



# ON THE **BARROW BEAT**

by Oldham coach TONY BARROW



WELCOME to 1991 . . . and talk of a major restructuring of the Rugby League format with the possibility of Scarborough coming into the League and the formation of three divisions.

If Scarborough was admitted, that would make a total of 36 professional clubs and already there is serious talk of splitting them into three divisions, each of 12 clubs.

I am all for this revolutionary move because the present system is unsatisfactory on several counts.

The Second Division fixture formula is unsatisfactory and I shudder to think what will happen next season to the sides that win promotion this time.

Salford, Halifax, Swinton, Ryedale York, Carlisle and Leigh are all in the running and in my opinion not one of those teams will have a realistic chance of First Division survival.

This season's First Division is probably the most competitive it has ever been and it is a shame that three teams out of the 14 will have to go down to be replaced by clubs with little chance of making an impact.

With three divisions of 12 teams each, clubs would find their level and to try and reduce Rugby League's "yo-yo" syndrome, I would opt for only one up and one down in each division.

There is also talk of automatic one-up and one-down, with another place up for grabs on a play-off basis.

I welcome anything that would reduce the possibility of clubs moving unprepared between the divisions, but first and foremost we have to hope that Scarboroough are admitted and that the new club wins the necessary two-thirds majority to bring Rugby League to the Fourth Division soccer club's trim and tidy stadium.


A 12-club division would provide 22 league matches and I think that is certainly enough for First Division clubs which, in the main, will also monopolise most of the three major knock-out competitions.

A lot of people in the game think that our top players are already under too much pressure and are asked to play too many games at a time when standards at the highest level are more demanding than they have ever been.

If clubs in the Second and Third Divisions were to feel that 22 matches were not enough, a separate knock-out tournament could be provided for them with the early rounds over two legs and the final as a curtain-raiser to the premiership final at Old Trafford.

Even a Third Division outfit would then be guaranteed a minimum of 27 fixtures - 22 in the League, one each in the county cup, Regal Trophy and Challenge Cup and two in their own knock-out cup.

Count me in on the three-division bandwagon!

Oldham Evening Chronicle Rugby League writer, Roger Halstead, looks at today's visitors FEATHERSTONE Rovers are today's visitors to Watersheddings and if there was ever such a thing as a "four-pointer", this is it.

There is a real dog-fight now towards the bottom end of the First Division and Featherstone are in alongside half the teams in the division. Makes you think, doesn't it?

Rovers did themselves a great favour by beating Wakefield on Boxing Day on the same day that Oldham beat Rochdale Hornets and both St. Helens and Warrington slipped up.

That lifted Oldham above Warrington but still one point behind Featherstone and having played one game more.

The New Year games will have slightly altered the situation but there is no denying that this is one game Oldham are desperate to win and enhance their chances of staying up in what is probably the First Division's most competitive season on record.

Who, then, will be standing between Oldham and victory?

First of all, of course, there are those stalwarts of Post Office Road, the Fox fellows — coach Peter and scrum-half Deryck, who apparently had a brilliant game on Boxing Day as partner to lan Smales at half-back.

Then there is a young man who needs no introduction to Watersheddings — prop Leo Casey, who joined Rovers from Oldham in a club record £100,000 deal, plus another £20,000 if Leo ever plays for Great Britain.

This will be Leo's first game at Watersheddings since he left his home-town club so it will be a big day for him playing against so many of his former mates on home territory.

Chris Bibb is an international-class full-back with a penchant for swift attacking and Paul Newlove is one of the finest young centres to emerge in recent years.

Up front, Jeff Grayshon is still battling along in the front row — what a great example he is to younger forwards of today — and there are currently three Kiwis in the running for pack places, namely hooker Trevor Clark and back-row men Clarry Iti and Brendan Tuuta.

That's a far cry from the days when the Post Office Road pack was full of local miners. It just goes to show — even in Featherstone things change with the times!

**Chris Bibb:** A former GB Under-21 international full-back and Yorkshire county cap, he joined Rovers in 1985. Scored 13 tries in 34 games last season. Scored a record-equalling six tries against Keighley in the Yorkshire Cup.

Ikram Butt: Fast-moving three-quarter signed from Leeds at the start of the season.

