THREE days can be a long time in sport, and our experiences over Easter were no exception. We hit rock bottom when losing at Swinton on Good Friday and then produced a memorable performance to demolish Rochdale Hornets 30-2 at Watersheddings on the Monday.

I was very critical of the team's performance at Station Road, but I cannot speak too highly about how the boys came back off the floor to produce that terrific show against Hornets.

It's a big step to take for someone who has played all his rugby in the backs, but Charlie did a great job. He was a bit apprehensive before the kick-off and I know he was tired at the end, but in between he did a first-class job for us and

I cannot praise him too highly.

The same goes for Paul Round, who was always eager for the ball and the action, scored two first-half tries, and no doubt did a lot of work on the field in guiding Charlie through his first experience of forward play at this level.

The secret of success was the teamwork, and if we can continue to play like that in the premiership we will take some beating.

It was a pity we couldn't quite manage the winning margin of 29 points that we needed to secure second place in the league — always an advantage in the premiership.

When we led by 28 points we got a penalty late in the game, but it was from 40 yards out and I think Duncan Platt made the right decision to elect to kick for touch.

The wind was against us and was exceptionally strong last Monday afternoon. Duncan felt the odds were stacked heavily against him because of the distance and the wind and he did not want to surrender possession by failing to put the ball dead.

We went for touch and, as you all know, Hornets managed to hang on to second place by the skin of their teeth or, to be more accurate, one point over the course of a full season.

Still, that is all behind us now — and today we have the chance to avenge our Station Road defeat when we meet the Lions in the play-off.

Paul Mellor, who has been a very unlucky lad from the injury point of view, pulled off two try-saving tackles last week and produced an accomplished game at full back. **Scott Ranson** is a pacy right-winger and **Ian Pickavance** has a lot of strength on the other flank, the wingers playing outside two experienced centres in **Gary Peacham**, signed from Carlisle, and the former New Zealand Test player **Joe Ropati**, snapped up from Warrington.

Stand-off **Barry Peters** also joined the Lions from the Wires, while the little lad who had a great scrum-half game on Friday, **Barry Ashall**, was a former amateur with Thatto Heath, the St. Helens club at which the Barrow brothers have had such a major influence over the years. Ashall deservedly won the man-of-the-match award on Good Friday, so if he is playing today he will presumably not be given the freedom that was afforded him at Station Road.

In the pack, big No. 8 **Mark Sheals** had a strong game against us, while hooker **Alec Melling**, Oldham born and bred, will be keen to do well here. Another talented performer in the Lions pack is Kiwi back-row man **Shane Tupaea**.

We welcome the Swinton players and officials for today's first-round game in the premiership and look forward to a game befitting the great traditions of both clubs.

Spotlight on...PAUL ROUND

OLDHAM may have had a great season winning promotion and enjoying two great cup runs, but forward Paul Round won't be too disappointed when the current campaign ends.

"I felt helpless sitting on the sidelines watching the team play while I was laid up and couldn't do anything. I've been playing the game professionally for eight years and a big part of my life was suddenly missing."

At 26 years old, Paul has a fair amount of experience in rugby.

He started playing the game at the tender age of 10, turning out for both his junior and secondary school teams in his home town of St. Helens.

Paul turned professional at 17 when he signed for St. Helens, winning GB Under-21 honours in 1984. Three years later he was picked to play for Lancashire in 1987.

"At 17, signing for St. Helens was a massive step to take. I learned a lot there and was playing on the first team by the time I was 18. I've



come a long way since then — I may have lost some speed but I've more than made up with experience!"

Although he still lives in St. Helens with his wife Carol and three dogs Gemma, Sheba and Ella. Paul has recently set up his own roofing business in Oldham to make life easier for himself where training is concerned.

"I learned the ropes a few years ago and decided to go into business on my own. It's a lot easier fitting in training than it was with my last job — I spent seven years working shifts down the pits!"

Paul is only too happy to be back on the team at Watersheddings and feels at home in Oldham's close-knit rugby community.

"It's great to play for your home town but I've always been made to feel one of the family here right from the start — Oldham is really in a class of its own!"

Throughout the summer he'll be concentrating on intensive weight and speed training to put himself back in top condition so he can put the disappointments of this season firmly behind him.
