



Saints won 17 lost 4.

As can be seen from above Saints and Oldham have met on 21 occasions to date since the introduction of the two division system back in 1973 with Saints holding the upper-hand by winning 17 of the encounters, the most recent being a closely fought game at Watersheddings, Oldham last month which resulted in a narrow 20 points to 16 for Saints thanks largely to two magnificent kicks by Shane Cooper in the 2nd half which resulted in two fine Alan Hunte tries.

Last term Oldham gained promotion from the 2nd Division by finishing in 3rd place winning 24 of their 28 games for a total of 48 points and did magnificently well in the respective cup competitions. In the Lancashire Cup Oldham were beaten finalists here at Knowsley Road to Warrington who beat them 24-16 after beating three 1st Division sides to get there, Barrow 46-12, St. Helens 36-6 and Wigan, the holders, 19-18 in the semi final. In the Regal Trophy fine victories over Bramley 48-16 and Huddersfield 22-8 saw them meet St. Helens again, in the quarter finals only on this occasion for Saints to gain their revenge with a 32-18 win, after Oldham's full back Duncan Platt was sensationally sent off for tripping in the very 1st minute. In the Challenge Cup they reached the semi final and were very unlucky to lose to Warrington at Wigan by 10 points to 6 after leading for a spell and having a last minute try controversially disallowed. On route to the semis Oldham accounted for Huddersfield, 30-8, Workington 30-8, Salford 18-7 and Widnes 16-4 in a great cup run and to their credit ended a very successful season by winning the 3rd Division Premiership Trophy in a thrilling final at Old Trafford 30 points to 29 against Hull K.R. after beating Swinton 32-10 and Ryedale-York 32-8 to qualify.

To date this season Oldham have struggled and are currently 3rd bottom of the 1st Division desperately trying to avoid relegation although they have, like Saints, reached the semi final of the Challenge Cup.

TALKING RUGBY



I'D like to start my column tonight by congratulating the boys on a fine performance last Sunday at Halifax in the quarter finals of the Challenge Cup to qualify for the semi-finals for the third successive season. By the time you read this programme our semi final opponents will be known and who knows it could be tonight's visitors Oldham who had a magnificent win at the weekend over high flying 2nd Division outfit Salford by 40 points to 3.

Oldham have a very strong Saints connection and as well as extending a very warm welcome to the players, officials and spectators of the 'Roughyeds' for this evenings encounter I'd like to extend an extra special welcome to Oldham's former Saints players — John Fieldhouse, Brett Clark, Paul Round and Austin Donegan. It won't be easy tonight as last weekends fine win was a hard, bruising encounter that must have taken a lot from the lads and Oldham are on a good run, significantly Saints being the last team to beat them last month.

Union Challenge

Next Autumn the sports world will be bombarded with the Rugby Union World Cup which is to be held in England for the first time. It is very important that just what RL has to offer next Autumn is promoted to compete with Rugby Union matters on the sporting press.

It always amazes me that a sport watched by a few hundred spectators gets three-quarters of a full page in our National newspapers when Rugby League is watched by thousands of fans each week and is Britain's second most popular sport behind football gets a few columns — if that!

The newspaper bosses will say that Rugby Union is a national sport whilst Rugby League is local but surely this is an old argument, since the successful spreading of BARLA and judging by some of the games shown on "Rugby Special" probably many BARLA teams are watched by more spectators and significantly Amateur RL — contrary to all the past arguments and scandal is and has been for some considerable time the only true Amateur form of Rugby. Only in the last couple of weeks I've read two very significant pieces of news regarding the spread of our great game that have interested me, the first being the Rugby League's decision to take next August's Charity Shield game to the all-seater 11,000 capacity Gateshead Athletic Stadium in the North-East and the second being Hemel Hempstead ARLFC's request to join the 2nd Division of the Slalom Lager Alliance League with a hope of joining the 3rd Division of the R.F.L. in a few seasons. I'm sure that you'll agree that there are very significant moves and show how healthy our great game is at the present time.

Next Autumn sees three Rugby League playing nations coming to our shores. The well publicised Russians will be here, hopefully after a successful professional league season behind them which for the record kicks off in May with eight clubs involved, the enthusiastic Papua New Guineans are coming for a short tour and the South Sea Island Amateurs are to tour Gt. Britain to play the leading Amateur clubs and the 2nd Division Club from the lower reaches of the league. So all in all there is a lot to look forward to for league fans.

JOHN COGGER: Born in Sydney, Aust., John spent 2½ seasons with Runcorn before becoming one of Tony Barrow's bargain boys — for £12,000 — in February, 1989. His team in Sydney was Western Suburbs. A tearaway loose-forward he skippered Oldham to promotion in 1989-90, but has now been succeeded as captain by Mike Ford.

