Even those clubs who missed the split and ended in the 3rd Division now realise that under the new structure they have something to play for right until the end of the season.


The new second division premiership system will involve the top four teams from the third division. A lucrative game at Old Trafford next May is an incentive for any club.

The real experiment of the new system is the eight club second division. Critics argue that fans will be bored seeing the same team visit at least twice per season. But would fans rather

see Eagles v Oldham two times in a year or Eagles v Nottingham or Oldham v Chorley? (I think the answer is obvious).

Incidently, Sheffield are slight odds on with Corals to take the Second Division title, with Oldham 2 to 1 against to top them. Real gamblers will be taking 1000 to 1 about London Crusaders to be champions or even 5000 to 1 about Hull KR or Swinton to win the Stones Bitter Championship.

The two division system was re-introduced in 1973 and has lasted 18 years. Three clubs - Batley, Doncaster and Runcorn Highfield spent the whole of that period in Division Two. All three look to have a good chance of getting back there next season.





UNDERSTANDING the Rules

New Rules

Not that many changes for this season but nevertheless some interesting ones.

The one that will interest Eagles fans is that 'the practice of heading the ball forward is illegal'. It is a pity nobody thought of that one before!

It is also illegal to steal the ball in the tackle. There was some controversy last season when it was permissible to steal the ball if the player was making progress - a very grey area indeed - which seems to be the reason for the change. Problem is, I can see the more devious professionals giving the ball away to get a penalty of two. Look out for more controversy.

The third rule change is a bit more complex, this one regarding substitutions. Basically:

- a. An injured player can now leave the field and a substitute enter the field of play with the knowledge of the touch-judge. Tactical substitutions can still only be made during the stoppage of play.
- b. Should a player suffer an open wound, he can leave the field for treatment and he can be replaced for ten minutes without that affecting the four possible substitutions a coach can make.

Should that replacement be sent off, the repaired player must sit on the bench, or if sin-binned then he must sit out the full ten minutes.

So watch out this season for the referee holding up a white card with a red cross on, to signal a player going to the *blood bin*.







The Eagles notched a record forty points in opening their 1986/87 campaign against a troubled Marksman side.

Mansfield set off with a drop goal from Sanderson in the first minute, but it only served to spur on the Eagles, for whom Kuhnemann earned the main honours, with "Bludger" Bridgeman's powerful runs again catching the eve.

Sheffield went ahead in the fourth minute, Smith crossing to give Rafferty the opportunity to kick his 100th goal for the Eagles.

Winger Steve Lidbury celebrated his debut by cutting a poor Mansfield defence to pieces before another debutant, Kevin Nason, set Rafferty loose on a spectacular 70 yard run to the line.

Despite a hamstring injury to Gary Smith the Eagles continued to pile up points in a second half which belonged to classy centre Andy Dickinson. He ran in a hat trick of tries after young Lidbury had added to his tally.

Somewhere along the line, Mansfield added a try - scored by one N C Kellett, who was to end the season with the Eagles - but that's another story.

Rugby League players are not always athletic looking. Gary Smith looked anything but a professional athlete - overweight, hated training, smoked like a chimney, a steady, if not heavy drinker, mouth full of bad teeth - yet he was undoubtedly a player of immense innate talent.

Gary had spent fifteen years at York appearing in a Yorkshire Cup final and Challenge Cup semi-final, before coming to the Eagles in January 1986. He was almost 32 and his role was to be that of playermaker, adding knowhow to the talented, but inexperienced Eagles team.

His debut was not a success. On a cold, wet night at the decrepit Athletic Grounds at Rochdale, the Eagles went down 24-4.


Smithy was virtually an ever-present in the following two seasons, as the Eagles marched steadily towards the top of the table. Although he was much slower than in his York days, he still had a magical sleight of hand and could accelerate quickly over short distances.

Smithy's last game for the Eagles was in France against a combined Carcassonne-Lezignan-Limoux team. Unfortunately his career ended as it began, with a twenty point defeat, 40-20. As the Eagles youngsters developed, the time was right for the 34 year old to retire, perhaps to ponder on what might have been, had he been keener on the training field.



JUNIOR EAGLES Amateur Rugby League Club

Rugby League is a fast growing sport for children in Sheffield. Prior to the formation of Sheffield Eagles in 1985 the sport was not played in the city in any organised sense. In the past six years the explosion of interest has been extraordinary. Rugby League is now played in the majority of Sheffield Secondary Schools and in a rapidly increasing number of Primary Schools. It is a game that has much to offer youngsters - a full range of physical skills the collaborative endeavour, individual and collective discipline and a tradition of fair play.



Junior Eagles was formed in 1988 to give children the opportunity to develop their interest in the game and enhance their playing skills.

After a modest beginning the club now has a membership of over 150 youngsters from five to seventeen and a wide range of support from parents and coaches. During the 1991/2 season the club will run teams at under 9, 11, 13, 14, 15 and 17 level.

Although there is no formal link with Sheffield Eagles, Gary Hetherington and his staff are extremely supportive and close links exist between the professional clubs and Junior Eagles. This includes the joint use of facilities at the Don Valley International Stadium one night a week when on occasions he, his coaches and players join in with the coaching of our youngsters. On ten occasions last season our sides provided prematch entertainment at Sheffield Eagles First Division matches; giving an enormous boost to our players and helping to promote the game with our youngsters.

Junior Eagles have an entirely open policy to membership. All children regardless of ability are welcome. The club has a positive policy in encouraging girls to play and have three qualified women coaches in our coaching team of ten. We encourage discipline, loyalty to their peers and a sense of striving for achievement whatever their ability. We like to see our teams achieving a high level of success, such as our under 11 side that won the South West Yorkshire League and Cup. However, we take as much pleasure in seeing the less able progress. Playing should be fun and we believe it is with the Junior Eagles!
