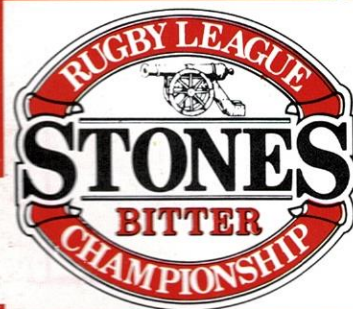
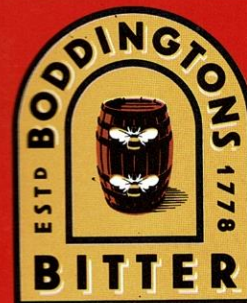

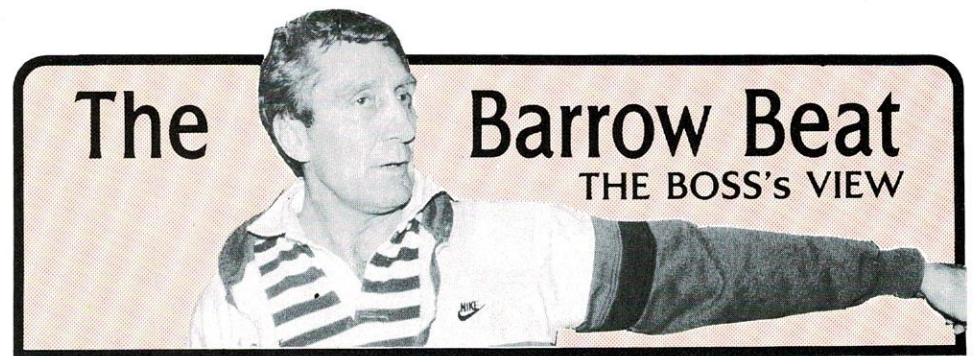

WE'RE PUTTING OUR SHIRTS ON OLDHAM



YOU will have read in the newspapers, no doubt, that we are constantly on the look-out for players of proven First Division calibre and quality with whom to strengthen our squad in readiness for next season.

We have already signed Peter Lewis on loan from Bramley, with a view to a permanent deal, and we were also involved in talks at one time with Brimah Kebbie, the Widnes wing.

At the time of writing these notes, we had agreed terms with Halifax to sign their Australian centre Tony Anderson and we were hopeful of completing a deal for a player with vast experience in the First Division.

I am also on the look-out for a couple of forwards, because in the First Division it is absolutely essential that you have a ready-made squad of at least 23 experienced men and, ideally, up to 25.

You only need to look at Liverpool soccer club to see that they are constantly at the top because they never sit back on their laurels. They keep competition for places at the highest level, they buy good players when they become available, and I have the highest regard for the job done by Kenny Dalglish and the entire Anfield set-up.

You see, in the First Division opponents hit you a lot harder, the game is much quicker and you pick up a lot more injuries. Consequently, you need a lot more players and it has been proved time and time again that if you only have 18, 19 or even 20 recognised First Division players are going

to struggle.

Anyone who thinks you can get by with a small squad in the top flight, filling in with youngsters, is living in a dream world. You can always pitch in one youngster, providing he is good enough and physically mature, but you can't be throwing in three or four and expecting to win matches at this level.

During the course of a season you can be hit by injuries, suspensions and various other factors that prevent you putting out your first-choice men, so you need to start off with enough quality players in a squad system to cope with everything that misfortune throws at you. Battle for places has to be tough and the man in form gets the job.

Last time Oldham won promotion, before my time at the club, efforts were made to consolidate with the team that went up. Unfortunately, it did not work. The squad needs to be assembled before the end of the promotion season, so that it can work together all through the summer and be ready and raring to go when the First Division campaign starts. If not, you can easily lose the first five or six games, and after that you are chasing to make up the leeway for the rest of the season.

My intention is to be ready for next season by the end of this one because we must be in a position to make an early impact next September. You never know... we could be playing Wigan, St. Helens, Leeds and Widnes in the first few matches. We must be ready.

Welcome to Runcorn

RUNCORN, the team that props up the rest, are coming good and ready to take off ... so says Canal Street chairman Terry Hughes, who is far from downhearted at his team's lowly position at the foot of the Second Division. He can point to some very encouraging results in recent weeks and says boldly: "We might give Oldham a fright, who knows?"