JOHN FAIRBANK: Born in Halifax and one of the famous five farming and Rugby League brother. John signed for Oldham in the deal that took Hugh Waddell to Leeds in the late summer of 1988. Valued at £35,000 against Waddell's £85,000. Hard-working prop-forward.

JOHN FIELDHOUSE: Oldham pack leader and former Warrington, Widnes and St. Helens star. Seven full caps for Great Britain and voted man-of-the-series against New Zealand in 1985. Joined Oldham from Saints for fee of £45,000 to renew a partnership with Tony Barrow who first plucked him from amateur rugby for Warrington.

MIKE FORD: A young man of 24 who has already played at Wembley and toured Australia. While with Wigan he picked up a Challenge Cup winners' medal, three Lancashire Cup medals (one losers), two John Player Trophy medals and a First Division championship medal. After a short spell at Leigh he joined Oldham for £65,000 in January, 1988 and was an influential figure from scrum-half during Oldham's headline-hitting cup exploits during 1989-90.

DES FOY: First signed for Widnes as a youngster, but returned 'home' to Oldham in the Brian Hogan deal in August, 1982. Played twice for Great Britain under-24s in 1983, and went on to play in three full Tests, including the first Test against Australia in Sydney on the 1984 tour. Played stand-off opposite the great Wally Lewis. Played nearly 200 games for Oldham despite a spell with Aussie club Newcastle Knights.

JOHN HENDERSON: Another local lad. First turned 'pro' for Leigh but signed for Oldham for

£50,000 in September, 1988. A prolific try-scorer in a pacy Leigh back division, he has scored more than 100 tries in his career — none more vital than his first-half try in Oldham's shock third-round Challenge Cup win at Widnes in season 1989-90. Had a spell with Wests in Sydney.

GARY HYDE: Spent a decade with Castleford, his home-town club and played twice for Great Britain under-24s in the early 1980s. Played at left-centre in the Castleford team which beat Hull KR 15-14 in the 1986 Wembley final and joined Oldham for £15,000 in December, 1988.

RICHARD IRVING: Former Great Britain under-19 amateur international who played at left-centre during Oldham's run to the Lancashire Cup final in the autumn of 1989. Now playing on the right-wing after a 1990 summer stint in Australian country football.

PAUL LORD: Signed for Oldham as a 17-year-old from amateur rugby in Wakefield where his great pace attracted Oldham scouts. Came as a stand-off but has made his home on the left-wing. One of Oldham's most prolific scorers, he can seek out the gaps in midfield as well as hug the touch-line to score his tries.

TOMMY MARTYN: Baby of the squad at 18, Tommy has the perfect pedigree. His father and uncle both played for Great Britain as forwards. Remember Tommy senior . . . or Mick, who set scoring records for Leigh in the 50s and 60s? Signed from Leigh Miners, Tommy jnr toured Australia with the BARLA Young Lions in 1989 and hit the headlines when he scored the winning try in Oldham's fantastic comeback against Hull KR in the Second Division premiership final at Old Trafford in May, 1990.

CHARLIE MCALISTER: Big centre or wing, now playing in the back-row of the pack. Charlie was spotted playing Union for Bradford and Bingley. Signed after trials in January, 1988. Before coming to England he played for New Zealand Maoris at Union and was an All-Blacks trialist. Talented with the ball and a powerful runner, he had a spell with Sydney League club Newcastle Knights in 1988.

KEITH NEWTON: Widnes born and bred, Keith signed for the Chemics from local amateur rugby. Made around 50 senior appearances — many of them substitute — and jumped at the chance to sign for Oldham in January, 1989. Fee of £12,000 fixed by tribunal. Yet another Tony Barrow

bargain, he was voted man-of-the-match in the Silk Cut Challenge Cup third-round win at Widnes in early 1990.

DUNCAN PLATT: Another former Widnes player, Duncan cost Oldham £35,000 in December, 1988 and was one of Tony Barrow's first signings. Landed 125 goals last season despite damaging an ankle in the Lancashire Cup final and missing the next seven matches.

PAUL ROUND: Paul was the first Oldham signing when the board of directors replaced the former committee. Tribunal ordered Oldham to pay St. Helens £65,000 — then a club record. Played twice for Great Britain under-21s in 1984 and represented Saints at Wembley in 1987, scoring a try in an appearance as substitute.

