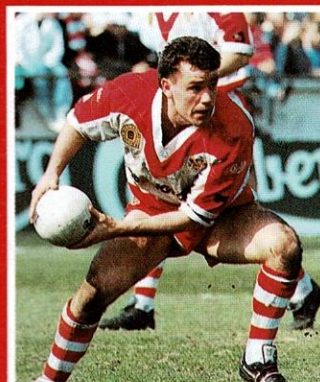

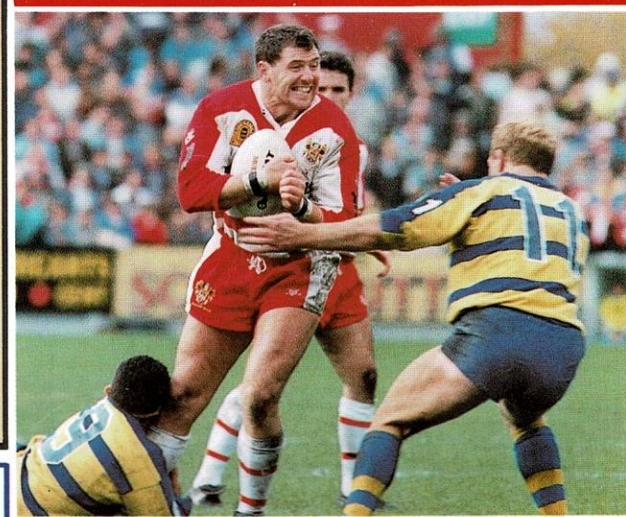

WATERSHEDDINGS SURVEY

WELL, our dream of appearing at Wembley for the first time was not to be. On the day, Wigan were the better side in the Silk Cut Challenge Cup semi-final at Bolton and, once again, our bid to play in the famous London stadium came to grief at the final hurdle.

Nevertheless, there was no disgrace in losing by 14 points to a side like Wigan, which had won 28-4 at Castleford in round one, 72-4 at Rochdale in round two and had beaten Bradford 32-2 at Central Park in round three.

Using those games as a comparison, there was some credit in scoring 16 points at Burnden Park and there was certainly some credit in qualifying for the semi-final, which provided our fans with a late-season impetus as we fight tooth and nail to stay in the First Division.

The win over Sheffield Eagles in our last home game gave us a lifeline and with several clubs still not out of the worrying period — Hull KR, Wakefield, Bradford and Warrington among them — it looks as though the battle to stay up may go down to the wire on the last day of the league season.

These notes had to be written before the Good Friday matches, but player-coach John Fieldhouse stated within minutes of losing the cup semi-final that the objective now was to win each of the four remaining First Division games against Rochdale, Wigan today, Warrington away and Hull at home on the last day of the season, which is a 6.30 p.m. kick-off for televising by BSkyB.

As this will be the last home programme before the Hull match, may we take this opportunity of urging as many of our supporters as possible to turn up that night to back us in a match which may well determine whether we are hosting First Division football again next season.

Prior to the kick-off, there will be junior and schoolboy rugby for two hours — first, the finals of the GM Police seven-a-side tournament and then the final of the local schools' competition which has been running all season as curtain-raisers to our home games.

Try and get here early to give these youngsters some encouragement and then cheer us on to what will hopefully be a successful conclusion to the 1990-91 campaign.

Incidentally, the annual general meeting of shareholders went off well with the re-election of chairman John Chadwick and directors Ian Carr and Mike Winterbottom.

Shareholders were pleased to hear that the club was poised to take over the Oldham Greyhounds operation and regain the use of its land from the tenant, Mr. Joe Pickavance, of St. Helens.

Some concern was expressed, however, at the number of all-ticket matches, with a resulting loss in revenue at the turnstile, and the board promised to have further talks with the local police and safety officers.


On the playing side, we are pleased to announce the signing of young back-row forward Simon Longstaff, a Yorkshire boy who was on Halifax's books.

He is now putting athletics behind him to concentrate on his first love, Rugby League.

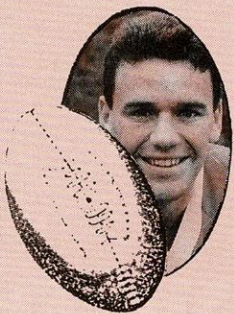

ROGER'S FOCUS

WIGAN need no introduction before today's crucial First Division fixture at Watersheddings. After all, it seems like only yesterday that the teams met at Burnden Park, Bolton, in the semi-final of the Silk Cut Challenge Cup.

All the Wigan players, of course, are household names in Rugby League and most of them are internationals of one form or another. From Steve Hampson at full back to the incomparable Ellery Hanley at loose-forward, the Pie Eaters, as they are affectionately known these days, are full of big-name players who are capable of pulling off big-match achievements.

At present, of course, Wigan are faced with a gigantic battle to retain the Stones Bitter championship because of a fixture backlog which would make any workaholic wince. They have been the victims of their own success.

That success has been earned because Wigan have collected many of the world's best players at great expense and the most recent of them — Frano Botica — has quickly established himself as one of the best goalkickers in the game. Botica was a stand-off half in New Zealand Rugby Union and he represented the All Blacks — no mean feat in a country where the Union code is almost a religion.

The overall standard of goalkicking in Rugby League these days falls short of what it used to be when we had marksmen of the calibre of Willie Horne, Bernard Ganley, Neil Fox, Jimmy Ledgard, Kel Coslett and David Watkins, to name but a few. In Botica, Wigan appear to have found a little gem when it comes to planting the ball between the sticks and his success has put the finishing touches to a team that can reasonably be described as one of the best club sides in the world.

