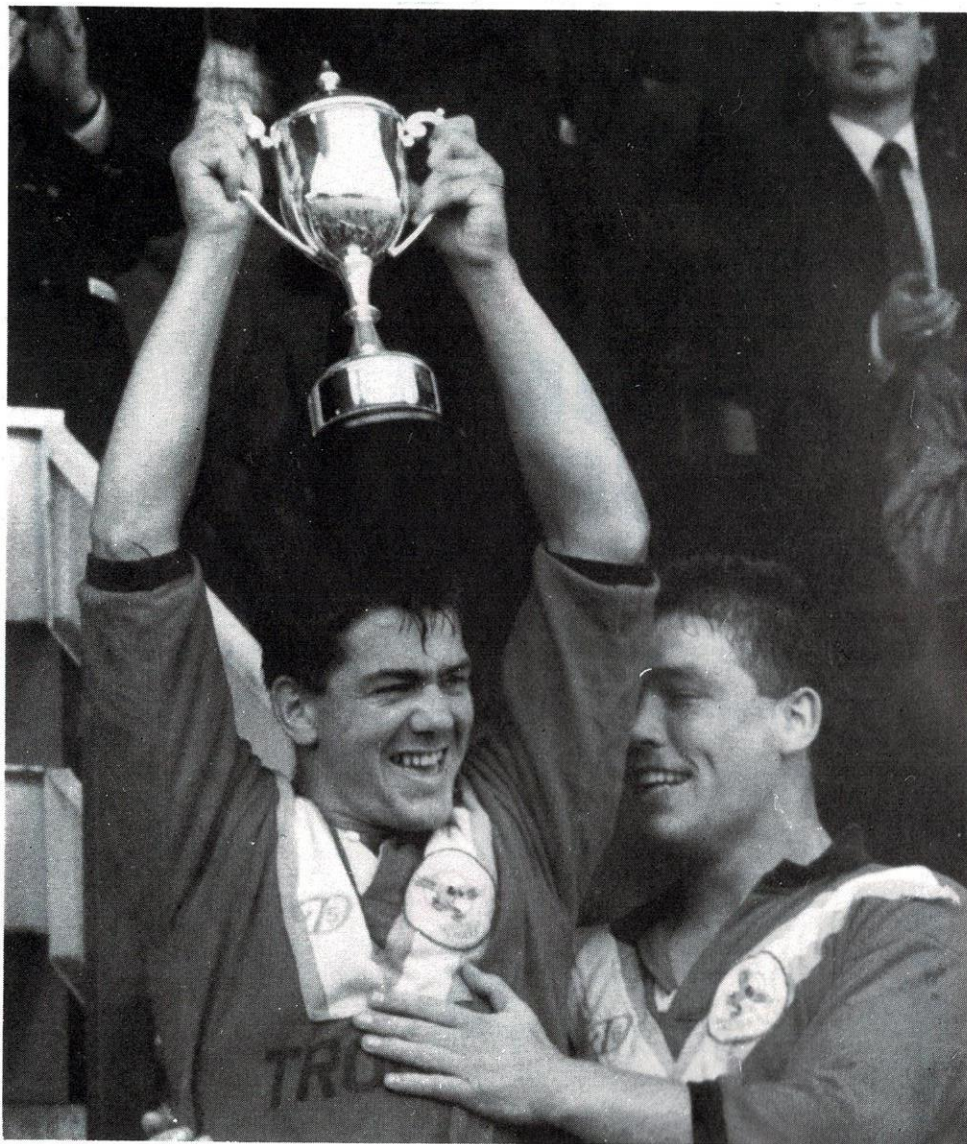

Supporters' Association Notes

Since our last home game three months ago the scoreboard end of Central Park has changed a great deal in readiness for the building of the new stand and the Riverside Club extension. WIGAN SEVENS

THIS afternoon sees the 33rd Wigan Summer Sevens competition at Central Park — some 67 years on from the very first tournament in 1923. That day Wigan defeated Barrow by 18 points to 10 in the Final. Unfortunately though the idea didn't catch on and it was another 26 years before the second Wigan Sevens took place. This time Salford took the honours with a 13 points to 11 victory over Warrington. There was another wait until the third competition however, but this time it was just 10 years later and there has been an annual Seven-a-Side competition at Central Park ever since, with the exception of 1972, when it had to be cancelled due to problems with sponsorship and the B.B.C.

Hosts Wigan have won the Sevens no less than 18 times and included in this total is a run of 6 straight wins from 1959 to 1964. Salford and Leeds have both won 3 times and Warrington, Oldham, Halifax, Workington Town, Wakefield Trinity, Widnes, Swinton and Sheffield Eagles have all won once.

Last season Sheffield Eagles caused a big upset by capturing the trophy at the first attempt. It was a thoroughly deserved success though and Darryl Powell was a popular choice as Man of the Tournament. For the record, the Yorkshiremen beat Leeds 18-10 in the first round, Wakefield Trinity 10-4 in the semi-final and Widnes 20-4 in the final. Holders Wigan went out to Widnes 16-0 after beating Hunslet 18-14.

