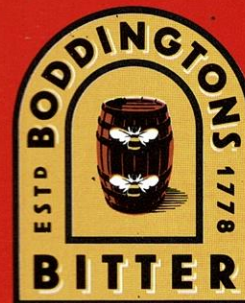
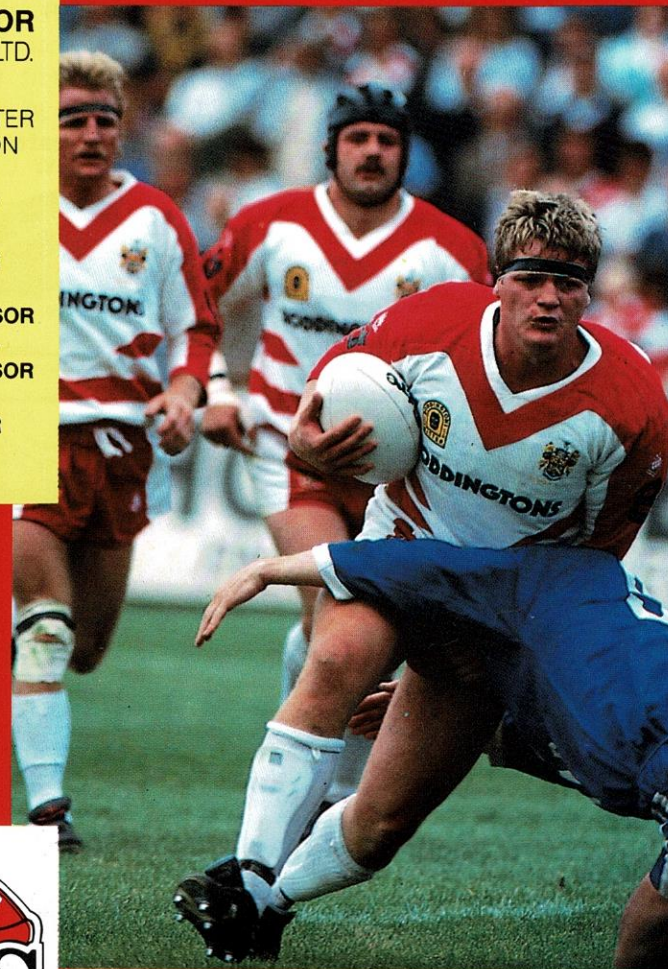

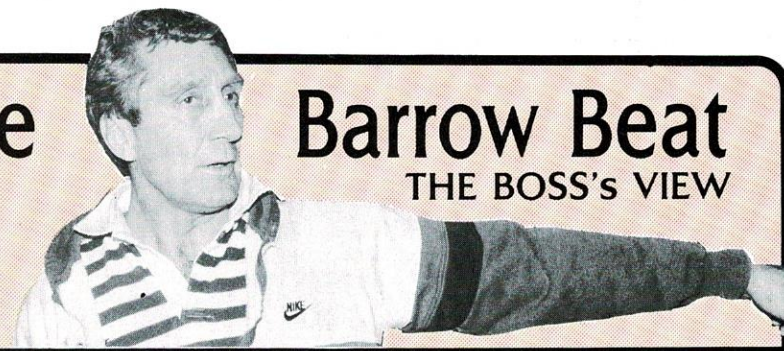

## The Barrow Beat

THE BOSS'S VIEW



I'M sure most fans were taken by surprise when the club announced the transfer-listing of Paul Round at £95,000.

It must have been a bolt out of the blue for everyone, but I was left with no alternative but to recommend a strong line of action to the directors when the player telephoned me and said he would not be coming to any more training sessions.

Paul, of course, is still under contract to Oldham, and this is just one more example of players appearing to believe that the contract system is for their benefit only.

The contract system seems to work much better in Australia, where both parties accept that the agreement is binding throughout its duration.

Here in England, the system is not working as it was intended because many players seem to think that the contract is for their benefit only. They are quick to shout 'contract' is something does not suit them but they seem to forget about its very existence at other times.

I am sure the time is not long away when a club will take a player to court for breach of contract.

