



IT has been an eventful summer at Watersheddings and you can rest assured that we are all looking forward immensely to life in the First Division. Make no mistake, it's the place to be.



ROGER'S FOCUS

Oldham Evening Chronicle Rugby League writer, Roger Halstead, looks at today's visitors A BURNING ambition to emulate Wigan lies behind that sensational summer signing by Leeds of the world's top Rugby Union full-back John Gallagher.

The ambitious Headingley club is reputed to have engaged the former All-Blacks star on a contract worth £400,000.

Only the best is good enough for Leeds, whose officials are determined this season to rid the club and the team of the 'Nearly Men' tag and restore former glories.

The prospect of seeing Gallagher make his First Division debut today is exciting in itself, yet the whole Leeds team is full of stars and none twinkled any brighter on Great Britain's close-season tour of Papua New Guinea and New Zealand than the man who proved he could be just as devastating at stand-off as he is in the centre — Gary Schofield.

Schofield had a magnificent tour, as most of us witnessed on TV, and he may well retain the No. 6 spot for Leeds, thus forming a new pairing with the former Bradford Northern half-back Paul Harkin.

Ambitious as ever, Leeds first went for Test men Peter Sterling (Australia) and Gary Freeman (New Zealand) before they discovered that Harkin was available.

The third major signing of the off-season was perhaps more by accident than design in that it followed a chain of events sparked off by the arrival at Headingley of a letter urging the club to give trials to one Eddie Rombo, a Union winger from Kenya.

It is history now that Eddie did well as A. N. Other in the Wigan sevens, signed a contract, and has been given the opportunity to substantiate the claim that he is among the world's best wingers of either code.

Leeds . . .

John Gallagher (full-back) Sensational summer signing from New Zealand Rugby Union. The Londonborn 26-year-old was voted the best Union player in the world last season and Leeds believe the former All Black will make a similar impact in League.

Eddie Rombo (winger) This Kenyan Rugby Union star was snapped up by Leeds after an outstanding showing for the club in the Wigan Sevens. Leeds believe the 23-year-old flyer could be their answer to Martin Offiah and their confidence is reflected in the fact that they offered him their last import slot.

Paul Harkin (scrum half) The 33-year-old half-back was signed this summer from Bradford Northern and will be a vital cog in the Leeds challenge for honours. Paul has been a constant thorn in the Leeds side during his time at Odsal and Leeds supporters hope he can do to other teams what he ahs been doing to Leeds for years!

John Bentley (wing) Former Sale and England Rugby Union international winger who has settled quickly into Rugby League after signing for Leeds in November 1988. A more than useful goal-kicker as he showed in a match against Oldham at Leeds within weeks of signing, he landed eight goals in a 48 – 4 win.

Carl Gibson (centre or wing) Moved from Batley to Leeds in January 1986 and later toured Australia and New Zealand with GB. Speedy, a slim-built back who plays above his weight. Tough and durable.

Garry Schofield (centre) Joined his home town club Leeds from Hull in October 1987 and scored 22 tries in twenty-seven appearances in his first season at Headingley. GB and Yorkshire County centre.

Phil Ford (wing) The only Welshman on the Leeds register at present, Phil is also a current GB wingman. Former Warrington, Wigan and Bradford Northern player who moved to Headingley from Odsal at Christmas 1988.

Vince Fawcett (wing) Powerfully-built young player who was signed by Leeds from local amateur Rugby League club Guiseley Rangers in November 1987. Under-21 international.

David Creasser (stand-off) David is a product of South Leeds Schools Rugby League, which has given so many fine players to the professional game. He was on the Barla Youth Tour to New Zealand in 1983 and signed for Leeds soon after his return. Four full GB caps, five at under-21 level and two for Yorkshire County. Fast amd incisive type of player, he is also an accomplished goal-kicker.

Rob Ackerman (centre) Former British Lions Rugby Union centre who played also in 22 international matches for his native Wales. Turned to professional Rugby League originally for Whitehaven where he spent three seasons before being signed by Leeds from the Cumbrian club in January 1990.

Colin Maskill (hooker) Former GB Under-24 hooker and one of the most talented and reliable forwards in Rugby League. Castleford-born former Wakefield Trinity player who moved to Leeds in the winter of 1985. Colin's ever-cheerful attitude and highly industrious work-rate makes him a very popular man with playing colleagues and supporters.

Cavill Heugh (forward) Australian forward who originally came to England to join Halifax and enjoyed a distinguished spell there before moving on later to Barrow, from which club he was transferred to Leeds in December 1989.

Roy Powell (second row) Joined Leeds in April 1983 from the John Fisher amateur club in Dewsbury and progressed through the Leeds Colts and Alliance teams to Yorkshire County and the GB status at Under-24 level before winning full GB cap in May 1985.

Paul Dixon (second row) Unlike Roy Powell, who came up through the Leeds junior ranks, Paul was a big money capture and already a GB Test player when he moved from Halifax to Headingley in January 1989 in an exchange of international forwards as Paul Medley went to Thrum Hall. Former club captain at Huddersfield and Halifax, Paul is a versatile player who can move around in the pack and gets through a tremendous amount of work in every match, wherever he plays.

David Heron (loose forward or stand-off) One of the most popular players of the 1980s at Leeds, David enjoyed an exceptional Testimonial two seasons ago. like David Creasser, his early Rugby League was in South Leeds with Hunslet schools. Later he gained Youth Internatinal honours and captained the GB Colts team over a decade ago. Won his Yorkshire cap in 1980 and two years later won GB honours.

Mike Kuiti (second row or loose forward) New Zealand Test forward who was with the Tourists who came to England in 1989. Within a few weeks of going back to his home in Wellington at the end of the tour, Mike returned to England to sign for Leeds in January 1990.

Gary Divorty (loose forward) York-born and still resident in the city. Gary signed for Hull FC originally from local amateur Rugby League. He moved to Leeds in a £120,000 transfer deal in October 1989. Constructive player who can vary the tactics at the base of the scrum and is a useful kicker.

You cannot read too much into these games, of course, but it served a purpose and it was a promising start as all those fans who watched the match seemed to appreciate.






