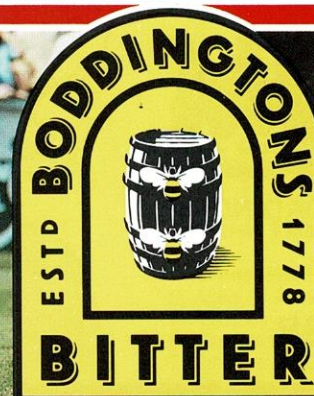
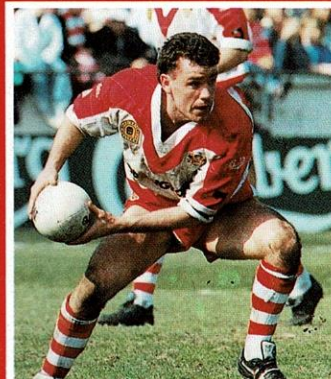

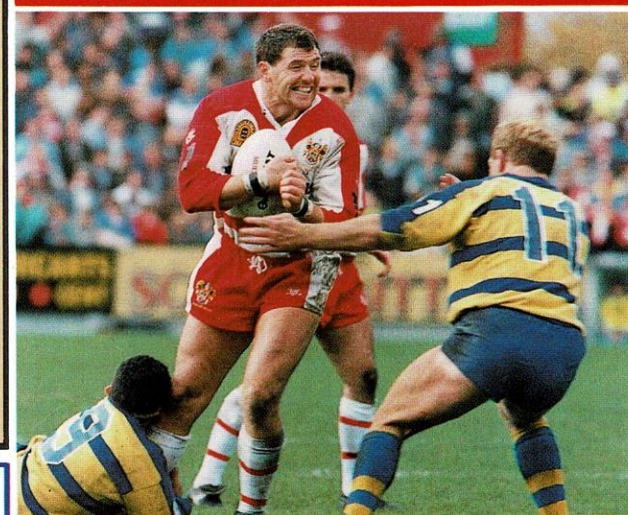

IT is with regret that the Oldham board of directors announces the departure from the club of senior coach Tony Barrow, the assistant Derek Whitehead, the sprint coach Bill Kindon and the 'A' team coach Ian Taylor.

The board had a long and searching meeting last Monday evening and decided unanimously that in the best interests of club and team it had no alternative but to terminate the employment of Tony, Derek and Bill as a result of results and performances over the past two months or so.

These decisions were not made lightly, and the club will honour the contract of the senior coach, which runs until the end of next season.

It was intended that Ian Taylor should carry on as 'A' team coach, but Ian announced earlier this week that he wished to resign because he had not been involved in the new coaching set-up which the club established in a caretaker capacity.

To all those people who have left the club this week we wish every good wish for the future and record our appreciation for the work they have done on behalf of this club.

You will have read various things in the press, depending on which newspaper you take, but the situation now is that John Fieldhouse is taking over as caretaker player-coach with Maurice Bamford in an advisory capacity and with Mike Ford and Gary Hyde assisting as senior professionals.

At the time of going to press, the club was considering various options in filling the gap left by Ian Taylor's departure.

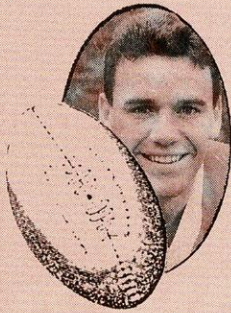
Finally, may we take this opportunity of assuring all shareholders and supporters that the board is totally united in its resolve to guide the club through these difficult days and into a bright and successful future.

## ROGER'S FOCUS

*Oldham Evening Chronicle Rugby League writer, Roger Halstead, looks at today's visitors*

WAKEFIELD TRINITY come to Watersheddings tonight for a match televised by BSB, having played Warrington in midweek when they hoped to recover from their two holiday defeats by local rivals Featherstone Rovers.

