**Raymond Ashton** (scrum-half/player coach): Height 5' 8", weight 12st. Ray made an excellent debut into the coaching world last season, being instrumental in a major revival at Workington Town. He will be hoping to keep the momentum going this term, with promotion the goal. Appearances 1990/91: 29+(5), 5 tries, 13 drop goals.

**Colin Armstrong** (front row forward): Height 6' 3", weight 15st. 10lb. Began his pro career with Carlisle before moving on to Hull Kingston Rovers, from where Town signed him early last season for a reported record fee. Cumbria county cap. Appearances 1990/91: 31, 3 tries, 25 goals, 4 drop goals.

**Wayne Kitchen** (scrum-half): Height 5' 7", weight 12st. 8lb. A niggling injury stifled Wayne's progress last season. However, now fully fit he is set to make his mark in the game. Appearances 1990/91: 9+(2), 5 tries, 3 goals.

**David Lowden** (winger): Height 5' 10", weight 12st. 7lb. Having shown excellent attacking qualities as a full back in previous seasons, David had no problems when coach Ashton transformed him into a very useful winger, which is typical of David's enthusiasm for the game. Cumbria county cap. Appearances 1990/91: 34, 8 tries, 14 goals, 2 drop goals.

**Ian McLean** (winger): Height 5' 10", weight 13st. 2lb. An excellent start to his Town career last season, scoring some crucial tries. Also good on defence, having made several appearances in the number one shirt. Appearances 1990/91: 29, 10 tries, 6 goals.

**Alan McMullen** (second row forward): Height 5' 11", weight 14st. Alan featured in all of last season's 36 fixtures, the only Town player to do so. Mr. Superfit, who always gives 100% of true Cumbrian grit. Voted player of the year by Town supporters. Appearances 1990/91: 34+(2), didn't score.

**Martin Oglanby** (loose forward): Height 5' 9", weight 13st. 7lb. A former B.A.R.L.A. open age international, good ball-handler with a fair amount of pace. The injury bug somewhat curtailed his progress at the latter end of last season. However, big things are expected of a fit 'Oggy' this term. Appearances 1990/91: 19+(9), 4 tries.

**Paul Penrice** (centre): Height 6' 1", weight 14st. A strong, hard-to-stop runner, whose versatility allows him to fill in as a forward if required. Appearances 1990/91: 21+(7), 7 tries.

**Ian Scott** (second row forward): Height 6', weight 13st. 7lb. Signed last season from neighbours Carlisle and settled in well. Should be a regular this term in what is becoming a formidable Town pack. Appearances 1990/91: 17+(6), 3 tries.

**Gary Smith** (full back): Height 5' 7", weight 11st. Fleet footed and a strong tackler, equally at home in the centre or stand-off. County cap. Appearances 1990/91: 19+(1), 1 try.

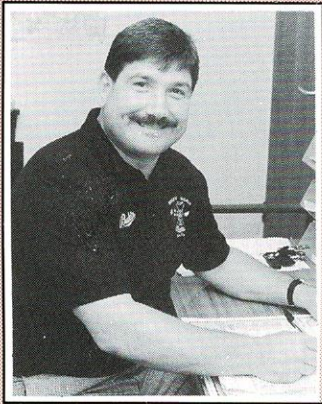

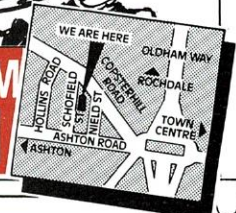

# Second Division Round Up

WITH a quarter of the season gone, it's time to see how the ultra-competitive Second Division is coming along. Hot favourites Sheffield Eagles are living up to their star billing. On the evidence so far, Eagles are the best organised team in the league and have international class players in Darryl Powell, Mark Aston and Hugh Waddell. Paul Broadbent is a forward to be feared and Mick Cook is a lively hooker. David Mycoe is young and sheer class, while threequarter line power comes from Iva Ropati and David Plange. With only one defeat at Carlisle to their name, I don't see anyone topping the Eagles.