There were signs of things to come when the Runcorn lads ran Bradford Northern pretty close at Canal Street in the Challenge Cup. Then came a trip to Humberstone to play Hull KR and what everyone believed would be a massacre turned out to be a close-run thing. "And we didn't even play well that day," says Terry, "although we gave Rovers a fright."

The improvement was underlined when Rochdale, who slaughtered Runcorn by 90 points at Spotland earlier in the season, won by only 22 points at Canal Street recently.

Off the field, two well-known figures help to guide the fortunes of the Merseyside men ... coach Dave Chisnall, well known as a former player and coach with several top west Lancashire clubs, and the inimitable Geoff Fletcher, without whose steadfast and loyal support the club would surely have gone under several years ago.

Many long-standing Oldham fans will remember Geoff as an outstanding ball-playing forward for Oldham in his younger days. He also played for Leigh and Wigan but he is better known here for the loyal support he gave to the Oldham club — the same loyalty and devotion that he has now given Runcorn, and the former Huyton club, for many, many years. These days Geoff is not only a Runcorn director but he is also the club treasurer and Rugby League Council representative.

There are not many well-known names in the Runcorn side because the side had to be entirely rebuilt after the infamous players' strike of two years ago.

"We had to recruit 21 players pretty quickly," explained Terry, "so we obviously had to go for young players whom we believed would develop in the long term. When you have to recruit an entire squad and start from scratch, you expect that it will take time for the boys to settle down and come good, but they have come on in leaps and bounds.

"We have had some highly encouraging performances of late and I think we can look forward to a promising future over the next two or three seasons"

The average age of a young side is 22 and the experience, once provided by Ken Kelly (now at Oldham), comes from loose-forward Billy Platt, the much-travelled forward who has played for several clubs on both sides of the Pennines.

It was from Runcorn, of course, that Oldham recruited John Cogger for a bargain £12,000 ... and John, our captain, is still highly respected at Canal Street. "With 13 players like him, you could conquer the world," says Terry.

Spotlight on... **TOMMY MARTYN**

ONE of the hot favourites for the first OB Young Player of the Year, a new Boddingtons-sponsored award for players under 21, has to be Tommy Martyn, one of a dozen or so youngsters signed by Oldham in the last couple of seasons.

Tommy, after spending most of the season with the A Team, is now displaying his silky skills in the first team, winning the man of the match award in the recent Second Division home match against Huddersfield.

Without question the young 18-year-old, who has been tipped for international honours by many of the game's pundits, can look forward to a great future in the Rugby League world, although signing for Oldham came as quite a surprise.

"I could hardly believe it when Oldham asked me to sign with them last year. I was just 17 and it was the chance of a lifetime to learn the game alongside top players like John Cogger and Mick Ford"

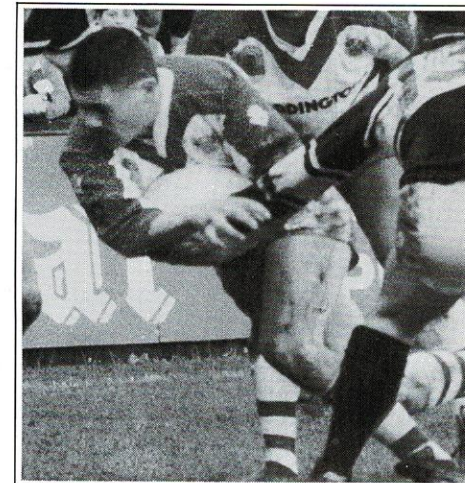
Not that Tommy hadn't already picked up more than his fair share of experience.

Tommy started out at seven years old by playing at wing for his junior school team before joining his hometown clubs, Leigh Rangers Under-16s and Leigh Under-19s, although at one point he was thinking of giving rugby up altogether and pursuing football.

"I lost confidence with rugby for a while and considered taking up football again, but my coach wouldn't hear of it and kept telling me I had to believe in myself more. His encouragement did wonders for my performance and I haven't looked back since!"

He was one of several Oldham youngsters picked for the GB Under-19s' Australian tour in the close season of 1989. Tommy's six weeks down-under was a real education.

"The Australian tour was brilliant experience for me because it was probably the first real challenge



of my rugby career — as well as being a superb trip!"

Although tipped for the top, Tommy is determined to keep his feet firmly on the ground. He says: "I still train twice a week with my mates at Leigh Miners and although they could have given me a hard time after my move to Oldham they've really spurred me on!"