Three consecutive league defeats sent Trinity shooting down the division after a spectacular start to the season in which they won the Stones Bitter team-of-the-month award in November after reaching the Yorkshire Cup final earlier in the season.

At the time of writing, Trinity were one place above Oldham in the league, but had three games in hand — statistics which underline the importance of this evening's game in the home side's fight against relegation.

The points are also vital for Trinity and their coach David Topliss, the former Oldham captain, who says: "Most teams have a bad patch in the First Division and it is all a matter of pulling out of it as quickly as possible.

"Everybody seems to be beating Rochdale but after that it is extremely competitive. We slipped up when losing twice to Featherstone and it sent us down the table, but after 12 games we had played six and won six, so we were probably on par with realistic expectations.

"We made a terrific start, but it is difficult to maintain consistency at that level in this most competitive of First Division competitions."

Trinity's overseas players are full back Chris Perry, stand-off Chris Mortimore and big Kiwi prop Adrian Shelford, the former Wigan star.

Other well-known players in the side include centres Ged Byrne and Andy Mason, scrum-half Mark Conway — always an influential figure — and forwards Andy Kelly and Garry Price, a youngster of whom big things are expected at Belle Vue.

Indeed, Wakefield Trinity relied heavily on a terrific contribution from some of the teenage forwards when they managed to beat Oldham at Belle Vue early in the season.

"We won on a wing and a prayer that day," admitted "Toppo," "but I was proud of the young forwards who got through the match on sheer courage and commitment."

# Wakefield . . .

**Chris Perry:** This young Australian utility back, signed in October, 1989, is safe on defence and an elusive, pacey, attacking player who links well with his three-quarters.

**Andy Mason:** Former captain of Wakefield and Trinity's leading try-scorer for the second successive season in 1989-90 with 17 touchdowns. Operating primarily as a centre, he was previously with Leeds.

**John Thompson:** Loyal, long-serving front-row forward who enjoyed a richly-deserved benefit season in 1988-89, crowning the year by being adjudged Trinity's Player of the Year for the first time.

**Billy Conway:** A product of the club's fine Colts side of the mid-1980s, Billy is a busy hooker, whether probing at dummy-half on attack or defending furiously. Considered to be one of the First Division's most consistent number nines.

**Adrian Shelford:** After gaining six winners medals in three seasons with Wigan — including three successive Wembley triumphs and a 1990 Championship — the New Zealand Test prop joined Wakefield at the beginning of this season.

**Andy Wilson:** One of the outstanding discoveries of the 1988-89 season, scoring ten tries in 30 appearances after beginning his Belle Vue career as a trialist winger. He followed that up with nine tries in 30 appearances last season.

**David Jones:** One of Wakefield Trinity's major signings of the 1990 close season, winger David opted to come to Belle Vue in preference to signing for home town Wigan or nearby Leigh. He enjoyed an outstanding summer tour with the BARLA party.

**Tracey Lazenby:** Has returned to Belle Vue for a second spell after a short stint with home town Hull. Played with Sydney outfit Penrith in 1989, starring in the second-row berth.

**Mark Conway:** Fast and elusive with good all-round kicking skills and an excellent football brain, Mark won Trinity's Player of the Year award for the second time in three seasons, in 1990. Joined his hometown club from Leeds, where he gained Great Britain Colts honours.

**Nigel Bell:** One of the mainstays of the Trinity side for six years, whether at loose-forward, prop or scrum-half. A consistent, fearless and loyal performer who has produced some outstanding displays for the club since making his first-team debut as half-back partner to Wally Lewis, against Leigh, in January, 1984.

**Andy Kelly:** The new Trinity captain began his career with the club in the 1979-80 season, before moving to Hull KR in a record £60,000 deal for a forward in June, 1982. Gained Championship and England international honours whilst with the Robins. Trinity's only ever-present throughout the 1989-90 season.

