WELCOME

Welcome to our visitors from Oldham for this evenings re-arranged fixture. Congratulations are in order for the men from the Watersheddings for the magnificent Cup victory at Widnes last Sunday which puts them just 80 minutes away from a first-ever Wembley appearance.

Oldham are riding on the crest of a wave - having already appeared in the Lancashire cup Final, and now reaching the Semi-finals of the Challenge cup to compliment their good league form which finds them challenging for promotion and the second division championship.

Compared to our own dismal league form Oldham will be confident of taking the league points this evening but I'm certain astute coach Tony Barrow will be remaining his charges of the last time the two teams met back in October when a gallant first half Keighley performance rocked the Lancastrians to take a 14 point lead at one time. In fact it was only through over adventurous play by Keighley in their own 25 that allowed Oldham to capitalise on our unforced errors and claw their way back into the game. Extra pace told in the second half and Oldham ran out winners 50-34. Lots of entertainment for the spectators but both coaches will be looking on "improvement in their teams" defensive capabilities for tonights return fixture.

OLDHAM PEN PICTURES

JOHN FIELDHOUSE - Recent Signing from St. Helens, Gt. Britain International ~man of the series against the Kiwis, has settled in and playing the sort of Rugby that made him an international.

RICHARD IRVING - Signed for Oldham in August 1987 from Moldgreen ARLFC and impressed coach Eric Fitzsimmons with his strong-running wing displays, scoring tries against Keighley and Rochdale. Scorer of just two tries against Wigan and Wakefield-last season.

JOHN HENDERSON - Signed from Leigh club, this prolific try-scoring centre suffered through injury for much of last season and scored 8 tries. Scored 31 tries in 1985-86 and another 27 in 1986-87 for Leigh, gaining selection for Lancashire and scoring a try in a 22-22 draw with Papua New Guinea in 1987. Guested for Sydney Wests in 1985.

CHARLIE McALISTER - A sensational capture from Bradford & Bingley RUFC in February 1988 scoring 9 tries and 15 goals in 18 appearances in his debut season. Had a summer spell in Australia with the Newcastle Knights in 1988, improving his defensive abilities. Kicked four goals in the 1988 Second Division Premiership Final. New Zealander with great strength and pace and the ability to play in a variety of back roles.

KEVIN MEADOWS - One of the First Division's most under rated wingers, having previously played for St. Helens and Warrington. Scored 16 tries in 38 appearances in 1987-88. In his second spell at Oldham where he once scored 5 tries in a First Division match against Salford in 1984. Seven tries last season included a hat-trick in a 64-2 Lancashire Cup slaughter of Workington.

DUNCAN PLATT - Goalkicking full-back signed in November 1988, from Widnes. Brother of Wigan and Great Britain forward Andy. He was in Widnes Premiership winning team in 1988 and contributed 80 points from 16 appearances in their championship win. Excelled for Oldham and scored 41 goals and 98 points in his debut season. Kicked 2 goals on his debut here at Thrum Hall in the 12-0 win last December.

RICHARD RUSSELL - Oldham's major off-season signing, coming from Wigan, where he had gained Great Britain Colts and two Under 21 international selections in 1987 and 1988. Played in every back role at Central Park but received very few opportunities last season. Represented Wigan in the 1987 Lancashire Cup and Premiership Finals.

MIKE FORD - BARLA Young Lions tourist to New Zealand in 1983, signed for Wigan from the Oldham, St. Annes A.R.L.F.C. in August of that year. Won Challenge Cup (1985), Lancashire Cup (1985 and 1986) and John Player (1986 and 1987) honours, before joining Leigh. Gained four Under 21 international caps between 1985 and 1987 and also had a spell with Sydney club Eastern Suburbs. Toured Down

Under with the Lions last summmer, scoring 5 tries in 7 appearances. Signed for hometown Oldham in January 1988, after an unhappy spell at Hilton Park, and was outstanding as Oldham defeated Featherstone in an epic Second Division Premiership Final. Totalled 9 tries and 3 drop goals in 19 appearances as Oldham swept to the Second Division Championship in 1987-88. Three tries last season.

STEVE ROBINSON - Signed from Saddleworth Rangers 2 seasons ago, and has progressed to be a very fine Winger.

NEIL CLAWSON - Son of much-travelled former Trinity and Great Britain prop forward Terry. Neil is another front-rower with lots of ability. Joined Oldham from Featherstone in May 1986 and scored 2 tries in 26 appearances in 1988.

JOHN FAIRBANK - former BARLA international forward signed by Leeds in November, 1987, from Elland ARLFC. One of five League-playing brothers and son of former Leeds and Huddersfield forward Jack. Played 19 games in his debut season for Leeds, but was surprisingly allowed to leave Headingley last August. Strong, forceful 21 year-old whose best is yet to come.

ANDY RUANE - Former Widnes and Rochdale hooker, signed for Oldham by Eric Fitzsimmons, his former coach of the Hornets. A great worker in the loose, with goalkicking skills, he scored 12 tries, 15 goals and 2 drop goals for Hornets in 1987-88. Made his presence felt at Watersheddings, claiming the No.9 Jersey and kicking his first goals against Workington Town in the Lancashire Cup tie. One of the most impressive performers in the relegation year, scoring 4 tries and 15 goals.

