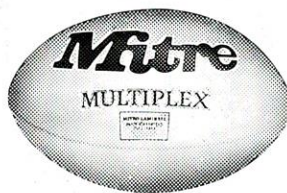

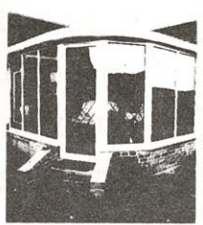

Welcome to Oldham

A very warm welcome to our friends from Oldham who have made the journey "over the tops" to today's game. This is, of course, the fourth meeting of the two clubs this season. Oldham have been victorious on all three previous occasions at Watersheddings by 22pts to 8 in the Regal Trophy, 30pts to 8 in the Challenge Cup and 23pts to 8 in the Second Division Fixture.

Oldham have only lost four games this season - league fixtures at Halifax and Rochdale, the Lancashire Cup Final against Warrington, and at St. Helens in the Regal Trophy. They have currently (these notes were penned before Wednesday's game at Hunslet) won fourteen successive matches and next Saturday meet Warrington, at Wigan, in the Silk Cut Challenge Cup semi final. Oldham have never played in a Wembley Final and we wish them well next weekend.

The game at Hunslet last Wednesday and the proximity of the Semi Final may have some bearing on the Oldham side chosen for today's fixture. They have recently signed Halifax's utility back, Tony Anderson who had an excellent game against us at Thrum Hall on Boxing Day. Tony has been signed for a reported £70,000 which is £5,000 more than the previous Oldham record transfer fee paid of £65,000 for Paul Round and Mike Ford. Peter Lewis has also been taken on loan from Bramley with prop Neil Clawson moving in the opposite direction.

Centre, Gary Hyde was the Oldham hero, in the memorable defeat of Wigan in this season's Lancashire Cup Semi Final, with his long-range match-winning goal from near halfway five minutes from the end of the game. Hyde is one of several bargain buys brought to Watersheddings by coach Tony Barrow since his arrival nearly 12 months ago. Indeed the normal back three of Keith Newton, Shaun Allen and skipper John Cogger were purchased for a total lay-out of just £30,000.

To the side that was relegated last season, he has added Richard Russell from Wigan for the proverbial "song", purchased John Fieldhouse from St. Helens and introduced Aussie stand-off Brett Clark on a 12 month contract.

Coach Barrow, the former Warrington boss was quoted as saying "It is gratifying to see so many good things coming from players we have bought in the past few months."

"None of them cost a fortune on today's valuations but they have all settled in well at Watersheddings and our teamwork and dressing room spirit is second to none."

"In this game a lot can be achieved if the spirit and the attitude are right and in assembling my squad of players over the past few months I have tried to ensure that I have brought players whose attitude is totally honest."

Oldham reacted positively to the blow of relegation. Before a pass was thrown in earnest this season, they announced an intention to win the Second Division, lift the premiership at Old Trafford and do well in the cup competitions.

Let's hope after our recent poor performances we react positively and produce some good rugby. We have already lost to Oldham three times but if a 100 to 1 shot can win the Cheltenham Gold Cup anything can happen in 80 minutes on a rugby field.

Hope you enjoy the game.

We welcome this afternoon the sports team from **THE SPORT**, Ancoats, Manchester, who have very kindly sponsored the game and the match programme.

Last season, even though Rugby League is the second largest spectator sport in the country, national coverage was on the wane, and Division 2 notes virtually expunged. 'The Sport', which comes out on Wednesdays and Fridays, and as from August also on Thursdays, with their coverage of the game has been like a breath of fresh air. Their knowledgeable writer Phil Thomas has had some superb scoops and set the whole game talking. If you want to be first with the Rugby League news then Wednesday and Friday mornings are a must now . . . for just 25p . . .

I also hear on the grapevine that the 'Sunday Sport' will be carrying a Rugby League column before long to more than rival the 'Sunday People' and 'Sunday Mirror'. We hope they and our friends from the Watersheddings enjoy today's game, for which the Mitre matchball is sponsored by our new director, Joe Bramley.

It's been a hectic week for the board with having to measure up once again to certain safety requirements, sift through 8 applications for the vacant coaching position and prepare one day in advance of normal to put on one of the biggest Stones Bitter Division 2 games of the season.

Oldham, who played at Hunslet on Wednesday evening, suffered a blow last weekend when Keith Atkinson was injured against Runcorn, and both coach Tony Barrow and the players will want to stay clear of injury today with next Saturday's semi-final with Warrington in mind.

The Halifax League game on Good Friday evening at 7.30 will be all-ticket. Tickets for the Main Stand and the terracing in the West Stand, North Terrace and East Terrace will be on sale at the Swinton game. Once again we would ask as many regular supporters as possible to come in from the greenhouse lane turnstiles to ease congestion. Those wishing to park around the cricket field and come into the main stand should come early. Season ticket holders will be given a pass ticket for the area they use upon presentation of their ticket.

OLDHAM PEN PICTURES

John Fieldhouse Recent signing from St. Helens. Great Britain international — Man of the Series against the Kiwis. Has settled in and is playing the sort of rugby that made him an international.

Richard Irving Signed for Oldham in August, 1987 from Moldgreen ARLFC and impressed coach Eric Fitzsimmons with his strong-running wing displays, scoring tries against Keighley and Rochdale. Scorer of just two tries — against Wigan and Wakefield — last season.

John Henderson Signed from Leigh club, this prolific try-scoring centre suffered through injury for much of last season and scored 8 tries. Scored 31 tries in 1985-86 and another 37 in 1986-87 for Leigh, gaining selection for Lancashire and scoring a try, in a 22-22 draw with Papua New Guinea in 1987. Guested for Sydney Wests in 1985.