ANDY RUANE: Started his career with home-town Widnes and moved to Rochdale Hornets from where he joined Oldham for £13,000 in the summer of 1988. Scooped most of the club's player-of-the-year awards in 1988-89 but had bad luck with injuries in 1989-90 when he began to face competition for the hooking job from Richard Russell.

RICHARD RUSSELL: The bargain to beat all bargains. For £3,000 down, Oldham snapped him up from Wigan in the summer of 1989, although once he has made 50 senior appearances there will be another payment to take the total fee to £15,000. Great Britain colts and under-21 honours as a centre but switched to hooker in a master-stroke.

SHAUN ALLEN: Began his career with St. Helens for whom he did enough to earn Great Britain under-21 honours as a centre in the 1984 match against France. Joined Oldham for a bargain £10,000 in March, 1989. Usually plays second-row but also turns out at loose-forward, hooker and centre.

KEITH ATKINSON: Keith started as an amateur when Oldham had a colts team and played for GB Colts as a winger against France in 1984. Serious injuries have restricted his senior appearances to fewer than 60, but he has successfully made the switch from backs to pack and, as a bonus, is a proven goalkicker of some repute.

BRETT CLARK: An Aussie who first came to England to play for St. Helens. Was the Saints stand-off in their 19-18 defeat by Halifax at Wembley in 1987. Joined Oldham at the start of the 1989-90 season.



WHITTLE'S WORLD OF RUGBY

THE old adage that the pre-requisite for the success of any side lies in its reserve strength certainly rang true at Knowsley Road in the mid 1950s, as a glance at the accompanying pictorial gem would confirm.

Season 1955-56 saw Saints poised to bring home the Challenge Cup for the first time and the club's 'A' team squad weren't doing too badly either — in fact they went through the previous campaign unbeaten!

Small wonder, when a study of the assembled company reveals that almost all eventually sampled the heady delights of first-team football, with four figuring in that Wembley showdown against Halifax, while for two of this quartet there was the ultimate accolade of international recognition.

With regard to that celebrated duo Vincent Peter Patrick Karalius is now resident in the Isle of Man, while Windle man Austin Rhodes has become quite a dab hand with the snooker cue, as opponents at the Nalco club in Bishop Road would no doubt testify.

The Wembley foursome was completed by second rower Roy Robinson and hooker Len McIntyre, with 'Robbie' nowadays dispensing Rugby League info. via his Lingholme newsagency, but for Len there is a different claim to fame in that he crossed the border from Wigan — a real feat of daring in those far-off days!

Frank 'Darkie' McCabe must surely have been in the running for the Number 9 shirt on that Saints date at the Empire Stadium in 1956, only to see his chance ruined through breaking a leg in the third round trouncing of Bradford Northern at Knowsley Road — after Thatto Heath lad Frank had crossed for two tries.

Eric Ledger, like his son Barry, was a winger of genuine pace, and was also quite a humorous character as I discovered after complimenting Eric on the way he shifted when scoring a 75-yarder against Wigan. 'So would you, with Billy Boston breathing down your neck!' chortled the likeable Ledger.



As in the case of Rhodes Arthur Pimblett and Tommy Flinn were schooled in the game's fundamentals under the watchful eye of headmaster Gerry Landers at the nursery that was St. Austins. 'Pimmer' went on to hold the Widnes goalkicking record while Flinn moved on to Hull and played for them in the 1961 RL Cup semi-final versus Saints at Odsal.

Josh Gaskell was a block-busting forward who is presently nursing arthritic twinges at his Napier Street home; Bill Boycott is a local businessman and Saints life member, while winger Alec Davies also earned distinction in the world of athletics.

Last but certainly not least was scrum-half and captain Joe Ball, another of chairman Harry Cook's proteges from Rivington Road who rendered yeoman service to the Saints before joining Barrow for whom he made a Wembley appearance against Leeds in 1957. Joe, father of latter-day star Ian, was a popular figure both on the field and terrace, and sadly side comparatively young.

Investigation has failed to unearth the whereabouts of others in the group but it is safe to record they were personalities skilfully orchestrated by coach Billy Mercer and kept in trim by the healing hands of physio Norman Borrowdale and —here's the rub — a dozen were local lads, which tells you something of the scouting policy of the time.

Despite the intervening 35 years picture identification posed few problems, but I took the precaution of enlisting the aid of Messrs. Rhodes, Robinson and Gaskell before bursting into print. Just two players escaped the combined memory banks and these were the warrior seated extreme right and the pensive-looking youngster sandwiched between Eric Ledger and Billy Boycott. On behalf of Austin, Roy and Josh I appeal to some long-standing Knowsley Road fan to plug the gaps of a bygone era.
