

WHAT must Mike Ford and Leo Casey do to get international recognition? That was just one of several thoughts that passed through my mind when watching Great Britian's defeat by France in the recent Test match at Headingley.

I think a lot of Britian's problems stemmed from team selection, and it will be interesting to see what the test squad is. It was named on Wednesday after these notes were written.

On the form leading up to the test I did not think Mike Gregory merited selection, and I wonder how a forward like Keith England can get in when he is struggling to command a regular place in his club side.

Roy Powell was in the squad, but he is also only on the fringe of his club pack at the moment, and I wonder what happened to the claims for forwards like our own Leo Casey or Dean Sampson, the big, young prop at Castleford, whose form is overshadowing that of England at club level.

You then look at the backs and the selection of Bradford's Welsh winger Gerald Cordle. He has only been a League player for a few months and everyone in the game knows that he struggles defensively. He took his try well on his debut,

but defensively he was poor and wingers these days must be able to defend as well as attack, especially at international level.

Mike Ford has played consistently well all season and he had an absolutely outstanding game in our Challenge Cup semi-final against Warrington. he won the man-of-the match hands down and deservedly so.

He also out-thought and outplayed David Bishop when he won that crucial Second Division game at Hull KR in January, but judging by the events leading up to that second test defeat he doesn't even figure in the first four at Test level. When Andy Gregory was ruled out, Shaun Edwards was switched to scum-half and there were two scrum-halves on the bench in Deryck Fox and Bishop.

I cannot comment on the test selection but I hope those who make the decisions have gone for the men in form to carry our hopes in Papua New Guinea and New Zealand this summer.

Finally, welcome to Watersheddings today for a derby clash with Rochdale Hornets which could well decide which club finished second — a vital advantage in the Premiership run-up providing there are no first-round upsets.

For Oldham it is not an entirely new step to take and as history has shown, a thorough preparation for the top flight is essential. After our brief encounter on our last visit, survival and stability must be the name of the game, anything else has to be classed as a bonus.

Finally I hope the semi-final disappointment has now disappeared and we look to new horizons. Hearty congratulations go to all who have contributed to Oldham's instant
