



Enjoy the game.



Steve Craven: 19-year-old prop signed from All Blacks. A tough tackler who the Wasps hope will have a big impact in the game.

Steve Dobson: Wily scrum-half in his seventh season with the club. Signed from Hull KR. Consistently under-rated, except by York fans.

Chris Hammerton: Another player who missed all last season, failing to win back his place after a serious knee operation. The former Heworth scrum-half is keen to regain the form which made him a top second division player.

Rich Hayes: Been virtually an ever-present in the front row since turning professional at the age of 18 from York All Blacks. Voted York's player of the tour on their history-making trip to the Soviet Union last summer.

Paul Hutchinson: Signed from the Redhill club, he made the full-back spot at York his own until picking up a knee injury. Now back to fitness, the 20-year-old will be out to regain his place.

David Kettlestring: Top local cricketer, he made his name by equalling the York club record of six tries in one match at Keighley just weeks after turning pro from the All Blacks club. A series of injuries, however, meant he had a quiet second season.

Mark Laws: Ball-handling forward who joined the Wasps from the Newland club in Hull. Expected to emerge to claim a first team spot this season.

Alan Pallister: Hooker signed from York All Blacks last season and bidding to establish himself as first choice number nine.

Geoff Pryce: Hugely popular forward who has just completed a record benefit season. One of only 18 York players in their 123-year history to record 250 appearances for the Wasps.

Steve Pryce: Brother of Geoff and signed from Bradford's West Bowling club last season. Made his debut against Warrington in the Cup.

Nick Pinkney: Great Britain under-19 amateur international as a winger with Hull amateurs Greatfield, he made his biggest impact when switched to stand-off last season with 12 tries in nine games to finish as joint top try-scorer. Brought into the Great Britain under-19 squad by Mal Reilly during the summer.

Stuart Morris: Another who spent all last season on the treatment table, but his 14 tries in 20 games in his first season with York after signing from Dewsbury suggests he could be one to watch again this year.

Graham Sullivan: Started the season with the longest points scoring run in rugby league. Last season's top try-scorer and goal-kicker, he can play anywhere, but is most often found at full-back or in the second row.

Matthew Shaw: Spent the summer in Australia with Canterbury under-21s. Loose forward who made several first team appearances last season but is only 18 years old.

Steve Wheatley: Loyal hooker who turned pro from York's Soughlands club.



SPOTLIGHT ON RICHARD PACHNIUK

OLDHAM'S ambitious youth policy, launched three years ago by former coach Tony Barrow, is beginning to pay dividends as teenage youngsters are now forcing themselves into the first team. Yorkshireman Richard Pachniuk, 20, is the latest voungster to follow Tommy Martyn into the first team and is looking to establish the hooker's No. 9 shirt as his own this season, alongside other contemporaries like Neil Flanagan and Tony Barrow Jnr.

He has an impressive start since making his debut against Leigh, proof that his decision to sign for Oldham rather than St. Helens was the right one. "I'd played for Yorkshire under-17s and had Oldham and St. Helens interested in signing me. I decided to join Oldham because they sounded like a well-run club with a lot of youngsters like myself, people like Tony Barrow and Richard Blackman."

Despite his name — he blames his Polish grandparents — Richard is proud of his heritage. "People always mention my name but I am Yorkshire born and bred. I still live in Dewsbury with my parents, Peter and Pauline, and I've just started a job as a joiner in the town."

Although he signed for the club in the summer of '89, it has taken him three seasons to break through into the first team. "I was in the squad towards the end of last season and played in the first team during the pre-season French tour. This season marks the breakthrough and I'd like to establish myself in the side."

Another ambition is to return to Australia following a summer playing with New South Wales Country Club, Yenda, with Chris Joynt and Paddy Mitchell. "Life Down Under is a lot different from Yorkshire and Lancashire. Totally different way of life. The game is quicker and harder, too. I'd like to go back and play in the Sydney league in the future.

But before he does that, Richard is looking to follow in Tommy Martyn's footsteps by winning a place in the Great Britain under-21 squad. An international call-up would cap what promises to be an exciting season for the Yorkshireman with the Polish name.
