SILK CUT CHALLENGE CUP 1991

Silk Cut are investing £300,000 in the 1991 tournament with £180,000 being offered in prize money - with a record winners purse of £32,000 - the remaining £120,000 going into the League's Capital Development Fund for ground improvements.

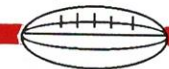

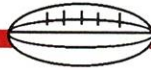

OUR VISITORS

Today we entertain Oldham, the club with whom a positive rivalry developed last season; supporters will hardly need reminding that although we won Second Division Championship, Oldham "came from the dead" to defeat us by one point in the closing minutes. This season however we managed a win at The Watersheddings despite playing with a man short for over half of a game dominated by controversy.

Coach **Tony Barrow** and his club were quite active in the transfer market. Considering they were well off for prop forwards they sold **Leo Casey** to Featherstone for a record £100,000. His last match for Oldham was that Premiership Final - not that he was involved in their recovery, having left the field injured early in the game.

Summer purchases have included props **Derek Pyke** from Widnes and **Austin Donegan** from St. Helens, centre **Ronnie Duane** from Warrington, and winger **Norman Francis** from Leeds. Duncan Platt: Full back: A former Widnes player who cost Oldham £35,000 in December, 1988 and was one of Tony Barrow's first signings. Landed 125 goals last season, despite damaging an ankle in the Lancashire Cup Final and missing the next seven matches. Brother of Wigan and Great Britain forward Andy Platt.

Richard Irving: Wing: Snapped up by Oldham from Moldgreen A.R.L. Club in Huddersfield. Won both BARLA, G.B. and Yorkshire honours. Rapidly making strides in the professional game.

Norman Francis: Wing: 25 year old who joined Oldham from Leeds for an undisclosed fee, at the end of August after being on the transfer list for £35,000. Scored four tries for Leeds 'A' against Oldham at Headingley in 1989 - 90 with Tony Barrow watching in the stands. Big, strong and fast, he is hoping for more senior chances at Watersheddings than he got at Headingley, where he spent most of his football in the 'A' team.

Tony Anderson: Centre: 29 year old former Brisbane player who joined Halifax when brother Chris was player - coach. Oldham's record buy at £75,000 from Halifax in the Spring of 1990. Had wretched luck since moving from Thrum Hall. In his second game for Oldham he broke his nose and his comeback at Workington he broke his ankle. Spent the summer of 1990 getting back to fitness and returned to action in October.

Des Foy: Centre: 27 year old local who had started his professional career with Widnes. Joined Oldham in 1983 in the deal which took prop Brian Hogan back to Naughton Park. Played for Great Britain Under 24's then toured Australia with Great Britain in 1984. Played in the first Test in Sydney and has a lot of experience in Australian football with Newcastle Knights to Oldham. Younger brother of Martin Foy, he was listed at £100,000 when he asked for a move at the end of November.

John Henderson: Centre: Another local lad signed from Leigh for £50,000 in September 1988. Represented Lancashire. Rated as one of the fastest centres in the game. Played almost 150 games for Leigh and has passed the career century of tries mark. Also had a spell with Wests in Sydney.

Gary Hyde: Centre: Signed for Castleford in 1978 and was their third top point scorer in 1980-81 with 231 points. A former Great Britain Under 24 and Yorkshire player, he moved to Oldham two years ago.

Ron Duane: Centre: Signed as a 16 year old by Tony Barrow when the latter was at Warrington. Burst on the international scene as a teenager and went on the 1984 Tour to Australia, only to suffer serious knee damage in the opening game at Darwin, Northern Territory. Injuries continued severely to restrict his appearances. Still only 27 he joined Oldham during the summer for a reported £15,000.

Tommy Martyn: Centre: Son of former Great Britain second rower Tommy Martyn senior, he was signed from Leigh Miners after outstanding displays as a schoolboy International against France and touring Australia with BARLA in 1989.

Paul Lord: Wing: Been at Watersheddings since April 1985 when he turned professional as a 17 year old from Stanley Rangers A.R.L. Club. Represented BARLA, G.B. and Yorkshire at Under 17 level.

