

TODAY'S

Welcome to Carlisle

TODAY we welcome Carlisle to Watersheddings, with a special greeting for their recently-appointed coach from New Zealand, Cameron Bell. Since Oldham won up in Cumbria last October, there have been two significant changes in the Carlisle camp, notably the departure of coach Tommy Dawes and the team's early-season general and tactician, Harry Pinner.

Carlisle and Tommy Dawes, the former Barrow boss, parted company in January after a defeat at York and within a fortnight the club had engaged

Carlisle and Tommy Dawes, the former Barrow boss, parted company in January after a defeat at York and within a fortnight the club had engaged Cameron, who was then living in Auckland, on a two-year contract. It took him some time to clear up his business affairs in New Zealand, but he arrived in Carlisle at the end of February and he is now settled there — the first time in the club's history that its senior coach has been based in the city.

The father of Wigan's Test centre Dean Bell, Cameron has had considerable success as a coach back home in New Zealand and one can assume that he will already have introduced new methods. New patterns of play and perhaps more emphasis on organisation and defence are now an accepted part of the Carlisle routine and he is getting a good response from the players.

Carlisle began the season full of optimism, having engaged former Great Britain loose-forward Pinner on a two-year contract. Pinner certainly gave Oldham a lot of trouble in the game up there, but he has not played for Carlisle since last November, and the club is suing him through the courts for breach of contract.

He had been signed not only as a tactical general on the field of play, but a player who would influence what is essentially a young side. It was not to be and Carlisle struggled for long periods after his departure, resulting in the split with coach Dawes some two months later.

In Cameron Bell's first two games there were defeats by Halifax away and Dewsbury at home, but then followed a 60-0 victory at Nottingham, a narrow 4-2 home defeat by Hunslet and an impressive 24-18 win at Bramley.

These notes had to be written before the home games against Fulham last weekend and Trafford Borough in midweek, on the day we played at Workington.

New Zealander Brad Hepi — a fast, strong-running second-row man when we played up there — is now operating in the centre, with Kevin Pape having switched from centre to stand-off. Kevin is a good player, once much in demand by other clubs, and he is scoring and creating just as much now at No. 6 as he did in the centre.

Unfortunately for Carlisle, they have just lost the services of a former Junior Kiwi, Hitro Okesene, who has been doing well in the second-row for the Cumbrians. He has returned home only this week, so Carlisle will be looking for a replacement to join a trialist, A N Other, who was booked to have his third run-out against Fulham last Sunday.

Despite his love of travelling, Tony, who lives in Halifax with his fiancee Tracey and cat Spongy. is very much at home in England.




"The people here, especially in the North, are probably more friendly and open than from where I come from in Australia. Here, you soon become part of your local community.







IT would appear that Oldham are destined not to appear at Wembley. The situation at Central Park last weekend was reminiscent of the first game against Hull KR when another refereeing decision meant heartbreak for the town, players and supporters. The evidence from last Saturday's semi-final is there for all who video-taped the game to see.

To be fair, referees have to make instant and snap decisions, but personally I long to see the day when a referee in any sport will have the honesty and character to admit that possibily they may have made a mistake. Further, the authorities of sport's governing bodies, in my opinion, can help situations like the one we had at Central Park, and also help their own referees, umpires and associated adjudicators.

With the modern technology available today, I feel the powers that be should either make use of it or ignore it completely. I base this judgement not only on the incident at Central Park, but having witnessed many other obvious and most blatant inaccuracies which decimate modern sport.

The most recent that springs to mind was the "handball" incident in England's international soccer match played at Wembley last week but one. It was reminiscent of the famous "hand of God" declaration by Maradonna in the last World Cup. The handling offence by England's full back Stuart Pearce against Brazil was so obvious that even John Holdsworth would have given a "knock-on"!

To remove unnecessary pressures being placed on officials, I wonder why the authorities don't consider banning the use of the "action replay." If they are not prepared to accept technological progress, then surely they can relieve extra burdens by eliminat-

ing its use. On the other hand, they could decide to use it to its full potential in assisting the officials in the making of hairline decisions, especially where the outcome is crucial.

On now to more positive thoughts. Congratulations to Tony Barrow and his boys on their achievement in returning Oldham to British Rugby League's premier division, and let's hope we can now have a long and rosy future in the top flight. The easy part has now been achieved (mind you, ask any Halifax supporter and I'm sure they would agree, second division rugby is not as easy as it appears), but first division, as we all know to our unhappy cost, is a particularly demanding gladiatorial arena.

We look to have some exciting young talent at Watersheddings, which is encouraging for the future, but next season may well turn out to be one of the most important in the recent history of the Roughyeds. It won't be easy and we must learn from our past experience, but somehow Tony Barrow's inspirational battlers on the field seem to provide a contagious recipe for success.

Finally, lest we forget, Warrington were

defeated in last year's Challenge Cup semi-final and returned to turn heartbreak into triumph. To do this takes character and courage, and they are two things that Oldham have in abundance, supporters and players alike.