Support has come from his family, too. "I'm very lucky because all my family, mum, dad and sister Samantha, have always been behind me and encouraged everything I've done"

Tommy, a car mechanic, even gets encouragement at work because his boss is a Rugby League fanatic! "Where work's concerned there is no problem because my boss knows how important the game is and gives me time off here and there for training.

"Discipline is the most important factor in successful rugby and I'm getting first class experience playing alongside such a professional team. At the moment I'm training five nights a week to get into peak condition and to hopefully stay in the first team!"

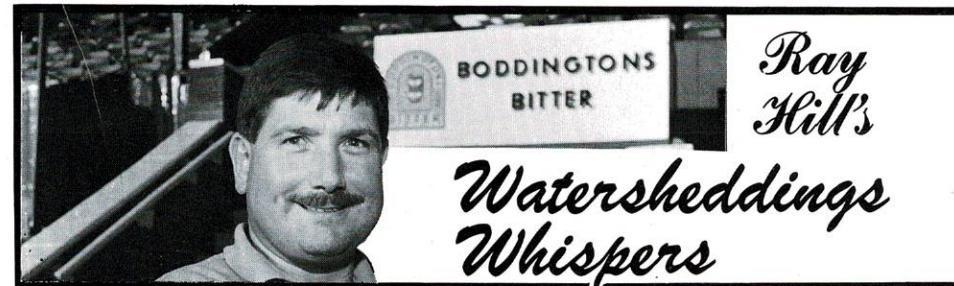

Like us, the Latics have enjoyed tremendous success this season and fully deserve their Wembley final.


And who knows, if all goes well against Warrington at the end of this month, we could well be joining them to make a double Wembley celebration for Oldham.

Terrace Talk

I DON'T know how the players are coping with it, but it seems that there is little else to discuss at the moment in Oldham except the Cup — be it Silk Cut or Littlewoods, the whole town is alive and buzzing with anticipation.

The reason I make the point is to stress the difficulties the players have to contend with by putting the semi-final to the back of their minds.

Take today's game, for example — Runcorn at home. On paper, it's the kind of fixture that looks a formality. It is certainly vastly different from our recent "big" cup games, but the concentration required by the players will be no less demanding. But I must confess that, human nature being what it is, surely there must be a subconscious feeling to take things easy.

I know that there are obvious answers like, "they are professionals and therefore must motivate themselves in the true sense of the word." That may be OK in theory, but doesn't always work in practice. This is where a coach can show his true colours. It must be very easy to motivate players to produce good performances when playing against the top sides, whether it be league or cup, but a coach must now try and produce a similar reaction and effective response from his playing staff when faced with a run-of-the-mill league encounter, and when coming up against the minnows of the game. But whatever the circumstances, the main achievement and aim has got to be promotion.

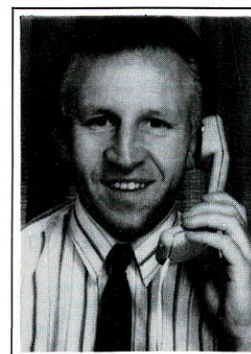
Fortunately, so far this season we appear to have got it right on all fronts,

as we can clearly be seen to have had a successful season. A Lancashire Cup Final appearance, plus effective and consistent league form with the added bonus of a semi-final appearance in the Silk Cut Challenge Cup. Today's fixture against Runcorn will be the last home game before our semi-final, and what a prospect to look forward to. It would be marvellous to think that by the next home fixture we might be in the Challenge Cup Final!

However, it's league action today, with Runcorn the visitors to Watersheddings. Their recent record certainly doesn't include any disclosed form, having gone 47 matches without collecting a win, their last victory being a 20-12 home win against Fulham on 30th October, 1988, although they have managed to draw against Workington Town on 22nd January, 1989. One has to feel some sympathy for the men from Runcorn, but the standards being set in the modern day game are very high indeed.

We do have something to thank Runcorn for in the shape of John Cogger, who is now performing heroically for the fans at Watersheddings, and let's hope for the 2 points, and also keep clear of injuries with our important semi-final looming on the horizon.

