

# WE'RE PUTTING OUR SHIRTS ON OLDHAM





THE Challenge Cup competition is with us again and, once more, it is sure to throw up its fair share of thrills, spills, drama and upsets even before the big day at Wembley dawns.

Wembley! The very name conjures up thoughts of many of Rugby League's greatest moments and it sets the adrenalin running just to think of the place.

I was lucky to go there twice as a player . . . first in 1966 as a substitute with St. Helens and then in 1971 as standoff to Alex Murphy when Leigh pulled off one of the greatest Wembley shocks of all time by defeating Leeds.

My greatest wish now would be to go back to the famous stadium as a coach and lead out Oldham for the first time in the club's history behind my chairman, John Chadwick.

A lot of people in these parts think that Wembley would mean more to them than those in other parts of the Rugby League territory because, for Oldham, it would be a first visit.

While I can well understand how they feel, let me tell you that the attraction of Wembley never fades even if you have been on numerous occasions.

Once you have sampled the atmosphere and the big-day build-up, you want more, probably more than when you are going for the first time.

I will never forget my Wembley days. The whole experience was brilliant — something I will never forget as long as I live.

A few of the Oldham boys have played

at Wembley for other teams — such as Brett Clark, Mike Ford and John Fieldhouse — and I'm sure they will all tell you the same.

There is a magic about the Challenge Cup and Wembley that makes the tournament unique and it is with that in mind that we approach today's preliminary round tie against Huddersfield.

We would have preferred not to be in the preliminary round, obviously, but we have been blessed with a home tie, at least, and another home tie, against Workington, awaits the winners of today's confrontation.

In that respect, at least, we cannot grumble about what Lady Luck has thrown at us, and everyone can rest assured that we will not be taking Huddersfield lightly just because we beat them here in a Regal Trophy game a week or two ago.

They gave us a few problems in that match and we know they will be coming here today well prepared to seek revenge.

The winners play Workington and many Oldham fans will remember that the Cumbrians pulled off a tremendous Challenge Cup shock here a year or two ago on a cold and frosty night at Watersheddings.

Let that be a warning to those who say that cup shocks are limited to the soccer game. They happen in the Challenge Cup, too ... and it is up to us to see that such a turn-up does not happen today.

OLDHAM coach Tony Barrow has spent many thousands of pounds on players during his spells in charge at Warrington and Oldham, although one of his best buys has proved to be Richard Russell, who cost him next to nothing.

Already this season Richard has played at standoff, centre, full back and hooker, replacing the injured Andy Ruane when he broke his thumb against St. Helens.



Saus Richard: "My dad is a real slave-driver when it comes to training. Having been successful in the game himself, he knows just how much hard work is really involved and it helps me a lot to know my family is really behind me".

Support is something Richard is not short of whether it's from his family, his girlfriend Tracey or from the fans on the terraces.

Says Richard: "Oldham has got to be one of the most tightly-knit clubs I know — everybody involved is concerned with your well-being. The team spirit is fantastic, with the players, coaches and directors always watching out for you. 





THE Rugby League Challenge Cup. The mere sound of the most prestigious trophy in Rugby League history is enough to raise hopes and aspirations. This year we find ourselves having to contend with a preliminary round stage before we can earn the right to play Workington Town in the first round proper.

Many clubs are, of course, unhappy with the situation of having to play preliminary ties, and have requested the league to use a "seeding" of clubs, which would allow the big guns to enter at a later stage.

I must admit I personally feel that with a large number of excellent amateur clubs who would dearly love to battle for a place in the first round draw, then perhaps it is time to allow more of them the opportunity, but overall it is a typical Catch 22 situation . . . that being whichever way you turn and whatever you do, somebody will argue against it.

Moving on to our own cup destiny, it would appear on the face of it that we have been given a golden opportunity to progress into round two, but cup ties do not always work out that way, as any history in any sport will show, and, of course, that's all part of the attraction of cup tie football and that special romance which is always associated with cup action.

So far this season we have faired pretty well in the cup competitions, and obviously with home advantage our prospects look bright. But Huddersfield themselves have a chequered past and must not be taken lightly.

Oldham have a double mission this season with a return to the top flight taking precedence over anything else — but that is where the tricky part comes, because a good cup run can sometimes be distracting to the initial aim. That's not to say it would be a good thing for Oldham to make an early exit, because a good run can have a complete opposite effect, as we have seen already this season.

It's certainly brought out the best in the players, particularly leading up to the Lancashire Cup final. But as history now shows, we have suffered formwise a little after the disappointment of the final defeat. Injuries have not helped, nor would a backlog of fixtures, and all these considerations have to be taken into account.

But to his great credit, coach Tony Barrow has never once tried to offer the injuries as an excuse for failure — and I don't think he ever will. His attitude is one of "It's no use moaning about

what might have been, it is up to the players who wear the jerseys to show pride and commitment." And that's the sort of attitude that wins cup ties.




