







CONCENTRATION has to be the name of the game in the Oldham camp as we swing towards the New Year in need of First Division points to take some of the pressure off the team after recent league defeats.

Our performance against league leaders Hull at the Boulevard last time out looked very promising in the first half. At the interval we trailed only 6-4 and although our line had survived some Hull pressure, the home team had also had a few narrow escapes.

We had done well because we concentrated on the basics such as sound tackling, ball control, effective kicking and a good chase, and these tactics rattled Hull who, in the first 20 minutes, were losing a lot of ball and causing their supporters a lot of anxiety.

I have no doubt that we could have won had we continued to employ those tactics throughout the match but, for no apparent reason, we lost our way in the second half. We started to try and play football in our own 25, began to lose the ball, and put ourselves under an enormous amount of pressure.





Finally, I hope you all enjoyed a good Christmas and will have a happy and prosperous New Year. You can rest assured that we will be going into 1991 at Watersheddings with a determination to do well and pull away from the bottom three.

# FOCUS

Oldham Evening Chronicle Rugby League writer, Roger Halstead, looks at today's visitors IT will take a long time for the respective followers of Oldham and Rochdale Hornets to forget the derby game at Spotland this time last year. Rochdale won 24-12 in front of 8,500 spectators. It was a marvellous day for everyone with allegiance to the red, white and blue and a bitterly disappointing Boxing Day for Oldham, who earned their revenge on the Easter Monday with a 30-2 walloping of Hornets here at Watersheddings.

Both games were of extreme importance in the Second Division championship race and today's encounter is no less crucial to both camps but for very different reasons.

Life in the First Division is extremely hard and both Oldham and Rochdale are currently in the bottom three relegation zone. Hornets have only two points from 11 games, while Oldham have only eight points from 12 matches. It will take a miracle now to keep Hornets in the First Division, while Oldham are also desperately in need of points after a run of five consecutive First Division defeats and that morale-shattering Regal Trophy defeat at Batley.

Hornets, of course, can take great comfort from their performances in the Regal Trophy, particularly their outstanding third-round win at Castleford, which put them into last Saturday's first semi-final against Bradford Northern at Headingley.

These notes had to be written before that cup-tie took place but, whatever the outcome, Hornets must have derived great confidence from their surprise victory at Wheldon Road.

In the first round, of course, they put out Saddleworth Rangers and then they won at Doncaster before taking everyone by surprise with their victory at

Today, Oldham will welcome several players in the Hornets camp back to their old happy hunting ground at Watersheddings, among them local boys Mark Lord and the Hall brothers, Martin and Robert.

Tony Humphries: Signed from Warrington at the beginning of last season, Tony is a Lancashire player and a very solid prop forward. Has played in the second row. A deceptive runner and very strong tackler. Enjoys his try-scoring.

Mike O'Neill: Signed from Widnes at the start of the season for Hornets record fee. Mike has bags of experience and a drawerful of medals from his years with the World Champions. A hard-tackling, powerful running forward, at home either at prop or second row.

Bob Grogan: 29-year-old from the Gold Coast Giants playing in his second season in Britain after a successful spell with Halifax. Bob is a very good organiser and his experience will come in handy. Scored his first try for the club against Sheffield.

Neil Holding: Made his debut against Sheffield Eagles after his £55,000 transfer from St. Helens. A marvellous 13-year career has given Neil a wealth of experience. A very popular player with a gift for amusing people. A potentially devastating half back pairing with Bob Grogan is in prospect.

Darren Abram: Signed from Trafford Borough just in time to make his debut in a game he will want to forget at Leeds. A young, pacy centre who scored on his debut and should provide some much-needed penetration wide out.

Stuart Galbraith: Signed in the deal which brought Darren Abram from Trafford Borough. On the fringe of the Kiwi national side, Stuart had an impressive debut as sub against Leeds. showing why Hornets took over his contract. A young, confident type of player with an excellent eye for a gap and pace to exploit it.

Colin Whitfield: Hornets finally got their man after chasing him for half a season. 29 years old and a wealth of experience with Salford, Wigan and Halifax. A prolific points scorer who will surely have his sights on Steve Turner's record of 243.

Mark Lord: Oldham-born pacy centre, signed from Leeds where he had limited chances in the first team. Devastating running and a vicious side-step saw Mark land 23 tries last season.

Martin Hall: Busy hooker in the loose, a player with great potential. Martin was snapped up from neighbours Oldham at the start of last season. A nippy player who can always be relied on to back up a move.

Neil Cowie: In his fifth season with the club since signing from Todmorden ARLFC. Originally second row but an inspired conversion to prop forward. Neil is a fierce tackler and strong runner and is now looking to off-load the ball.

Mark Viller: Signed from Swinton in a double deal with John Myler, Mark made a try-scoring debut against Fulham coming on as substitute. A tough, gutsy player who attacks well from the full back position.

Phil Fox: Experienced winger signed from Wakefield to provide the finishing required on the right wing. Scored on his debut as he has on every debut he has made. Dogged by injuries this season, but has shown up well since his return.

John Blackburn: Signed from Castleford for an undisclosed fee as cover for the second row. An impressive debut against Hunslet last season, but the season has seen John mainly in the 'A' team, although he is turning in some excellent performances. An extended run in recent weeks has shown him to be willing to take the ball up at every opportunity. A solid tackler.

Karl Marriott: BARLA Under-19 International tourist Karl signed from his home town team despite offers from other clubs. Featured on the wing for Great Britain but has the ability and pace to play stand-off or centre; in fact, Karl has also turned out in the second row.

Robert Hall: The younger brother of current hooker, Martin, has progressed through the 'A' team this season. An eager worker who has played at loose forward and hooker since his

Andy Sullivan: Top class scrum half with much First Division experience. Snapped up from Widnes when unable to hold a place in the face of competition from the Hulmes. A busy worker who struck up a good partnership with John Woods. Scored his first try for the club in the win over Swinton — his 29th game.

John Myler: Vastly experienced ex-Widnes star who moved on to Swinton two seasons ago with Steve O'Neill. Hornets see him as the ball-handling forward to provide the gaps for the backs to exploit. Made an impressive debut against Whitehaven, winning the man of the match award. This season has seen John turn out at stand-off following the departure of John Woods. Recently appointed 'A' team coach.

KEITH Atkinson is, without question, one of Oldham's unluckiest — and bravest - players.

Prior to this season he has suffered a broken back, dislocated and broken spine, a removed disc, broken leg, two broken thumbs and numerous broken fingers.

His run of bad luck has continued this season. In an 'A' Team match against Leeds earlier this season, young Tony Barrow sat on his knee in the scrum and damaged his ligaments. He suffered the same injury in his first comeback match against the Wigan 'A' team.

Now, as a new year approaches, he wants to put his run of injuries behind him — after he had the ideal 26th birthday present when he was selected to play in the second row in the 31-4 defeat at Hull.

"I was glad to be back — but wish I hadn't after the end of the match," he says. "I've never felt so tired after a game as I did after Hull. The step up in class is incredible but after a couple of games back in the first team I'll be back to full fitness and looking forward to establishing myself in the first team."

Despite his horrific catalogue of injuries, he has no intention of changing his game. "I'll always put everything into the game so I've got to expect a few lumps and bruises although you cannot legislate for serious injuries. After all, who would have expected one of your own players to fall on my knee!

All we need is a good win under our belts and I am sure we will rediscover our confidence. We've an excellent team here and we should be doing well, so hopefully we can get back to winning ways against Rochdale and give all our fans a belated Christmas present," said Keith, who spent the summer in Australia playing for a Canberra league side with team-mate Richard Irving.