Carlisle have surprised a few this season (not Sheffield) but probably lack strength in depth. Well coached by Cameron Bell, the Border Raiders pack power in the form of Okesene, Acherman and Williams. The inimitable Clayton Friend pulls the strings behind the pack and Kevin Pape remains one of the best centres not to have had a

First Division opportunity. Unlikely to stay the course, however.

Like their Cumbrian neighbours, Workington Town lack strength in depth, as witness the hammerings being sustained by their 'A' team. However, at full strength they can be a match for anyone. Ray Ashton and Colin Armstrong are class players, but Town also possess outstanding young talent with players like Kitchen and Lowden. However, defeats by London and Rochdale and only one victory on their travels have put Town in an unexpectedly lowly position. Watch out for a revival when their injuries begin to clear up.

London Crusaders continue to shame the Rugby League authorities by battling on in the capital with very little central aid. Sponsorship by Today newspaper must be a big help and Ross Standwick's devotion to the cause is much to be admired. Despite losing the classy Grey Peaver to Halifax, Crusaders still boast a workmanlike pack with the likes of Pitt, Olsen and Beekers. Lacklin Churchill calls the shots from scrum-half, and ex-Oldham favourites Hussein M'Barki and Mick Taylor continue to thrive. Star of the moment is ex-Halifax and Keighley winger Colin Atkinson. With good wins over Leigh, Rochdale and Workington, it is clear that the Londoners are no push-over.

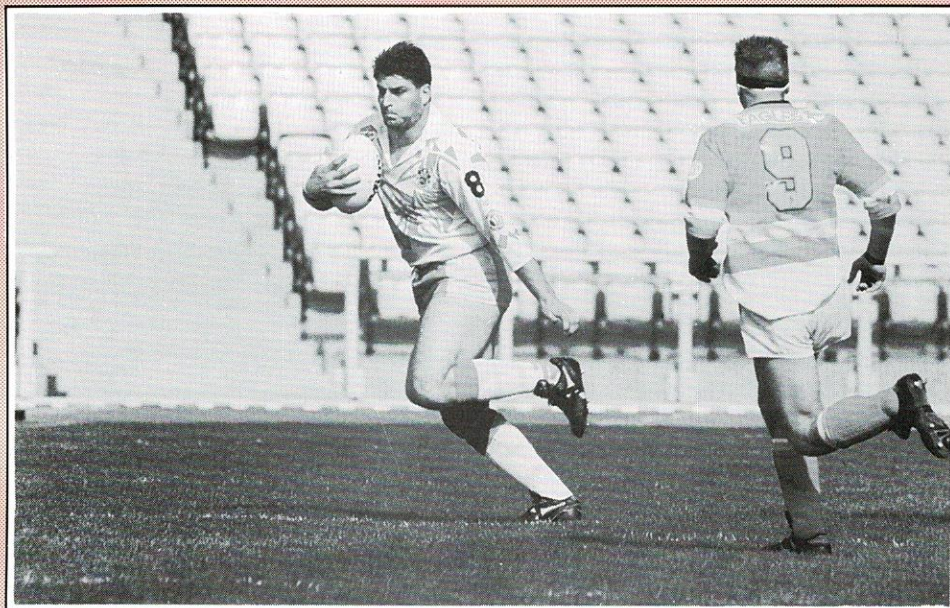

# SPOTLIGHT ON AUSTIN DONEGAN

However, powerful, strong-running forward Austin, who joined Oldham on a three-year contract from St. Helens for around £20,000 last season, still considers he has a lot to learn about the game.

"Rugby League is about experience and I am learning more about the game with every match. At the moment we have a lot of young lads in the side who are just starting their education and I'll be doing all I can to help them. Having good professionals like Joe Grima in the side will not only help the youngsters, but me as well!"

A bricklayer by trade, Austin, who is 6' 3" and weighs in at 17 stones 4 pounds, one of the game's biggest forwards, turned professional when he left school when Billy Benyon signed him for St. Helens. He spent four years with the Saints, the first two of which were marred by injury. However, despite a number of impressive first team performances, he was unable to establish himself in the first team and eagerly accepted the Tony Barrow's Oldham challenge.