Steve Robnson: Wing: Joined Oldham from Saddleworth Rangers in November 1987. Progressed to become an extremely fine winger.

Brett Clark: Off Half: Former Western Suburbs and Sydney St. George Player who first came to England to play for St Helens. Was the Saints stand-off in their 19 - 18 defeat by Halifax at Wembley in 1987. Joined Oldham of the 1989-90 season.

Mike Ford: Scrum half: Former Wigan player who spent several good seasons at Central Park. Played in the 1985 Challenge cup Final alongside Brett Kenny. Also played for Leigh. Toured Down Under in 1988, also gained four Under 21 caps.

Derek Pyke: Prop: One of the most experienced ball handling props in the game and player whose skills can unlock the toughest defence. Signed from Widnes for a £50,000 fee during the close season. He made appearances for Leigh in a ten year spell before moving to Widnes, who paid £60,000 for him plus Harry Pinner. Represented Lancashire. Hampered by injury last October which necessitated a cartilage operation.

Austin Donegan: Prop: 22 year old, 6'3", 16st. giant who was brought from St. Helens for £20,000 last May. Can also play second row. Big and Exceptionally fast for his size. Austin is beleived by Oldham to have a big future in the game.

Andy Ruane: Hooker: Started his career with home town Widnes and moved to Rochdale Hornets from where he joined Oldham for £13,000 in July 1988. Scooped most of Club's Player of the Year awards in 1988 - 89 but had bad luck with injuries in 1989 - 90 when he began to face competition for the hooking job from Richard Russell. Listed at £20,000 on asking for a move last November.

Richard Russel: Hooker: Former Wigan player who played in every back position at Central Park and earned Great Britain Honours at Colts and Under 21 levels. Snapped up by Oldham in the 1989 close season, and regarded as the bargain which beat all bargains, he was signed for £3,000 down, with a further £12,000 to pay once he has made 50 senior appearances. Switching him to hooker has proved a master stroke.

John Fieldhouse: Prop: Former Warrington and Widnes forward, a Great Britain International who was from St. Helens. Man of the series against the Kivis in 1985. Settled in well at Watersheddings, but has been a recent absentee with ligament damage.

John Fairbank: Prop or Second row: Born in Halifax, a former BARLA Interantional forward signed by Leeds in November 1987 from Elland Road A.R.L. Club. Joined Oldham in September 1988. One of five League playing brothers.

Keith Newton: Second row: 29 year old forward signed from Widnes his home town club in January 1989 for £12,000. Listed at £50,000 for disciplinary reasons in mid November.

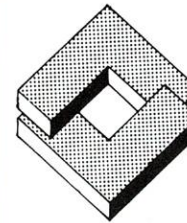
Paul Round: Second row: Was the first Oldham signing when Board of Directors replaced the former Committee. Tribunal ordered Oldham to pay St. Helens £65,000 - then a club record. Played twice for Great Britain under 21s in 1984 and represented Saints at Wembley in 1987, scoring a try in an appearance as substitute.

Keith Atkinson: Second row: Started as an Amateur when Oldham had a Colts team and played for Great Britain Colts as a winger against France in 1984. Has successfully made the switch from backs to pack and, as a bonus, is a proven goalkicker of some repute, but injuries have restricted his senior appearances to fewer than 60. Missed most of last season with a knee ligament trouble and suffered a recurrence in his first attempt at a come back.

Charlie McAllister: Second row in our earlier encounter this season. Back in New Zealand he played as a back row forward for Taranaki R.U. from Under 16 to Under 21 levels. When he withced to centre he earned an All Blacks trail. In 1987 he came to England, Joined Bradford and Bingley R.U.F.C. and was spotted by Oldham. After a couple of trials in the threequarters he was signed in January 1988. Also had a few games with Newcastle Knights in 1988. Reverted back to second row late last season.

Shaun Allen: Second row or Loose Forward. Began his career with St. Helens and earned Great Britain Under 24 honours as a centre against France for St. Helens in their 1984 Lancashire Cup winning side and in the 1985 and 1988 Premiership Finals. Joined Oldham on loan before signing for a bargain £10,000 in March 1989.

