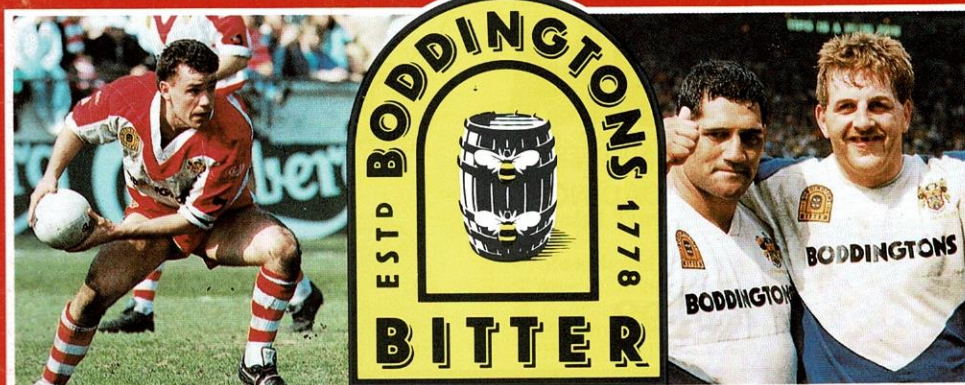

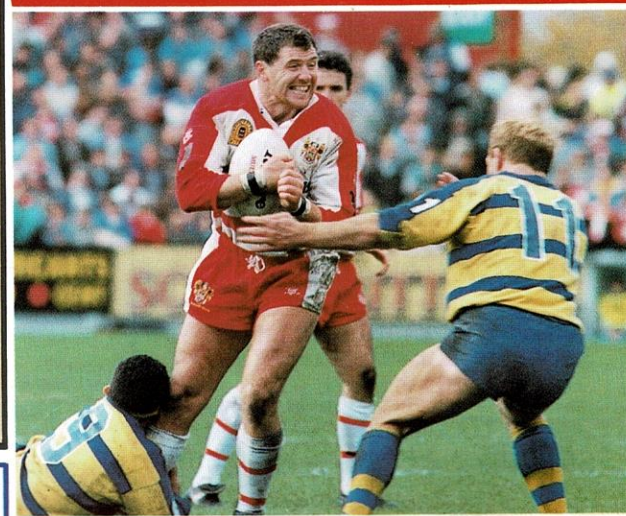

WATERSHEDDINGS SURVEY

CONGRATULATIONS to John Fieldhouse, Iain MacCorquodale and all the boys for their tremendous 40-3 victory over Salford in the third round of the Silk Cut Challenge Cup.

It was a workmanlike, professional and entertaining performance which put us into the last four for the televised draw that took place last Monday evening, no doubt watched by thousands of our supporters.

We drew probably the hardest possible semi-final in Wigan, the team which has won the Challenge Cup for the past three years and is bidding to equal the record of four consecutive finals, set by the great Oldham team of the 1920s.

However, we were the last team to beat Wigan in this competition ... and who will ever forget that magnificent evening in 1987 when Paddy Kirwan scored the winning try in the last minute?

Somebody did suggest this week that Paddy should carry a placard at Burnden Park and walk around the pitch at the start with a message: "Remember me? I'm Paddy Kirwan!"

Just a joke, of course. But we do have a good record recently against Wigan in cup competitions. Come to think of it, Gary Hyde also has good reason for remembering Wigan because it was his late penalty goal that knocked them out of the Lancashire Cup only last season.

So to the semi-final — our second on the trot in the Silk Cut competition and our third in six years, following defeats by Castleford in 1986 and Warrington in 1990.

The big game this time takes place on Saturday at Burnden Park, Bolton, the home of Bolton Wanderers and a ground on which we will be playing for the first time, Wigan having played there on several occasions in the past.

The kick-off will be 3 o'clock and it goes without saying that we will be looking forward to as much support as possible, in the knowledge that Wigan's big following will be out in force.

The only tickets on sale are those for the seats and these are priced at £10 for the best seats in the main stand and at £7 for seats at one end behind the posts. Turnstile admission will cost £5 for adults and £3 for pensioners and juniors.

The Burnden Park capacity is 24,000 and we are hoping for a full house or near to it as we bid to finally fulfil the club's Wembley dream.

With that in mind, we have had a voucher scheme operating for Friday's Slalom Lager Alliance Cup-tie against Castleford and for today's important First Division battle against Sheffield Eagles. If you have attended both games, you will have two vouchers, marked 'A' and 'B', and you will be guaranteed a Wembley ticket in the event of our victory at Burnden Park next Saturday.

