



TODAY'S

Welcome to Ryedale-York

THE Minster men, who now take the name of Ryedale-York, come to Watersheddings for the semi-final of the Second Division premiership today and it is their first visit since the 1985-86 season when both teams were in the First Division. Oldham won 8-2 at York in November and 24-16 at Watersheddings on January 12, 1986, and only one member of the squad on duty that day, substitute Paddy Kirwan, is still active on the Watersheddings scene.

Due to the way the Second Division fixture formula worked out, the two clubs have not met this season in league competition so today's encounter will be something of a novelty for both teams and both sets of supporters. York finished fourth in the division — one place beneath Oldham — and they come here today by virtue of Dewsbury's surprise win at Rochdale in the first round.

Beaten only twice at home in the league, York possess a young, talented and pacy squad of players under the coaching helm of Gary Stephens, the former Wigan and Halifax scrum-half and a canny play-maker around the base of the scrum and in the loose.

Chris Hammerton, York's regular scrum-half, may have to miss today's game due to a knee ligament injury, but York possess a more-than-able deputy in local boy **Brendan Carlisle** — one of only several members of the side born and brought up in the York amateur Rugby League. Indeed, one such player, **David Kettlestring**, on the right wing, only turned professional in January, but he has quickly made an impact, not least by scoring SIX tries in one match against Keighley earlier in the season.

Centre **Basil Ake**, the former New Zealand junior RU international, who was signed from Bradford Northern, scored a hat-trick of tries from the centre position against Halifax in the first round to become the club's leading tryscorer this season with 18. His co-centre, **Stuart Morris**, formerly with Dewsbury, has scored 16 tries and the left-winger, **Neil Pinkney**, is another dangerous finisher. A former Great Britain under-19 international, he is still an amateur although he is expected to sign pro forms any time now.

Stand-off **Garry Atkins** has spent part of the season out on loan to Halifax, but he has returned to York to make the No. 6 role his own since New Zealander David Watson, who has now joined Hull KR, broke his arm.

In the forwards, York have a nice blend of youth and experience, with most of the experience provided by hooker and captain **Stewart Horton** and loose-forward **Geoff Pryce**, a player who is in his testimonial year. Horton was a Castleford player and was actually picked by Mal Reilly to go on the 1988 tour of Australia, but he had to pull out due to an ankle injury.

The rest of the forwards are all local lads — $\overline{\text{Ian Paver}}$, Paul Maxwell, Steve Olsen and Rick Heyes.

Spotlight on ... ANDY RUANE

RUGBY LEAGUE can be a cruel game, as Oldham hooker Andy Ruane discovered when he broke his thumb in the Regal Trophy quarter-final against St. Helens.

The Roughyeds' number nine expected to be out of the first team for six weeks. Instead, he found his return delayed while his deputy, Richard Russell, played in the front row as Oldham embarked on a winning streak that took them into the semi-finals of the Silk Cut Challenge Cup and on the verge of promotion to the First Division.

Sidelined first by injury and then by Richard Russell's outstanding form was no fun for the twenty-seven-year-old.

"The situation was very frustrating — I was watching the team do really well but couldn't take part in the action. I missed out on the whole of the cup run, which was a real disappointment, especially because all I'd done was broken my thumb!"

Rather than sit back and moan about his bad luck, Andy worked hard to ensure that when the chance came to regain his place in the first team, he was ready to take it with open arms.

Intensive training at Watersheddings and in his own time has paid dividends. Andy has figured in Oldham's last half dozen matches, recapturing the form that prompted Oldham to buy him from close neighbours Rochdale in the first place.

"Unfortunately, I felt that I was getting my form back just as things were coming to an end. I've managed to get in a few good games at the end of the season and there's still the Premiership. But I'm really looking forward to some hard training in preparation for next season, which I hope will be more successful for me!

"This year's close season will be more important than ever, considering the teams we'll be facing next season. Every match will be like a cup tie, although that shouldn't present any problem at Oldham because we have become



a stronger and more experienced squad".

Andy, at 27, is one of the most experienced players on the Oldham books. He first started playing professionally at the tender age of 17 when he signed for Widnes, his hometown team

The search for first team action took him first to Rochdale and then on to Oldham, where he has been impressing fans with his commitment, effort and superb tactical kicking ever since.

Commitment is essential to Andy, who is quite happy to travel to Watersheddings all the way from Widnes, where he lives with his wife Caroline and young daughters Kimberley and Rebecca. He runs his own damp-coursing business, which allows him to arrange his time around training.

