WATERSHEDDINGS SURVEY

YOU will no doubt have read in the Press that the Oldham Rugby League Football Club plc had a trading loss of £156,000 to the year ended May 31, 1990.

The company's current net liabilities now stand at £663,232 and these figures will be presented to the shareholders at the company's second annual meeting, to be held at noon next Friday in the social club.

There were five main reasons for the deficit on the year under review — the youth policy, transfer fees, ground repairs, contract payments to players and interest charges.

The youth policy is continuing as was shown last week when three more local youngsters pledged their support to the club in a get-together with their parents and club officials.

Lee Bradbury (16), a full back or centre who plays for St. Augustine's School and Saddleworth Rangers, has signed amateur forms and will turn professional when he is 17 later in the year. The same applies to Martin Halkyard, another 16-year-old who is a second-row man or loose-forward and plays for Saddleworth School and Saddleworth Rangers. He captains the Oldham schoolboys team and he was also captain of the Oldham schoolboys squad that went to Australia in 1988 and returned unbeaten.

The third Oldham boy who has decided that his future is at Watersheddings is 15-year-old Richard Badby, nicknamed Joe Cool, and a stand-off half who has earned county honours at every age-group and has also captained North-West Counties schoolboys. Richard cannot sign amateur forms until he is 16 but he will ultimately become a fully-fledged pro with his home-town club.

When Richard signs on as an amateur we will then have five schoolboys waiting to turn pro — the aforementioned threesome plus Chris Eckersley and Paul Barrow, who signed amateur forms last year.

Whilst on the subject of youth, we must congratulate Tommy Martyn on his appearances recently for the Great Britain under-21s both in France and at Wigan, where he was the substitute.

Special mention, too, for several youngsters who have been performing particularly well in the 'A' team, notably Chris Joynt, Craig Mort, Paddy Mitchell, Richard Pachniuk and Neil Flanagan, not forgetting others, who are working hard at their game and making progress or are battling back after injury.

On transfer fees, the club paid out £154,000 during the year under review — mainly on Tony Anderson (£70,000) and John Fieldhouse (£45,000) — and pulled back only £48,000 from the sale of Ian Sherratt, Martin Hall, Tony Morrison and Bob Marsden.


A great deal of money has been spent on the ground and directors Ian Carr and Tom Patterson were delighted to show a party of about 30 supporters around the club the other Saturday morning to show them in detail what had been spent and where the money had gone.

The open-day was regarded as a great success and was finished off over a cup of coffee and a chat with John Fieldhouse and a couple of the players before the first-team squad left the club for Cumbria for the cup win at Workington in the last round.

The directors were left with the distinct impression that the fans thoroughly enjoyed their visit, including the questions-and-answers session which seemed to clear up a lot of their worries and doubts. If you are interested in joining a similar trip around the club either give us a ring or watch the press for details of when the next open day will be arranged.

The financial situation is a source of worry, of course, but the directors are working hard to try and return the club to profitability and the problems they are experiencing on the financial side, are not peculiar to Oldham. A similar picture is painted at clubs throughout the Rugby League.

The further we go in the Silk Cut Challenge Cup competition the greater chance we have of making some money, so today's tie is of a great importance to both clubs and we trust that we can rely on as much vocal support as possible so that we get the best possible advantage from our home draw.

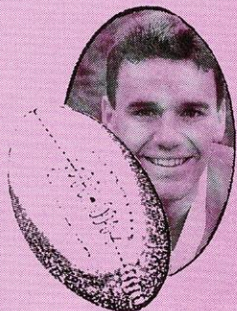

TODAY'S quarter-final between Oldham and Salford — the third time we have met in cup competitions this season — is a good draw for both clubs, although we probably start as favourites with home advantage.

ROGER'S FOCUS

IF SOME folk think there is a magnet which draws Leeds and Bradford together in cup competitions, they will soon be thinking the same of Oldham and Salford if the trend of the last 12 months continues.

Just over a year ago, Oldham won at the Willows in round two of the Silk Cut Challenge Cup and a few months later the teams were paired again in the first round of this season's Lancashire Cup and Salford won this time, en route to their final appearance against Widnes at Central Park, Wigan.

Onto the Regal Trophy and, sure enough, the teams clashed again, this time at Watersheddings in the first round. Oldham won this one, so Salford will be eager to level things up again in today's Silk Cut Challenge Cup quarter-final tie.

To reach this stage, the Reds beat Yorkshire amateurs Cutsyke in the preliminary round, Batley at the Willows in the first round and Sheffield Eagles at the Don Valley Stadium in round two — a great result this because Eagles were soaring high after knocking out championship-chasing Hull and Featherstone Rovers in their first two outings.

