



INTOUCH

NEW LAWS

- 1(a) Section 11 Law 7 to be deleted and the following inserted in its stead:
 - "7 A team in possession of the ball shall be allowed five (5) successive "play—the—balls", but if tackled a sixth time or a player in possession knocks on, passes forward or kicks the ball into touch on the full after the fifth play—the—ball, the ball not having been touched by an opponent in this period the ball shall be brought into play by an opposing player playing the ball at the point of tackle or infringement. The play—the—ball for this purpose shall not be counted for the purpose of the tackle count and the play—the—ball shall operate as provided for in Law 10 of this Section."
- 1(b) Insert new note to Law 7 of Section 11 reading as follows:-

"Point of infringement: 7 For the purposes of this Law the point of infringement in the case of a kick into touch on the full shall be the point from which the ball was kicked."

This law was at the experimental stage in Great Britain last season and now becomes International Law.

THE RUGBY FOOTBALL LEAGUE

Points of Play Relating to this Law

- Q How is play restarted if, after the fifth tackle, the player in possesion knocks-on or passes forward?
- A Handover at the point of infringement.
- Q How is play restarted if, after the fifth tackle, the player in possession runs into touch or is forced into touch?
- A Handover, 10m from the touch-line.
- Q How is play restarted if, after the fifth tackle, the ball is kicked directly into touch?
- A Handover at the point where the ball was last played, if played forward. If played backwards the handover is 10m in the field-of-play opposite where the ball entered touch.
- Q How is play restarted if, after the fifth tackle, the player in possession kicks the ball into touch, otherwise than on the full?
- A Scrum 10m in the field-of-play opposite where the ball entered touch. The non-kicking team to have the loose head and put-in.
- Q How is play restarted if, after the fifth tackle, the player in possession is tackled in his opponents in-goal area?
- A Scrum, 5m from the goal-line, opposite where the player was held (Section 12 Note to Law 1). The non-offending team (defenders) to have the loose head and put-in.



An injury-time converted try by David Noble earned the Dons their first-ever win over previously unbeaten Second

Division leaders Oldham, in a superb game at Tattersfield.

It looked as though the Dons, who had laid siege to the Oldham line in the last 20 minutes, were going to be denied a deserved victory until Noble chipped ahead and dived on the loose ball to earn his side a 20-18 win - their first league success in four games

Despite a brief flare-up early in the second half which resulted in Dons' skipper Mark Gibbon and Oldham loose-forward Terry Flanagan, one of five internationals in the visitors side, spending ten minutes in the sin-bin, the game was a tremendous advert for Second Division football

Loose-forward Andy Timson was named the Dons' man-of-the-match award, but Gibbon, Audley Pennant, half-backs John Evans and Kevin Jones and winger Neil Turner all pushed him hard.

Oldham dominated the early play territorially, but trailed 4-0 to two Noble penalties after 12 minutes.

The Dons looked set to increase their lead on 22 minutes when Turner broke strongly down the left flank, but his tryscoring pass to the supporting Evans was intercepted 15 yards out by Oldham's Paul Round.

Oldham drew level within 60 seconds when a well-worked move saw centre Kevin Meadows, squeeze in at the corner. Australian second-rower Steve Louis celebrated his home debut by forcing his way over for an unconverted try on 25

The strong-running Round, a £65,000 buy from St. Helens earlier this season, scattered several defenders before putting scrum-half lan Bates over for an unconverted try on 28 minutes.

The Dons bounced back to snatch a 14-10 interval lead with a superb 35th minute try. Jones side-stepping former Test fullback Mick Burke to score after John Stutchberry, Timson and Evans had all played their part in a sweeping 75-yard

Oldham hit back with a 55th minute try by Round and a try by prop Neil Clawson a couple of minutes later to lead 18-

The Dons looked beaten at this stage, but as at Whitehaven the previous week, they finished the stronger side and the Oldham line led a charmed life until Noble's late winner.

Sheffield Eagles grabbed the third promotion spot last season despite losing eight and drawing one of their 28 Second Division games.

