In recent seasons we have not played Oldham and a Rugby League trip to London will be a new experience for many of their supporters. I hope you enjoy your

Last Sunday's narrow win over Leigh was a big improvement over the previous week's performance. I thought the whole defence tackled well especially when we were under pressure in the second half and it was a pressure kick from Darryl Pitt which won us the match. Darryl has been one of our most consistent players this season regularly getting on the scoresheet. With man of the match, Lachlan Churchill also playing well and Jason Wing having his best game so far we achieved a very creditable result.

Now to news of our absent Australians. Tragically we lost Frank Rolls after only five minutes of the Leigh game. Frank suffered a double fracture. He had his leg pinned in surgery last Monday and will obviously miss the rest of the season. Frank has always dreamed of seeing

Europe. Unfortunately it won't be on a cycle as intended. Let's hope he makes a sound recovery and is able to at least see something of the continent before he returns to Australia.

Against Leigh we were also without scrum-half Ray Ovens. Ray took a heavy knock in the Wigan game but has been kept out of the side with a mystery virus which required hospital treatment. I hope to have him back in today's team. Bernie Wilkinson received a £40 fine and a four match suspension after being sent off against Sheffield Eagles and Danish Australian Ben Olsen collected a leg injury in the game.

One Australian who should be at today's match is Steve Rosolen. Either as a spectator or on the bench Steve will be most welcome. Congratulations to Steve on a winning performance in the Sydney reserve grade Grand Final. I wish him a successful stay both on and off the park.

Turning to off-field matters, the latest news of our replica shirts is that they should be available for our home game against Ryedale York.

Don't forget to visit the club shop in the Crusader bar where we are trying to locate most of the club facilities. Certainly last Sunday saw the biggest pre-match gathering of fans in the Crusader bar. Many were watching the Wigan game on the video and I intend to continue Rugby League videos available before every match.

The video will be sited at the far end of the bar room away from the stalls to allow them to operate freely.

Last year supporters asked that the Anmac be open during and after the game. The club arranged this and its now up to the fans to justify this move. This week as an experiment we are bringing the Man of the Match presentation forward to 5-15pm. To make this a success we need fans to be in the Crusader bar. 



CRUSADERS EARN NARROW WIN OVER LEIGH

London Crusaders 20 - Leigh 18

A penalty five minutes from time, thirty yards out in front of the posts, by loose forward Darryl Pitt was the difference between the sides in this closely fought contest on a rainsoaked pitch at the Crystal Palace Stadium.

The match had begun disastrously. In only his second game Crusader's new Aussie signing, prop forward Frank Rolls, was carried off after just five minutes with a broken leg after a harmless-looking tackle. Then seven minutes later Leigh's Paul Topping scored between the posts, following good work by David Ruane and Tony Cottrell, then converted. 0-6 to Leigh.

Six minutes later Pitt reduced the margin. On the sixth tackle and seemingly crowded out he prised open the defence to score a fine solo try. But Leigh hit back soon after to restore their six point lead. The ball ran loose to the left wing to be scooped up by centre lan Jeffrey who raced some 35 yards before being tackled in the corner. He appeared not to ground the ball, but despite Crusader's protests the try was awarded.

Crusaders stormed back and when Churchill's pressure high-ball kick was dropped on his own line by full back John Woods, the ball was pounced upon by Pitt to score his second try. Chris Smith goaled and the sides were level, 10-10. Crusaders were then awarded a penalty in injury time and Smith slotted it over for a two-point half time lead.

Immediately after the restart Crusaders increased their lead. As another Churchill "Bomb" dropped on the Leigh line Crusaders winger Steve Buckley rose majestically to catch the ball and land over the line near the posts. Smith again goaled. Nine minutes later Churchill crossed only to be turned on his back and was unable to ground.

But Leigh hit back. Opting to forego an easy penalty and take the tap paid off when Topping created a break to score himself in the corner. He then looked certain to level the score when he was brought down only feet from the line by a last-ditch tackle by Doug Winborne. But Topping was back three minutes later to feed Jeffrey for his second try. Unfortunately for Topping he missed both goal attempts, but the scores were now level.

In a hard-fought finish it was the Pitt penalty that decided the match. Crusaders had won 20-18 and Leigh were left regretting three missed conversions and one missed penalty.

