



RUGBY League has a habit of lifting you up . . . and then knocking you down. I'm sure you all know what I mean judging by our impressive opening-day win over Leeds in the Stones Bitter championship and then our dissappointing defeat at Wakefield seven days later.

It was surely a case of . . . after the Lord Mayor's Show!

Against Leeds I was a bit worried when Derek Pyke had to go off with a knee injury as early as the tenth minute, but the players never stopped running and tackling and in the end they thoroughly deserved their victory.

It was an excellent team performance in which several individuals came up with top-class performances.

And so to Wakefield. This was a match which we were capable of winning and one in which I expected us to pick up two precious league points. I say precious because all points are vital in the cut-and-thrust of the First Division.

What happend? We let ourselves down because we failed to repeat the form we displayed against Leeds. In short, we didn't play well enough and if you don't play well you can't expect to be up there among the leaders of the First Division.

Wakefield remained on top by beating us, But I still maintain that it was a match we could and should have won.

We had them on the ropes at 8-4 early in the second half and I am sure that another try at that stage would have finished them off. In the event our attitude was not professional enough and we did not display the killer instinct — a vital commodity, I think, in the First Division.

We failed to play to our strengths and Trinity swung the game with two tries in three minutes. I'm saying nothing about their first try, but we should never have allowed hooker Billy Conway to charge clear from dummy half in the build-up to their second try.

In the First Division you can't always rely on staging a comeback. We tried desperately hard, but it was not to be and the result was that we missed a wonderful opportunity of consolidating on the great start we made against Leeds.

So to Castleford in this evening's rearranged fixture . . . and another hard one. But then I guess they are all hard in this First Division and that's what makes it such an intriguing competition.



ROGER'S FOCUS

Oldham Evening Chronicle Rugby League writer, Roger Halstead, looks at today's visitors IN recent seasons Castleford have moved away from their almost exclusive "home made" policy to pay out a small fortune on transfer fees and even bring in a coach from the other side of the world.

It would have been almost unthinkable for Castleford to shell out £150,000 or so on a player in the days of the Wheldon Road H-bombs, Hepworth and Hardisty, when the local talent was in such abundance that a certain Roger Millward was allowed to move on the Hull K.R.

What a contrast to today's team which will probably include one or two overseas men, two of the English games's most expensive buys in Lee Crooks and Graham Steadman, all led by Australian coach Darryl Van De Velde.

Crooks, whose early-season form has suggested that he will be knocking on the door for a Test recall in the forthcoming series against the Kangaroos, cost Cas £150,000 from Leeds last season.

Stand-off Steadman had previously moved from nearby Featherstone for a similar fee with a further £25,000 to be added if Test recognition followed, which it duly did.

More recently, of course, another Castleford link with the club's roots was severed when burly prop-forward Kevin Ward was transferred to St. Helens.

Nevertheless, classy Cas met Wakefield Trinity last Sunday in their seventh Yorkshire Cup final in the last ten years — an impressive record, but one in which Van De Velde would prefer to have seen reflected in Stones Bitter championship successes.

The Aussie boss would like to see the county cup competitions scrapped because he feels they make too many demands on the game's top players who are often asked to play two games in the space of four days at this time of the year.

He also feels that a successful team in the county cup faces an unfair disadvantage in the league.

Castleford . . .

Steve Larder (full-back) Australian recruit from the Illawarra Steelers Club in Sydney. 26 year old Steve has plenty of experience 'Down Under' and has operated in the threequarter line. A useful goal-kicker and has signed up for the full season.

Shaun Irwin (middle-back) Castleford born product of Redhill A.R.F.C. for whom a big future is predicted. Shaun already has Colts and Gt. Britain Under 21 caps and with a little better luck with injuries should be pushing for Senior level honours.

Grant Anderson (middle-back) Very promising, came via the Colts production line, representing Yorkshire at that level. Grant soon made the Cas 1st team squad and last season ended with him as the clubs leading scorer, on 24, in his first full term. His success was rewarded by Gt. Britain Under 21 honours and a nomination for the young player of the season award.

Giles Boothroyd (threequarters) Giles quickly established himself in the first team squad since signing from local amateur football a couple of seasons back. Yet another who achieved Gt. Britain Under 21 honours last term.

Graham Steadman (stand-off) Close season signing from Featherstone for a record fee of £145,000, which could become a world record fee if Cas have to hand over the extra £25,000 that the tribunal deemed necessary if he gains international status. With York he notched 60 plus tries and over 200 goals in 3½ seasons before a £55,000 move to Featherstone in 1986.

Gary French (scrum-half) Aussie star who has signed a one year contract with Cas. Whilst making his name Gary had a spell with Springfield Borough and was highly rated before injury forced an early return. Normally a Number 7, but has covered for stand-off Wally Lewis at Brisbane and has played in the loose forward role.

Keith England (prop) Another Castleford Colts product who toured Australia at that level with GB before winning caps at Under 24 and then in 1987 and again last term at senior level. Keith or 'Beefy' as he is better known locally plays well above his weight never gives less than 100% and has become one of the clubs most consistent players.

John Joyner (loose forward) Club Captain, John has served Cas loyally for 17 years, he holds a record number of appearances. Most recently in Summer 1988 John received a call lup to join GB in Australia, his third tour. He captained Cas to victory at Wembley in 1986 setting a Challenge Cup medal alongside John Player and Yorkshire Cup winning honours. Switches easily between loose forward and stand-off.

St. John Ellis (wing) A new recruit this season form Ryedale-York, started out with Southlands A.R.L. and scored regularly in the 2nd Division with York.

lan Bragger (centre) A £60,000 buy from Salford who has added strength to the threequarter line. His form at Lawkholme Lane persuaded Salford to give him his 1st Division chance which he took, improving still further his try scoring feats.

Jeff Hardy (stand-off/back row) Aussie star, came to this country with Sheffield Eagles. Cas quickly snapped him up to replace the homeward bound Ron Gibbs. Played stand-off with Eagles but has plenty of back-row experience.

Graham Southwood (hooker) Teenager who has firmly established himself in the first team squad. A record junior signing from Redhill A.R.L. Graham gained selection for the GB Under 21 squad recently.

Lee Crooks (prop) A cup deadline signing from Leeds for a new club record fee of £150,000. It was the second time Lee had commanded this fee, Leeds having paid a similar amount to Hull when they signed him up. A Gt. Britain International at 19 against the 1989 Aussie tourists Lee has totalled 14 caps the last being gained last season.