**John Glancy:** Has a reputation as a solid, no-nonsense forward, with the added ability of being able to slip a short pass. He signed from Sheffield Eagles for a bargain £20,000 at the start of the 1988-89 season.

**Gary Price:** Trinity's only Lions tourist to PNY and New Zealand last summer, and a player signed from Charlston ARLFC in October, 1986. The Under-21 international scored two tries for Great Britain in their 30-0 defeat of France at Headingley in 1989.

**Chris Mortimer:** Australian who joined the club from Penrith, for whom he appeared in this year's Grand Final. He was previously with Canterbury-Bankstown and has appeared in a total of six Grand Finals in a brilliant career, mainly as a centre and latterly at stand-off or loose-forward.

**Nick Du Toit:** After arriving in England from South Africa, the giant back-rower enjoyed success with Wigan, with an appearance in the 1985 Wembley Cup Final. He was with Barrow before joining Trinity.

**Ged Byrne:** The former Wigan and Salford utility back became Trinity's record signing at £60,000 when he left Central Park in September. He was a member of their 1988 Wembley winning side.

**Lynton Morris:** A teenage forward with a big future, he was outstanding in Alliance football as Trinity romped to the Second Division title and has the size and determination to make a big impression in 1990-91.

**Richard Slater:** One of the brightest young prospects at Belle Vue, playing a prominent role in the Alliance team's Second Division Championship-winning season in 1989-90. Richard is equally at home in either the half-back, full-back or loose-forward roles.

TOMMY Martyn, Oldham's teenage centre, capped a remarkable 12 months when he was selected for the GB Under-21 squad to play against France at Limoux next Saturday.

In the past year Tommy, still only 19, has burst out of the 'A' Team into the first team with the sort of flair that is expected to win him full international honours.

"I was very pleased to be picked for the squad and I am eternally grateful to Tony Barrow for giving me the chance to prove myself. I'd like to thank Tony for putting my name forward for the squad," said Tommy, who was voted the Boddingtons Bitter young player of the year by Oldham fans last season.

At the moment, he is the club's second-highest try-scorer — eight in 12 games. "I am closing in on Paul Round fast!" said Tommy.

However, despite his try-scoring record, he still sees a lot of room for improvement. "I need to place more emphasis on defence and improve my tackling, even though it is not that easy because the first division is so hard and fast," said Tommy, whose father played for Leigh and Warrington and toured with the GB squad in 1975 and 1979.

Proof of the hardness of the First Division is provided by the fact that Tommy has been concussed three times already this season, against Wakefield, Castleford and Salford, and has been wearing a head guard for protection.

"I've taken knocks but it is part of the game. The head guard is for protection but I'll no longer need it in a couple of weeks."

It has been a tremendous season for the young player, who fully expects to be playing in the first division next season. Tommy says: "It will be a hard fight, but we have enough class to stay up!"

I SPENT a splendid day coaching Lancashire's under-15 squad last weekend. Their coach, Haydn Walker, coach of Orrell St. James' under-16s side, who has already seen six of his under-16 side sign for professional clubs this year, invited me to run the rule over them and it was a great opportunity to have a close look at the youngsters who will be tomorrow's stars.

At Oldham, we do not have the big scouting set-ups that many of the other Lancashire sides have and it's important that we look at a player's attitude as well as his size, speed and skill (which, of course, are clearly to be seen by all), because we don't have the financial resources to allow us to make mistakes.

It's interesting to talk to the chief scouts, particularly of Wigan and Warrington, who are both now only watching under-15 games.

Jimmy Reeder, the Warrington man, was responsible for the signing of nine out of last year's Wembley 15 and the total cost of them all was covered by the sale of one of my former schoolboy pupils, Steve Molloy, to Leeds this year.

That's naturally the sort of success rate we're looking for here, and although we don't intend to rush into signings for signing's sake, we're optimistic that the youth policy will continue to produce gems like Tommy Martyn, who has fully deserved his GB under-21 call-up. Well done, Tommy!