Players must come to terms with the fact that a contract is a two-way agreement.

The players will quickly draw attention to the details of the contract if they feel something is wrong — and quite rightly, too — but they have to accept that they must fulfil their obligations to the letter as well.

As a general rule, contracted players are

now earning far more than they used to do and they have the added benefit of getting paid even if they are out of the game through injury, depending on the terms of their contract, of course.

It is just not on for any player to try and dictate to the club what he will or will not do if it is contrary to his agreement and I will not accept it from anyone.

During my Warrington days, Andy Gregory was involved in a similar dispute and I took a strong line with him, too.

At any Rugby League club — just as at any football club or even in business and commercial life — there can be only one boss or governing body, and there must be rules which are adhered to.

At a rugby club you can only have one man making team decisions and that is the coach or manager or whatever you wish to call him.

If the boss's authority is undermined, you quickly have anarchy and the whole thing crumbles and falls to pieces.

That's why Paul Round is on the list . . . no player is bigger than the club, and especially so when, as in this case, the club has met its part of the bargain to the letter.

Over and above any contract agreements, the players here get the best possible treatment, as many who have been at other clubs will vouch for.

It must come as a kick in the teeth to the directors, as well as to me, when something like this happens.

WITH half the season nearly gone, now is the time to start thinking about who you are going to select for the Boddingtons-sponsored OB Player of the Year.

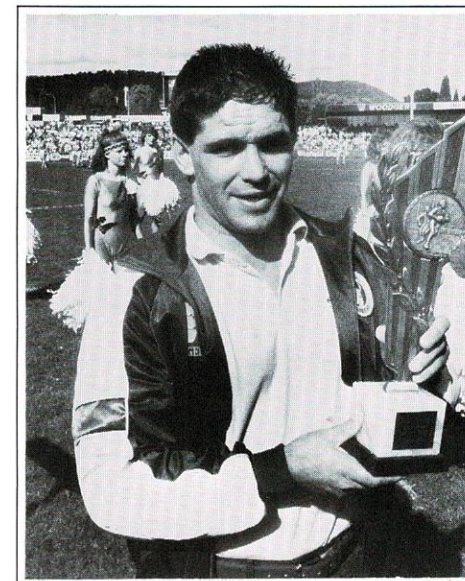

ONE of the players most missed during Oldham's recent run of appalling injuries was bustling, all-action forward Keith Newton, known to fans and players alike simply as 'Beefy'.

Tragically, Keith had broken his thumb in the 14-3 home win against fellow promotion contenders Halifax, ending a run of nine consecutive appearances and depriving the club of his invaluable services. Who could forget his memorable effort against mighty Wigan in the Lancashire Cup semi-final when he shrugged off three tackles to crash over the line to help set up an Oldham victory?

That hand injury is behind him as the 25-year-old second row forward is back in action and looking to return to the form that made him an automatic choice at the start of the season.

Intensive training and sheer hard work in the gym and on the training pitch has paid off in his last two games against First Division St. Helens and promotion rivals Rochdale.

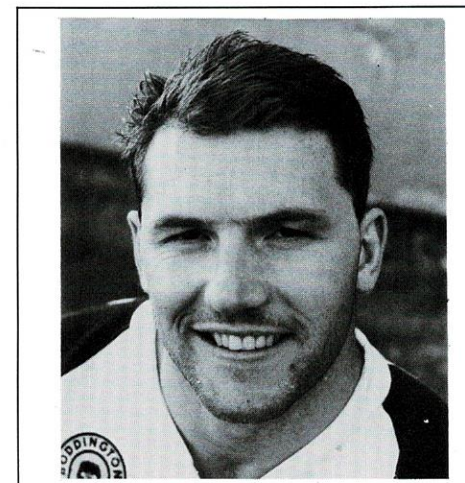
Comments Keith: "The break was quite a bad one but I wanted to get back to training as soon as I possibly could — there are far worse injuries than a broken thumb!"

Fans who saw Keith in action against St. Helens would hardly have believed he had just returned from a major injury. But the dogged determination that enabled him to enjoy a successful comeback has epitomised Keith's career from the early days when he played for local amateur sides, representing Lancashire Under-17 and Under-19 teams in the process.