PAUL ROUND - Signed for £65,000 from St. Helens in August, 1987, instantly repaying Oldham with 16 tries in 26 appearances and gaining inclusion in the Lancashire teams which opposed Yorkshire (scoring a try) and Papua New Guinea in 1987. Originally a back-row forward who has played on the wing and at full-back. Nine tries last season including ones in home and away meetings with Halifax.

LEO CASEY - Recruited from St. Annes ARLFC in April 1985, this hard grafting prop-forward scored 3 tries in 8 appearances for the club in 1987-88. 7 tries last

season

JOHN COGGER - An outstanding signing from Runcorn Highfield last season. This inspirational Aussie had picked up the Second Division Player of the Year award in 1987, and starred in Oldham's end-of-season matches, scoring a try hat-trick against Featherstone and totalling 6 tries for the club, to go alongside seven scored for the league's wooden-spoonists. Can play loose-forward or stand-off.

SHAUN ALLEN - Appeared for St. Helens in 1988 and 1988 Premiership Finals and also in their 1984 Lancashire Cup winning side, gaining an Under 21 international debut for Great Britain against France in 1984. Played centre and in the back-row for the Knowsley Road club, joining Oldham initially on loan last season, scoring a try against Widnes.

PAUL LORD - Signed from Stanley Rangers ARLFC as a Stand-off but recentley playing on Wing. Represented Yorkshire at Under 18's level and Great Britain, has great Pace.

COLIN HAWKYARD - Current beneficiary and an unsung workhorse of the Roughyeds pack, being a frequent scorer and a tireless defensive player. 3 tries in 27 appearances in 1987-88, and a further 4 last term. Played for Oldham in the 1988 Lancashire Cup Final against wigan. Had a 3-match loan spell at Huddersfield in 1981-82.

KEITH NEWTON - Strong back-row forward signed from champions Widnes last season, opening his try account for Oldham with two int the 40-9 cup win at Dewsbury in the first round. Added another to in a big defeat of Featherstone at Watersheddings.

GARY HYDE - Another of Tony Barrow's recruits, joining Oldham from Castleford, after winning Great Britain under 24 international honours as a centre in the early 80's. Has played centre and loose-forward for Oldham, scoring the first of four tries in a 23-22 defeat of Salford. Played in 7 major Finals for Castleford, including their 1986 Wembley defeat of Hull K.R.

Oldham continued to build for the future during the summer, with England Schools skipper CRAIG MORT (16) being added to the starlets already at Watersheddings. NEIL FLANAGAN, TOMMY MARTYN and STEVE ENTWISTLE all starred on the BARLA Youth tour of Australia this summer.







MARTIN OFFIAH

Martin Offiah of Widnes needs four League tries for a career century of division One touchdowns and is set to do it in easily the fewest number of matches.

The former Rosslyn Park RU winger's total of 96 has been run up in just 66 matches since he made his Rugby League debut on 30 August 1987.

No other player has scored a century in fewer than 100 matches since the reintroduction of two divisions in 1973.

Former England RU international Keith Fielding of Salford was the first to score 100 Division One tries but it took him 108 matches and was reached early in his fifth season. That is still the fastest century of Division One tries.

Wigan's Ellery Hanley has scored most division One tries with 181 but his century came in 118 matches. mostly for Bradford Northern. It was reached nine years after his debut but he missed playing in most of the first three seasons.

Offiah has missed only four League matches since his debut at home to Halifax. He did not score that day and has failed to touchdown in only 19 of the 66 division One matches he has played.

He has scored a hat-trick or more on 14 occasions including five four-try feats and five once.

Offiah looks certain to finish as the top Division One tryscorer for the third successive season. He was top in 1987-88 with 33 and the following season with 37, while he is well ahead this year with 26 tries. Offiah's Division One totals at a glance are:

WEMBLEY SEMI-FINALISTS

All four Silk cut challenge Cup semi-finalists are from West of the Pennines for the second successive year but only the third time since the final was taken to Wembley in 1929. St Helens, Wigan and Warrington are again semi-finalists as last year with Oldham throught to the last four for the first time since 1986. Yorkshire provided all semi-finalists in 1962, 1973 and

Oldham are the only one still seeking their first Wembley appearance despite this being their fifth semi-final. They are also aiming to become the first Division Two team to play at Wembley. Since the re-introduction of two divisions in 1973-74, only two other teams have reached the semi-finals - York, who lost to Wigan in 1984, and Halifax, beaten by Hull KR

In another two division era Oldham finished as Division Two champions after losing to Hull KR in the semi-finals following a second replay.

Wigan are on course to become the first team to win the Cup in three successive years after equalling the record run of 13 successive challenge cup tie wins. Oldham were the last team to beat them in the Cup -10-8 in the first round of 1987 at Watersheddings.

David Ruane's try scoring run ended at five matches when he failed to touchdown in Leigh's 14-26 Stones Bitter championship home defeat by Leeds.