Wigan have not neglected local talent, but they have never been afraid to buy big on the English market (Lydon, Gregory, Skerrett, Platt, Hanley, Goodway, etc.), or to enlist the best from overseas such as Kevin Iro, Dean Bell and Botica.

With such an array of talent, the most famous club in the game will never be far away from the top honours.

Wigan . . .

Martin Dermott (Hooker, age 23): Signed from Wigan St. Patrick's ARLFC on November 19, he was the 1986-87 Wigan Young Player of the Year and toured with Great Britain in 1990.

Kelvin Skerrett (Prop, 24): Kelvin was signed on a three-year contract in July, 1990, from Bradford Northern and toured with Great Britain in 1990.

Denis Betts (Second row, 21): Once on the books of Manchester United, he was the 1988-89 Wigan Young Player of the Year and toured with Great Britain in 1990. Denis is currently rated the fifth-best second row in the world by Open Rugby.

Andy Platt (Utility forward, 27): Signed from St. Helens in September, 1988, for £140,000, he was the 1989-90 Wigan Player of the Year and is currently rated the second-best prop in the world by Open Rugby.

Ellery Hanley (Loose forward, 30): MBE. Captain. Ellery joined Wigan in September, 1985. He has toured with Great Britain in 1984 and 1988 but had to pull out of the 1991 tour. In 1988-89 he won the Lance Todd Trophy, the JPS Trophy final man-of-the-match award and the Wigan Player of the Year award.

Andy Goodway (Back row, 29): Former Oldham player Andy toured Down Under in 1984 and played in Australia in 1985. He was the 1989-90 Division One Player of the Year.

Steve Hampson (Full back, 29): Signed in October, 1983, from Vulcan RUFC. He scored a try on his Wembley debut in 1989 after previously missing three finals due to injury. Steve is currently rated third-best full back in the world by Open Rugby magazine.

Joe Lydon (Utility back, 27): A £100,000 signing from Widnes in January, 1986, he has represented Great Britain, Great Britain under-24s and Lancashire. Toured with Great Britain in 1984 and 1990 but had to pull out of the 1988 tour. Played for Eastern Suburbs in 1989.

Kevin Iro (Centre, 22): Scored a world record 20 points on his New Zealand debut versus Papua New Guinea in 1987 and then played an important part in New Zealand's win over Australia nine days later. Joined Wigan in November, 1987, after touring Great Britain with the Junior Kiwis and Auckland.

Dean Bell (Centre, 28): A former New Zealand captain, Dean has played for Carlisle and Leeds in Great Britain and Eastern Suburbs in Australia. Was man-of-the-match in New Zealand's win against Australia in 1987 and played in the 1988 World Cup Final.

Franco Botica (Utility back, 27): Big-name All Black signed on a three-year contract in May, 1990. Great things are expected of him. Fine goalkicker.

Shaun Edwards (Stand-off, 24): The youngest player to have appeared in a Wembley RL Cup Final and the only player to have been Young Player of the Year three years running.

Andy Gregory (Scrum-half, 29): Andy was a £130,000 signing from Warrington in January, 1987. During his career he has represented Great Britain, Great Britain under-24s and Lancashire and toured with Great Britain in 1984 and 1988 but had to pull out of the 1990 tour.

Ian Lucas (Prop, 23): Ian joined Wigan from the Colts team in November, 1984. He represented Great Britain under-21s, Great Britain Colts and Lancashire Colts and was selected for Great Britain this season. He was the 1987-88 Wigan Young Player of the Year and toured with Great Britain in 1990.

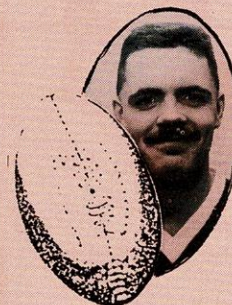

OUTSTANDING Oldham prospect Tommy Martyn is the fans' favourite for the second consecutive year as he has been voted the Boddingtons Bitter Young Player of the Year after winning a closely-fought contest with Chris Joynt.

The highlight of the season has undoubtedly been his appearance in the Great Britain under-21 team, when he scored a try on his debut.

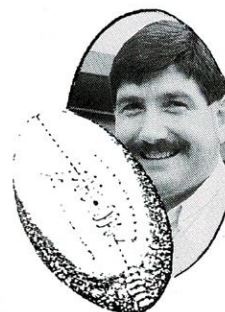

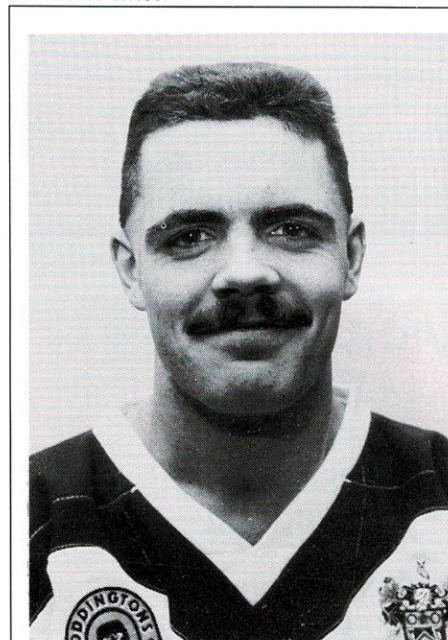
TOMMY MARTYN WINS BODDINGTONS BITTER YOUNG PLAYER OF THE YEAR AWARD