Keith played both codes of rugby before deciding to turn professional, signing for Widnes at the tender age of seventeen.

Putting pen to paper for a major Rugby League club like Widnes was every boy's dream come true, although Keith says that his move to Oldham in December, 1988, was the best he's made to date.

"Without doubt, one of the greatest things about playing at Watersheddings is the loyalty of our fans — they're the best supporters I've ever had. At



Widnes the fans on the terraces would be all too quick to knock you but here they always give you a second chance."

Versatile Keith — he's played centre and wing — believes he has found his ideal position in the pack. "Second row suits me best because I fit the size and have the speed the position requires," says the likeable forward, who still lives in Widnes with his wife, Marie Ann, and two young boys, Sam, 6, and two-year-old John.

When Keith's not delivering the goods on the pitch he can be found working hard running his own home delivery business.

"Whatever you do in life, you need to apply yourself. Whether it is running a business or playing rugby."

Now fully recovered from injury, Keith is looking forward to more hard work. "My long-term ambition is to earn a place with the 1992 Australian tour party, although my more immediate goal is to get there this summer playing for one of the local sides — after Oldham have won promotion to the First Division, where they and their fans belong!"

A SETBACK at Rochdale will serve as a warning to everyone — that no team has a divine right to return to a higher grade of rugby. However, one good thing to come from the defeat is perhaps the players will now be doubly determined to guard against any future slip-ups. But make no mistake, Hornets themselves are certain to cause problems for teams other than ourselves, and it appears that they will have a lot to say about just who finally emerges triumphant in the quest for First Division rugby.

One player who won't be lacking in determination and spirit is our skipper, John Cogger, who is under no illusions just how hectic life can be in the Second Division. But whatever happens, as John himself declared, a move to Watersheddings for him was perfect. "A lot of clubs took more than a passing interest in me during my time at Runcorn, but Barrow were the only ones to come up with a realistic offer. But I didn't really fancy a move up there."

So were there any such worries about a move to Watersheddings? "None at all. Oldham are an ambitious, go-ahead club, and even though we didn't quite do enough to remain in the top flight last term, the challenge of playing in the top division was an opportunity, and ambition to prove myself in the best company."

I suggested to John that during his Second Division days with Runcorn, he earned himself a reputation for being a little bit of a hot-head. "One of the biggest problems I found in playing at Runcorn was the responsibility of trying to do almost everything myself. During matches, I got so involved I frequently found that I was trying to cover about five different positions at once, which is impossible, and being a naturally aggressive type of player, it probably seemed much worse than it actually was.

"In fact, when Oldham first came in for me, I was very concerned about the reception I would receive from the fans, but Tony Barrow assured me that as long as I played with the same determination for Oldham that they would respond, and thankfully that appears to be what's happened?"

So what has been the biggest change so far? "The big difference in playing for Oldham means that I can concentrate on doing my own job, knowing that everyone else is producing their own efforts in the cause of the team?"

Any sadness at leaving Runcorn? "I will always have a soft spot for them, and continually keep a check on their progress. I have lots of friends there and wish they could have a good spell to lift them out of the doldrums."

Finally, how does John view the current situation at Watersheddings! "Like most people, I cannot understand the Second Division fixtures, which may be a bit unfair, but we definitely have the players here who are more than capable of bringing top-flight rugby back to Oldham, and I'm just glad to be part of it."

