Oldham

This afternoon we extend a warm welcome to the players, officials and supporters of Oldham.

The Roughyeds began the season regarded, along with Sheffield Eagles, as promotion favourites but have not had things all their own way so far.

Home defeats have been suffered at the hands of Rochdale (18-26) and Sheffield (12-38), the latter reversal, in their last match, being after a disappointing display in which their tackling was strongly criticised.

In their other home games Oldham have run in big scores, 46-19 against ourselves (after the score was 22-19 at one stage in the second half) and 52-18 against Ryedale-York.

Away from home, Oldham drew 16-16 at Sheffield and 6-6 at Workington and had two fine wins, 23-20 at

London Crusaders and 30-10 at Carlisle.

In the Lancashire Cup, Oldham won 22-21 at Swinton before a 26-39 defeat at eventual cup winners St. Helens.

Former Australian test forward Peter Tunks, who played last season for Salford and Sheffield, has overseen a big change in the playing personnel in his first coaching appointment. The team for the Sheffield game showed only five players left from the Tony Barrow/John Fieldhouse coaching stints last season.

A number of last season's regulars have moved on- Brett Clark (to Rochdale), Fieldhouse (Halifax), Mike Ford (Castleford), Paul Round (Wakefield) and Andy Ruane (Leigh). Of the new players, teenager Richard Pachniuk and Australian full-back Vince Nicklin have made the biggest impression. Former Wigan utility back Ged Byrne and Widnes' Kiwi prop Joe Grima have been recent acquisitions.

We look forward to an exciting and entertaining game. second season.

MATCH REPORTS

Two incidents either side of half-time proved crucial as Leigh's injury-ravaged team went out of the Regal Trophy after a terrific fight.

Jason Donohue was masterminding the show and giving highly-rated Aussie Greg Mackey the runaround when the Hull number seven's high and late challenge was tolerated by the referee and two touch judges.

Donohue was forced out of the action with concussion and with Mackey calling the shots Hull looked a better outfit.

Then Andy Ruane's volleyed bomb on the last tackle was safely gathered by Hull full-back Nolan. To everyone's amazement referee Gilmour gave a drop-goal, one of the most incredible decisions many seasoned watchers had ever witnessed. Leigh now led 7-6.

The injustice of this decision roused Hull into action and the strangely muted Boulevard crowd at last began to get behind their side. Three tries in the space of 16 minutes, by Porlock, Blacker and Eastwood, ended Leigh's brave challenge on a wild and wet night on Humberside.

Leigh had plenty of things to look back on with satisfaction. Craig Rodgers made a most impressive debut, Andy Ruane's leadership and tactical kicking were first-class and Andrew Collier never stopped taking on Hull's big pack. Everybody gave their all.

Three days earlier Leigh had pulled off a valuable win on their first ever visit to the Ryedale Stadium, the game also ending 22-7.

York looked a better side than their record

indicated and had their finishing matched their approach play the score would have been much closer.

Again Leigh's tackling was out of the top drawer and the line was only pierced in injury time when Hutchinson went over wide out.

Three first-half tries set up the win, Booth going over after Woods' superb break and finely judged long pass. When Dave Ruane's bomb fell kindly, Russ Bridge was on hand to dive in and then David Hill scored Leigh's individual try of the season so far - a brilliant 60-yard effort through a whole string of despairing would-be tacklers. Mark Sheals' close range try and Donohue's accurate kicking complemented a good evening's work though Ake's 90-yard try being disallowed for obstruction remained the major talking point.

The last home game against Workington was a tense and rugged affair containing only one try. Wear spilled the ball in a superb Donohue tackle and Dave Ruane showed fine opportunism to pick up the loose ball and send Booth streaking away to the corner.

Leigh survived a strong second-half revival inspired by player-coach Ashton and it was all hands to the pumps as an injury-depleted side held out with some brave and committed tackling.

The legacy of the hard-earned two points was a serious one, notably Andy Collier's broken jaw. The second row had been in superb form all season and it was a cruel blow that another off-the-ball offence went unpunished.

With Paul Topping sustaining a back injury and John Woods incurring a nasty eye injury in the York game, Leigh's ranks have been depleted with a number of other players having to carry niggling knocks. The team spirit and greater strength in depth than previous seasons have been crucial so far.