It has been an important weekend for us, first with the annual meeting in the club last Friday lunchtime, followed by the Alliance Cup-tie in the evening and concluded today with a match which ranks as one of the most important in the season in terms of First Division survival.

It is all happening at Watersheddings just now. Good luck to the lads today ... and next Saturday when once again we stride out proudly in the semi-final of the Challenge Cup. See you there. Don't miss it!

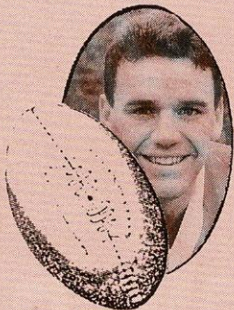

LAST Monday's draw for the Silk Cut Challenge Cup semi-final saw us paired with my old club Wigan, unquestionably the greatest rugby league side in the world.

And although the vast majority of the Rugby League world will see us as the underdogs, the team are confident that we can beat Wigan.

Sheffield have played well recently, including beating Widnes, but we are playing well too and should get a result today with home advantage.

Retaining our First Division status is very important to all the players, so this match will be just as important as next Saturday's semi-final.

ROGER'S FOCUS

Oldham Evening Chronicle Rugby League writer, Roger Halstead, looks at today's visitors

SHEFFIELD EAGLES come to Watersheddings today for a crucial battle in the fight to stay in the First Division. The result is an extremely important one for both clubs, and Eagles will not be short of information on the Oldham team because former Watersheddings coach Eric Fitzsimons is on the staff at the Don Valley Stadium and big prop Hugh Waddell, who made his name here, is a key member of the Eagles pack.

Gary Hetherington, chairman, coach and, without doubt, "Mr. Sheffield" himself — is one of the most respected young men in the game — a man of vision and foresight who has hit the headlines recently with the Hetherington Plan for the introduction of a 14-8-14 three-division split. This did not win enough support for adoption at a recent meeting of clubs, but it has another chance to succeed on April 3 and the Oldham club will be voting in favour, as it did last time out.

Eagles caused a few raised eyebrows when they beat Hull in the preliminary round of the Silk Cut Challenge Cup and then knocked out Featherstone in round one, but they slipped up in the second round when beaten at home by Salford. However, they recovered quickly from their disappointment to pick up shock First Division wins at Bradford and Widnes and enhance their chances of staying in the First Division.

Injuries have hit them hard in recent times, so much so that they went into the Castleford game last Sunday without players such as Mark Gamson, Peter Lewis, Richard Picksley, Sam Panapa, Sonny Nickle and Des Maa.

Having signed centre Richard Price on loan from Hull and second-row man Andy Bateman on loan from St. Helens, Eagles could still field a strong side, however, with former Bradford star Keith Mumby at full back and a half-back partnership of Great Britain international Darryl Powell and the high-scoring Mark Aston. They are particularly strong in the front-row with Waddell and former Australian Test forward Peter Tunks providing plenty of strength and experience, while £55,000 buy Anthony Farrell — an Ellery Hanley lookalike — is dangerous from the loose-forward position.

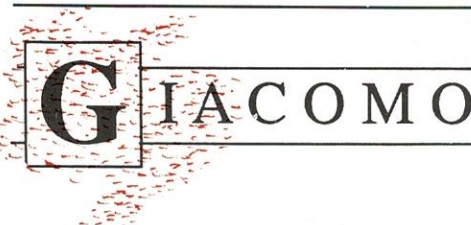

Sheffield Eagles . . .

Daryl Powell (Age 24): The Eagles first signing in 1984, Powell is now approaching his 200th appearance for the club and has enjoyed success at international level, having played in the last eight Test matches for Great Britain.

Mark Aston (22): A record run of 65 consecutive scoring appearances ended last season with an eight-match suspension. This season started brightly but a knee injury sustained in September curtailed his international aspirations. Hoping for better luck during the second half of this season.

Mark Camson (24): The Eagles second signing in 1984, from Leeds Colts. Mark has occupied every back position throughout his 199 appearances and has missed only one game in the past two seasons.

David Nelson (26): Signed from Queens Park ARLC in 1987 after playing Rugby League for only one season. Very speedy and exciting runner with a sound defence.

Andy Dickinson (29): One of the Eagles best-ever buys four years ago. Andy has justified his £1,500 transfer from Halifax with 57 tries in 134 appearances. Excellent defender who specialises in good support play.

Anthony Farrell (22): A record signing from Huddersfield last season. Now settled into the loose forward position with good effect.