Salford won 19-16 in Sheffield with the following team: Gibson; Gilfillan; Fell; Williams; Hadley; Cassidy; Kerry; Sherratt; Lee; Blease; Hansen; Worrall; Burgess. Subs: Birkett; Conroy.

This was Salford's tenth successive league and cup victory, but it was marred by a serious collar-bone injury to prop and club captain Ian Blease which is likely to put him out of action for the rest of the season.

Nevertheless, Salford have assembled a squad which, at the time of writing, was on top of the Second Division with a 100-per-cent record and will be playing First Division rugby next season. That's for sure.

Scrum-half Steve Kerry, a former RU man, is the only player to have played and scored in every match for his club this season — a run of 28 matches, not counting last Sunday's game at Keighley.

Most of the Salford players are well known to Oldham supporters and two of them — Ian Sherratt and Mick Worrall — need no introduction at all as former Watersheddings forwards, who were extremely popular players during their time here.

Mick signed for Oldham as a boy and won Test honours and a 1984 trip to Australia with Great Britain before he joined the Reds for a fee of £50,000 a year or two ago.

Ian, an Oldham boy, joined his home-town club via Bradford Northern, in the deal that took David Hobbs to Odsal, and then moved on to the Willows for a fee of £22,500.

Salford . . .

Steve Gibson: Fullback. The popular Australian fullback, formerly with Brisbane Souths, is now in his fourth season at the Willows. To date he has scored 43 tries in his 99 appearances for Salford.

Tex Evans: Winger. Signed from neighbours Swinton in a £40,000 move, he has scored 23 tries in 51 appearances since his move at the beginning of the 1988-89 season.

Martin Birkett: Centre. Joined Salford on a three year contract in December 1989 after representing English Schools and Colleges before being selected for the BARLA G.B. side prior to turning professional.

Peter Williams: Centre. A sensational capture from the Orrell RU club in March 1988, after representing both Lancashire RU and England RU, gaining four caps in all at the International level. Peter has already played for GB and Lancashire in the professional code.

Adrian Hadley: Winger. Turned professional in September 1988, becoming Salford's costliest signing at £100,000 in a four year deal. The former Welsh RU International and Cardiff club player has now settled in well at the Willows after a niggling injury halted his progress.

Frank Cassidy: Stand off. Another former Swinton player who joined Salford for £35,000 in November 1989. A clever footballer and accurate touch finder who originally played for Rose Bridge ARL.

David Fell: Stand off. Joined Salford from Orrell RU club on a five year contract in October 1989. Made his debut against Leeds last season.

Steve Kerry: Scrum half. Signed in December 1988 from the Preston Grasshoppers RU club. Prolific scorer who is improving all the time. After spells at stand off and on the wing he is now being given a run at scrum half. Top try scorer last season and the number one choice goal kicker at the Willows.

Shaun Brown: Scrum half. Forced his way into the first team last season after some dazzling Alliance team performances. Former BARLA G.B. International who toured Down Under in 1989. Played for Leigh East ARL as an amateur.

Ian Sherratt: Prop. Powerhouse front row forward signed in August 1989 from Oldham. Also had a spell with Bradford Northern where he began his professional career. A leg injury forced him to miss a large part of last season but he is now back to full fitness.

Mark Lee: Hooker. Bargain £15,000 signing from St. Helens in January. Went straight into the first team and has missed one match since then.

Shane Hansen: Second row. New Zealander with bags of experience having played for top Auckland side Northcote Tigers. Tremendous tackler who adds steel to the Salford pack.

Chris Whitley: Prop. Joined Salford from Wigan St. Patricks ARL club in August 1986 and was voted Alliance's Player of the Year in his first season at the club.

Arthur Bradshaw: Second row. Signed from Thatto Heath ARLC in August 1989 after representing BARLA at County level. Broke his leg in his first team debut match against Warrington but has now made a full recovery.

Ian Blease: Second row. Former Folly Lane ARL player who signed professional for Salford in March 1985. Developed well at the Willows and can play anywhere in the pack. Installed as captain of the side at the beginning of the season.

Andrew Burgess: Loose forward. Signed professional on his 17th birthday after several games with the Alliance side as an amateur. Previously played for Irlam Hornets ARLC.

This week's **PLAYER PROFILE**

FEW fans could argue with John Fieldhouse's selection as Roger Halstead's Boddingtons Bitter player of the month for February.

John, who took over as player-coach following Tony Barrow's departure, has led the team into the quarter-finals of the Silk Cut Challenge Cup and given the side a vital lifeline in the fight for First Division survival.

After six weeks in the job, John is loving every second: "I am the kind of person who likes responsibility. The more I have, the better I perform. At the same time, the players have helped tremendously and made my job a lot easier."