STONES BITTER TEAMS OF THE MONTH AUGUST/SEPTEMBER 1991

Unbeaten St. Helens are the Stones Bitter Team of the Month for the First Division. The Stones Bitter Second Division Team of the Month title goes to Rochdale Hornets; while the first-ever Stones Bitter Third Division award goes to top of the table Batley.

An Aussie with a New Zealander's passport, Vince came to Oldham from Sydney via Limoux in France. Sort that one out! As a boy, he played with St George and Easts in Sydney, before making a name for himself in France and then joining Oldham during the summer.

Currently playing full back, but can also operate at half-back, stand-off or in the centre.

RICHARD IRVING

A blockbusting winger from the Huddersfield area, Richard Irving won youth international honours before turning pro for Oldham in Eric Fitzsimon's first spell at Watersheddings. Played regularly in the first team for the past couple of seasons.

TOMMY MARTYN

A player of exciting potential, Tommy is the son of the former Leigh, Warrington and GB forward Tommy Martyn and the nephew of Mick Martyn, who set scoring records as a forward with Leigh in the early 60's. He is a stand-off or centre, who can "sniff" tries out of nothing - a poacher who can turn matches at a stroke.

CHARLIE MCALISTER

A New Zealander, Charlie signed for Oldham three years ago from Bradford and Bingley RU club in Yorkshire. Can play centre or second row and is also a goal kicker. A powerful man, Charlie has played in Australia and has just been appointed the club's vice-captain.

JOHN HENDERSON

Former Leigh centre and a prolific try scorer. John signed for Oldham for £50,000 and after a summer of discontent (he was one 7-3 of several contract rebels) he has made his peace, won back his first team place and is looking as keen as in his early days with the club.

STEVE WARBURTON

Steve was the BARLA open age international stand-off last season. He signed for Oldham from Warrington amateur club, Woolston, and made his debut as substitute against Hull in the last match of last season. Did well and enhanced his reputation further in France. A clever, attacking player with promise and class.

NEIL FLANAGAN

A local lad, Neil is a scrum half who won international honours as a young amateur and had several clubs chasing his signature. Recently, he attracted the attention of Hull with his all action displays.

AUSTIN DONEGAN

At 17 stone, the biggest man on Oldham's books. He joined Oldham from St. Helens and is a young prop in whom Oldham have high hopes. Very fast for a big man, he can show the odd back or two a clean pair of heels.

RICHARD PACHNUIK

A 20 year old from Dewsbury with Polish grandparents, Richard starred in the "A" team last season, did well preseason in France and made his debut in the first home game of the season against Leigh. A clever creative thinking type of hooker, he is expected to go a long way.

TIM STREET

A local lad, he signed for Wigan and then moved to Leigh and Swinton before joining Oldham in the summer in a swap move with John Fairbank and Neil Clawson going to Station Road. A strong prop, Tim earned GB colts and under-21 honours during his Wigan days.

PAUL ROUND

One of the most respected and well-known forwards in RL, Paul signed for Oldham from St.Helens for £65,000 four years ago. The fee was set by tribunal and at the time, was a club record. A long-striding running forward, he has recently been elevated to club captain, which he regards as a great honour.

KEITH NEWTON

One of the more experienced players in a young squad, Keith had several seasons with hometown Widnes before signing for Oldham for £12,000 during Tony Barrow's reign as coach. A hardworking prop or second-row man, he can bob on a bit when a gap appears. Prefers second row.

RICHARD RUSSELL

A local lad who arrived home at Watersheddings via Wigan. Played for Wigan on the wing in the world club championship against Manly but is now regarded as a hooker or loose forward. Creative player with an excellent pair of hands.

SIMON LONGSTAFF

Simon was a young man whom many clubs were chasing. Almost joined Oldham in the first instance, but opted for Halifax and finally came to Watersheddings towards the end of the 1990-91 season. A versatile player he could have made a big name for himself in athletics, but has chosen RL - and Oldham - to make it big in sport.

KEITH ATKINSON

Local lad, Keith acme through via the colts and played in France for Great Britain colts a year or two ago. Full of courage, he is one of the unluckiest players in the game, twice having returned to action in the second row after major spinal surgery.



GREAT BRITAIN IN FRANCE