**Paul Newlove:** Great Britain's youngest international appearing as a substitute against New Zealand last year at the tender age of 18. Centre Paul signed as a professional at the age of 17 and went straight into the first team. His father, John, captained Rovers to the club's Wembley triumph against Bradford Northern in 1973.

**Terry Manning:** Joined Rovers from fellow Yorkshire club Keighley, where he had a well-earned reputation as one of the best centres in the division.

**Alan Banks:** Shot to prominence as a teenager in Allan Agar's 1983 Challenge Cup-winning team appearing in the final at stand-off. Injuries have hampered his career but he is now back in fine form.

Martin Pearson: An 18-year-old teenager, this young stand-off is strong, fast and has outstanding goalkicking ability. He is expected to go far in the game.

**Deryck Fox:** Experienced and skilful scrum-half who has played in nine full tests between 1985-1986, he signed from a local amateur side in 1983. Won his place back in the GB squad last year after a three-year absence.

**Jeff Grayshon:** A credit to the game after 20 years, he won every honour in the game except a Wembley appearance. He was the oldest man to play for Great Britain at 36 and gained the last of 13 test caps against Neew Zealand in 1986. He has played for coach Peter Fox at Bradford and Leeds.

**Trevor Clark:** A 1983 Maori tourist signed from Leeds, he is a versatile player who has played at centre, full-back, hooker and the back row. He has produced his best form for Rovers at No. 9.

**Leo Casey:** A former Oldham favourite who signed for Rovers in the close season for a record transfer fee of £100,000. This exciting prop, who needs no introdouction to the Oldham faithful, is now back to full fitness after injury.

**Chris Burton:** Signed from Hull KR last season, he is a highly-experienced GB international with nine caps and has also appeared in nine major finals.

**Gary Rose:** He joined Rovers from Keighley last season and has already become a firm favourite with the crowd courtesy of his rugged tackling and straight running.

**Brendan Tuuta:** A New Zealand international who has made a big impact in the first team with strong running and tackling and a high work rate.

**Andrew Fisher:** Joined Rovers in 1989, this busy loose-forward made his debut against Castleford and has impressed since then.

**Paul Hughes:** A determined strong-running forward with plenty of pace, he joined Rovers from a local amateur side in 1987. He has also played on the wing.

**Gary Price:** Previously with York and Leeds, this hard-working back-row player cost Rovers £50,000. He was a member of the York team that was 80 minutes from a Wembley final in 1984 and played for Peter Fox at Leeds prior to moving to Featherstone.

**Tim Sharp:** Another Featherstone teenager who promises a lot for the future, he is the brother of the Hull forward Jon.

**Owen Simpson:** Signed last week from Keighley in a record £50,000 deal, he is an ex-Army Rugby Union player who was a leading try-scorer in his two seasons in Division Two.

**Clarry Iti:** A New Zealand Rugby Union All Black forward, Clarry has joined Rovers on a two-year contract. He is the cousin of Brett Iti, Bradford Northern's scrum-half.

THE last quarter of 1990 is one that speedy Oldham centre John Henderson would rather forget as he was struck down by a nagging groin injury at the beginning of the season. That injury restricted him to a handful of A team games as he tried to make a comeback on three separate occasions.

Now, with a new year to look forward to and two first team appearances against Hull and Rochdale to his name, John hopes to say goodbye to the injury.

"I have had three very painful anti-inflammatory injections which have helped the injury and the doctor says it is OK to carry on playing," commented John, who was signed from Leigh two years

"Groin strains are notoriously difficult to shake off. Look at the number of Wigan players who have struggled with similar injuries.

"It has been a very frustrating time as I wanted to get back into the first team. One of the worst aspects was that outwardly nothing appeared to be wrong except that I couldn't play Rugby vet when I broke my jaw it was obvious I couldn't play.

"When I came back from the broken jaw last season I scored II tries in three games. It would be nice to get back to scoring ways as quickly," says John, who started a new job with a Manchester investment company at the beginning of lanuary.

John made his comeback against Hull and unfortunately dislocated his collarbone. He remains philosophical. "You go through phases in your career picking up injuries. Now I hope to remain injury-free for the rest of the season?






