



ON THE BARROW BEAT

THE Kangaroos opened their tour at St. Helens this afternoon — and I feel sure that, unlike 1982 and 1986, the Aussies will be far from invincible this time.

Don't get me wrong. They are big, strong, fit and fast, but, despite Wally Lewis's injury problem, I'm surprised he has not been brought along and I have to say that their half-backs this time don't exactly fill me with fright.

There is no Lewis, no Sterling and no Kenny. You've got Langer, Alexander, Lyons and Stuart, but I honestly believe the 'Roos will slip up at half-back this time and, unlike a lot of people, I believe Great Britain can turn them over in all three Tests.

I don't think they are anything like as strong as they were on their last two visits and, on top of that, we have also to acknowledge that the game in England has come a long way since 1982 and has also progressed since 1986.

My heart says Britain \dots but my head says Britain, too. All through the side, I think we can match them or beat them. I don't put Belcher in Tait's class, and in Offiah we have the best winger in the world. On the other flank I would put Tony Sullivan of Hull KR — a great prospect.

Australia cannot match us on the wings, but I admit they are big and powerful in the centre with Meninga and Daley.

Loughlin can match them in that respect, however, and then we have Schofield and Davies, and I would not hesitate to play the Welshman although I would have to give a lot of thought to whether I would play Schofield at stand-off and Davies in the centre or the other way around.

Meninga is big and strong, but he is slow off the ball. That's where Davies would score against him. Meninga's strength versus Davies's pace. They would cancel each other out.


Andy Gregory would be my scrum-half, but if he was unfit or out of form I would not hesitate to play our own Mike Ford. Fox of Featherstone has had his chance and I don't think he is up to it. Ford is in top form and he would definitely by in my team if Andy Gregory wasn't on form or available.


I would go for Sampson, McKenzie and Ward in the front-row, with Mike Gregory, Andy Goodway and Ellery Hanley behind them.

Four subs are allowed in this Test series and mine would be Edwards, Platt, Lydon and - a surprise to many people - Round or Betts.

The Australians are frightened of Ward. He is in top form for St. Helens, and to me is the man for the No. 8 job. Believe me, the Aussies are worried to death and they would be worried even more if they were to discover that Ward was back on Test duty.

I don't think we can attach too much importance to the display of the youngsters who did so well in New Zealand. Top marks to them all ... but the Aussies are a different kettle of fish and we have to go for the best side available.

ROGER'S FOCUS

Oldham Evening Chronicle Rugby League writer, Roger Halstead, looks at today's visitors HAVING been beaten three times by Oldham last season — twice in the Second Division and in that remarkable premiership final at Old Trafford — you can bet the Humber Bridge to a North Sea mackerel that Hull KR will come here today determined to gain revenge.

Equally, Oldham will be keen to continue an excellent run of home form which has produced 23 consecutive victories at Watersheddings stretching back to April, 1989.

Rovers will show several significant changes from the teams they fielded against Oldham in the Second Division last season, not least the presence of two New Zealand Test men in prop James Goulding and stand-off or centre David Watson.

They will, however, be without Australian centre Greg Austin and Kiwi secondrow man Tony Botica, who have lost their places on the club's overseas quota to make way for Goulding and Watson.

The departure of Austin, who ultimately joined Halifax, was a somewhat controversial decision as he was the club's top try scorer with 38 touchdowns last season, and he had formed a prolific partnership with winger Anthony Sullivan, who himself scored 34 tries as Rovers ran rampant through the Second Division and finally finished off as champions courtesy of Oldham's shock defeats at Workington and Swinton late in the season.

Somebody had to go to make way for Goulding's signing from the Australian club Newcastle Knights and it was Austin, the former Rochdale Hornets and Salford centre, who was shown the door.

Botica — 17 tries in 26 games last term — had returned to New Zealand before the end of the 1989-90 campaign, and this paved the way to sign Watson, a fellow Kiwi who had already had experience in this country with Whitehaven and York.

Garry Clark (right wing) 26 years. 6ft. 12st. Has toured Australia in 1984 and played for England in Internationals against France, but cannot qualify for Yorkshire in State of Origin games as he was born in Malta. Signed a new contract for this season.

Jim Irvine (centre) 24 years. 5ft. Ilin. 13st. Late on New Year's Eve, 1988, Rovers signed him from Hunslet for £25,000. A Leeds-born player, he had joined them from Bison's Sports early in 1986/87 and is a former Great Britain Colt.

Anthony Sullivan (wing) 21 years. 5ft. 10in. 11st. Joined Rovers Colts three seasons ago and was chosen for Great Britain Colts after playing for Rovers' first team at Swinton in November.

Wayne Parker (off-half or scrum-half) 23 years. 5ft. 8in. 11st. 7lb. In 1987/88, he won Under-21 honours in both internationals against France. He also won the Halbro'-Open Rugby "Shooting Star" award as Britain's outstanding young player.

David Bishop (scrum-half) 28 years. 5ft. 9in. 13st. Controversial signing from Welsh Rugby Union club Pontypool. An instant favourite with the fans, he was the club's "Player of the Year" last season and toured with the GB party during the summer.

Asuquo Ema (prop or second row) 27 years. 6ft. 16st. Son of a Nigerian father. A permanent fixture in the Robins first team for four seaons, but shook the club with a transfer request, but early this season he signed a new contract and was taken off the list.

Paul Lyman (second row) 24 years. 6ft. 15st. 7lb. He was in the Great Britain squad for the first two Tests against the 1986 Australian Tourists without getting a game. Rovers signed him on January 7th, 1989, for £55,000, with Test forward Chris Burton going in part exchange.

Andy Thompson (second row) 22 years. 5ft. Ilin. 13st. Originally a full back, but often called upon to play at centre. He was a surprise choice at loose forward this season, but has acquitted himself well.

Des Harrison (second row) 25 years. 6ft. 2in. 15st. Yet another product of the Colts "A" team football. Started as a centre and is now establishing himself as an excellent forward.

Paul Speckman (loose forward) 23 years. 6ft. 13st. 5lb. Via Colts and "A" team, now challenging for a regular first team place.

Graeme Cook (full back) 19 years. 6ft. 11st. 5lb. The latest find via the Craven Park — highly productive junior and "A" team set-up. Called into the first team following injury to Dave Lightfoot.

James Goulding (prop) 24 years. 6ft. 15st. 5lb. Rovers' latest overseas signing. A New Zealand tourist who comes to the club via Australian club Newcastle Knights.

Sean Hoe (hooker) 20 years. 5ft. 8in. 12st. Came into the side at the start of the season with Chris Rudd and Dane Harrison not available.

Graeme Hallas (centre) 19 years. 6ft. 12st. 6lb. Although he missed most of last season through illness and injury, has re-established himself back in the side. Taking over the goalkicking duties in the absence of Mike Fletcher.

David Watson (centre/stand-off) 5ft. IOin. 12st. New Zealand international who has previously played for Whitehaven and York.
