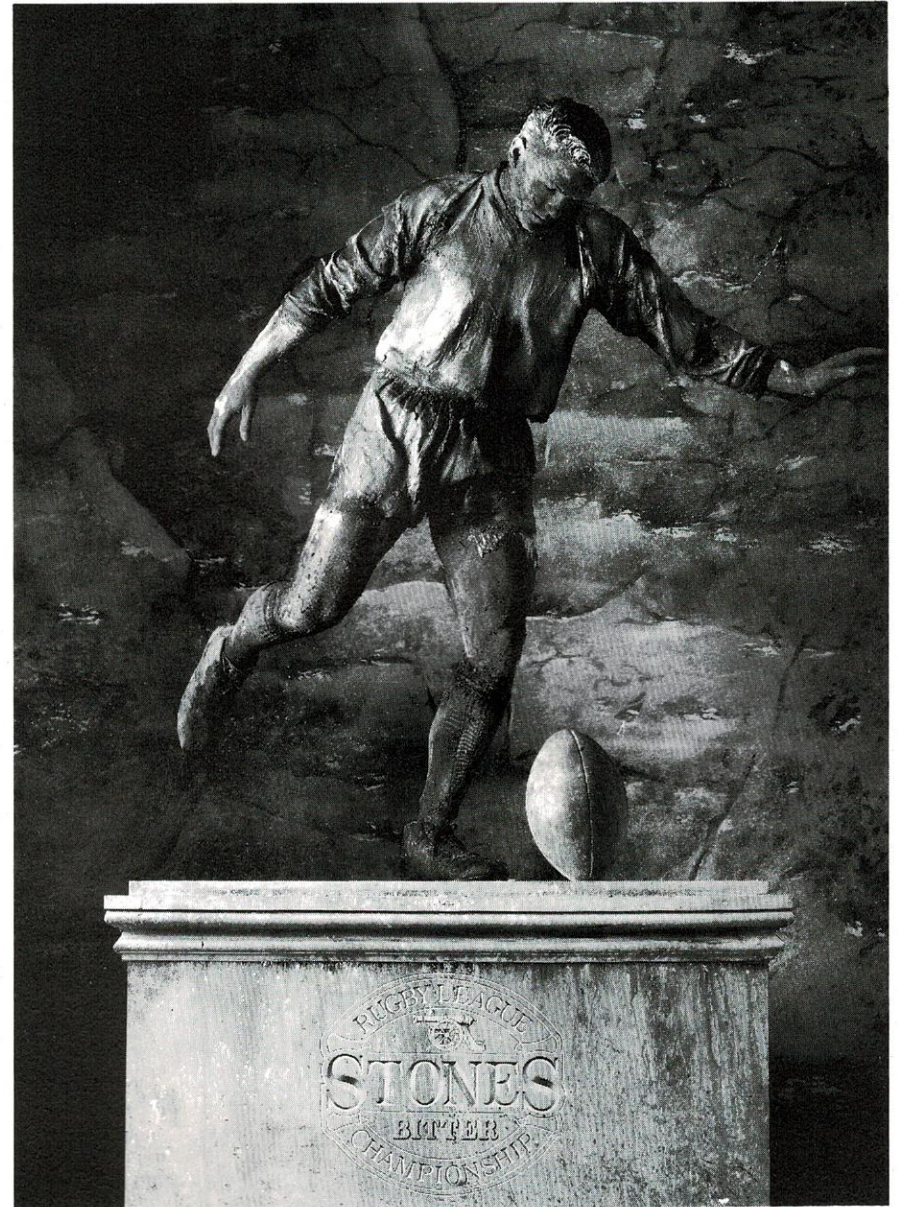

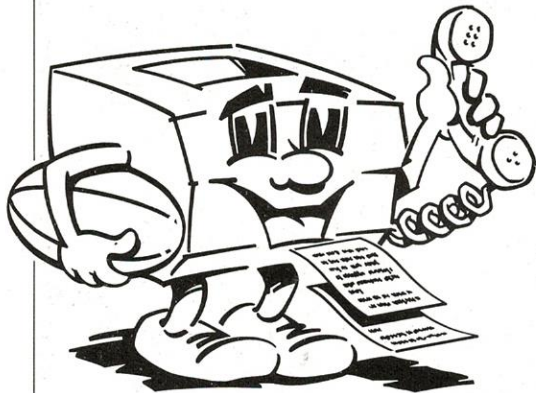