"I've always taken rugby very seriously—even when I was a kid I used to enjoy the hard work that goes with playing the game. You have to want it to take up a big chunk of your time or you just aren't dedicated. And the players and the fans at Oldham are so dedicated to the game that now we're back in the First Division we should stay there!"

GET YOUR SEASON TICKETS NOW — IT PAYS

RELUCTANTLY, the directors have decided they had no alternative but to increase admission prices for the 1990-91 season. In doing so they draw attention to the club's acute financial problems, rising costs, spiralling contract payments, a levy of eight per cent on next season's turnstile takings and ambitious ground improvement projects.

If the club is to have a successful future, every effort must be made to budget from a profitable situation rather than one of deficit, and that is the ONLY reason why the directors are asking the supporters to stand an increase — only the second such increase, incidentally, in the last four or five seasons.

Turnstile admission will be £5 and seats will cost £7. The turnstile cost for pensioners and juniors will be £3.

However, big savings can be made on season tickets, particularly if they are purchased before June 1, and by buying a season ticket you are getting free admission to 'A' team games, a priority on bigmatch tickets next season, and you are ensuring that the club gets maximum benefit from your investment because season tickets are not subject to League levy.

Season ticket prices are as follows (and you can work out the savings based on 13 First Division home games):

BEFORE JUNE 1

Main stand and Hutchins stand seats £75; ground £50; pensioners and juniors £33; one adult and one child (standing) £80; one adult and two children £110; two adults and one child £130; two adults and two children £160.

AFTER JUNE 1

Main stand and Hutchins stand seats £80; ground £55; pensioners and juniors £36; one adult and one child (standing) £86; one adult and two children £118; two adults and one child £140; two adults and two children £172.

The club office is open each week day from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. and on Saturday mornings from 9.30 a.m. to 11 a.m., so hurry to buy your season ticket, help the club and save yourself some money on turnstile prices.

Trafford is once again with us, and now only Ruedale-York stand in the way. But we have already seen in the earlier round of the play-offs that there can be no room for complacency. I have had the opportunity to run the rule over Ruedale-York earlier in the season and witnessed their demolition job on Halifax and, going off that

display, cannot be taken lightly. It would certainly be a marvellous way to end the season by going to Old Trafford and once again playing a part in one of the best days on the Rugby League calendar. But before looking ahead to what might be, let's look back to what has been.

Right from the start of the season, there hardly seems to have been a week gone by without Oldham not making some kind of news. Once again, our best performances have been reserved for some of Rugby League's elitist teams. The coach and staff at Watersheddings in my view have managed to supply entertainment whilst picking up points.

Although you can't please all of the people all of the time, you only have to look at the situation just across the Pennines at Halifax to realise that no-one has a devine right to win matches. What has happened at Thrum Hall this season should serve as a warning to all clubs. Obviously, only they themselves will know the real reasons for their dramatic demise, and this once again indicates the thin dividing line between success or sorrow.

Another aspect of the game this season which for me has been an increasing worry is the plight of some of the clubs at the lower reaches of the second division. I don't think that victories by 70-90 points is good for the game. Similarly, the situation that Runcorn find themselves in, having lost all their fixtures, is another occurance which the league can well do without. I would urge the powers that be to

look quickly and seriously at the implementation of three divisions. Especially with the current arrangement of the 2nd division fixture list.

Another improvement I would like to see will come as no surprise to Rugby League followers, concerning not only the standard but the consistency of referees. In particular, the fascination of an eight-match ban. I don't condone foul play, but I do feel that Rugby League is an aggressive contact sport and this season some of the enjoyment has been removed.

One thing that I have enjoyed, though, has been the emergence of the re-vamped youth policy at Watersheddings, and one or two of the club's youngsters would appear to have all the attributes to play the game at the highest level. There is no guarantee that young players will all eventually end up as proficient 1st team players but, as the saying goes, if you don't buy a ticket, you won't win the raffle!

An indication of the benefits of a successful youth policy can be taken from Wigan, who look likely to win everything apart from the boat race. An interesting observation comes to light when you look closely at their playing register, because they have not made a major transfer signing for the last 18 months, their last signing of a Rugby League player being Andy Platt.

Finally, here's hoping for a successful season next year in the top flight — when the REAL test will come. Enjoy the entertainment.