The 1989 Wigan Sevens was also notable for two very unusual incidents. Firstly, despite the draw having been made several weeks previously, Widnes turned up in a red kit to play Salford — they hurriedly changed into Wigan's second choice tops — and secondly, when Salford kicked off the ball struck the referee, who had no choice but to order a scrum.

SUMMER SEVENS RULES OF THE TOURNAMENT

1. Games will be played under the Laws of the Rugby Football League except that:
 - (a) at a Kick off following a score, the ball need not travel ten yards forward, and
 - (b) the three tackle rule shall apply.
2. Each side will consist of seven players, the usual formation being three forwards and four backs.
3. Selection may be made from eight players but one substitute will be allowed during any part of the game.
4. The duration of each game before the Final game will be sixteen minutes, i.e. seven and half minutes each way with one minute interval at half-time. If at the end of the sixteen minutes the scores are level the teams shall change over and continue playing until one side scores, such side being the winners; ends being changed every seven and a half minutes if necessary. In extra time there will be no interval. The final tie will be played for ten minutes each way with an interval of one minute at half-time.
5. Time is checked by an independent Time Keeper who allows for injury time. A Klaxon indicates the end of each session of play, except that if a try has been scored, the scoring side shall be allowed to attempt the conversion.

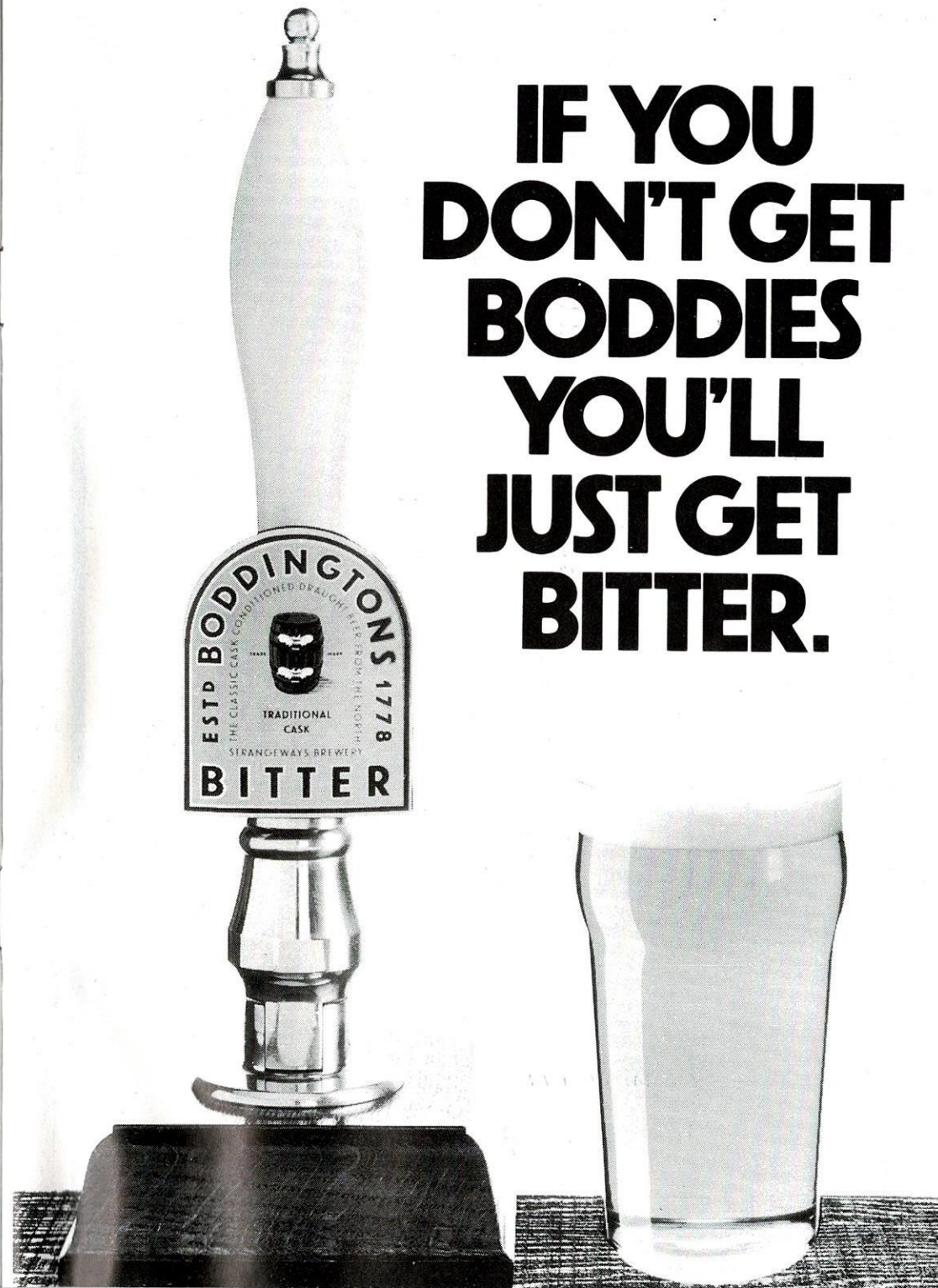