John Cogger: Loose forward: Born in Sydney and played for Western Suburbs. Spent two seasons with Runcorn Highfield before being signed by Oldham in February 1989 in a bargain deal. Went home to Austrilia early last April and missed the Premiership Final. As a consequence he was listed at £95,000, but has now returned to the Club and differnces have been resolved.

FIRST TEAM FOCUS

WIDNES 28 ROVERS 8

(Played 19th December, 1990)

Rovers visit to Naughton Park, delayed three days due to Widnes's involvement in the Regal Trophy Competition, was our first match for two and a half weeks, on an evening when an icy cold wind and rain made handling difficult.

We had first use of the elements at our back, but the home side soon pushed us into our own quarter and in seven minutes split our defence for a try wide out.

Craven Park was waterlogged on the original Boxing Day for this encounter, and anyone who saw it late on Friday evening would probably have bet on it being off again on the Saturday. As it was, the pitch had drained remarkably, allowing the match to go ahead though it was a heavy surface.

The rain fortunately held off, but there was a strong wind and we had first use of it. We launched the first attack and when Sheffield erred, **Mike Fletcher** put us ahead with a penalty.

Our lead was short lived. As the Eagles swooped towards our line there was a clear knock-on, but play was allowed to continue and the following side gained advantage with a try awarded to put the visitors ahead.

Back came Rovers, although even at this early stage we were looking decidedly "rusty" after our lay-off. 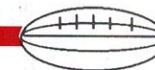

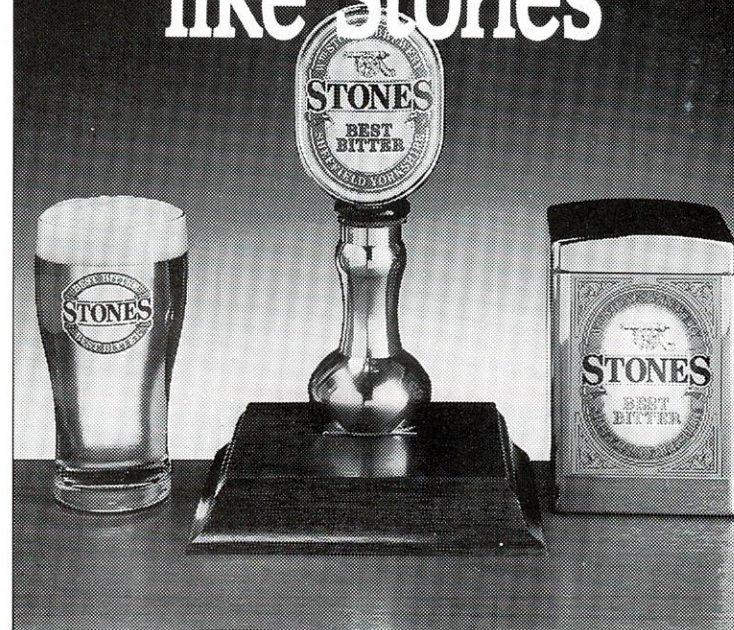

Bryan Neibling was an inspiring skipper, being involved in most of the play and earning a richly deserved standing ovation when he was substituted near the end. He carried off the man-of-the-match award but was punished hard by many of his colleagues, especially **David Watson** and **Wayne Parker** who posed problems for Hull whenever they had the ball, and **Andy Thompson** and **Paul Lyman** whose brilliant tackling took most of the sting out of Hull's bigger forwards.

Some of the match statistics are most revealing. **Andy Thompson** topped the Tackle count with 22 in the first half and 13 in the second for a 35 total, followed by **Bryan Neibling** 33 (18 & 15); **Paul Lyman** 27 (12 & 15); **Chris Rudd** 23 (13 & 10) and "**Zook**" **Ema** (10 & 10).