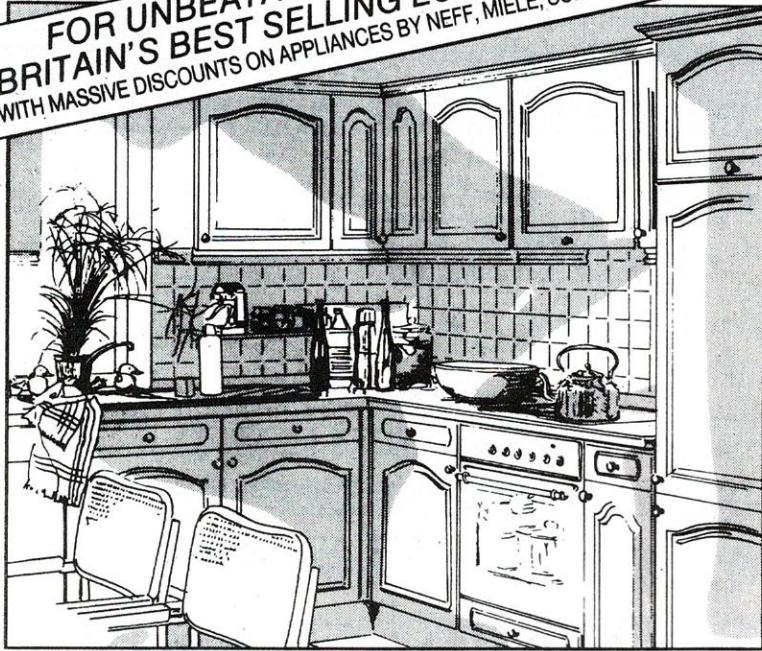

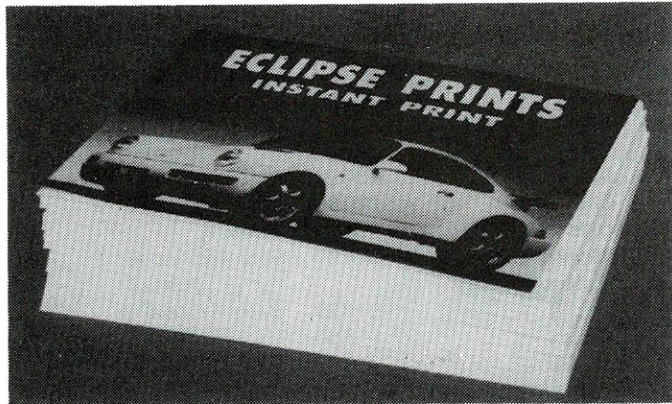

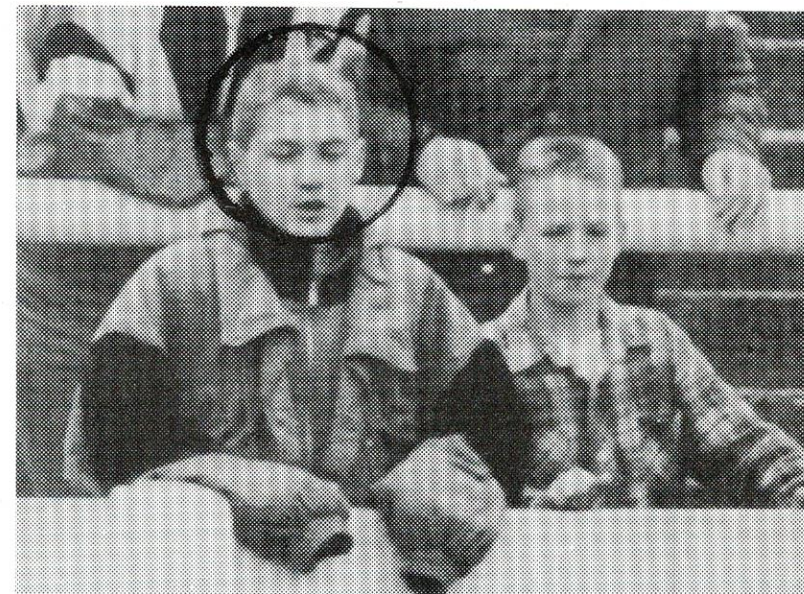

PLAYER PROFILE

One of the most pleasing aspects of Leigh's season so far has been the way local amateur talent has been brought to Hilton Park. As Kevin Ashcroft says: "When you've got two of the best BARLA sides in the country in Miners and Easts it makes sense to take advantage.

"These lads have been thrown in at the deep end - we've had very little option - but when lads want to play for Leigh you're 80% there already."

Tommy Hayes ended a long association with East when he turned pro earlier this season after a successful trial. A try-scoring debut in the fine win at Rochdale got him off to a good start and the talented back row forward has swiftly bridged the gap between amateur and pro football.

"The biggest difference is the pace at which the game is played" says Tommy, "and it really finds players out who are not properly prepared. I wouldn't say that it's any harder physically because you certainly get a lot of knocks in the amateur game but it is the speed and the quickness of thought which makes the difference.

"It has been a big step up for the lads who have come up from the amateurs but we are all in it together. I have been used to playing alongside the likes of John Costello, Gary Pendlebury and Mark Dainty, so it has helped us joining Leigh at the same time.

But the spirit among the team is superb. As a newcomer you are ac-

cepted straight away and the encouragement and help I have had from some of the established players has been brilliant."