At first, John hesitated when he was offered the coaching job, but eagerly accepted after receiving Tony Barrow's backing.

"Tony and I will always be friends because we've known each other a long time. A lot of what went wrong wasn't Tony's fault. Players were in a rut, lacked confidence and didn't believe in themselves. However, Tony understands the game and what happened to him could easily happen to me."

John, a former Great Britain international, has put as much commitment into coaching as he does on the field: "In addition to coaching, I also work full time as a joiner. However, all my spare time is spent thinking about Rugby League.

"We've all worked to improve our commitment and attitude and to support each other on the field. At the moment, we are riding on the crest of a wave and I'd like to play every day.

"However, there will be no celebrations until the end of the season because we'll be fighting right to the very last kick."

And John's hopes for the future! "I want the job this season, the next season and the season after that!"

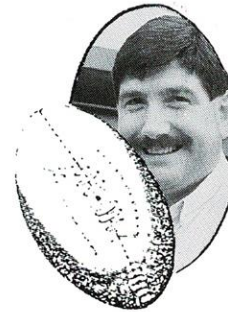

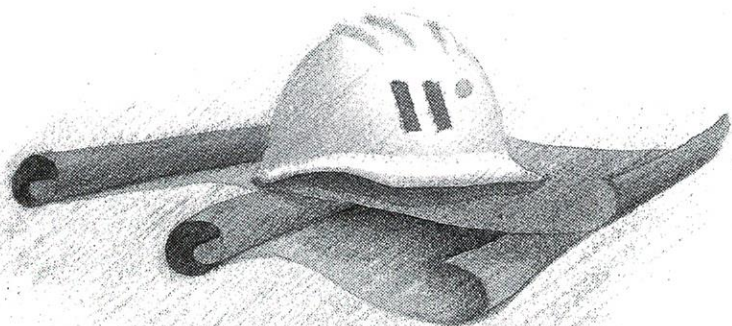

Although both results were gained through excellent team performances a special mention must go to Chris Joynt, who earned man-of-the-match awards in both games.

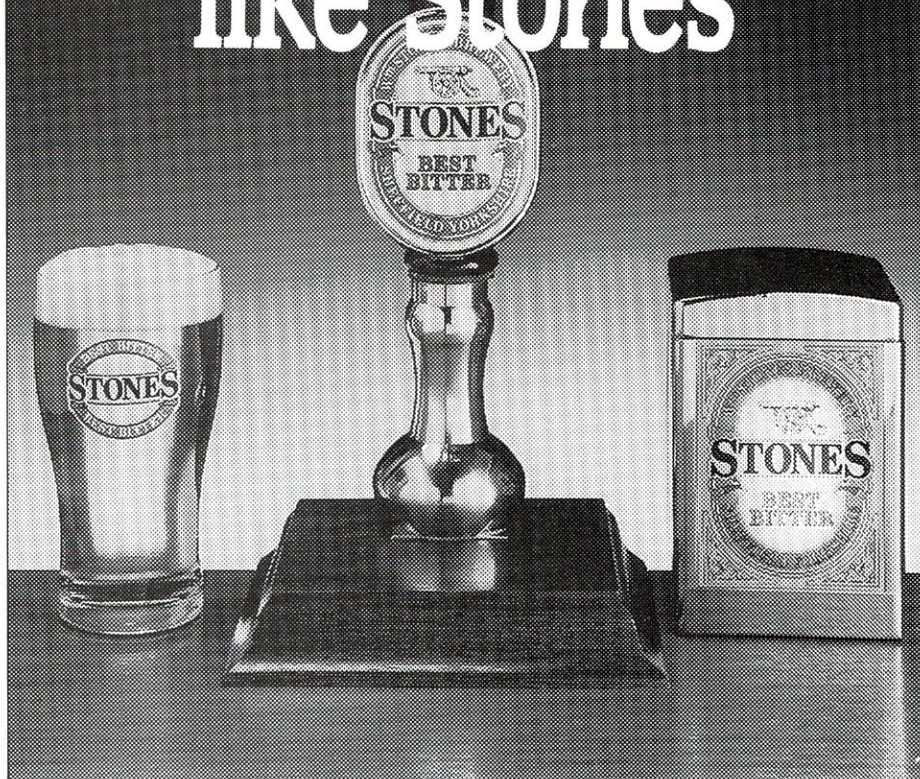

PREVIOUS ENCOUNTERS

SALFORD and Oldham have met on eight previous occasions in the Challenge Cup, with the Roughyeds registering three victories and five defeats. The first cup battle was a semi-final in 1902-03, when Salford won 8-0 after a replay. The latest battle, last year, was at the Willows, when Oldham won 18-7 on the way to the semi-finals.