He made a dramatic impact when he joined the club, helping them to a memorable Silk Cut Challenge Cup semi-final against Wigan. "It was bad news losing my first-ever semi-final appearance against Wigan, but I felt more for the players who have lost three or four semis. I'll hopefully get the opportunity again!"

His start to this season was disrupted when he broke his right thumb but now he is back to full fitness and is looking forward to getting his place back in the first team.

Since coming to Watersheddings, Austin has really taken to the town. "I love it at Oldham. The people are very friendly and a lot more down to earth than they are in St. Helens!"

Now Austin is looking to drive forward to a successful career in Rugby League. "I am still a young player and I want to enjoy top class rugby in the first division with Oldham — and get through to Wembley, of course!"

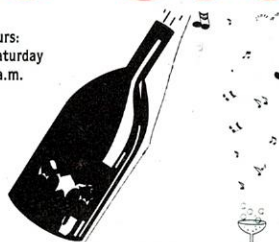

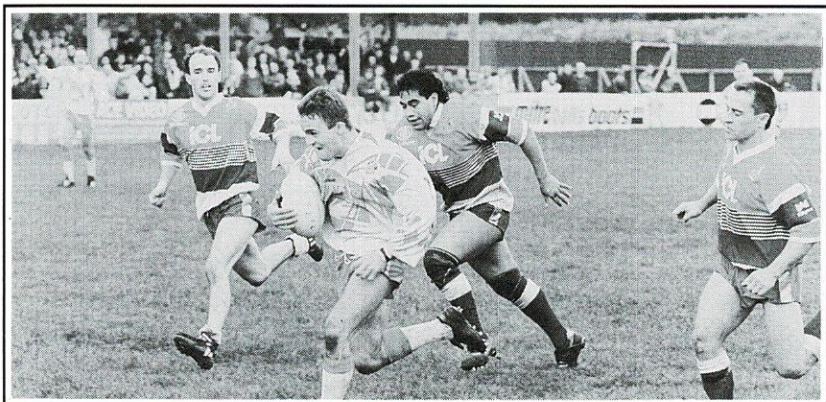

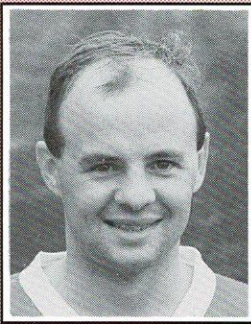

# Paddy's View

THE loss of over a dozen players with proven 1st team experience has certainly taken its toll on the 'A' team performance. The replacements for these experienced professionals have been, in the main, youngsters and triallists, and with injuries and suspensions adding to the problems, 'A' team selection has not been about who to leave out but how to shuffle players into positions to resemble a team.

At Bradford two weeks ago, another young side impressed for the first 30 minutes without applying the killer punch to convert pressure into points. A poor spell just before half-time saw Bradford take an undeserved 14-0 half-time lead. Again, early in the second half several clear-cut chances provided by the forwards were missed by the backs. The missed chances deflated the young side and lifted Bradford Northern, who eventually ran out 30-10 winners, a scoreline that in no way reflected the effort put in, especially by players such as Shaun Allen, Ian Bates and the ever-improving Darrell Rogers.

The lack of a first team game last weekend was a very welcome chance to introduce some experience to the 'A' team. Based on the platform provided by the front row of Joe Grima, Richard Russell and Austin Donegan, the team played in a much more professional manner, with much of the credit going to Joe Grima, Shaun Allen and Richard Russell for the organisation and communication on the field. For the first time in several matches I felt comfortable on the bench with the team always looking in control and, but for a number of dubious second-half refereeing decisions, I'm sure the score would have been much higher than the 14-4 victory. I feel sorry for the spectators who pay to watch good rugby on Friday nights often to find a young referee out to impress the assessors, taking over as the star of the show.

With a bit of luck on the injury front, I will have a stronger squad to choose from over the next few weeks. This should enable a string of good results to be produced which will improve the confidence amongst the youngsters and help them achieve their full potential.