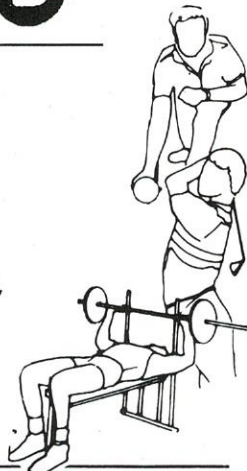

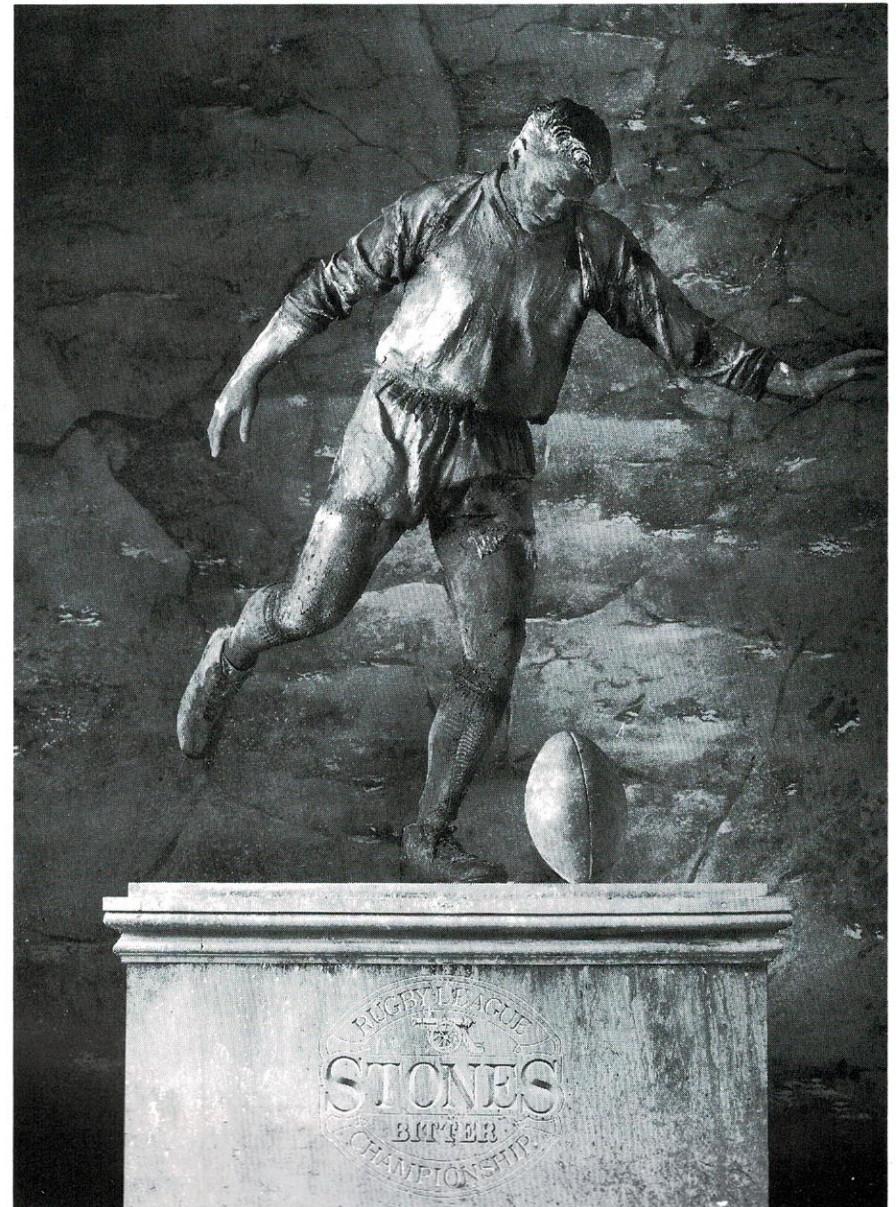

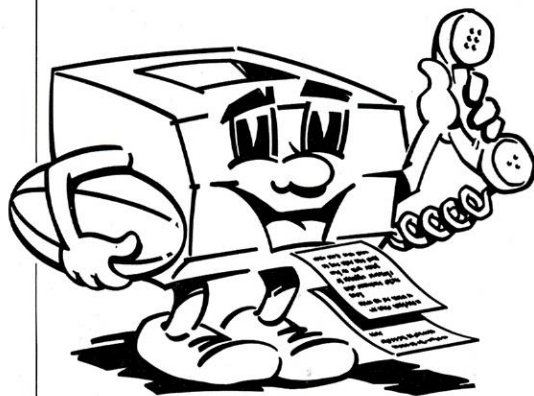