Charlie McAlister A sensational capture from Bradford & Bingley RUFC in February, 1988, scoring 9 tries and 15 goals in 18 appearances in his debut season. Had a summer spell in Australia with the Newcastle Knights, in 1988, improving his defensive abilities. Kicked four goals in the 1988 2nd Div. Premiership Final. New Zealander with great strength and pace and the ability to play in a variety of back roles.

Richard Russell Oldham's major off-season signing, coming from Wigan, where he had gained Great Britain Colts and two Under 21 international selections in 1987 and 1988. Played in every back role at Central Park but received very few opportunities last season. Represented Wigan in the 1987 Lancashire Cup and Premiership Finals.

Mike Ford BARLA Young Lions tourist to New Zealand in 1983, signed for Wigan from the Oldham, St. Annes ARLFC in August of that year. Won Challenge Cup (1988), Lancashire Cup (1985 & 1986) and John Player (1986 & 1987) honours, before joining Leigh. Gained four Under 21 international caps between 1986 and 1987 and also had a spell with Sydney club Eastern Suburbs. Toured Down Under with the Lions last summer, scoring 5 tries in 7 appearances. Signed for hometown Oldham in January, 1988, after an unhappy spell at Hilton Park, and was outstanding as Oldham defeated Featherstone in an epic 2nd Div. Premiership Final. Totalled 9 tries and 3 drop goals in 19 appearances as Oldham swept to the 2nd Div. Championship in 1987-88. Three tries last season.

Steve Robinson Signed from Saddleworth Rangers two seasons ago and has progressed to be a very fine winger.

John Fairbank Former BARLA international forward signed by Leeds in November, 1987, from Elland ARLFC. One of five League-playing brothers and son of former Leeds and Huddersfield forward Jack. Played 18 games in his debut season for Leeds, but was surprisingly allowed to leave Headingley last August. Strong, forceful 21 year old whose best is yet to come.

Andy Ruane Former Widnes and Rochdale hooker, signed for Oldham by Eric Fitzsimmons, his former coach of the Hornets. A great worker in the loose, with goalkicking skills, he scored 12 tries, 15 goals and 2 drop goals for Hornets in 1987-88. Made his presence felt at Watersheddings, claiming the No. 9 jersey and kicking his first goals against Workington Town in the Lancashire Cup tie. One of the most impressive performers in the relegation year, scoring 4 tries and 15 goals.

Paul Round Signed for £66,000 from St. Helens in August, 1987, instantly repaying Oldham with 16 tries in 26 appearances and gaining inclusion in the Lancashire teams which opposed Yorkshire (scoring a try) and Papua New Guinea in 1987. Originally a back-row forward who has played on the wing and at full-back. Nine tries last season including ones in home and away meetings with Halifax.

John Cogger An outstanding signing from Runcorn Highfield last season. This inspirational Aussie had picked up the 2nd Div. Player of the Year award in 1987, and starred in Oldham's end-of-season matches, scoring a try hat-trick against Featherstone and totalling 6 tries for the club, to go alongside seven scored for the league's wooden-spoonists. Can play loose-forward or stand-off.

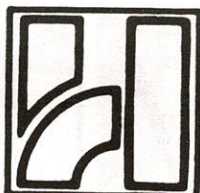

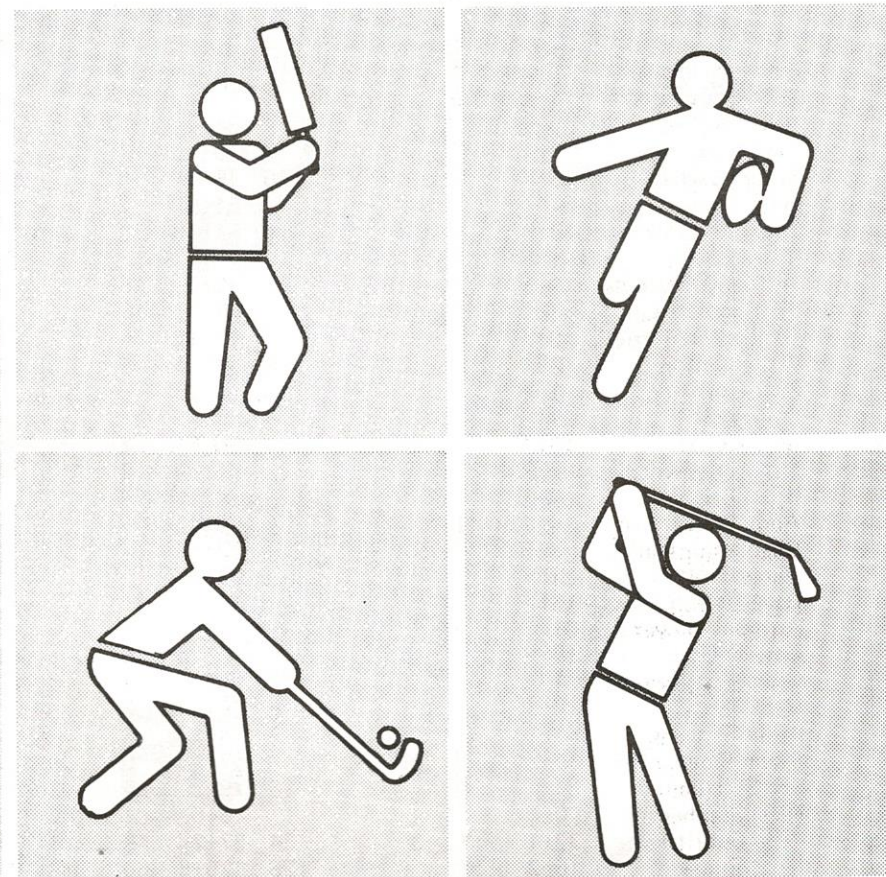