PASSING BACK

5 years ago (11/11/84) **Bleak at Tattersfield**

Dons - 8pts Rochdale Hornets - 20pts

It looks like being another bleak winter at Tattersfield on the evidence of yesterday's 20-8 defeat against visiting Rochdale Homets. For there was little to enthuse about, in a scrappy encounter, as the Dons crashed to their sixth successive defeat.

Although their tackling was an improvement on the Mansfield game, the Dons often looked devoid of ideas when in possession and proved easy prey for the keen-spotting Hornets.

Once again the pack, with the possible exception of prop Peter Harrison, was disappointing and it was left to three quarters Dave Plange and Alan Hutchinson to provide such highlights as there were.

It was Plange who gave the Dons their only real look at the Rochdale line in the first half with an exciting 40-yard break, while wingman Hutchinson slotted in well at full-back after promising Kevin Harcombe had sustained a 32nd minute shoulder injury.

Boosted by Billy Platt's second minute penalty, Rochdale dominated the first half exchanges and would have added to converted

Well served by former Hull scrum-half Tony Dean, who interested the Dons earlier in the season, Rochdale increased their lead after 24 minutes of a dreadful second half when second rower Craig Whitehead sent hooker Kevin Lowe scurrying over for their third converted try.

Just when it looked as though the Dons wouldn't add to David Noble's 34th minute penalty, substitute back Gary Hawes rounded off their best move of the match to cross for a 78th minute converted try.

10 years ago (21/10/79) Dons show spirit

Dons - 2pts Halifax - 11pts

A casual observer would have had great difficulty deciding just which of these teams will be playing in Saturday's Yorkshire Cup

Halifax, just six days away from their big clash with Leeds, were given plenty of trouble by a Dons side who turned in a spirited performance in a bid of their first victory of the season.

The Dons got over the Halifax line on two occasions but both tries were ruled out by referee John Mean, who also awarded a staggering 19 penalties, mostly for minor offences, in the first half.

The game was only three minutes old when Dons winger Stewart Piper dived in for what he claimed afterwards was legitimate try

. . but it was disallowed on the intervention of a touch judge who claimed he had demolished the corner flag before touching down.
Then scrum half Trevor Denton found his way through the Halifax defence to stretch for the line but referee Mean ruled that he was just short.

The Dons did plenty of attacking and, with hooker Neil Gray getting the better of the experienced Dean Raistick in the scrums, they had plenty of chances.

But the tries did not come and team manager Don Vines said afterwards: "We did enough to win but didn't deserve to. That's the sad part but you've got to take your chances.

The new half back pairing of Trevor Denton and Gary Brook formed an improved link between the forwards and the backs and

Dave Pflaster, called up at full back, was impressive Gray had another fine game at hooker and Pete Moody will find it hard to reclaim his regular position after injury, while Graham Arrand did well in the second row.

But it was Halifax second row man Dave Busfield who scored the one vital try of the game two minutes after the interval.

He sold a brilliant dummy to stroll in near the Dons posts and leave full back Jimmy Birts an easy conversion to stretch the lead to

Birts kicked three other goals and the only Dons reply came from a penalty by Gray.

15 years ago (29/9/74) Dons – 3pts Hull K.R. – 33pts.

The consolation for the Dons is that they should not meet any stronger team than Rovers in the Rugby League's Second Division this

The Hull side, determined to return to Division One at the first attempt, paraded close season signings Neil Fox, Clive Sullivan both former Great Britain stars - and Bernard Watson in their back division.

Fox kicked six goals from seven attempts and Watson scored a try . . . but Sullivan hardly got a look-in.

Dons left-wing threequarter Graham Arrand kept him under close surveillance and then completed a tremendous performance by rounding Sullivan for his side's only try.

Trialist centre Dave Varey did the spadework to set up that chance and turned in a promising performance.


The only time Sullivan escaped from Arrand during the 80 minutes Varey chased back and bundled him into touch a yard from the comer flag

Dons scrum half Ron Spiring, who got through a lot of work, kicked ahead, ran round the Hull defenders and then failed to ground the ball cleanly.

Full-back Terry Lawrence, who earned applause for fielding a succession of high kicks while under pressure, missed two shots a goal before KR had scored.


But Dons coach Ted Strawbridge said: "I'm not too downhearted. I didn't think that there was as much difference in the side as the score suggests."


