



It was good, too, to see John Henderson and Des Foy back in harness the other night and their return makes up, to some extent, for the loss of Paul Round, Duncan Platt, Keith Newton and Colin Hawkyard, although there is a lot of competition now and it won't be easy for anyone to break into the side.

Poor Colin! He has had some desperate luck hasn't he? The least we can all do is to rally round in his benefit year.

Spotlight on . . . JOHN FIELDHOUSE

AS ONE of two ever presents in the Oldham team John Fieldhouse has been one of the major forces behind the club's fabulous Lancashire Cup run and rapid ascent up the Second Division.

Now the 27-year-old red-headed fiery forward, who signed for Oldham before the start of the season for £45,000, has received suitable recognition for his outstanding performances by winning the October Evening Chronicle OB Man of the Month award.

This most recent accolade is the latest in a memorable career with some of the game's top clubs — five years with Warrington, two and half years with Widnes and St. Helens and three months with Oldham — with the icing on the cake being nine GB international caps.

When he was first picked for the GB squad several of the game's commentators doubted the wisdom of Maurice Bamford's selection but John repaid the GB coach's faith with interest by picking up the Man of the Series award in the drawn Test series against New Zealand in 1985.

Further caps were in the offing but a disappointing two and half years at St. Helens, where he had to put up with nasty injuries to his wrist and knee, left John in the international wilderness.

Despite the setback at St. Helens, John is determined to get back in a GB international jersey. That's why he's joined Oldham, even though the club was relegated last season.

"I joined Oldham to achieve three things. First to help Oldham achieve First Division status. Second, to win a major cup for the spectators who in the three months I've been here have given me brilliant support and, third, on a personal level to win back my international jersey."

"Oldham, under Tony Barrow's influence, are a good side with good players. Originally, I was undecided about dropping down into the Second Division because it might have affected my chances of playing internationally."

"In the Second Division you have to play twice as well as the rest to get in the squad. But I am confident of my ability to play the game at the highest levels. I've proved it before and I'll prove it again with Oldham."

John, who is married to wife Maureen with two children, Kelly, 3, and Ryan, 18 months, has set his sights high this season. Promotion, a place in the GB-New Zealand tour party this summer and a trip to those famous twin towers.

"Another trip to Wembley would be nice. I've been twice with St. Helens but Oldham have yet to get there. However, it must be our turn soon!" says the all-action forward who has won the hearts of Oldham fans with his never-say-die attitude.

Certainly if John maintains his early season form he could find himself back in the First Division and knocking on the GB squad's door.