Tommy says: "It is a really close and hard division. There are no easy matches at all so, as a player, it must improve your own game having to play at an intense level every week.

"In the amateur game there were some matches where you could take it easy but here you can't do that. It is a lot more disciplined and organised.

Looking back at his career with East, Tommy was full of praise for everyone at the club. I had been there since I was 14 so it was a wrench to leave but it had always been my ambition to play for Leigh.

"The coaches, Keith Latham, Steve Grimshaw and Brian Burns have been a great help and they encouraged me. There is no way I would have joined a struggling third division side because it wouldn't have been any improvement on East, but Leigh was different.

East won the Miners Champions Challenge, the Lancashire Cup and, to cap it all, the BARLA National League after overcoming a big fixture backlog. Yet it was the cup tie with Bradford which Tommy remembers with particular satisfaction.

"Our performance that day (East lost only 12-24) made people sit up and take notice and showed how good standards are in the National League. That game has to be the highlight of my amateur career."

Hopefully Tommy, something of a latecomer to the pro ranks at the age of 26, will have many more highlights to look back on before he eventually hangs up his boots.

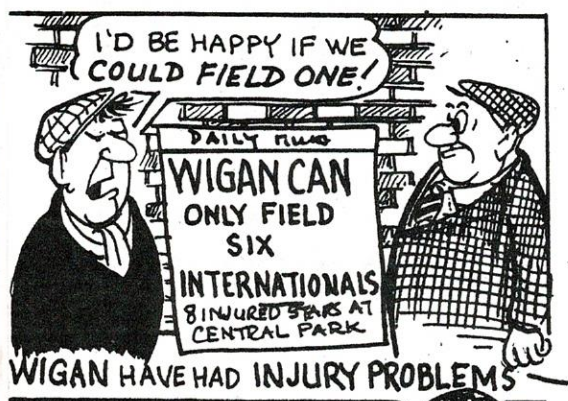

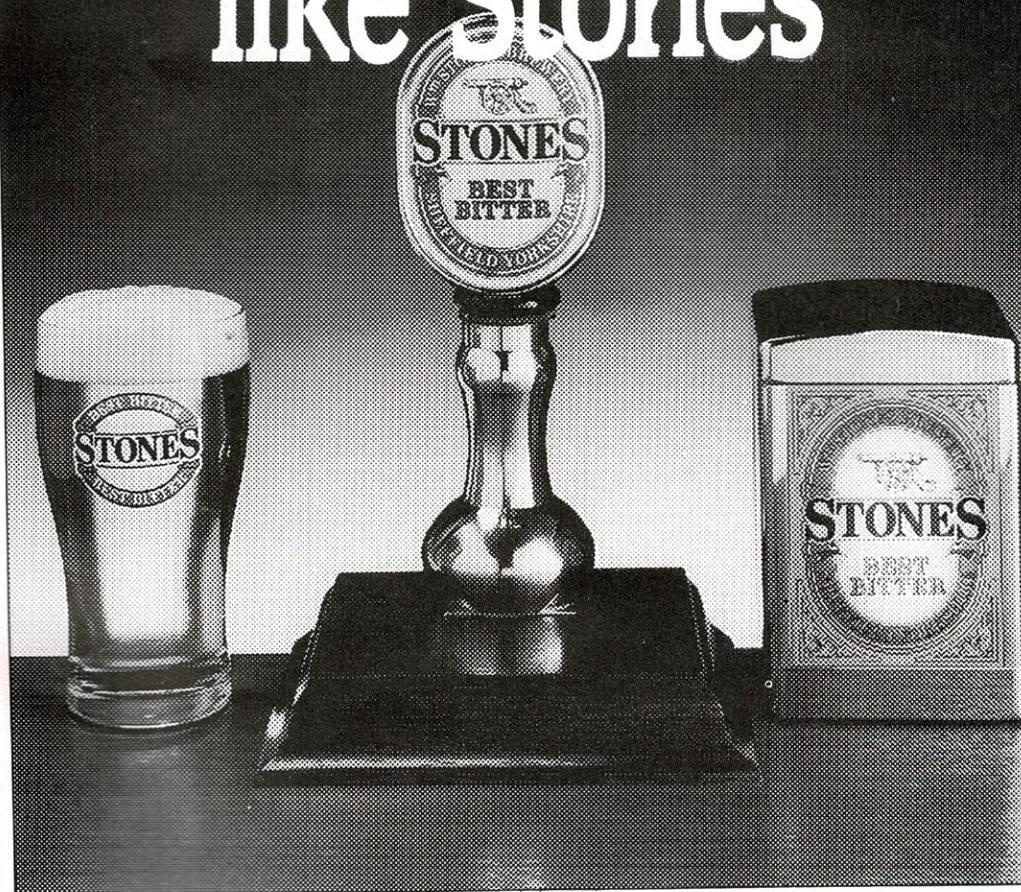