"**Zook**" **Ema** made the most drives (13 & 13); supported by **Paul Lyman** (9 & 9); **Bryan Neibling** (5 & 8) and substitute **James Goulding** (4 & 9). Handling errors by Rovers 6 first half, 8 second half; compared with 9 and 17 by the visitors.

Times in possession:- Rovers 17 minutes 40 seconds first half; 17 minutes 31 seconds in second half; compared with Hull's 16 minutes 37 seconds and 13 minutes 53 seconds. This is reflected in Rovers playing the ball 84 times in the first half and 78 in the second, Hull returning figures of 76 and 65.

WARRINGTON 30 ROVERS 12

(played 6th January 1991)

Rovers visited Warrington, the current "form team", hoping to repeat our "local derby" form and possibly catch Warrington with the Regal Trophy Final upmost in their minds. If it was, then perhaps the home players were still anxious about ensuring selection for the Final line-up.

Perhaps we knew it was not going to be our day after the opening minutes! Deputy winger **Steve Hadl** was only just held short of the line in the first minute, and then **John Lydiat** touched down for what looked a good opening try following a grubber kick. Even "Wire" fans were surprised when dead ball was ruled. From this set-back Warrington made an immediate reply with a spectacular try under the posts to go six points up after eighteen minutes.

As we counter attacked only desperate defence kept us out on several occasions before a superbly timed pass from **Bryan Neibling** sent **James Goulding** galloping between the uprights for **Mike Fletcher** to level things after 23 minutes.

In twelve minutes before the interval we lost our way as the home side ran in further tries in spectacular fashion. Some of our tenacity was missing especially in defence, with Warrington able to run the ball out and turn defence into attack after our kicks for position. The home side also seemed to put three men into the tackles when we had possession.

22-6 down at the interval, we had to use both our subs when **Bright Sodje** did not resume and **Bryan Neibling** who had been outstanding in setting a real captain's example, had to come off soon afterwards.

Our defence had tightened but just when it looked as though as we were stemming the tide, Warrington again moved the ball with pace and skill to put us further in arrears.

A great touchfinder by **Wayne Parker** gained all of 60 yards but as had happened so often, good spade work was spoiled by poor finishing. But **Paul Lyman** kept going through a couple of tackles to score under the posts and **Mike Fletcher's** conversion brought a little respectability to the score before the "Wire" finished with their sixth try when we surrendered possession in our own quarter.

CHRIS PARK'S RESERVES REPORT

ROVERS 'A' 34 LEEDS 'A' 32

(Played 21st December 1990)

After playing so well with a settled side in the last half dozen games, it was something of a blow when Rovers 'A' lost injured players like Paul Vannet, Paul Fletcher, Stuart Schultz and Steve Robinson for this match, especially with the likes of Eddie Rombo, David Creasser, Rob Ackerman, Paul Delaney, David Young and Neil James Lining up for Leeds.

However, Gary Chatfield's Christmas came early, when he found two tries and seven goals in his stocking - with the final successful kick snatching the points! Other Rovers scorers were Sean Hoe, a local trialist centre - and Paul Speckman whose 78th. minute touchdown proved so vital and allowed Chatfield to show his nerveless goalkicking touch.

Leeds were very disappointed in the final result - perhaps understandably, after outscoring Rovers by six tries to five. Their tries came from wingers Jones (2) and Rombo, with centres Creasser and Ackerman completing an all scoring threequarter line, and stand off Maloney kicked four goals.

Leeds often looked dangerous, but were prone to give away penalties which eventually proved to be their undoing. The game had a real fairy tale ending for Paul Speckman, who had another good game in the pack, supported well by Sean Hoe and Wayne Jackson. After Chatfield's successful conversion of his own try, he dropped the restart kick and Leeds scored in the corner to go 32-28 ahead with eight minutes to go : but with just two minutes left, he went in for the eleventh try of the game - and Chatfield stepped up to land the angled goal which won the game.

Leeds wre upset afterwards at the high penalty count against them - which they reckoned up at something like 17-3 against them; but just across the corridor, John Edson was full of praise for his side, for maintaining discipline, concentrating on the football - and never giving up!
