





#### FIRST TEAM FOCUS

FULHAM 6

ROVERS 60

(Played 17th December, 1989).

With Fulham fancying their chances of presenting us with a tough challenge on their own North London ground, our pre-match preparation had to be just right.

The result would suggest that this was indeed the case. We travelled to the London area the previous day. Not because a lively weekend in the Capital was planned, but we were taking no risks of motorway traffic problems or weather delays. At our West of London hotel we studied Fulham performances on video, on the morning of the match our players went to have a look at the Chiswick Stadium, and as a result of what we saw it was decided not to arrive at the ground too early!

The playing surface showed the effects of a match played there the previous day, Fulham had early advantage of wind and rain, but Rovers made light of the miserable conditions. **Mike Fletcher** opened affairs with an early penalty, then converted the opening try, finished off by **Greg Austin** from **Jimmy Irvine's** speedy break.

Anthony Sullivan was next to race over from a skilled passing move, before strong work by Colin Armstrong led to Mike Fletcher being blatantly obstructed and the referee awarded the try. (Statisticians please note, Rugby League records indicate the centre was the scorer and not Garry Clark as erroneously reported in the Local press). With goals to both tries Rovers were 20 points up in almost as many minutes.

The home side enjoyed a brief look in with six points, but right on the break **Anthony Sullivan** was sent sprinting clear to give us a 24 - 6 lead, a pleasing scoreline since we had the elements at our backs for the second half.

Inside four minutes **David Lightfoot** sliced his way clean through to increase our lead. Some tries, they say, are worth going a long way to see, and those fans who took time and inconvenience to make the long trip to Chiswick now saw a real cracker. **Andy Thompson** started it with a break only five yards from his own line. He found **Greg Austin** at his elbow for the Aussie centre to leave everyone trailing in his wake as he sped to the posts. **Garry Clark** was next to cross. Then **Dvid Bishop** looked to have missed a chance, but quickly recovered and burst his way over. **David Lightfoot** added his second before **Mike Fletcher** rounded things off with a try and his 10th goal of the afternoon.

Though they did not feature amongst the scorers, the prompting and skilled leadership of **Mike Smith** was much in evidence and there was some powerful foraging from props **Colin Armstrong** and **Bryan Niebling**, though this was essentially a fine team effort.

That teams cannot afford to be too complacent however was evidenced that afternoon when Bramley, not seriously regarded as promotion contenders, beat league leaders Rochdale at Rochdale comprehensively. The day's results thus saw Rovers move up to the top of the table.

Although it is several years since we last met, then under the briefer title of York, recent meetings with the Wasps have proved to be dour affairs. This Boxing Day fare proved little different.

After 38 minutes **Mike Fletcher** kicked an angled penalty goal, and early in the second half missed a straightforward kick when the ball rebounded from an upright.

On the hour York fumbled a pass close to Rovers 25. **Greg Austin** snapped up the loose ball and raced away from his pursuers on a thrilling 70 yard run to the posts and gave **Mike Fletcher** an easy conversion. A minute later **David Bishop** made one of his typical blockbusting runs and a precision pass sent **Anthony Sullivan** flying for the corner to complete a brilliant try and an exciting two minute spell.

For the rest there was little to write home, or anywhere else, about. Fans anticipating another scoring feast were disappointed. Tight defences ruled on both sides for the most part - York didn't get a single kick at goal - whilst a number of scoring chances went begging.

Too many players on both sides were below form, but there was a customary 80 minutes of graft from Colin Armstrong, David Bishop always looked likely to make the vital break, and the man-of-the-match award went to Bryan Niebling for a powerful foraging display.



The stumbling display display against Ryedale York was followed by another performance riddled with errors at Hunslet to round off the Old Year. So uncertain was our form in fact that we allowed the home side to snatch a shock lead. A fine try it was too, as our defence was ripped wide open and Hunslet really looked the part as they supported each other well to race over half the length of the field.

Down by 6 points, we reduced the arrears when **Jim Irvine** was able to score against his former team mates, and then on 26 minutes **Greg Austin** was sent sprinting to the line. He was felled by a tackle which earned instant dismissal for player-coach and fellow Aussie Graeme Jennings, but was still able to spin round and dive for the try, to give us a slender 8-6 interval advantage.

Against a short handed defence, tries started to come in the second half, but we continued to be our own worst enemies and fluffed probably twice as many chances as we scored. **Greg Austin** was on hand to bring his match tally to four tries, usually by capitilising on the charging runs of David Bishop or the distribution skills of **Mike Smith**. The latter scored one himself when our tacklers forced a Hunslet forward back over his own line where he dropped the ball to give the Robins' skipper the simplest of touchdowns.

Garry Clark added a spectacular individual try when he broke out of Rovers quarter and sprinted 75 yards to the posts, leaving the Hunslet full back rooted to the spot as the winger raced round him. Mike Fletcher landed four goals but uncharacteristically missed rather more, and Hunslet had the last word with a closing try. The match ended with another typical error as Austin moved inside, ignoring the unmarked Sullivan, only to be tackled. The final mistake in an error ridden game which, despite the winning margin, proved another unsatisfactory performance by many of the players.

#### NOTTINGHAM CITY 0 ROVERS 58

(Played 7th January 1990)

Rovers started the New Year as Second Division leaders with ten straight league wins behind us and our first visit to the Harvey Haddon Athletic Stadium on the programme. Facing competition from the Nottingham Forest verses Manchester United F.A. third round tie, the attendance was below 900, with many of those favouring the red-and-whites.

In the opening stages on their very short pitch Nottingham buzzed about spiritedly and tackled well, looked lively and plucky, trying to move the ball about and not keep it tight.

Once Rovers started to send the ball out wide in a much improved display we showed far too much power and pace for the home side, who rarely visited our 25 throughout the game. After ten minutes **David Lightfoot** pounded up from full back and the support was there to send **Anthony Sullivan** clear to the corner. **Mike Fletcher** found it too far out for the conversion, but added a splendid goal from touch three minutes later after **Mike Smith** completed a round of sweet flowing football. Another three minutes and Greg Austin sped over after more flowing football.

On thirty minutes came the try of the day as **David Bishop** and **Mike Smith** got **Greg Austin** away from his own 25. The centre served **Anthony Sullivan** near halfway and the winger went fifty yards, turning inside and outside to outwit the cover and score his second unconverted try. Another 'Bish' break and skilfully delayed pass by **Mike Smith** saw the supporting **Jim Irvine** on hand to stroll over. This time **Mike Fletcher** added the goal and Rovers went in 24 - 0 ahead.

Shortly after the interval **Mike Smith's** superb break and flighted pass got **Greg Austin** away from the 25, the move finishing with **Anthony Sullivan** flying to the posts to complete his hat trick. **Mike Fletcher** goaled, as he did when **Bryan Niebling** plunged over after typical break by **Chris Rudd**.

Greg Austin crossed again at threequater time, Mike Fletcher adding the goal, then substitute Paul Lyman went under the posts, and Tony Botica soon followed. Mike Fletcher converted both tries, and rounded off the scoring with Rovers eleventh try of the afternoon. He was unable to convert, but his tally of seven goals left him on 98 for the season, top of the League's goalkicking chart, ahead of Paul Loughlin on 96.

Our win represented the biggest winning margin away from home in the history of the club.



Rovers 'A' got their Year off to a good start with this well merited victory over a strong Castleford side in a fixture which was a repeat of the Yorkshire Senior Cup Final we won earlier in the season.






#### HALLAS STILL UNLUCKY
