



I think they proved that at Widnes last Sunday, didn't they?

We still see promotion as our priority, of course, and every league point is vital not only to ensure that we go up but as a possible step towards the title or a place in the top two for a home run in the Premiership.

We have a terrific three months to look forward to . . . and I know you will back us every inch of the way as we look for glory on three fronts: the Challenge Cup, promotion or the Second Division championship, and the Premiership with its big day out at Old Trafford.

Spotlight on... **RICHARD IRVING**

ONE of the unsung heroes who has been a sheer revelation during Oldham's triumphant season is speedy, tough tackling winger Richard Irving.

So far this season the young 22-year-old has played 21 matches and scored nine tries, impressive statistics which do not take into account his immaculate work on defence.

But even though Richard has been one of the outstanding successes of a very successful season, he may well have been lost to Rugby League for good had the lure of soccer proved too great.

Football was his first love during his early teens and would have remained so but for a school-teacher spotting the potential and encouraging him to give Rugby League a chance.

Richard duly gave the game a chance and hasn't looked back in the seven years since.

Comments Richard: "I'd always refused to even try rugby at school but when I did finally give it a go I was hooked right away and I hung up my football boots for good!"

After playing rugby league for Rawthorpe High School, Huddersfield, and Mold Green Amateurs, winning the Yorkshire and Barlow GB awards, Richard fulfilled his ambition by turning professional when he signed for Oldham at 19.


"Signing for Oldham was without doubt the best move I have ever made. Being given a chance to play professionally for the first time with the Watersheddings team was an absolute privilege.

"In the past three and a half years I couldn't have asked for more from either the team or our fans. They have always given me a fair crack of the whip."

Loyal support is vital to team morale and Huddersfield-born Richard feels that the Oldham players are lucky to have such dedicated fans.

"Our supporters are really something. They stick by us even when the chips are down and such a feeling of unity means our victories are more precious because of that!"

One such moment was last Sunday's epic defeat



of mighty Widnes 16-4 in the quarter-finals of the Challenge Cup which shook the Rugby League world.

"I have never experienced such brilliant team spirit as I did last Sunday. We all went out feeling positive and our fans did wonders for our confidence. We owed it to them to get through, just as we owe it to them to get to Wembley this year. And I know we can do it," says an elated Richard.

Making it to Wembley is Richard's immediate goal but he has already set his sights on the Great Britain squad.

"I am aware of how much dedication is required to make it to represent your country, but it's something I am really working towards. Every sportsman dreams of playing for a Test side as it's the height of any career and the true test of ability."

Playing for Oldham has helped. "I've always been pushed in the right direction at Oldham but at the same time I have never come up against any 'superstars' who get preferential treatment. Fellow team members are always ready to help you out and we keep our competition between ourselves and our opposition!"

Welcome to Huddersfield

The men of Fartown today make their third visit to Watersheddings this season, having been beaten here 22-8 in the second round of the Regal Trophy on December 10 and 30-8 in the preliminary round of the Silk Cut Challenge Cup on January 14.

Since they last played here, Huddersfield have strengthened their pack with the signing from Nottingham on loan of Oldhamer Craig Whitehead, a boy who will not feel in strange surroundings here today as he was brought up at Watersheddings when he and his family occupied the house attached to the pavilion.

By all accounts Craig impressed Huddersfield while on loan and there is a possibility that a more permanent deal will have been fixed up by now, thus allowing the Oldham-born lad, who began his career at Rochdale Hornets, to return to the old haunts of his youth today.

Whitehead apart, the side will not show much change from their previous visits, with an explosive danger man at full back in Australian Wally Gibson, who scored his third hat-trick of the season at Workington recently.

Prior to last Sunday's home game against Dewsbury, Huddersfield spent a seven-week period on their travels but they came out of the spell with two hefty wins at Workington and Nottingham in which they scored 13 tries in the process.

Looking ahead to the return fixture at Fartown on March 25, we give advance warning that the game might have to be all-ticket. The current Fartown capacity is 5,770, but this may have to be cut further unless essential ground-safety work is completed in time. More news of this will be forthcoming nearer the time.

Bearing in mind that Oldham will be taking a big crowd to Fartown the all-ticket regulation is a distinct possibility, as is the possible switch of the Huddersfield-Halifax derby to the Huddersfield Town soccer ground at Leeds Road.

Huddersfield are working desperately hard on and off the pitch to revive the club's former glories and the players will be going all out today to make it third time lucky on their trips to Watersheddings this season, especially so as Oldham will be playing their third game in eight days following the midweek match at Keighley.


But the last word is reserved for Tony Barrow, and when I reminded him that there is still a job to do in the Second Division he hadn't lost sight of it.




