



#### WATERSHEDDINGS SURVEY

IT is difficult to write this survey for the final game of the season because printing deadlines meant it had to be penned before the Rochdale-Wakefield game on Wednesday. In other words, at the time of writing we did not know whether Oldham would be condemned to the Second Division next season or still in with a chance of survival from today's game against Hull.

If Rochdale did us a good turn and beat Wakefield in midweek, we will have a chance of First Division survival tonight if we beat Hull by enough points to finish with a better points difference than Trinity. If Trinity drew at Rochdale, or won, we will go into this evening's match with little more to plan for other than pride and in the knowledge that we will be in the Second Division next season.

If the former applies, please give us all the support you can so that we can attempt to beat Hull with enough points to stay up. If it is the latter that applies, please stick with us next season in the Second Division when we will be doing our best to make a quick return at the first attempt.

To give ourselves a fighting chance of staying up, we needed at least a point at Warrington last Sunday, but that was not to be and we believe we can fairly say that we had no luck at all on the day. Even before the match, good fortune was not on our side when several players, mostly backs, were ruled out of the match due to injury. To make matters worse, Paul Round and Richard Russell were forced to quit after half an hour and Keith Atkinson played for most of the game with a jaw injury which required a medical check after the game.

We went 8-0 up and then provided Warrington with a gift try, but how can you legislate for the bad luck we suffered on drop kicks. We performed our own drop kicks well and scored two by Mike Ford and Andy Ruane. Warrington were not out quickly enough to charge down the kicks, with the result that we scored two points. However, we managed to charge down each of Warrington's four drop kicks, but each time the ball bounced kindly for them, and off one of them Duane Mann was played onside and he scored what must have been one of the luckiest tries of the season.


They kicked the goal and had, therefore, scored six points off a drop goal that went wrong. How unlucky can you be? Still, we did not play well enough to win after a great opening spell in which we went 8-0 up with those drop goals and a try by Round, off a Russell pass, which Duncan Platt goaled.


Tonight's match is kicking off at 6.30 p.m. because it is going out live on BSkyB. It also brings to an end the 1990-91 campaign, which has been an eventful season for the club, although there have been a few more downs than ups.

One of the brightest spots was our qualification for the semi-final of the Silk Cut Challenge Cup for the second consecutive year, but we were well beaten by Wigan at Burnden Park as Wigan booked their fourth successive final appearance — a record for the Wembley era and an achievement which equalled the feat of the Oldham club in playing in four consecutive finals in the pre-Wembley days of the 1920s.

It has been a long, hard season, but a lot of crucial decisions must be made in the next few weeks — concerning matters both on and off the field — so watch the local press for matters of interest. In the meantime, all supporters can rest assured that the directors will be working hard throughout the summer on a variety of projects designed to give the club some firm roots and foundations.

# ROGER'S FOCUS

Oldham Evening Chronicle Rugby League writer, Roger Halstead, looks at today's visitors HULL FC come to Watersheddings this evening to bring down the curtain on the 1990-91 Stones Bitter championship campaign.

Although they had a spell when their away form let them down, the men from the Boulevard have enjoyed an excellent First Division season, first under the guidance of Australian coach Brian Smith and, more recently, under the watchful eye of his fellow countryman Noel Cleal, the former Kangaroo Test forward and tourist.

For much of the season Hull topped the table, but although their championship aspirations slipped with a series of disappointing results whenever they had to hit the M62, they are well placed to finish in the top four and will be formidable challengers in the premiership play-off.

Even "Crusher" Cleal will acknowledge the immense influence on everything black and white of the popular Smith, who was given an emotional send-off when he left the Boulevard a few weeks ago to take over the helm of Sydney St. George.

Not surprisingly, the Saints have made a splendid start in the opening weeks of the Winfield Cup.

Cleal inherited a well-organised, well-drilled team, whose success has been based on a big, strong pack to do the basics right and a clever; creative pair of half-backs in Greg Mackey and Patrick Entat.

Mackey, an Australian, was snapped up from Warrington shortly after he had helped the Wires to beat Oldham in the final of the Lancashire Cup last season.

The partnership was complete when Entat, the French international scrum-half, got out his English phrase book and a map of the British Isles and decided to settle on Humberside.

**Rob Nolan:** Utility player who is a product of the club's vouth policy. Regarded as a back-row forward but has developed into a player who can play anywhere.

Paul Eastwood: Made his debut against Oldham in 1985 and has since established himself as a top class player. Last season he scored 101 goals and 22 tries to earn a Great Britain squad call-up. He starred in the recent Test series against Australia.

Brad Webb: A stand-off or centre from Down Under who had two years out of the game and is now determined to reestablish himself in Britain.

Lee Jackson: Another product of the club's youth policy, Lee is currently in possession of the Great Britain No. 9 shirt. He toured Papua New Guinea and New Zealand last year and featured in the recent Australian Test series.

Karl Harrison: A £57,000 buy from Featherstone Rovers, Karl's powerhouse style of play has earned him the nickname Rhino and international honours. He has formed an awesome partnership with Andy Dannatt.

Ian Marlow: A back-row forward who signed from Beverley Rugby Union and is an outstanding prospect.

Russ Walker: A back-row forward signed from Barrow, known for his excellent work-rate and strong defensive abilities.

Jon Sharp: A loose forward or second row, who signed from Featherstone, making his debut in 1984.
