ON THE **BARROW BEAT**

I don't think anybody at Watersheddings will be sorry to see the back of November. It was always going to be a difficult month for us with games against Wigan, Bradford, Castleford and Widnes but, to make matters worse, we spent most of the month without injured forwards such as Derek Pyke, John Fieldhouse, Austin Donegan and Keith Atkinson while Charlie McAlister also missed the first two games of the month against Wigan and Bradford, and Duncan Platt was suspended for the matches against Bradford and Castleford.

Our injuries continued when Tommy Martyn took a nasty blow to the head at Castleford and he is unlikely to be playing until next week at the soonest.

In the 'A' team at Castleford the other night, my own son Tony received a double fracture of the cheekbone so he, too, will be out for a few weeks.

Our form over the month has been erratic. We played well at Wigan, despite losing Duncan Platt for an alleged trip on Ellery Hanley, but we threw away two points against Bradford, we played badly at Castelford, and then we produced a vastly-improved show against Widnes last Sunday only to go down 24-18.

The result was a disappointment, of course, but all the lads gave everything they had and wasn't it nice to see Norman Francis making those two stunning first-half breaks that produced tries for Brett Clark and Duncan Platt.

Two areas of the game in which we must improve are tackling close to the rucks and our control of the ball.

We started off all right against Widnes, but later in the game we were giving the Widnes forwards far too much latitude, not moving up quickly enough, and consequently they became twice as hard to tackle.


We must attack in defence. That means we must take the initiative to get up among the opposing forwards before they hit the advantage line, rather than staying back to wait for them coming at us.

The other thing we have to improve on is our control of the ball at vital times. Too often we are giving the ball away on the first or second tackle because we get excited if somebody makes a break or a half-break.

We have to be prepared to play the percentages and prepared to stick to the ball and build on what we have achieved, rather than throw out risky, chancy passes that enable the defence to take off our pressure.

FOCUS

Oldham Evening Chronicle Rugby League writer, Roger Halstead, looks at today's visitors SALFORD, hot favourites to make an immediate return to the First Division, further strengthened their squad last week when they signed the Sheffield forward Francis Leota in a straight swop for the Australian, Peter Tonks.

The news of Leota's capture, coupled with the return to action of long-standing injury victims Peter Williams and Mike Worrall, will enhance Salford's prospects of doing well in the cup competitions this season, as Oldham did last year when they were sitting pretty towards the top of the Second Division.

Under the coaching of Kevin Tamati, the Reds have already reached the final of the Lancashire Cup, knocking out Oldham en route, so a tremendous match is in prospect today in round one of the Regal Trophy.

Ian Sherratt, the former Oldham prop, will be keen to do well at Watersheddings on a personal note and it will be interesting to see whether another ex-Oldham man, Mick Worrall, has been able to force his way into the squad after playing his first game of the season in the 'A' team last weekend.

Salford owe much to their posse of recruits from the Union code such as centre Peter Williams, Welsh wing Adrian Hadley, and half-backs David Fell and Steve Kerry.

Fell had an outstanding game when Salford beat Oldham at the Willows in the county cup at the start of the season and Oldham will have to show good form to make home advantage count if they are to avenge that disappointment when Salford scored the winning try late in the game.

Striding Aussie full back Steve Gibson is a dangerous and speedy attacker when joining the line or clearing his lines and there is plenty of pace and power in a back division of Tex Evans, Williams, Hadley and former Wigan man John Gilfillan, a more recent recruit by the club.

The forwards are strong and mobile and, as a Second Division outfit, Salford are in the habit of winning . . . so Oldham will have to be on their mettle.

Steve Gibson: Fullback. The popular Australian fullback, formerly with Brisbane Souths, is now in his fourth season at the Willows. To date he has scored 43 tries in his 99 appearances for Salford.

Tex Evans: Winger. Signed from neighbours Swinton in a £40,000 move, he has scored 23 tries in 51 appearances since his move at the beginning of the 1988-89 season.

Martin Birkett: Centre. Joind Salford on a three year contract in December 1989 after representing English Schools and Colleges before being selected for the BARLA G.B. side prior to turning professional.

Peter Williams: Centre. A sensational capture from the Orrell RU club in March 1988, after representing both Lancashire RU and England RU, gaining four caps in all at the International level. Peter has already played for GB and Lancashire in the professional code.

Adrian Hadley: Winger. Turned professional in September 1988, becoming Salford's costliest signing at £100,000 in a four year deal. The former Welsh RU International and Cardiff club player has now settled in well at the Willows after a niggling injury halted his progress.

Frank Cassidy: Stand off. Another former Swinton player who joined Salford for £35,000 in November 1989. A clever footballer and accurate touch finder who originally played for Rose Bridge ARL.

David Fell: Stand off. Joined Salford from Orrell RU club on a five year contract in October 1989. Made his debut against Leeds last season.

Steve Kerry: Scrum half. Signed in December 1988 from the Preston Grasshoppers RU club. Prolific scorer who is improving all the time. After spells at stand off and on the wing he is now being given a run at scrum half. Top try scorer last season and the number one choice goal kicker at the

Shaun Brown: Scrum half. Forced his way into the first team last season after some dazzling Alliance team performances. Former BARLA G.B. International who toured Down Under in 1989. Played for Leigh East ARL as

Ian Sherratt: Prop. Powerhouse front row forward signed in August 1989 from Oldham. Also had a spell with Bradford Northern where he began his professional career. A leg injury forced him to miss a large part of last season but he is now back to full fitness.

Mark Lee: Hooker. Bargain £15,000 signing from St. Helens in January. Went straight into the first team and has missed one match since then.

Shane Hansen: Second row. New Zealander with bags of experience having played for top Auckland side Northcote Tigers. Tremendous tackler who adds steel to the Salford pack.

Chris Whitley: Prop. Joined salford from Wigan St. Patricks ARL club in August 1986 and was voted Alliance's Player of the Year in his first season at

Arthur Bradshaw: Second row. Signed from Thatto Heath ARLC in August 1989 after representing BARLA at County level. Broke his leg in his first team debut match against Warrington but has now made a full recovery.

Ian Blease: Second row. Former Folly Lane ARL player who signed professional for Salford in March 1985. Developed well at the Willows and can play anywhere in the pack. Installed as captain of the side at the beginning of the season.

Andrew Burgess: Loose forward. Signed professional on his 17th birthday after several games with the Alliance side as an amateur. Previously played for Irlam Hornets ARLC.



McCorquodale looks at Rugby League around Oldham LAST Saturday the inter-school Oldham-Leigh fixtures produced two major shocks.

An Under 16 unbeaten Leigh met an Oldham side, depleted by injury, still seeking its first win of the season and despite being 12-8 down at half-time Oldham stormed back to win 20-12. Captain Martin Halkyard was at his inspirational best scoring two fine tries as well as being involved in the others by forwards George Slicker and Jonathan Eastwood.