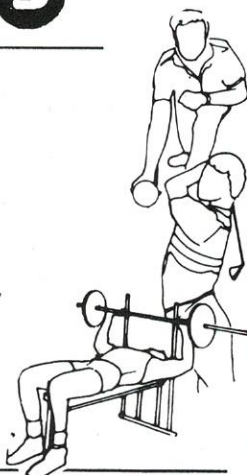

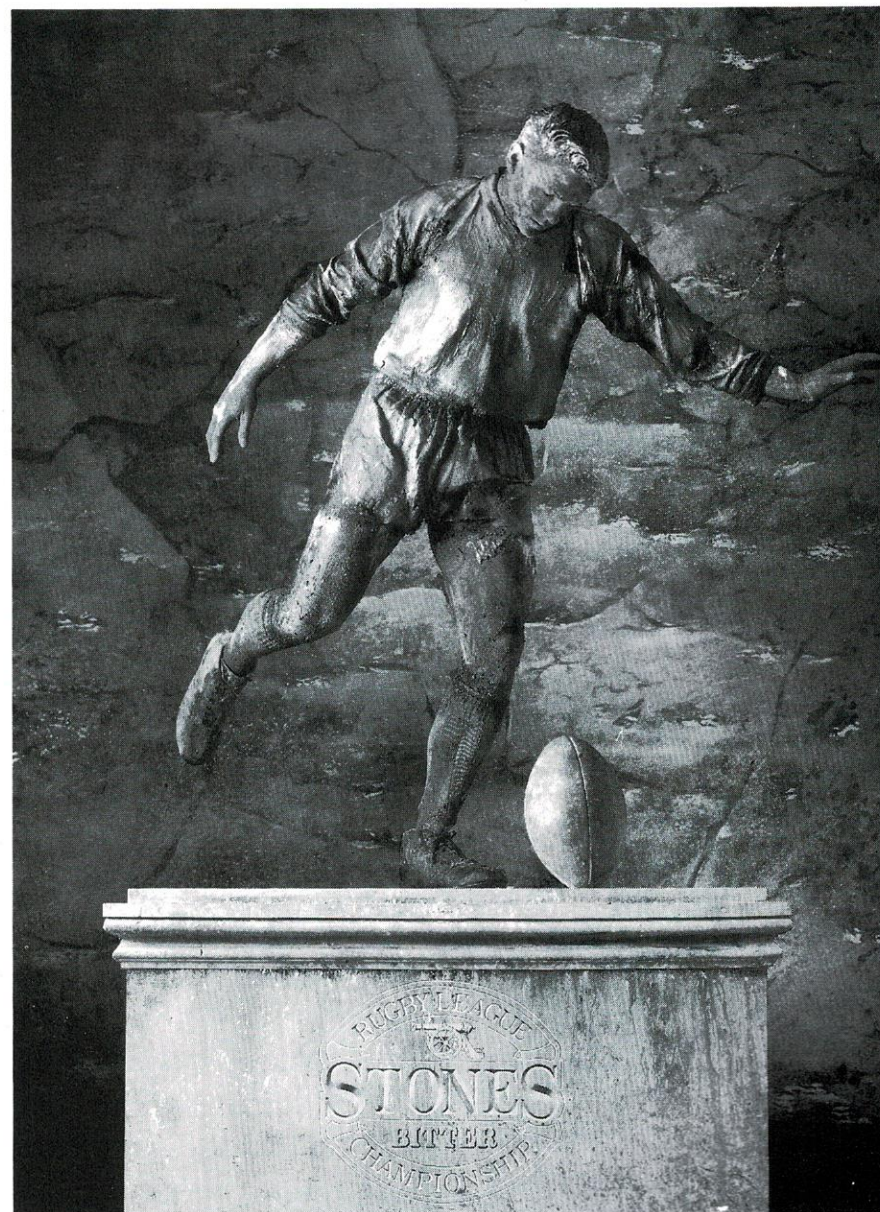

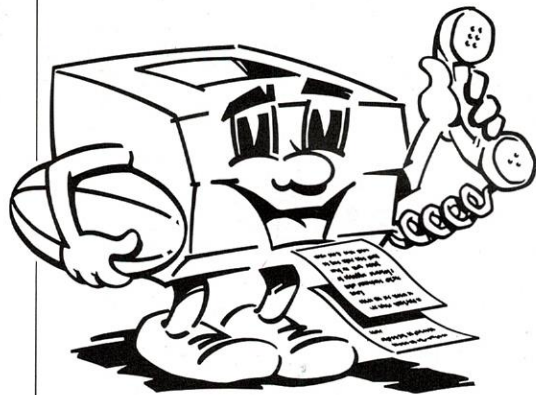