David Mycoe (18): Had a sensational debut season last year after joining the Eagles from Criggleston under-17s. Scored nine tries in 52 appearances and also won Great Britain under-21 honours. Can play full back, centre or stand-off, and his talent and pace suggests he could repeat last season's performances.

David Close (22): Missed most of last season with a knee injury, but is now fit and eager to cement a place in the team. A former county junior at Rugby League and Rugby Union who signed from Pontefract Labour ARLC in 1987.

Paul Broadbent (21): Another recruit from Lock Lane under-19s, Paul has emerged as one of the game's most up-and-coming prop forwards. Very big work-rate and an ability to off-load the ball suggests that representative honours could come his way.

Mick Cook (27): Rated by many as one of the game's best hookers, Mick's terrific tackling displays have alerted the attention of several leading Australian clubs. Another signing from Queens Park ARLC and last season's 'Player of the Year'.

Hugh Waddell (30): A £50,000 signing from Leeds in March. Hugh has added experience and mobility to the forwards. Well remembered for his Man of the Match award in Great Britain's defeat of Australia in 1988. He is keen to reclaim a Test place this season.

Sonny Nickle (20): A £20,000 signing from Hunslet eighteen months ago, Sonny had an outstanding season last term, including 17 tries and a Great Britain under-21 appearance. Tipped for future international honours.

Nick Grimoldby (27): Born in Doncaster, Nick learned his Rugby League in the South before signing for Fulham. Transferred to the Eagles in January, 1989, and has made 49 appearances. A powerful running forward with plenty of pace and a sound defence.

Andy Young (25): A former Eastmoor amateur and voted the best looking player of 1990. Has made 79 appearances, mainly on the wing, but hoping to graduate to the centre position this season. Very strong runner and tackler with a good turn of pace.

Neil Kellett (26): Signed from Mansfield Marksman after previously playing for Castleford. Very powerful runner who scored eight tries last season.

Simon Rhoades (17): A summer signing from Bransholme under-17s in Hull. Represented England under-17s last season and captained Yorkshire. Very pacy and talented player and an excellent goalkicker.

Nick Halafihi (21): A former Hull Colt who signed in 1988. Has made 33 appearances and is hoping to win a place in the team this season. Very fit and fast forward with an eye for scoring tries.

Tim Wilby (33½): A much-travelled player who joined the Eagles from Hull at the start of this season.

Sam Panapa (28): A New Zealand international who played in all three Tests against Great Britain this summer. Prolific try-scorer and exciting runner.

Peter Tunks (32): The former Australian Test prop was a recent signing from Salford as part-exchange for Kiwi Francis Leota. Tunks' experience should prove invaluable to the Eagles younger players.

Keith Mumby (33): A recent signing from Bradford Northern, where he spent 17 seasons, and represented Great Britain on many occasions. Made an immediate impact with the Eagles with a Man of the Match performance in the recent win over St. Helens.

Peter Lewis (26): A recent signing from Bramley. The League's tallest winger. Very fast and elusive player with a natural ability to score tries.

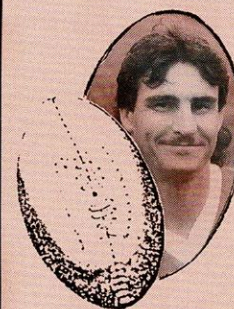

This week's PLAYER PROFILE

ONE of the key figures behind Oldham's successful Silk Cut Challenge Cup run has been the form of Aussie stand-off Brett Clark, the only ever-present in the side alongside skipper Mike Ford.

Brett has only missed a handful of games since playing Rugby League and puts his lack of serious injuries down to keeping out of trouble.

"I don't seem to get hurt that badly although I normally feel pretty sore on a Monday morning," says Brett, who has scored 10 tries in the First Division this season, five less than top scorer Paul Round.

However, Brett doesn't set himself any scoring targets. "I am not interested in breaking records. I'd much rather score tries that win us important games, like next Saturday's semi-final!"

Like everyone at the club, Brett is looking forward to the Wigan semi-final and the chance to win through to Wembley, even though he's been there before.

"I was playing for St. Helens alongside Paul Round and John Fieldhouse. Unfortunately, we lost narrowly to Halifax, so I'd like to get the opportunity to go back there and collect a winner's medal!"

Brett, who is 30 in November, will be able to devote himself totally to his Wembley dream as wife Donna and his two children, Andrew, three, and Aaron, seven months, have flown back to Sydney for a couple of months.

"I'll miss them all while they are away but if we get through to Wembley they'll be back a couple of months earlier than planned!"
